[The musical treatment of these Songs has been supplied by twelve different musicians. No other song writer in America has collaborated with so many composers, or worked more assiduously to advance the interests of American popular music. In addition to individual songs, Mr. Pidgin has written the librettos for one grand opera, four cantatas, nine comic operas, and nine musical comedies, representing more than 400 songs. His works already presented to the public include: Mercedes (grand opera), "Cambyses" (cantata), "U. S. S. Pinback," "The Electrical Doll," "The Electric Spark," and "The Courtin'" (comic operas), "The Adventure Club" and "Sunflowers and Lilies" (quartette operas), "Sancho-Pedro" (burlesque opera), and "Lucifer Matches," "The American Girl," "Tactics," "Wanted—a Partner," "Peck's Bad Boy" (the Geo. W. Peck authorized version), and "Miss Fitz," musical comedies, besides five acting plays not containing music.]

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
