#### STATE ROAD.

As in 1908, the selectmen employed Mr. E. A. Faunce to take charge of the building of the state road, and have had no regrets thus far for so doing. We completed 2800 feet, which, in addition to the 1300 hundred feet built in 1908, makes nearly one mile of continuous state road. We have not been looking for bouquets, but are pleased to hear that the state inspectors have reported to headquarters that Mechanic Falls led the state in building country state roads for length and goodness at the lowest cost.

# PIGEON HILL ROAD.

The new road on Pigeon Hill was built by the road commisioner, E. A. Faunce, under the supervision of the selectmen, for \$25.98 less than the appropriation. We believe that the

road is substantially built, and we have received commendations from many sources in praise of its construction. We are glad to note that a large majority of those who did not favor this expenditure, are commending it for the saving of the grades and distance by the old route.

#### LIBRARIAN'S REPORT.

The library has been very well patronized by the citizens during the year just closed. The scholars in our schools have

made much more use of the reference books than formerly and appreciate the help they are able to get from the encyclopædia and other books of reference with which the library is well supplied.

The number of borrowers added during the year is 64 making a total of 1498 as shown on the books, but owing to removals from town and deaths, the number is not as large probably as the figures indicate.

Have received \$10.90 in fines.

The average circulation is about the same.

In June the library had a donation of nearly fifty volumes from the late Mrs. Louisa F. Cobb through Mr. Hiram Bailey. A set of Bulwer's and Scott's novels were among the volumes presented. In November more books were added including a complete set of Shakespeare's works. The library contains about 2000 volumes. A number of books have been taken from the shelves as they were unfit for circulation. The usual number of state and government reports have been received. The Study Club deserve thanks for the beautiful bust of Longfellow presented by them to the library on Dec. 27 when a very pleasant evening was spent at the public library rooms. Mrs. Lizzie Jewett Butler made the presentation speech which was responded to by the trustees of the library. If any of the citizens have magazines that they would be willing to contribute, their kindness would be appreciated by the patrons of the library.

If the inhabitants of our town will study the proposition of taking care of the poor as diligently as the overseers have worked the past year to keep down the expenses in this department, and profit thereby it will benefit the town financially.

You will see in one case over \$400 00 was expended which would have been materially decreased had we had an alms-

house where such persons could be cared for.

We have had three deaths among our town's poor. Melintha Thayer, John F. Thomas and Rufus W. Herrick. Prior to their deaths they were the most costly of all the beneficiaries.

Commencing January 1, 1910, the insane paupers will be provided for by the State which will reduce the expense considerably as we have two persons which this law applies to, John B. Rand and Hattie Spiller, which will reduce our yearly expense about \$400 00.

We renew our recommendation of last report that some plan be adopted to reduce the cost of the poor and have placed an article in the warrant under which the town can act.

We lack the language to express ourselves relative to the cost of our infant industry, which expense is under the head of the contingent account. We cannot make it more impressive than the cold figures indicate, and we are not sure we can say anything that will assuage the pangs of the tax payer, who contributes to this enterprise by sermonizing at length on the subject.

Fortunately for the town, we had the excuse to make the repairs at this time, as it would have been but a few years before the shoe factory would been useless as a business proposition. The boilers had to be re-set, every window had to be taken out and the glass re-puttied. Six bends, which was nearly half of the entire flooring on the main building, was replaced with new timbers and flooring. The pipes were not properly drained when the factory was closed by the Chase-

Merritt Co., and the damage from that source alone was \$500.00 to \$600.00 additional, There was nothing done but what was called for by the contract between the town and the Sprague Shoe Co. and the insurance underwriters.

The prospects for a good business from now on are encouraging, and we trust the tax-payers will be amply repaid for the expenditures. The tax-payer who is assessed for \$1000 will be called upon to the extent of \$2.90, and we believe it is amply worth that amount.

# Superintendent's Report.

To the Town of Mechanic Falls:

Our school work for the past year has been, generally speaking, eminently satisfactory. This is not claiming that everything connected with the schools has been above all criticism. But on the whole, our schools have been doing excellent work, our teachers have been faithfully endeavoring to perform their full duties, and in most cases teachers and scholars have labored together harmoniously for the best interests of their respective schools. There seems to have been of late something of an awakening of ambition among the pupils of the higher grades, evidenced by the increased number of those who have determined to persevere, and, at least to finish the courses of the high school. However, there are still too many of our young people who fail, for one reason or another, to fully appreciate the manifold privileges provided, at little or no expense to them, for their education and preparation for the active duties and responsibilities, which are soon to be thrust upon them, as citizens of the state.

Our citizens are inclined to great liberality in expenditures for educational concerns, and the pity is, that so many of those who most need the privileges freely furnished them, should neglect to avail themselves of their opportunities, which once gone, never return. Too many leave school at the very first moment, when the compulsory laws of the state cease to compel their attendance. We believe that another year, at least, should be added to the age to which all scholars should be, by law, obliged to attend school. At present, many pupils leave school at the very age when they are prepared to receive the most advantage from attendance.

But this failure to accept and receive the benefits of training is not to be wholly charged to the thoughtlessness of the young. We must not expect mature ideas and actions from the immature and inexperienced. At this age we must depend upon the judicious influence of parents to hold and guide the young to and along the course of their true interests. The parent must govern and control until maturity of judgement renders the child capable of discerning and comprehending those things which make for his own highest welfare. The abounding vitality of youth, the lack of experience and the inability to properly appreciate the privileges and opportunities of the present in their relation to the duties and responsibilities of the future, doubtless explain in part the fact that so many of our young people fail to stand to and complete the full courses in our higher grades, and especially of the high school. Only proper restraint and insistence on the part of parents can correct this trouble.

Your school committee has during the year made necessary repairs on the several school houses, and has made some advantageous changes in the heating apparatus. The idea inaugurated last year, of requiring the janitors to be in attendance at their several places at an early hour in the morning, and to remain there during the noon hour, has been continued through the year to manifest advantage. Your committee has also added another route to those usually maintained for the transportation of scholars, so that, at the present time, nearly every scholar, living at any great distance from school is pro-

vided with the means of transportation.

Through the thoughtful generosity of the Women's Relief Corps Auxiliary to A. A. Dwinal Post, G. A. R., each of our five schools has received the gift of a beautiful flag, together with a standard to support the same, which were recently presented to the several schools, with appropriate ceremonies. Our citizens unitedly appreciate the efforts of this patriotic organization in fostering the sentiments of patriotism and loyalty to country amount the youth of our town.

Much labor has been entailed upon your committee this year in rearranging and formulating the new courses of study for the high school to make them conform to the requirements of the new state law. Our courses, as adopted by the committee, have received the approval of the state superintendent of schools, and there appears no reason why our high school will not hereafter receive \$500.00 each year, instead of \$250.00, as heretofore, from the state.

It will be necessary to make an additional appropriation for this year for the equipment of a laboratory for work in physics and chemistry. This is a requirement of the state in order to secure the additional assistance above mentioned. This will require an appropriation of probably \$500.00, but once made, this department will require only a small yearly expense for replenishing.

Many of our citizens have exhibited their interest in our school work by frequent visits to the various schools, and we confidently believe that all who have made personal observation of our schools and their work, will cheerfully testify to their efficiency.

#### HIGH SCHOOL.

Prof. Burton H. Whitman has continued as principal during the year, and to his zealous and conscientious labors the high standing of the school is largely due.

Miss Ethel Bradford has been assistant in this school. Her rare tact and fine scholarship, have contributed to the success of the school.

#### GRAMMAR SCHOOL, 7TH, 8TH AND 9TH GRADES.

Miss Lola D. Smith, as principal, and Miss Ethel Howe, as assistant, have labored most successfully for the interest of this school. This school is largely attended, and is by no means the most easily controlled of our schools, but notwithstanding this situation, this school has experienced a most prosperous and satisfactory year.

#### INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL, 5TH AND 6TH GRADES.

Miss Edith G. Cross has continued as principal, with Miss Evis Bridge as assistant. This school is in fine condition of discipline, and the work of the pupils has been satisfactory to a high degree. Both these teachers have labored zealously and faithfully for the good of the pupils under their instruction.

#### WATER STREET PRIMARY.

This school comprises the third and fourth grades, and has been under the care and instruction of Mrs. Sadie Bray. This school is in a most satisfactory condition, both as to discipline and efficiency of its work.

#### ELM STREET PRIMARY.

This school is made up of the first and second grades. Miss Inez Martin has been in charge of these grades during the year and has continued the good work of her previous service. By reason of the greatly increased numbers attending this school during the last term, your committee found it necessary to employ an assistant. Mrs. Orvie Jordan has occupied this position in a most acceptable mauner.

The problems of sanitation and ventilation, brought to your attention in previous reports, still remain unsolved, and should receive the thoughtful attention of the citizens. It would not require a large outlay to provide scientific sanitary condition, for our two houses, and it would seem that a due regard to the health and well-being of our scholars, should prompt the town to immediate action in this matter.

I have to thank the members of the school committee for their faithful and untiring labors in the interest of our schools during the year, and to be speak for them your grateful appreciation for their otherwise unrewarded sacrifices of time and effort.

# Warrant for Town Meeting.

To Fred F. McCann, a constable of the town of Mechanic Falls, in the County of Androscoggin and State of Maine.

#### GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Mechanic Falls, qualified as the constitution requires to assemble at Perkins Hall, in said town, on Monday, the fourteenth day of March, 1910, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- ART. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
  - ART. 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
  - ART. 3. To act on the report of the town officers.
- ART. 4. To choose a board of selectmen, assessors, overseers of the poor, a town treasurer, town agent, member of school committee, one trustee of public library, a truant officer, a road commissioner, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

- ART. 5. To choose a collector and fix his compensation.
- ART. 6. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for support of common schools for the ensuing year.
- ART. 7. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of a free high school for the ensuing year.
- ART. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to expend for a free high school for the ensuing year.
- ART. 9. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- ART. 10. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of the poor for the ensuing year.
- ART. 11. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the contingent fund for the ensuing year.
- ART. 12. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the town officers' salaries for the ensuing year.
  - ART. 13. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the sinking fund for the ensuing year.
  - ART. 14. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the payment of interest for the ensuing year.
  - ART. 15. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for abatements for the ensuing year.
  - ART. 16. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the observance of Memorial Day for the ensuing year.

- ART 17. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for lighting streets for the ensuing year.
- ART. 18. To see if the town will grant and raise the sum of \$1,680.00 for hydrant rental for the ensuing year.
- ART. 19. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of the fire department and for the purchase of hose for the ensuing year.
- ART. 20. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of the public library and the purchase of books for the ensuing year.
- ART. 21. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the purchase of text books, apparatus, furnishings and incidentals for schools for the ensuing year.
- ART. 22. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the repair of school houses for the ensuing year.
- ART. 23. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise to defray the the expense of graduating exercises of the high school for the ensuing year.
- ART. 24. To see if the town will vote to determine the time when the commitment of taxes shall be made and at what time taxes shall be payable and what interest shall be collected from and after such time.
- ART. 25. To see if the town will authorize the town treasurer, with the approval of the selectmen, to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges.

- ART. 26. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" upon the adoption of the provisions of chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1907, as amended by Chapter 69, Public Laws of 1909, relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to state aid for highways for the year 1910.
- ART. 27. To see if the town will raise and appropriate in addition to the amounts regularly raised and appropriated for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the sum of \$450.00, being the maximum amount which the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1907, as amended by Chapter 69, Public Laws of 1909.
- ART. 28. To see if the town will vote to provide for the construction of permanent sidewalks and if necessary raise money therefor.
- ART. 29. To see if the town will vote to take action to protect the trees and forests from moth pests and raise money therefor.
- ART. 30. To see if the town will vote to authorize its superintending school committee to join with any other town or towns for the purpose of employing a superintendent of schools in accordance with the provisions of Sections 40 to 45 inclusive of Chapter 15 of the Revised Statutes.
- ART. 31. To see if the town will vote to execute a quit claim deed in behalf of the town, releasing its right in and to real estate held by it by tax deed, upon payment of taxes, interest and costs.

- ART. 32. To see what action the town will take relative to replacing the bridge, built in 1877, over the Little Androscoggin from Elm to Main Streets, and raise money therefor.
- ART. 33. To see if the town will vote to arrange with the Electric Light Co. for a light on Pleasant Avenue near the residence of W. F. Hall, and if necessary raise money therefor.
- ART. 34. To see if the town will take any action relative to providing an alms house for the poor, and if necessary raise money therefor.
- ART. 35. To see what action the town will take relative to the collection of taxes due for the years 1899, 1900, 1901, 1902, 1903, 1904, 1905, 1906, 1907 and 1908; and also to act on the resignation of F. Edwin Dwinal, collector of taxes.
- ART. 36. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for collector's commissions for the ensuing year.
- ART. 37. To see if the town will grant and raise the sum of \$519.28 to liquidate the deficiency in the poor department; the sum of \$234.36 to liquidate the deficiency in the highway department; the sum of \$92.85 to liquidate the deficiency in the high school department; the sum of \$79.29 to liquidate the deficiency in the text book account; the sum of \$953.18 to liquidate the deficiency in the contingent account; the sum of \$60.65 to liquidate the deficiency in the interest account; the sum of \$250.84 to liquidate the deficiency in the brown tail moth account.
- ART. 38. To see if the town will instruct the selectmen to build a sewer from a point on Water Street to connect with Main Street sewer, thence up Pleasant Street as by plan adopted by town, and if necessary raise money therefor.

ART. 39. To see if the town will accept a list of jurors as prepared by the selectmen.

ART. 40. To see if the town will instruct the selectmen to take action as provided by Chapter 29 Section 26 of the Revised Statutes.

ART. 41. To see if the town will instruct the school committee to take action as provided in Chapter 73 Public Laws of 1909 relative to the appointment of a school physician and other provisions as provided in said chapter.

Hereof fail not, and have you there this warrant with your doings thereon.

The selectmen will be in session at the selectmen's office on the 14th day of March at eight o'clock in the forenoon for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
