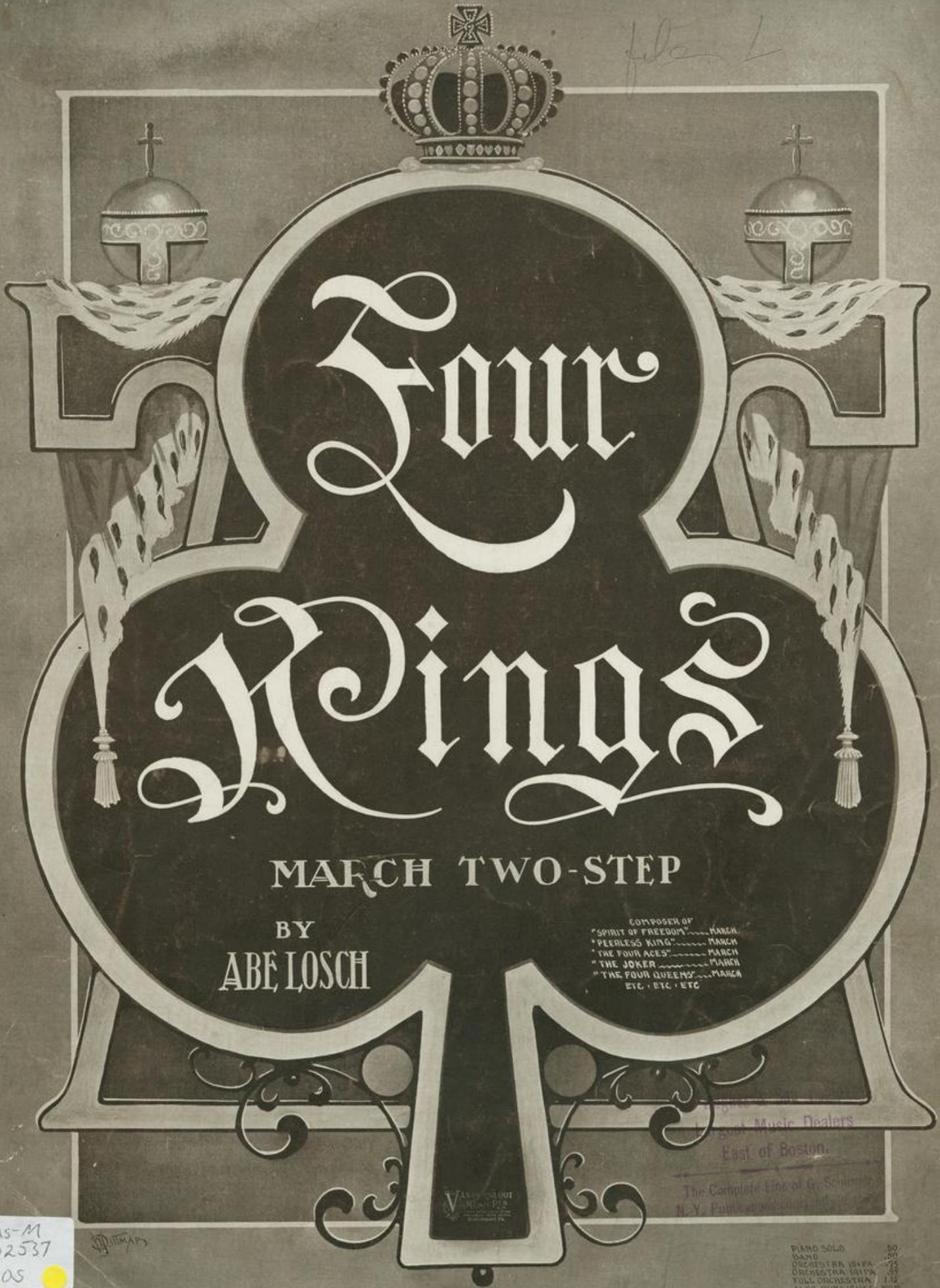

TRIO.
