Report of Superintendent of Schools.

PRIMARY SCHOOLS.

The resignation of Miss Stonie Tucker, Bailey Primary, caused a vacancy that was filled by the election of Miss Agnes McNamara. Miss Vidae Gardiner was elected to teach the Mill River school where Miss McNamara had so successfully taught for several years.

The other Primary teachers for the school year have been—Miss Rose Moran, Gleason street; Miss Marion Robinson, Wadsworth street. The Oyster River school was opened and Miss Elizabeth Lermont installed as teacher. The average attendance did not warrant the Superintending School Committee to continue the school. Consequently that Board directed the Superintendent to furnish transportation to the village schools. This was done by purchasing street railway tickets for the pupils. The Beechwood school remains closed, the pupils being very carefully transported by Mr. L. K. Fales. To open these schools a vote of the town at annual meeting is required. Hence article in warrant. In case there are pupils enough to warrant school being opened, the Superintendent of schools could do, by vote of the town.

INTERMEDIATE SCHOOLS.

These scholars have been taught the past year by these efficient teachers, Miss Eliza Crawford and Miss Helena B. Hanley. These rooms have not been so over-crowded, hence on the average, I believe their work better than last year, as the teachers have had more time for individual attention.

GRAMMAR SCHOOL.

The resignation of Leroy Kane was caused by his having a more remunerative offer from Higgins' Institute. After accepting the position he resigned, hence the election of a college graduate, Mr. Eben F. Davis. That Mr. Davis has been a success, I need not mention. Miss Rachael Beals, because of her success last year, was requested to continue as teacher of the Seventh Grade. Her work has been very satisfactory.

Miss Adele Morse, one of our very best teachers, because of sickness in her family that demanded her personal attention, requested a vacation of one term. The School Committee cheerfully complied to accommodate her, but reluctantly parted with

her valuable services. Miss Margaret Ruggles, a trained teacher, accepted the difficult proposition to teach Miss Morse's grade during the winter term. Here I must state, we need not go out of town to hire teachers, when such teachers can be employed from among our townspeople. Miss Ruggles has been a success. This is a short sentence, but means just as it reads.

HIGH SCHOOL.

At last the teaching force and curriculum of that school is satisfactory. Miss Annetta Goddard was succeeded at commencement of fall term by Miss Lenora Bessey of Waterville, and a graduate of Colby College. Miss Bessey brought to school, what has been so long required in an assistant, education, literary tastes and refinement.

Miss Emilie Philips has continued as teacher of music.

The teaching force today is the best since I have been superintendent. Thanks to careful consideration of your proficient School Committee.

JANITORS.

Mr. Geo. Allen of the Meadows School has been succeeded by Alton Morse. Wm. K. Starr continues janitor of Bailey and Wadsworth St. Schools. Mr. James L. McManus who for two years was janitor of the Mill River, Gleason St. Grammar and High Schools resigned last October. Mr. Ralph Reed was appointed to the position. During winter term because of burning soft coal Mr. Andrew Nelson has had charge of Grammar School building. The coal famine has affected Thomaston and the increased prices should not reflect on the public officials. We have done very well considering our janitors were compelled to learn how to operate with soft coal.

FIRE.

The fire at the Grammar schoolhouse last November was caused, in my opinion, by the flues conducting the heat to the upper room, not being properly lined and protected by incompatible material. Some of the joints may have been opened by settling of building, hence exposing woodwork. The insurance covered the damage, but we have been compelled to overdraw the Reform account to repair building, as Selectmen inform me the money received \$230.54 for damage would not be credited to repairing building but given to some other account. Amount received was \$230.54, and it cost \$265.50 to repair building.

The account has been overdrawn \$279.00, so it can be seen that the cause of this increased expenditure was not due to extravagance, but because of the fire. Had repair account been credited with insurance money received, the overdraft would be \$15.00.

Of repairs absolutely needed there are: ventilation for Bailey Intermediate. Painting interior and exterior of Meadow school, also better out buildings for last named school.

BOOKS.

Those introduced are Hydes Grammar, Baldwin's Physiology, Rodey's Geography, Alice in Wonderland, Stepping Stones to Literature, History of American literature, History of England. Relief Maps and colored Physical maps for Grammar school. Every school is equipped with music charts, maps, globes, and liberally supplied with books.

Books that should be replaced next year are: Arithmetics, more Rodey Geographies. Commercial Geographies for Grammar school.

I am a firm believer in school spirit, hence encouragement of High school to enter into competition with other High school teams. But such sport should not interfere with the school work.

A regulator must be placed on the graduating classes from High school. These graduations are expensive and the preparation consumes too much school time of teachers and pupils. The classes devote too much time and attention to earning money to defray expenses. I would not say there should be no ball and public graduation, but this vying to outdo the preceding class is wrong. It modifies those not able to pay as the more wealthy of the class, hence simplicity must be enforced, if these events are to be under management of school officials.

The average attendance in all the schools has been lower by vaccination. But on the whole the average attendance has been splendid. Truancy is not practised in town by those under 15 years of age, except in a few isolated cases.

Thanking the pupils, teachers, parents and town officials for their harmonious support, I respectfully submit this, my annual report.

In the name of the State of Maine, you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Thomaston, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Watts Hall in said town, on the 30th day of March, 1903, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:—

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To hear the report of the Selectmen, Assessors, Treasurer, Overseers of Poor, School Committee, Road Commissioner and all town officers.

Art. 4. To choose Selectmen, Assessors, Treasurer, Overseers of Poor, Superintending School Committee of one for three years, Superintendent of Schools, Road Commissioner, Auditor and all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of the Common Schools for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of the Free High School for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of the Poot for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will raise for repairing sidewalks, highways and bridges, breaking out roads and shoveling snow from sidewalks.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will raise for town expenses.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of Fire Companies.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will raise to pay Interest on Town Debt.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will raise to pay on principal of town debt.

Art. 13. To see if the town will raise money to pay water rent for the ensuing year, and if so, how much.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the P. Henry Tillson Post to defray expenses on Memorial day.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will raise for care of Cemetery for the ensuing year.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the purchase of text books.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will raise for repairs on School Buildings, supplies, incidental expenses, etc.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will raise to pay School Superintendent.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will raise to pay Superintending School Committee.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will raise for lighting streets the ensuing year.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to purchase hard pine lumber for sidewalks, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to discount on taxes paid before a certain date, when and how much, and charge interest after a certain date.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to purchase machinery for permanent road building, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to select a committee including the Selectmen, Superintendent of Schools, Road Commissioner, Treasurer and other citizens, to investigate Articles in this warrant calling for appropriations of money, and to report recommendations, at an adjourned town meeting.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to place steel ceiling in the east store in Watts Block and how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to choose a committee to destroy redeemed and cancelled bonds and coupons of the town, of the so called Railroad Aid Issue, now on deposit.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to build a road as provided by law for State Road, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to raise money for bills of contagious diseases, and if so, what sum they will raise for said purpose.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to repair and improve the vaults in the selectmen's office, for better protection against fire, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to build a reservoir on Beechwood Street near Willis's Corner, so called, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to have a survey made for a sewer on West Main Street from the terminus of the sewer at the Prison, or near that point, to a point near the residence of John Ackerman, and how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to accept a Quit Claim Deed from the heirs of Hezekiah Prince of all rights, titles and interest in and to the Old North Parish Meeting House in Thomaston (the Old Meeting House on the Hill,) and if any repairs are needed, what sum of money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to establish a street light on West Main Street near the residence of John Ackerman and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to establish street lights on Broadway at junction with New County Road, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Superintending School Committee to open the Oyster River and Beechwood Schools when said school districts register the legal number of pupils.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to pay Mrs. Almeda Willey for damages to cellar wall of her residence on Knox street, caused by water from said street, and what sum of money they will raise for said purpose.

Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Road Commissioner to lay a plank crossing on High street near the Old Church.

Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Road Commissioner to lay a plank crossing on Gleason Street across the foot of Penelope Street.

Art. 39. To see if the town will vote to complete the sidewalk on Dexter street and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to repair and cover the drain or gutter on north side of Plucker street, near residence of A. F. Burton and A. J. Young, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to repair Knox street sewer, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to keep the snow cleared off the sidewalk on Dexter street, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 43. To see if the town will vote to buy chemical fire extinguishers for school and other public buildings, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to repair the drain on east side of Beechwood street, north from a point where work was suspended last year, about 100 feet, and how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 45. To see what action, if any, the town will take in regard to abating the taxes of the Thomaston Face and Ornamental Brick Company.

Art. 46. To see if the town will vote to purchase a Street Sprinkler, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 47. To see if the town will vote to repair the drain or gutter on the west side of Beechwood street near residence of J. F. Stimpson, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 48. To see if the town will vote to build a hose tower for the Knox Hose Company, and how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 49. To see if the town will vote to repair Eureka Engine House, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 50. To see if the town will vote to accept the sewer on Dunn street built by T. W. Dunn.

Art. 51. To see if the town will vote to abate a portion of L. K. Fales tax for maintaining a public watering trough at his residence.

Art. 52. To see if the town will vote to raise William Whitney's house, located on Main street, near Mill River, up above the street level, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 53. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Road Commissioner to fill about 15 feet inside south end abutment of the lower toll bridge.

Art. 54. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Superintendent of Schools to purchase land for athletic field for High and Common Schools, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 55. To see if the town will vote to establish an electric light on Erin street near residence of John McManus, or Mrs. Jane Feyler, and if so, how much money they will raise for same.

Art. 56. To see if the town will vote to repair Whalen's bridge so called, and if so how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 57. To see if the town will vote to repair High street near Marsh Road by under drain or otherwise, and how much money they will raise for same.

Art. 58. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Road Commissioner to put a guard rail on sidewalk on Beechwood street near Overlock house.

Art. 59. To see if the town will vote to amend the existing, or adopt new articles of by-laws.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session at their office on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, the 26th, 27th and 28th days of March at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, for the purpose of correcting and revising the list of voters.
