## Report of the Town Council Chairman

Over the last year the Windham Town Council worked on many issues, not only taking care of the routine business of keeping the town running – along with the efforts of the town manager and town employees – but planning for the town's future. The 21<sup>st</sup> Century Downtown plan, the first phase of development for Lippman Park, an economic development strategic plan, the establishment of development impact fees to help pay for capital facilities, and the process of writing a new comprehensive plan were all matters of discussion, and action, by the Council in 2013.

Along with the routine, approving licenses and permits, referring proposals for rezoning to the planning board, keeping the Land Use Ordinance Committee and other committees active and engaged, replacing equipment and improving facilities, the Council spent time and effort on the town's natural and community resources. A plan for an initial phase of harvesting at the Lowell Preserve was considered and approved – later, the Council would review the work that was done due to some concerns about whether it was what people expected and whether it should continue.

The Council received and approved grant applications for watershed protection funds. Funds granted to the Little Sebago Lake Association, Collins Pond Improvement Association, and Windham Land Trust will help improve and maintain water quality in our town's lakes, streams, and ponds. The very successful Windham Community Garden effort asked for and was granted room for expansion. The Council restarted discussions about the effect of development on ground water and how to safeguard that resource while still trying to achieve the town's community and economic development goals. Though a sewer project was turned down by the voters in 2012, the issues have not gone away. The town also worked with the US Environmental Protection Agency and Maine Department of Environmental Project to get the derelict mill in South Windham on the national priority list for Superfund in hopes of eventually getting the site cleaned up and redeveloped.

The economic development strategic plan, developed with the assistance of the Windham Economic Development Corporation, led to the establishment of a task force. This task force's job was to determine how best to structure the town's economic development program to achieve the goals of the strategic plan. The task force recommended and, at the end of the year, we were working on implementing a transition of the town's economic development office to the WEDC as a way of strengthening the town's involvement in the corporation and economic development, and the corporation's voice for economic and business development in the town.

The Council started off its new term in late 2012 by orienting new members and refreshing continuing members on matters of budget, organization, and all the kinds of legal and technical issues the Council has to contend with to do its work. Early in the year we were also presented with potential financial challenges because of the state's budget problems. Because of revenue shortfalls at the state level we had to consider how to deal with the possible loss of revenue sharing and other funds from the state. The Council, its finance committee, the town manager and staff worked together to come up with strategies for dealing with the uncertainty while the state's budget process played out. The outcome was not nearly as challenging as it appeared at first, but it was important that we put together a plan just in case.

## Town Manager's Annual Report

Change is all around us. Change happens around us. Change happens to us. What can we do, and what do we do, to affect those changes in a positive way and help ensure the outcomes we want? The first, and most important, thing to do is get involved. I can hear you now, "What? You want me to sign up for a committee? Or to run for Council?" Well, if those are ways of getting involved that suit you, sure. But not all "getting involved" means signing up for something. Watch or attend meetings, get familiar with the issues, contact Council members – or me – and let us know your thoughts, concerns, and ideas. Just getting involved doesn't guarantee a particular outcome, but NOT getting involved guarantees your perspective isn't considered.

2013 brought more efforts to have the town, the community, shape the change that will happen in it, and to it, starting with the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Downtown Plan. This plan, focused on the North Windham commercial district and the areas around it, envisions an evolving place where people go to access businesses, services, and entertainment, community spaces and amenities that make Windham's "downtown" an increasingly vibrant and enjoyable place to be. Through its economic development arm, the Windham Economic Development Corporation, the town has also been working on a plan to express and achieve its goals for economic growth and increased prosperity. The years following the Great Recession have been hard on many, but the economy is gradually improving and Windham should be prepared to take advantage of the opportunities.

Both the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Downtown Plan and the economic development strategic plan will be incorporated into the town's new comprehensive plan, something we will be working on for the next two to three years. The last comprehensive plan was adopted in 2003 and needs to be updated to reflect the ongoing changes in Windham's population and development, to express a vision for the community's next 10 to 20 years and – most importantly – outline a plan for realizing that vision.

During 2013 we said goodbye to two members of the town's management team; Inese Gruber, director of the Windham Public Library, announced her plans to retire in the spring. And Brooks More, planning director, took a position with Avesta Housing to pursue other career and professional goals. We thank them both for their service to the community and wish them well. And we welcomed a new director for the library, Jennifer Alvino, and we're well into the process of selecting a new planning director at year's end. Changes, like time, march on.

I've said it before, but I'll say it again: Windham is a great town. It is the Lakes Region's marketplace, an integral part of Greater Portland, and it will continue to be a great place to live, work, raise a family, and have a business. In the years (decades? centuries?) ahead the trees and fields will still be green, the water clear, and the people engaged, friendly, and hard-working. And we're all going to work together to make it happen so that, in the years to come, others will look back and say we did.

# Superintendent of RSU#14

2013-2014 School Year

Dear Windham Citizens,

We've had another amazing school year due to our dedicated students, employees and community members. Our facilities continue to be a priority and in the past year, the School Board and Middle Schools Facilities Advisory Committee has been charged to investigate and consider additions and/or renovations to the current Middle Schools that would support high-performing middle-level educational programming in our two school communities. For more information, go to [www.rsu14.org](http://www.rsu14.org) and view our progress to date by reading the minutes of our meetings and preview video tapes of sessions held.

We continue to be excited with Windham High School Students offered an early jump on college. High school juniors and seniors have the opportunity to challenge themselves with college courses through the University of Southern Maine, Saint Joseph's College and Southern Maine Community College, and to take online courses through the University of Maine in Orono. Upon successful completion of a course, students receive credit that may be transferred to many colleges after graduation as well as being added to their Windham High School transcripts. Depending on the college, courses cost up to \$150, plus fees and textbooks. Students who receive free or reduced lunch are eligible for a grant that will reimburse all fees along with textbook costs and even gas money.

As a school community, "Success for All" is surely catching on and it is my pleasure to share the following:

- Deb Luce, National Teacher of the Year Award, Smart/Maher National Citizenship Education
- Rick Nickerson, one of two quarterfinalists nationally for the first ever Music Educator award presented by the recording Academy and Grammy Foundation.
- WHS Varsity Girls Soccer Team was selected as Southern Maine Activities Association Champions and Class A State Champions.
- Deb Lebel, Girls Varsity Soccer coach was named Maine "Large School" Coach of the year for the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. She was also in *Sports Illustrated* "Faces in the Crowd" for leaving the hospital a day after giving birth to her second child and went directly to a Western Maine regional match, where she led the Eagles to a 4--3 double-overtime win over Thornton Academy. Three days later Windham won the Class A title 3--0 over Bangor for the program's first championship in 19 years.
- Windham High School – Top 2000 high schools in America in 2013!
- Both Anthony Gugliuzza from WMS and Loudon Greene from JSMS won the Maine State Stock Market Game, InvestWrite.
- Kelli Deveaux is named 2014 Assistant High School Principal of the Year by the Maine Principals' Association.
- Soccer Coach Wally LeBlanc wins Outstanding Sportsmanship Award
- Ian Mills is a commended student in the top 5% in PSAT from the National Merit Scholarship Program.

- Adult Education completion rates continue to increase with over 300 different courses and nearly 2,400 annually enrolled.
- American Chemical Society Chemistry Olympiad, MS Robotics team, Maine Drama Festival, American Mathematics competition.
- RSU 14 has received Blue Apple awards from the National Health Education Association, Alliance for a Healthier Generation (Health, Phys Ed and Wellness programs recognized nationally).

Highlights over the past year included:

- College Transitions/Workforce Education Coordinator, Steve McFarland and ESOL Teacher Mae Morris received awards at the Maine Adult Education Association conference in June; Steve for ‘Special Recognition/ Distinguished Service’ and Mae for ‘Teacher of the Year’.
- Career Pathways Coordinator, Tina Christophersen was named the Sebago Lakes Region Chamber of Commerce ‘Volunteer of the Year’
- Steve McFarland began serving on the local Windham Economic Development Council Board and organized a successful business summit to bring education and businesses together for meaningful dialogue.
- Director, Tom Nash began his term in July as the President-Elect of the national Commission on Adult Basic Education (COABE) professional organization.
- Grant Funding increased by \$11000 to develop and deliver a ‘New Cohort Model College Transitions Program’ in partnership with Gray-New Gloucester Adult Education

# Report of the Assessor

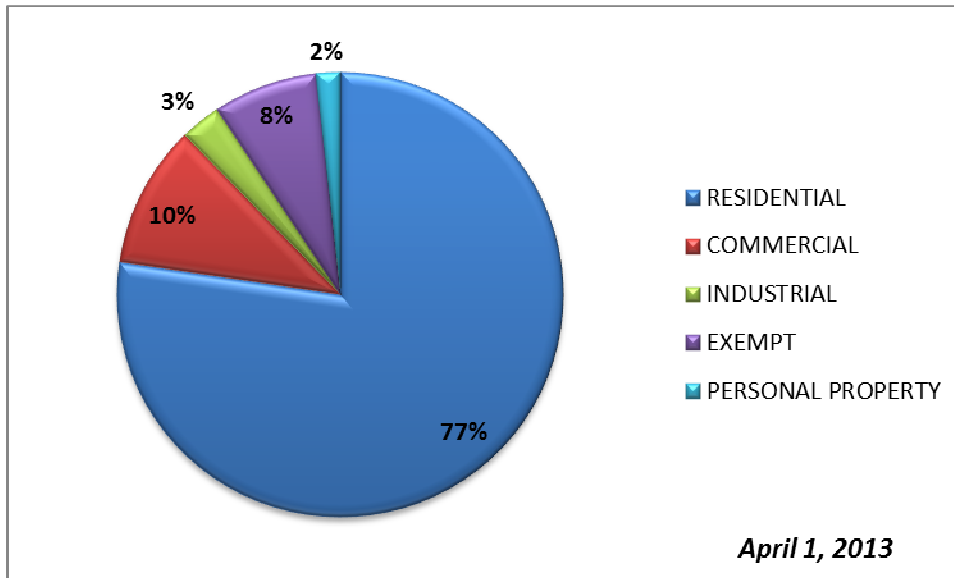

Properties as of April 1, 2013, were classified as follows:

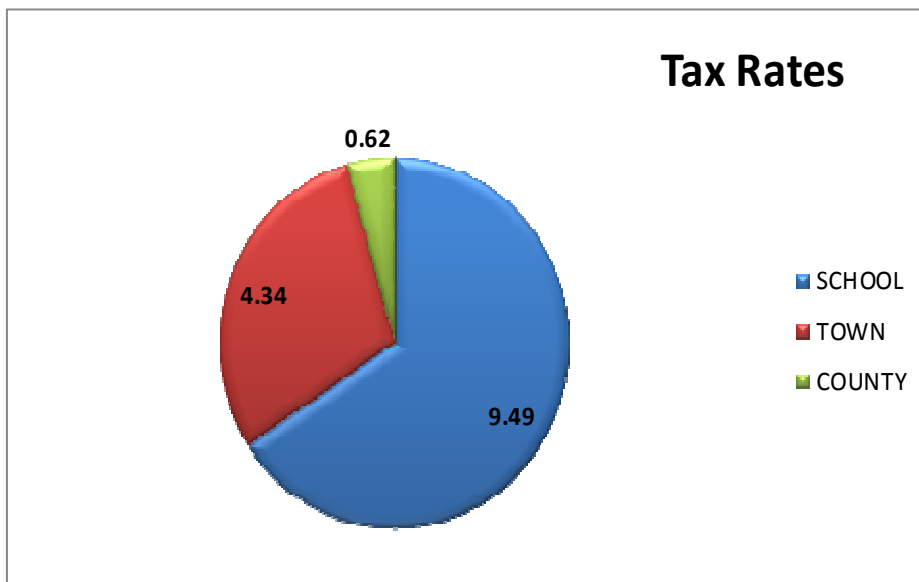

## Code Enforcement

**The Code Enforcement Office** offers a variety of services to residents and property owners. In addition to issuing building, internal and external plumbing, and electrical permits; the Office's responsibilities include the adherence and enforcement of land use and shoreland zoning, gravel pit regulation, junkyard regulation, flood plain regulation, rules in regard to the conversion of seasonal dwellings in shoreland areas, and the standards of the Street Naming and Addressing Ordinance, Wireless Telecommunications Tower Ordinance, Surface Water Protection Ordinance as well as the Mass Gathering Ordinance. Windham has 14 lakes and ponds covering 32,180 acres of area and 15 rivers, streams and brooks, all of which are in Shoreland Zoning.

Code Enforcement was responsible for processing 947 permits in 2012 resulting in revenue of \$141,885.85 and in 2013 was also responsible for processing 1107 permits, resulting in revenue of \$143,122.40. This includes for permits: Building, Junkyards, Plumbing, Shoreland Review, Soil and Erosion, Use, Wastewater, Driveway and Street Opening. \*\*\* New

**Stormwater Education** was provided by Cumberland County Soil & Water Conservation District and Portland Water District to 304 students at **Windham High School and Windham Middle School**. The total number of student contact hours equates to 1,643 hours.

Lesson topics included a facilitated “Ecocentricity” event where high school students taught lessons to middle school students which included conservation-based lessons about geology, water, soil, atmosphere, ecology, and wildlife; water quality discussion and macro invertebrate sampling and identification (bio assessment). Staff provided input about water quality during high school students’ presentation about a wetland ecosystem; various lessons included information about nonpoint source pollution, human impact, watershed characteristics, stormwater, low impact development, and behavior change.

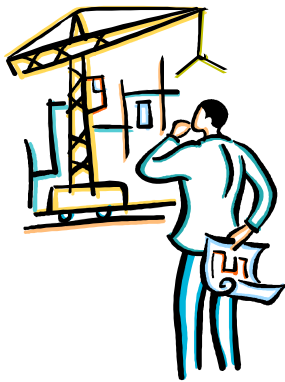
### **Yardscaping Healthy Lawn Care**

The Cumberland County Soil & Water Conservation District worked with Blue Seal and Aubuchon Hardware to provide healthy lawn care information to their customers. The District also staffed a healthy lawn care display at Blue Seal’s spring open house on May 6<sup>th</sup>.

## Economic Development

The past year has seen the town re-visioning our Economic Development Program. The Windham Economic Development Corporation has spearheaded the development of the Town of Windham Economic Development Strategic Plan. After meeting with various groups and the Town Council, and taking those results to the public for more discussion and refinement, the plan was completed and the Town Council approved the adoption of this economic blueprint for Windham. The Economic Development Strategic Plan, which will be incorporated into the comprehensive planning efforts underway by the Town's Planning Office, will be the basis for future investments and programing supporting economic development in town.

One of the realized outcomes of the Strategic Planning process was the realignment of the Economic Development functions of the Town with the Windham Economic Development Corporation taking the lead role in providing support to new and existing businesses and carrying out the daily functions of the Economic Development Department. The Town's Director of Economic Development now reports directly to the Board of Directors of the WEDC as its Executive Director. The Town of Windham has maintained the funding to the Corporation that has been provided to the Economic Development Department in previous years and the Town Council receives regular updates from its Council representatives to the WEDC about ongoing activities and programing.

The WEDC actively works to support the many entrepreneurs, business owners and workers throughout Windham. The Town's business directory, [www.WindhamMarketplace.com](http://www.WindhamMarketplace.com), where over 800 Windham businesses are listed, continues to be viewed regularly by people all over the United States, especially New England, as well as many area residents looking for goods and services our businesses supply. We are reaching out to retailers and developers who do not have a presence in Windham to let them know how good of a market we are. We have maintained our Holiday flag program along our roadways, and we have advertised the Windham Marketplace both regionally and locally in print and on TV. We have sponsored the Rotary's Ice Fishing Derby as well as other local events, including the Sebago Lakes Region Job Fair held at the Windham High School.

The Windham Economic Development Corporation looks forward to its expanded role in supporting the community by providing assistance to both the Town and businesses located or looking to locate in Windham.

# Windham Fire-Rescue Department

**“The mission of the Windham Fire - Rescue Department is to assist the citizens and visitors of our community with emergencies that they are unable to handle themselves”.** This mission to our members means the personnel and the department will respond to many situations to provide assistance or technical advice.

The Windham Fire - Rescue Department has four locations that we provide response from. These locations are: District 1 [South Windham (14 members)], District 2 [North Windham (20 Members)], District 3 [East Windham (11 Members), and District 4 [Windham Center (10 Members)]. Other groups that operate under the Windham Fire-Rescue Department are the Rescue Company and the Windham Fire Police Company.

Windham Fire-Rescue provided service to the community for another year. This past year, 2013, saw a decrease in the number of requests for service. The decrease over the previous year was 107. In reviewing the statistics, one can see that the largest percentages of calls were related to medical emergencies. Windham Fire-Rescue is in line with the national average of 65% to 75% of the total volume of calls being medically related.

The 65-75 members of the department participate in training on most Wednesday nights. The department also has other dates where we perform special training topics or events. The amount of documented training time for the year 2013 was 6,765 hours. The programs are diverse ranging from becoming a basic firefighter, programs for beginners, officer development programs, medical emergency programs, advanced firefighting skills, vehicle extrication and advanced and specialty programs. These training topics provide a wealth of experience and knowledge to handle the communities' emergencies.

The department is currently using three pick-up trucks in responses and activities. These three vehicles are going to be utilized in responding to emergency medical calls in the North Windham, South Windham, and East Windham areas. The idea is to reduce the road mileage and fuel consumption of the larger vehicles with the smaller pickups. In addition it is nice to have the four-wheel drives for the winter season. We have added a vehicle that was part of the Windham Police Department. We are planning to put the vehicle into service for use by the Windham Fire Police. This vehicle would carry barricades, safety cones, spare batteries for portable radios, and other equipment related to traffic control issues. We anticipate this vehicle being ready in the latter part of 2014.

During the month of June 2013 our replacement breathing apparatus were delivered. Personnel were trained and the new units were put into service. The newer airpicks have replaced units that ranged from 20 to 25 years of age. The 48 airpicks came at a cost of approximately \$200,000 and are anticipated to last 20-25 years. We did not purchase new bottles as we have maintained a rotation of replacement of the bottles used. In June the department also replaced our vehicle extrication equipment for about \$35,000. Our previous equipment came to us in the latter part of the 1970's and was piece meal updated into the 1990's.

If you have questions, concerns, or comments, please feel free to come by one of the stations and talk with us. If you would like a tour of our facilities we would be glad to arrange one and can do by calling and talking with Administrative Assistant Nancy Graves. We look forward to another challenging year of serving the community and visitors of Windham.

This year has started with many grass and woods fires. Open burning requires a permit and those may be obtained on line by checking the website at [www.burningpermit.com](http://www.burningpermit.com). We as a department and community will face new challenges the passage of Maine's new open fireworks legislation. Please be extra careful this year with your fire related activities. You are responsible for your fire related activities.

Throughout 2013, Windham Public Library continued to serve the Windham community by providing valuable space to meet, resources for information and entertainment, and ongoing programs. The library offers several spaces for quiet study and public forums that are heavily used each month. We offer many types of materials to circulate and view, such as books, magazines, audiobooks, eBooks, DVDs, music, daily newspapers and access to computers and the internet. **So what's new?** As our mission states, we strive to provide up-to-date access to all types of information in a variety of formats. In order to accomplish this in 2013, we added new materials and informational resources to the collection and assisted the community to learn to use new technological devices through one-on-one trainings. The library migrated to a new website that provides more information and easier access to it. New furniture was added to create more functional and welcoming spaces in the teen area, public computer area and study spaces. We added a new Adult Graphic Novel collection and continue to look for titles to build up this new section. In the Children's Room, a new computer literacy station was added to increase access to technology for young children ages 2-8.

**Staffing Changes**— We said goodbye to two longtime staff members, our Library Director, Inese Gruber and Library Aide, Mary Drew both retired in 2013 after lengthy careers at the library. Their time and hard work has impacted library services for many years and their service to the community is greatly appreciated. With the retirement of Inese, the search began for a new Library Director. I am honored to have been chosen to lead the library forward and have enjoyed my first few months in Windham. I look forward to many years of successful partnerships in the community and working with a wonderful group of colleagues.

**Community collaborations**—Library staff members collaborated with a number of organizations in 2013. We presented a program on foreign policy with the Raymond Village Library called “The World In Your Library”. We were one of six libraries statewide to offer this program which was made possible by the Maine Humanities Council. Library staff members coordinated with Steven Nadeau and his Scout troop who built a sheltered picnic area for the library as part of his Eagle Scout requirements. Library patrons enjoy the picnic area in the warmer months. Finally, along with ongoing outreach to local senior housing facilities, schools and daycares, the library participated in Literacy for ME meetings and the Maine Historical Society/Maine Humanities Council Local and Legendary: Maine in the Civil War grant. This grant was awarded to the towns of Gorham and Windham and members of both communities participate in programming to shed light on Maine’s history.

In May, a courtesy notice is sent to homeowners who have a balance due. At the end of June, a Tax Receivable Summary is prepared for the auditor stating balances due on all taxes. Eight months from the date of tax commitment, if any tax remains unpaid, the lien process begins.

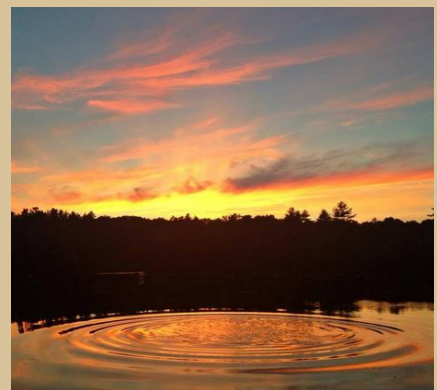


## Windham Parks and Recreation Department

In the spring of 2013 the Town Council proceeded with the development of the Donnabeth Lippman Park with selection of Milone & MacBroom for design and engineering services. The Windham Planning Board accepted the first phase of the park development project on September 13<sup>th</sup> 2013. Drew Corporation was chosen as the contractor to improve the access road and construct a parking area and an open field area in fall of 2013. Construction will continue in spring of 2014. Our next phase of the park project will include installing board walks, new bridges and playground components making the Donnabeth Lippman Park a more community friendly park. Several Eagle Scout projects are also being planned at the park for 2014. Thank you to Mr. Lippman for donating a new park entrance sign for the park in memory of his wife Donnabeth Lippman.



Dundee Park had several new additions in 2013. A new addition and renovations to the bathhouse were done in spring which included a handicapped accessible bathroom, office space and a new configuration of the existing building. A handicapped ramp was also constructed as part of the building project for the park. Many residents have enjoyed the new ramp and bathhouse additions making it more user friendly for families. Many Thanks to Mona Dodd and Ron Faucher, our park managers and all the Dundee Park staff for a successful season. We ended the season with 14,546 visits at Dundee Park and sold 426 passes. We had 8% of our users from groups and 57.2% of our visitors had season passes.



Our summer day camp program was very successful in 2013 with 194 children enjoying one of our three day camps run by the Department. Many thanks to the Windham High School and Middle School's staff that assisted us in making this a great program for so many Windham children. We offer a wide variety of activities at camp including field trips, arts and craft activities, games, special themed events and camp wide activities for all to enjoy and to make it a positive and active summer for all our children at camp.

Our ski program at Shawnee Peak went extremely well with 40 participants in our Friday evening program and 15 participants in our Wednesday afterschool program. Our Friday evening program is again gaining in popularity and continues to be staffed by two dedicated volunteers Steve Walker and Bill Tracy. Many thanks to them for their continued support of our ski program for youth of the community. Also many thanks to Rodney Waterhouse of Vacation Tours for his continued service to our Friday evening ski program.

Our seniors had many choices for day trips during the year. We had trips to see the "Sound of Music" play at Hackmatack Playhouse to a lighthouse cruise to seeing the "Elephants of Hope" Maine. We had over 280 seniors participate in our trips through out the year. Many thanks to Laura Rhodes, one of our drivers, who has volunteered over 10 years with the Parks and Recreation Department.

We encourage Windham residents and their families to enjoy one of our programs mentioned above or one of the many other program offering. # Windham Planning Department

The Windham Planning Department is dedicated to encourage, support and enable Windham's citizens, elected leaders, and officials to:

- Realize their stated inspirations, visions, and goals through the creation and implementation of the community's plans and policies.
- Achieve the community's vision through the refinement of policies, the facilitation of projects, and the employment of a fair and predictable development review process.
- Provide input and feedback to continuously help define the community's vision, goals, and policies through diverse methods at all stages of planning.

To accomplish this, planning staff work on both short and long range projects. Short range projects involve providing staff support to the Planning Board in the review of development proposals. Long range projects involve the preparation of comprehensive plans, zoning ordinance amendments and issue-specific reports and studies.

## **Department Structure**

The Department has undergone a transition in staffing, starting with the departure of Planning Director Brooks More in September 2013, who moved on after six and a half years as Director. The Department remained staffed by Assistant Planner Ben Smith and Administrative Assistant Lisa Fisher. The Planning Director is responsible for overall management of the department and long range planning projects. Long range projects, which are undertaken as directed by the Town Council and Town Manager, include a range of topics that deal with land development and transportation. Ben remained lead staff member for short range planning issues. The majority of this work involves coordinating Town staff's review of development proposals. These reviews are provided as recommendations to assist the Planning Board in its decision making on Subdivision and Site Plan applications. For those not familiar with these terms, subdivision applications involve the division of land into multiple parcels, while site plan applications are typically for the construction of commercial or industrial buildings on a single parcel. Lisa provides assistance to the public and support on development review and research projects.

## **Short Range Planning Activities**

During the 2013 calendar year, the planning department accepted six (6) subdivision applications, seven (7) site plan applications, eight (8) ordinance amendments, and one (1) contract zone amendment. This represented an increase over application levels in 2012.

The Planning Board issued approvals for seven (7) site plan applications, seven (7) subdivision applications, five (5) ordinance amendments, and one (1) contract zone amendment during 2013.

In addition to assisting applicants and the Planning Board with development review, ordinance amendments and rezoning requests, staff provided advisory and clerical support to oversight of performance guarantees and development escrow accounts for projects under construction.

## Long Range Planning Activities

In 2013, the department worked on the long-range planning projects listed below. Additional information on these projects can be found on the department's webpage at [www.windhammaine.us](http://www.windhammaine.us).

- Land Use Ordinance Committee
  - ◇ Issues Addressed: Commercial Real Estate Signs; Maximum Private Road Slopes; Impound Lots and Heavy Truck Repair; Commercial 1 District Sidewalk Impact Fee; Personal Campground Amendments.
- North Route 302 Transportation Plan (White's Bridge Rd. to Mineral Springs Rd.)
  - ◇ The Town Council adopted a plan to fund the alignment of Whites Bridge Road and Anglers Road which includes impact fees new development and use of tax increment financing (TIF) funds.
- 21<sup>st</sup> Century Downtown Plan – Adopted January 22, 2013
  - ◇ Comprehensive effort to build upon the sense of place in the North Windham commercial district through transportation improvements and land use planning tools.
  - ◇ This plan has already proved useful in the development review process.
- Windham Energy Committee
  - ◇ Department Staff is working with the Energy Committee to make energy efficiency improvements to Town facilities.
  - ◇ Worked with Town Staff and Revision Energy for installation of solar panels on the East Windham Fire Station.
  - ◇ The Town Council adopted a Streetlight Policy in June 2013 based on this group's inventory work and recommendations.
- Windham Active Lifestyles Coalition (WALC).
  - ◇ This group was instrumental in making sure that shoulders were included on a Windham Center Road repaving project, and worked with staff on exploring the possibility of sidewalks on Gray Road (Route 202) between the school campus and the Gray Road/Windham Center Road intersection.
- Pleasant River Watershed Management Plan
  - ◇ This cooperative effort between Gray and Windham, coordinated by the Cumberland Soil & Water Conservation District, identified point source locations for run-off or other pollutants into the Pleasant River, such as road crossings or agricultural activities, and directed grant funding to address many of them.
- Portland Area Comprehensive Transportation System (PACTS) Planning Committee
  - ◇ Federally mandated transportation planning and funding agency for the region.

## Looking Ahead

Ben Smith was promoted to Planning Director in January 2014, and Amanda Lessard started as Planner in April. The Planning Department will continue working to improve the development review process and assist the Land Use Ordinance Committee. In addition, staff hopes to commence a number of projects that will help the community as it prepares for the future. Some of these projects include:

- **Comprehensive Plan.** The Town Council updated the charge for the Comprehensive Plan Review Team in March 2014, as the first step in the update of the Town's 2003 Comprehensive Plan.
- **21<sup>st</sup> Century Downtown Plan.** Implementation of this plan will occur through the Land Use Ordinance Committee and WALC.
- Staff will serve as resources for the Wastewater Planning Committee as they explore potential wastewater solutions for North Windham, and development of Donnabeth Lippman Park as a vibrant, active community park.

In addition, the 118 Simple Assaults that were reported, 91 of those Assault cases were cleared which resulted in a clearance rate of 77 %

## OTHER ACTIVITIES

### Traffic

Officers conducted 4375 traffic stops which resulted with 83 Seat Belt citations, 295 Speeding citations, 71 OUI Arrests and 31 Operating after Suspension citations. The remaining 3,895 stops were issued either a citation or warning for other traffic violations.

### Accidents

There were a total of 520 reportable traffic accidents investigated: 395 were property damage, 125 involved injuries and 0 were fatal.

On January 24, 2013 one sworn officer resigned. The police department is approved for 26 sworn staff with one vacancy. In the Fall of we processed three Police Officer candidates.

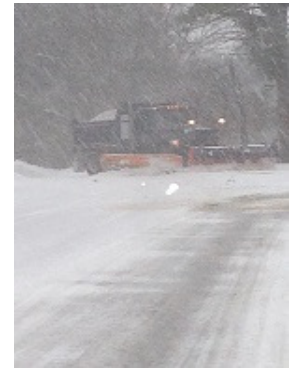

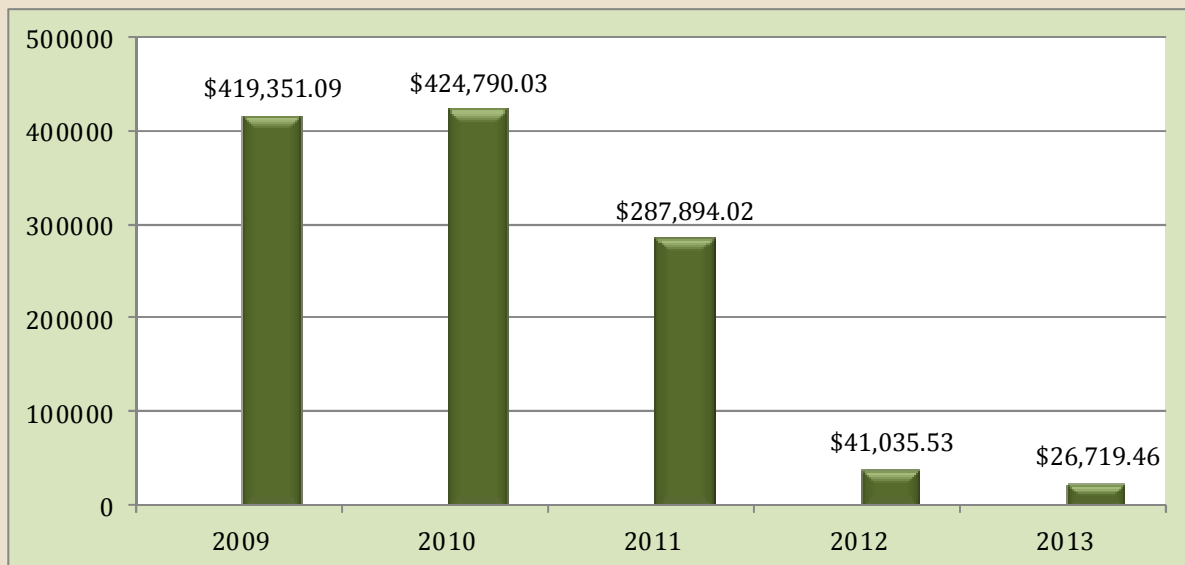
# Social Services

## General Assistance

The Town of Windham's General Assistance Program (G.A.) is a state mandated, municipally administered financial assistance program. It was designed to be a program of "last resort" for residents who are unable to provide for their basic needs. The G.A. office is located in The Family Resource Center at 377 Gray Road. It is overseen by the Assistant Town Manager/H.R. Director and is staffed by René Daniel, G.A. Administrator.

Assistance is available for basic necessities as defined by local ordinance and state statutes. Eligible applicants are assisted through payments made to specific vendors. Administrative costs of the program are paid for through tax dollars. The state reimburses the Town for 50% of the cost of general assistance benefits paid for residents. In 2013, \$26,713.46 was issued to eligible recipients prior to reimbursement. This number reflects a 35% decrease in overall general assistance costs from 2012. The decrease is attributed to diligent oversight of the program: Administration by a certified General Assistance Administrator, strict adherence to the ordinance, better education regarding the program, and furnishing food/non-food assistance through the Windham Food Pantry.

### General Assistance Expenditures 2009 - 2013



Under G.A., applicants must provide verification of their income and expenses, residence, and if unable to work, medical documentation substantiating their work limitations. Applicants are required to seek work if they are physically able and/or to apply for assistance through other state and federal programs that may be available to them. A determination of eligibility is made for a thirty-day period based on anticipated earnings. Individuals and families that do not qualify for financial assistance are referred to local resources appropriate to their need(s).

**Food Pantry/Clothes Closet**

The Food Pantry and its companion Clothes Closet were established in response to a growing need for assistance in the community. Food insecurity is a real and urgent issue and it is being addressed at the Food Pantry with confidentiality and compassion through private appointments with the Social Services Assistant, Colette Gagnon.

Clients are served once a month and receive fresh milk, eggs, bread, and vegetables/fruit (when available) in addition to meat and staple items. Families with children are provided with "extras" during school vacations and the summer break. In 2013, the Pantry served 2,194 families made up of 3,890 adults and 1,083 children for a total of 4,973 people.

In addition to the \$20,000 funding provided through the town's budget process, the Food Pantry received U.S.D.A. surplus and "rescued" food from Wayside Food Rescue and has developed a relationship with The Good Shepherd Food-Bank. The Food Pantry relies on, and is very fortunate to have, generous individual and corporate donations as well as community participation during food drives. In 2013, local businesses, churches, service groups, grocery stores, schools and individuals have all been very generous and provided the Food Pantry with \$28,316.49 in cash donations. The Town would like to thank these businesses, organizations, churches, and volunteers that assist those in need throughout the year.

The Food Pantry and the Clothes Closet are open Monday - Thursday 8am - 4pm. Food Pantry clients must provide proof of residency - i.e. utility bill or lease. There is no residency requirement for items needed from the Clothes Closet. Call 892-1931 to schedule an appointment.

On December 7, we held our annual Rabies Clinic for Windham residents and surrounding towns. We had about 100 shots given that day by the Lake Region Animal Hospital. We appreciate Dr. Griffin offering to do this for us year after year.

Lastly, I would like to thank all the wonderful people I work with who help me with running elections. They are a dedicated group and work very well together to get the job done. Judy Vance and Rita Bernier are two very devoted and experienced Deputy Clerks and the town and I are very fortunate to have them. Together we have 64 years of experience in this office, which I think is quite an accomplishment! It is has been my pleasure to serve you as your elected Clerk since 2001.

Dear Friend,

I hope this letter finds you and your family well. It is an honor to represent you in Congress and a pleasure to update you on the work I am doing in Maine and Washington.

You are probably aware that Washington is a very challenging place to get anything done these days. The partisan climate has kept many important issues from being addressed and even led to a shutdown of the federal government. Worst of all, it has created uncertainty for Maine families and the economy. It's the last thing we need. Over the next year, I will continue pressing Congressional leaders to bring the focus back to helping people rather than advancing ideologies.

As difficult as it's been, though, there are areas where I have been able to make progress on needed policy reforms. One has been support for local food producers. For decades now, federal agriculture policy has only benefited huge farms and commodity crops, not the kind of the diverse family farms we have in Maine. It's time for that to change. With small federal changes, we can capitalize on the huge economic potential of the local food movement. I've introduced the Local Farms, Food, and Jobs Act to make some of those changes, and have been pleased to see many of these reforms gain bipartisan support.

Another issue is helping veterans who were sexually assaulted during their service. I've introduced the Ruth Moore Act—named after a Maine veteran who struggled for 23 years to get disability benefits from the Department of Veterans Affairs after she was sexually assaulted while in the military. The bill would help veterans like Ruth get the assistance they need to recover from the debilitating trauma they suffered while serving the country. The bill passed the House and now awaits consideration in the Senate.

While policy in Washington is important, so is the work my staff and I do here in Maine. My office keeps close connections to Maine communities and their leaders to make sure we're doing all we can to help them succeed. This work might include providing letters of support for federal grant applications, getting answers from federal agencies, or bringing national officials to our state to raise awareness about the good things being done here.

We also work with hundreds of constituents who have issues with federal agencies and programs. Not everyone knows that you can call your Member of Congress for this kind of thing, but it's an essential part of my responsibilities and my commitment to the people I serve. Members of my staff are experts on issues ranging from veterans benefits and IRS questions to Social Security problems and passport inquiries. They can help you navigate the process, communicate with federal agencies, and, in certain circumstances, facilitate the expediting of claims. ## Annual Report to the Town of Windham A Message from Senator Gary E. Plummer

Dear Friends and Neighbors:

As the 126<sup>th</sup> Legislature draws to a close, I want to thank you for the trust you have placed in me to represent your interests in the Senate. I have decided not to run for re-election in November 2014 so this will be my last town report letter to the citizens of Windham. My time in the Legislature during the past 10 years has been one of the most challenging, yet rewarding experiences of my life. Thank you for allowing me to be your voice in Augusta.

Last year began with an overwhelming undertaking of how to fill an \$880 million shortfall in the state's two-year budget, caused mostly by cost overruns in the MaineCare program. Lawmakers balanced the budget without reversing the income tax cut passed by the previous Legislature, reductions that have benefitted low and moderate-income residents the most. The budget also restored cuts that were slated for the Drugs for the Elderly program. Unfortunately, it also included a 10 percent sales tax increase and a 14 percent hike in the meals and lodging tax.

One of the Legislature's most significant achievements last year was finally paying off Maine's massive debt to its hospitals, which totaled \$484 million at the beginning of 2013. The Legislature approved a plan that allows the state to use a revenue bond to pay off the debt and use the proceeds from a renegotiated state liquor contract to pay off the bond. The debt was the result of Medicaid services provided by 39 Maine hospitals for which they were never reimbursed, dating back to 2009.

The Legislature also approved the bipartisan Omnibus Energy Bill, which addresses reducing the cost of energy in Maine, cutting back on greenhouse emissions, and making money available to insulate Maine homes. The enacted law will increase natural gas capacity and improve connection to underserved areas of Maine, provide funding to help companies cut back on greenhouse emissions and give rebates to homeowners who switch from oil to natural gas or other more efficient heating systems, and provide funding to help homeowners improve insulation.

We also worked hard to enact measures to ensure concealed handgun permit holder confidentiality. I was very proud to be the lead cosponsor on a bill that allows the names and personal information of people who hold concealed handgun permits to be kept confidential. Many bills were also introduced, but ultimately defeated, that would have limited the right of law-abiding citizens to own firearms or ammunition.

Lawmakers have been busy this year at the State House addressing a number of issues including welfare reform, reducing the waiting lists for section 21/29 services, Medicaid expansion, securing funding to help our rural nursing facilities, protecting education reforms, and arming forest rangers.

Dear Friends:

It is a privilege to represent Maine in the U.S. Senate, and I welcome this opportunity to share some of my work from the past year.

Encouraging the creation of more jobs remains my top priority. I have developed a Seven Point Plan for Jobs in Maine, which includes proposals to spur small business investment, ensure robust workforce education and training, reduce regulatory red tape that stifles job creation, support Maine agriculture and manufacturing, and invest in the infrastructure needed to expand our economy. Traditional industries and small businesses remain the backbone of Maine's economy, and innovation will be important for future jobs as well. I have supported Maine's effort to lead the world in deepwater wind technology and was proud when the University of Maine and its private sector partners launched the first prototype this year. This emerging industry has the potential to create thousands of good jobs here in Maine.

BIW remains a major Maine employer and is critical to our national security. I have worked hard to support the Navy's request for a 10<sup>th</sup> DDG-51 and to continue construction on the DDG-1000s at the shipyard. This year's annual defense policy bill also contains more than 30 provisions to eliminate sexual assault from our military, including several provisions that I authored.

Partisan divisiveness in Washington continues to prevent us from addressing some of our nation's most serious challenges. Gridlock reached a peak in October with the federal government shutdown that pushed our country to the brink of defaulting on its financial obligations and damaged our economy. As the shutdown continued with no end in sight, I presented a proposal I believed both sides could support. Within days, I was leading a bipartisan coalition of 14 Senators that worked night and day to craft a plan to reopen government, avert default, and restart negotiations on a long-term plan to deal with our nation's unsustainable debt of more than \$17 trillion. Known as the "Common Sense Caucus," we will continue to work to develop solutions and bridge the partisan divide.

Earlier this year, across-the-board federal spending cuts known as "sequestration" took effect. These indiscriminate cuts jeopardized priorities from national security to medical research and stand in stark contrast to the thoughtful and thoroughly debated spending priorities set at town meetings throughout Maine. To bring some Maine common sense to this process, I authored bipartisan legislation to allow federal agencies to set priorities in administering the required cuts and wrote a new law to ensure that sequestration would not disrupt air travel, which plays such an important role in fueling Maine's tourism economy.

I have also enjoyed my work as the ranking member of the Senate Special Committee on Aging where, with Senator Bill Nelson of Florida, we work on issues of critical importance to Maine seniors. The committee has created a toll free hotline (1-855-303-9470) to make it easier for senior citizens to report fraud and scams and to receive assistance. I also serve as the Senate Co-Chair of the task force on Alzheimer's, a devastating disease that takes a tremendous personal and economic toll on more than five million Americans. Better treatment for Alzheimer's and ultimately finding a cure should be an urgent national priority.

Finally, I am proud to reflect our famous Maine work ethic by completing another year of service without missing a single roll call vote. I have not missed a vote since I was elected – a streak that stands at more than 5,300 in a row.

May 2014 be a good year for you, your community, and our great State of Maine.
