## *Town Manager's Annual Report*

"Changes aren't permanent, but change is." Change is one of the only constants in life, and that's as true of the life of a community as it is of each of us as individuals. What can we do, and what do we do, to affect those changes in a positive way and help ensure the outcomes we want? The first, and most important, thing to do is get involved. I can hear you now, "What? You want me to sign up for a committee? Or to run for Council?" If those are ways of getting involved that suit you, sure. But not all "getting involved" means signing up for something or running for office. Watch or attend meetings, get familiar with the issues, contact Council members – or me – and let us know your thoughts, concerns, and ideas. Just getting involved doesn't guarantee a particular outcome, but NOT getting involved guarantees your perspective isn't considered.

Issues related to how much change Windham has gone through over the last decade, or two, three, four, and more decades, took up a lot of Council and staff time over the last year. Planning for the community's needs – present and future. We have a lot of catching up to do after many years of growth and too little investment in facilities and infrastructure. The town's new comprehensive master plan update was approved by the Council and the state, setting the stage for work in the coming years. The plan distills all of the various goals and strategies into four major themes, what the Comprehensive Plan Review Team and planning director Ben Smith have called the "4 Big Things: "

- Changing the Game for Growth Areas
- Invest in Rural Windham to Keep it Rural
- Create a North Windham to be Proud of
- Focus on Community Facilities and Programs

Each of these big things captures a dimension of what the town needs to be doing to meet the challenges of growth and change. A significant amount of staff and Council time has been taken up with issues around private roads and how development has occurred over many decades and, most recently, with the growth- and development-related impacts on water quality in Highland Lake.

The town has continued implementing its capital facilities plan, with improvements planned for the public library and a maintenance facility approved by voters in November. , developing a more workable approach to wastewater management and ground water protection needs in the North Windham area, and improvements for the corridor through North Windham. We have putting that planning focus on to work internally as well with an organizational strategic plan to guide how we make decisions about those services and budgets, and how we report to you about whether we're achieving what we intended. That strategic plan is being updated to incorporate items from the new comprehensive master plan.

I've said it before, but I'll say it again: Windham is a great town. It is the Lakes Region's marketplace, an integral part of Greater Portland, and it will continue to be a great place to live, work, raise a family, and have a business. In the years (decades? centuries?) ahead the trees and fields will still be green, the water clear, and the people engaged, friendly, and hard-working. And we're all going to work together to make it happen so that, in the years to come, others will look back and say we did.

# *Superintendent of RSU#14*

2017 Town Report

Superintendent of Schools

RSU 14 serves approximately 3100 students and 725 employees representing the communities of Windham and Raymond. We are located in the heart of the beautiful Sebago Lake region known as Cumberland County. We are the sixth largest school system in the State of Maine. I personally welcome you to our school district and unquestionably see you as an important partner as we embark on another important school year.

Every five years our school communities develop a new subsequent strategic plan which has been helpful with ensuring that we remain focused on the needs of our students. I have remained excited about the work of this district and how the RSU 14 wider school community has come together with preparing all learners for the future.

In looking ahead, I constantly see our mission statement, "Success for All" to be in the forefront of our work throughout the district. Our current strategic plan, which had extensive input designing for the future, continues to be at the heart of work by adhering to the following Goals.

1. Design for Learning: All RSU 14 students will be engaged in authentic, personalized learning experiences to master standards through multiple pathways.
2. Environment for learning: All RSU 14 students will continue to learn in a school environment that meets the developmental needs of learners and supports both the quality of life for all members of the learning community.
3. Technology for Learning: By 2021, all members of the RSU 14 community will be proficient users of technology and will have consistent and equitable users to the technology needed to support mastery of personalized learning goals.

We continue to celebrate Windham High School's graduation rate as being one of the highest compared to districts in Maine with a student population over 3000. Our graduation rate is 90.2% - the state average is 87.5%. Recently, our decennial accreditation process was acknowledged by the Committee on Public Secondary Schools at its June 24, 2018 meeting. The committee was impressed with many of the programs and services and commended us on the following:

- the efforts of the school community to ensure that all students experience academic and social success in a positive learning environment
- the positive energy and support for the aspirational message presented in the school's mission and vision statement
- the effort of the faculty to implement a Habits of Work rubric to provide feedback to all students
- the hiring of a (Great Schools Partnership) coach to support the development of curriculum and assessment practices aligned to proficiency-based learning
- the staffing, resources, technology, supplies, and materials that provide students with a comprehensive educational experience
- the efforts of the district curriculum coordinator to create a comprehensive, articulated K-12 curriculum
- the commitment to offer students choice, in both topics they wish to study and the format in which to demonstrate understanding
- the focus on engaging students in self-assessment and reflection that is used to improved student work

- the use of varied assessment strategies to allow students to demonstrate learning in a variety of ways
- the emerging efforts to provide students both proficiency-based and traditional grades to create a more robust picture of student achievement

As well, the Committee was pleased to note the following:

- the safe, positive, and supportive culture that reflects a sense of pride and shared ownership
- the collaborative efforts of the superintendent, board of education, and administration to provide opportunities for all students to achieve 21 century learning experiences
- the instructional leadership of the principal who models the school's core values and beliefs
- the comprehensive range of support services that address student needs
- the proactive outreach by support services staff to meet the needs of all students the clear and consistent efforts to create and maintain a clean, safe, and efficient school
- the school site and plant which consistently support the delivery of high quality school programs and services
- the creation of innovative school programs and community partnerships that benefit all students
- the development and implementation of a long-range plan that addresses programs and services, enrollment changes and staffing needs, facility needs, technology and capital improvements. (We have two exceptional tech integrators training staff and assisting with technology updates in the classrooms. In addition, RSU 14 has a new Website full of resources and information. ## *Windham Raymond Adult Education*

Town Report 2017

2017 was the year of collaboration.

Collaboration in all sense of the word. First, we collaborated with our students to give them the necessary support to overcome their barriers to pursue their next steps, sometimes it might have been their first steps towards a brighter future. In order to provide greater support for our students, we collaborated with area businesses to provide a bridge between employer and employee to help with possible job opportunities in our region.

We also collaborated with area businesses to provide necessary skills training for their employees. This helps our community to provide the necessary leading edge for area industries.

As an adult education program, Windham Raymond Adult Education (WRAE) became part of Hub 8. This hub represents most of Cumberland County Adult Education programs. This collaboration continues to support our students and our community by expanding opportunities for training and educational opportunities throughout our hub region (Windham, Raymond, Gray, Standish, Buxton, Freeport, South Portland, Portland, Scarborough, Bridgton, Naples, Casco, Fryeburg, Brownfield, Lovell, Stow, Stoneham, Sweden, Denmark & Chatham, NH).

We continue to collaborate with our community to provide the area with the best adult education experience possible. We strongly feel that our program contributes greatly to the quality of life in our communities as we continue to be seen as a local and statewide leader in adult education, offering the most diverse array of adult learning opportunities in the area.

We served a diverse adult population and continually tried to offer the most affordable and highest quality learning opportunities we could. Academically, our English for Speakers of Other Languages, Literacy, High School Diploma and HiSET classes have helped many in our communities to achieve their own dreams for work, military and college. Our College Transitions classes and advising have given many students the necessary tools to become successful college students. Our numerous in-house and online Career Pathways classes enabled students to advance in their own chosen careers or attain skills and confidence to take a new path.

Over the course of 2017, adults of varying ages, vastly different educational, economic and skill levels, with an equally diverse number of interests, found their way to all of the sites where the Windham Raymond Adult Education Program operates in Windham and Raymond. Adults ages 17-87 once again had access to over 300 different adult learning opportunities during this year which helped us realize nearly 3000 total enrollments.

Highlights over the past year included:

- J Provided onsite training at two local businesses
- J Offered a Registered Maine Guide training at Windham Weaponry
- J Offered a very popular Maine State Hunter's Safety course
- J Through partnerships, expanded offerings such as Construction Craft Skills training (a partnership with Portland Area Technical High School- PATHS), EMT-Basic Training (a partnership with United Training Center) and First Aid/CPR for Pets
- J College Transitions Coordinator, Shelli Pride, served on the boards of the Sebago Lakes Region Chamber of Commerce (SLRCC) and the Maine Adult Education Association (MAEA)
- J Director, Tom Nash once again called upon our US Delegation in Washington DC several times to advocate for adult education/literacy while serving as the President of the national Commission on Adult Basic Education (COABE) the nation's largest professional organization dedicated to improving the adult education services for all US residents. He also served on two other national boards, the National Coali-

tion on Literacy (NCL) and the Coalition of Life-long Learning Organizations (COLLO) where his goal has been to advance the standing and importance of adult education and adult literacy in our country

- J Two of our ESOL students became US citizens
- J Four adult students attended the Student Day at the Maine State Hall of Flags
- J Several students took their first-ever field trip to Boston to walk the Freedom Trail for their US History course
- J 19 adults completed their High School credential in 2017
- J Ten of our students were inducted into the National Adult Education Honor Society
- J One of our HISET graduates went on to a 4-year college
- J Family Literacy Fun Day featured 3 authors, 1 book arts artist and The Book Fairy Project founder. Nearly 100 community members were in attendance.

Enrollment/Participation Figures

There was a slight decrease of 200 (6%) in adult enrollments from the same period of time last year (January – December). There is still a 3-year calendar year average of over 3100 enrollments.

## Report of the Assessor

The mission of the Assessing Office is defined by the Maine Constitution, which states: All taxes upon real and personal estate, assessed by authority of this State shall be apportioned and assessed equally according to the just value thereof."

The Assessing Office is responsible for ad valorem taxation of all Windham real and personal properties, addressing for E9-1-1 and the coordination of Geographic Information Services (GIS).

### Valuation as of April 1, 2017:

Taxable valuation of real estate:	\$1,798,657,700
Taxable valuation of personal property:	\$32,959,100
Total taxable valuation of real estate and personal property:	\$1,831,616,800

Personal Property accounts:	1,148

**Homestead Property Tax Exemption:** The Homestead Exemption provides a reduction of \$20,000 off the assessed value of your home for property tax purposes. To qualify, you need to be a legal resident of the State of Maine and have owned your home for twelve consecutive months prior to April 1st. This property must be your permanent residence. Applications are required to be filed on or before April 1st with the municipality where the property is located. If you are currently receiving the exemption, there is no need to reapply.

**Veteran's Exemption:** Veterans who were honorably discharged, served during a federally recognized war period and are over 62 years of age, or the un-remarried widow/widower of a qualifying veteran, may be eligible for a reduction in the valuation of their property. Veterans under the age of 62 who are 100% disabled due to a service-connected disability may also qualify.

**Business Equipment Tax Reimbursement (BETR) and Business Equipment Tax Exemption (BETE):** Business Personal Property may qualify for reimbursement from the State of Maine through the BETR Program or for exemption under the BETE Program.

## Code Enforcement

The Code Enforcement Department offers a variety of services to residents and property owners. In addition to issuing building, internal and external plumbing, mechanical and electrical permits; the department responsibilities include the enforcement of land use and shoreland zoning, gravel pit, junkyard and flood plain regulations, rules in regard to the conversion of seasonal dwellings in shoreland areas, Wireless Telecommunications Tower Ordinance, Surface Water Protection Ordinance and the Mass Gathering Ordinance. In September 2017 a moratorium was enacted for the Highland Lake Watershed effecting over a 1000 parcels of property. In response the Town passed amendments to the Surface Water Protection Ordinance requiring better erosion control measures and a point system to address Phosphorous and Stormwater Management Practice. A Stormwater and Phosphorous Management control permit is now required in the Highland Lake watershed. Windham has 14 lakes and ponds covering 32,180 acres of area and 15 rivers, streams and brooks, all of which are in Shoreland Zoning.

Code Enforcement was responsible for processing 1,651 permits in 2017 resulting in revenue of \$359,178.35 and in 2016 was also responsible for processing 1750 permits, resulting in revenue of \$408,546.91. This includes: Building permits, Impact Fees, Junkyards, Plumbing, Shoreland Review, Soil and Erosion, Use, Wastewater, and Road Permit applications. Estimated cost of construction for 2017 was \$5,915,874 for commercial projects and \$25, 531,197 for residential projects.

Activity levels continue to rise in the Code Enforcement Department due to the surge in construction and increased regulations both federal and state. We saw increased efficiency and department transparency after the implementation of new permitting software in 2014. The software program has also allowed the community to apply for permits, schedule inspections, report a code violation and subscribe to department reports online. The Windham Economic Development Corporation takes the lead role in providing support to new and existing businesses, and in carrying out the daily functions of Economic Development. WEDC's Executive Director reports directly to the Board of Directors of the WEDC. The Town of Windham provides funding to the Corporation and the Town Council receives regular updates from its Council representatives to the WEDC about ongoing activities and programming.

The WEDC actively works to support the many entrepreneurs, business owners and employees throughout Windham. The Town's business directory, [www.WindhamMarketplace.com](http://www.WindhamMarketplace.com), where over 800 Windham businesses are listed, continues to be viewed regularly by people all over the United States, especially New England, as well as many area residents looking for goods and services our businesses supply. We are reaching out to retailers and developers who do not have a presence in Windham to let them know how good of a market we are. We have advertised the Windham Marketplace both regionally and locally in print and on TV. We have partnered on events with local organizations such as the Rotary's Ice Fishing Derby and the Sebago Lakes Region Chamber of Commerce as well as other local events, including Town of Windham sponsored events, attracting visitors to our commercial district and to our parks and trails.

The Windham Economic Development Corporation looks forward to continuing its support of the community by providing assistance to both the Town and businesses located or looking to locate in Windham. We are especially excited about the possibilities that the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Downtown Plan brings to the North Windham Commercial District. The vision includes a more vibrant, walkable, "Town Center" with business people and residents alike enjoying enhanced amenities with access to public spaces and new and improved streetscapes and shopping and dining areas while improving the environment with modern wastewater technologies and improved stormwater practices. # Windham Fire-Rescue Department



"The mission of the Windham Fire - Rescue Department is to assist the citizens and visitors of our community with emergencies that they are unable to handle themselves".

The Windham Fire - Rescue Department provides service to the community from four locations strategically placed throughout the town. The South Windham Fire station a shared station with Gorham and is located at 8 Main Street, East Windham Station is at 47 Falmouth Road, North Windham Station is at 718 Roosevelt Trail and Windham Center Station is at the Public Safety Building at 375 Gray Road.

Windham Fire-Rescue had a successful 2017 year providing effective service to the community of Windham. The department saw a 11.3% increase in call volume over 2016. The majority of our calls, 64.4% continue to be Emergency Medical Services related. Our second most frequent call for service was for service calls. These calls include mutual aid to other communities, service to other agencies like law enforcement as well as other non-fire or medical calls for service we receive from the community.

We staff the department using what is known in the industry as a combination department. This means we are providing service through a hybrid system of paid on-call firefighter/EMTs, per-diem firefighter/EMT's and full time Firefighter/Paramedics. Using this model we currently staff the Public Safety Building and the North Windham Station with 24 hour coverage with this hybrid model. Over the last two years we have added four new firefighter/paramedics to ensure that our two primary ambulances have paramedic level coverage available.

Currently, during the day (7am to 7 pm) there are three per-diem firefighter/EMT's at North Windham. At the Public Safety Building there are three per-diem firefighter/EMT's and one full time firefighter/paramedic. During the night, (7pm to 7am) there are two per-diem firefighter/EMT's at North Windham with one per-diem firefighter/EMT's and one full time firefighter/paramedic at the Public Safety Building. We also partner with Southern Maine Community College to have college four students live at the South Windham Station and three students at the East Windham Station during the school year. In exchange for the hands on learning experience, room and board those students have to be in the station during the night from 10pm 7am and on weekends from midnight to 7am to assist in providing coverage from those stations.


102 members of the department participated in training on a regular basis to maintain and learn new skills. In 2017 the men and women of the department completed 6,447 hours of training. We hold company level trainings on Wednesday evenings with certification programs taking place on nights and weekends.

In May of 2017 the department accepted delivery of two a 2017 Ford/Braun Ambulances. This purchase replaced one 2010 ambulance. The other ambulance that was replaced was retained and has been completed outfitted to operate as a third ambulance for the town. This has increased our capacity to handle more calls before calling mutual aid from other towns. Additionally, having a third ambulance reduces the response time for those in need during high call volume times.

2016 brought a change to how we respond to fire calls. Using the information from the Emergency Fire Dispatch we are able to categorize our calls by severity and adjust the amount of units that respond. As a result of this change the answers the dispatcher receives from the 9-1-1 caller calculate into a code that will send more or less units for help. In 2017 we have been able to further refine our responses. On some calls based on acuity we now respond without lights and sirens. This program has been very successful for us thus far as we try and ensure that we are sending the right amount of help to the right people and trying to avoid sending too much equipment when it may not be needed.

# Windham Public Library

## Annual Report 2017

The mission of the Windham Public Library is to be your center for community, information, technology and entertainment by powering learning and fun for all ages.

In 2017, the Windham Public Library served the Windham community by providing materials in print and digital format to both entertain and educate library users. The library provided programs and activities such as movies, games and puzzles. In the community, the library provided outreach services and school visits. Additionally, we checked out park and museum passes that offer discounted rates for patrons. The library offered valuable space for quiet study, educational and civic meetings, story times, author talks, and more.

The library's collection includes an always-expanding variety of materials to circulate and view including books, magazines, audiobooks, eBooks/ eAudiobooks, DVDs, Blu-Rays, music and newspapers. The library also provides access to computers and internet. The library held Story Time, Books and Babies, a Summer Reading Program for all ages, a monthly book group, "Tea for You," a weekly knitting group, a movie program, and other entertaining and educational programs. Library staff members participated in local librarian and literacy groups to collaborate and discuss library services in the community. They also worked with RSU#14 staff and Windham Parks and Recreation staff to coordinate several events throughout the year. 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### So, what's new?

Our monthly Author Talks continued into 2017. This year, we had author visits from Melanie Brooks, Phyllis Chinlund, Bruce Robert Coffin, and Bob Beane. The Children's Room also hosted several authors, including Youbell Jackson and Michelle Patch. 2018 will surely bring more exciting author talks.

To complement our extensive digital and print offerings, we added Universal Class, a new digital service. This service allows patrons to explore classes in parenting, business, cooking, math, crafts, pet training, and much more. Patrons need only a library card and a web browser. With hundreds of self-paced classes to choose from, there's something for everyone!

We also added a new wireless printing service. This service allows users to send a print job from their laptop or even from a home computer to the library's printer. Just come in, log in, pay, and print!

In addition to their already popular backpack collection, the Children's Room added a new microscope back-

pack. The backpack contains a microscope as well as a book, slide preparation kit, and other items geared toward self-learning.

In the Spring of 2017, the outdoor landscaping was completed. New shrubs and a granite bench complete the inviting atmosphere.

In December, the library renovations began. The Children's Room moved a large part of their collection into their temporary space in the meeting room. Painting, new carpeting, and new walls commenced. Construction is slated to be completed in early April of 2018.

#### Staffing Changes

In January of 2017, the library hired Jen Dupree as the Circulation Supervisor. In 2018, we will hire three part-time Circulation positions and a part-time Reference Assistant. These positions will utilize the substitute hours we have been using to cover our service desks. A part-time Teen Services Librarian will also be hired in April. This position was approved in the 2018 Municipal Budget as part of the strategic plan. We are very excited for what these positions will be able to offer in terms of expanding programming and services to our patrons. We have had no retirements or resignations in 2017.



#### Community Collaborations

In September, the library was the recipient of the Hannaford Helps Program. For every Hannaford Helps bag purchased in September, the library received \$1.00. In total, \$44.00 was raised.

The book group began another Maine Humanities Council book series in January of 2017 entitled "Making a Difference: How Love and Duty Change Lives."

This year's summer reading theme "Build a Better World" inspired a construction theme for the Summerfest parade and throughout our summer programming. As part of building a better world, the library planted a small community garden. Staff and volunteers planted, watered, weeded, and harvested flowers, vegetables, and herbs.

Visits were made each month to several daycares, assisted living, and senior housing facilities. Library staff members read stories to children and brought materials for use at each facility. In this way, the library is able to reach community members who may not be able to visit the library in person.

Library staff members visited several school events to promote library services and sign up community members for library cards.

This year's Teen Read Week theme, "Unleash Your Story," lent itself to a successful visit from the Animal Refuge League. Teens loved the visit from the service dog, as well as two crafts to make dog and cat toys that were donated to the shelter, plus a snack of bone-shaped cookies.

In August, the library gave out eclipse-viewing glasses and hosted a wildly popular eclipse-viewing event. Families of all kinds came to see this rare event!

Due to space restraints and equipment maintenance costs we are no longer accepting electric wheelchairs/scooters or medical beds.

Residents, their visiting nurses, physical and occupational therapists utilize the Loan Closet more and more each year. During the 2017 calendar year items were loaned to approximately 425 individuals.

The Medical Loan Closet volunteers are diligent in their efforts to maximize their funding dollars, donations and donated medical equipment in order to try and fulfill as many loan requests as possible. ## Annual Report 2017

The National Recreation and Park Association’s tagline has become “Everyone deserves a great park”, and the citizens of Windham are no exception. Windham’s parks are truly a valuable resource to the members of our community, and the department continues to make improvements to each park and seek ways to attract visitors to our parks. The department received official confirmation that the Town is the recipient of a grant from LWCF (Land & Water Conservation Fund) in the amount of \$168,750, which will be used with matching funds from impact fees to construct the Community Park on the site adjacent to the Public Safety Building. The grant will fund construction of a new skatepark as well as site preparations for future expansions, which we hope will included basketball and beach volleyball courts, a playground, walking trails, and other park amenities.

With the introduction of our new Park Ranger position in 2017, we were able to incorporate some new programming in the parks, while at the same time having a presence at each park (Lippman, Lowell Preserve, the Skatepark, the Mountain Division Trail, and Dundee Park) that helped to monitor activities there. Events that the Park Ranger was involved with included Summerfest, Find it Here (trails edition), Windham Trails Day and National Night Out in partnership with the Windham and Gorham Police Departments and the Cumberland County Sheriff’s Department. We also encourage all of our residents to bike, hike or walk one of our great conservation and trail areas here in Windham.

In 2017, the following upgrades were made throughout our parks:

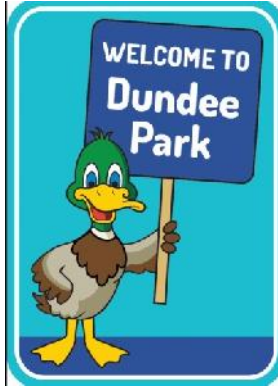
Donnabeth Lippman Park: New swing set installed in the summer to enhance the existing playground facility (includes the unique expressions swing for parent and toddler); Continued renovation to garage for maintenance workshop; clean-up of group camping area.



Lowell Preserve: Introduction of a new storywalk trail; Signage added along various trails, along with GPS work being completed in order to update trail maps

Many thanks to Ron and Dusti Faucher, our park managers, and all our staff at Dundee Park for a successful 2017 season!

There were 1436 people that registered for 202 different program offerings during 2017, and this doesn't take into account the many people that took part in various special events throughout the year. There were many new programs introduced in 2017, and they served to enhance the many offerings already established by the department. These new offerings included After School Yoga (grades K-5), Lego Brick by Brick program (grades K-3), Middle School Early Release Day programs, Happy Hearts Creative Movement (ages 2-5), Kiddie and Me Seasonal Creations (pre-school), Find it Here, Trails Edition (for families). Long-running programs that the department offers includes Open Gym for adults on Tuesday/Thursday evenings and Sundays, Men's League Basketball (3 seasons), Adult Pickleball, Kiddie Gym, Mad Science after school enrichment programs and senior citizen offerings. Summer Camp began on Monday, June 26<sup>th</sup>. In addition to the varying enrollment options and enrichment activities offered to 251 kids (an increase of 17 over last year), we also added some additional activities during the course of the summer. There was an overnight camping trip to Dundee Park, an overnight trip to Adventure

Bound Whitewater Rafting, a kayaking experience for all at Dundee Park, and a tubing trip down the Saco River. Enrichment programs included cycling club, paddling club, video production club, and something resurrected from the past, and a key element of summer camp – swim lessons at St. Joseph’s College. Community service projects were completed, with senior campers working on the high school community garden, and all three camps working on a Food Drive that brought in many donations to the Food Pantry. We had 24 staff members providing a quality experience to our campers this summer. We also offered a Summer Tennis Camp (8 participants) and our Summer Track Program (40 participants).



For the first time in many years, the multi-week Ski Program at Shawnee Peak did not run due to limited enrollment. (There were a few families that took part in the Wednesday program.) The department offered a discounted night season pass to Shawnee, and 46 people took advantage of that. The department also loans out snow shoes throughout the winter months, as well as discounted tickets to Funtown/Splashtown, York’s Wild Animal Kingdom and Aquaboggen for the summer months.

Our seniors had many choices for day trips during the year, and we also joined forces with our surrounding communities to offer more senior options. We send out a quarterly newsletter and encourage people to call the office to get added to that mailing list. Highlights in 2017 included the following: Bethel Historical Museum, Boston Flower Show, Think Spring Luncheon, Cold River Vodka Distillery Tour, Green Ladle Culinary Arts Lunch, Lunch Cruise on Casco Bay, Maine Botanical Gardens, the Fryeburg Fair, numerous shopping destinations and some great eating establishments.

The Parks and Recreation Department offers some annual special events that the community looks forward to each year, which includes the Father Daughter Dance, the Mother Son Sports Nite, and the Halloween Party, which was expanded in 2017 to include Trunk or Treating. This year we also introduced Arts in the Park, and partnered with the Windham PTA once again in offering Winterfest. Although Mother Nature did not cooperate with us on the day of the event, the 1<sup>st</sup> annual Winterfest Photo Contest had a very good response by photography hobbyists. We also offered Little Plays by the Children’s Museum and Theater of Maine for preschoolers and their parents, along with S’Mores and Skate Night at the Manchester Ice Rink. Special calls from the North Pole were made by a dedicated volunteer and town councilman, and the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Community Tree Lighting was held at the Public Safety Building, with much support from the Fire and Police Departments, Windham Public Library, Social Services and Mrs. Nancy Cash-Cobb’s 3<sup>rd</sup> grade chorus.

## *Windham Planning Department*

### Vision for the Windham Planning Department

The Windham Planning Department is dedicated to encourage, support and enable Windham's citizens, elected leaders and officials to:

- J Articulate and formalize their visions and goals through the creation of the comprehensive master plan, programmatic and district plans and policies.
- J Achieve the community's goals by implementing plans through ordinance and policy development, project management and the employment of a fair and predictable development review process.
- J Contribute through opportunities for meaningful participation by diverse methods at all stages of planning in order to continuously update and refine community goals, ensure transparency in planning services, and to build awareness for community issues and opportunities.

### Department Mission

The mission of the Planning Department is to provide professional advice and technical expertise to citizens, elected leaders and municipal officials to assist in understanding and addressing community issues and priorities. This is accomplished through a focus on long term economic vitality, environmental integrity, and quality of place through the development of high quality plans, plan implementation and development review services.

### Department Structure

The Planning Director, Ben Smith, AICP, is responsible for overall management of the department and long range planning projects. Long range projects, which are undertaken as directed by the Town Council and Town Manager, include a range of topics that deal with land development and transportation. Ben is the project manager for the 21st Century Downtown ordinance changes for North Windham.

Planner, Amanda Lessard, is lead staff member for development review services. The majority of this work involves assisting the Planning Board and Staff Review Committee in their reviews of Subdivision and Site Plan applications by coordinating the recommendations of Town staff members and outside engineers and working with applicants on ordinance and process questions. For those not familiar with these terms, subdivision applications involve the division of land into multiple parcels, while site plan applications are typically for the construction of commercial or industrial buildings on a single parcel. Amanda also assists with long range projects as time allows.

The Town Engineer, Jon Earle, joined the Planning Department in October of 2016. Jon is responsible for plan review and construction inspection for site plan and subdivision projects. In addition, he is the Town's project manager for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Downtown infrastructure work in North Windham, including sidewalk and intersection improvements and the Wastewater Study. Jon also provides preliminary cost estimates for future town projects including roadway reconstruction, paving, and drainage projects. The Town Engineer also serves as the Town's Technical Committee member to the Portland Area Comprehensive Transportation System (PACTS).

Administrative Assistant, Lisa Fisher, provides assistance to the public and support on development review and research projects. Lisa also provides administrative support for the oversight of performance guarantees and development escrow accounts for projects under construction.

### Development Review Activities

During the 2017 calendar year:

The Planning Department reviewed sixteen (16) subdivision applications, ten (10) site plans, one (1) shoreland zoning review, seven (7) ordinance amendments, and one (1) zoning map amendment.

The Planning Board issued approvals for eight (8) subdivision applications, four (4) site plan applications, one (1) shoreland zoning review, one (1) zoning map amendment, and made recommendations for three (3) ordinance amendments.

The Staff Review Committee reviews the smallest projects subject to site plan review. This Committee reviewed and approved one (1) commercial site plan.

### Long Range Planning Activities

In 2017, the department worked on the long-range planning projects listed below. Additional information on these projects can be found on the department's webpage at [www.windhammaine.us](http://www.windhammaine.us).

#### ) Comprehensive Master Plan—update adopted in June 2017

Adoption of this major update to the plan was the culmination of a 2.5 year planning effort.

The Long Range Planning Committee was formed in the fall of 2017 and had their first meeting in December. This group is charged with many of the implementation items from the Comprehensive Plan.

#### ) 21<sup>st</sup> Century Downtown Plan for North Windham

Comprehensive effort to build upon the sense of place in the North Windham commercial district through transportation improvements and land use planning tools.

Ordinance work started to implement the vision of this plan. Part of that work is an examination of a Character Based Code for North Windham.

The Town is working with Wright-Pierce Engineering on a wastewater study for the North Windham area.

#### ) Portland Area Comprehensive Transportation System (PACTS) Planning Committee

Federally mandated transportation planning and funding agency for the region.

### Looking Ahead

The Planning Department will continue to work on the implementation of the Comprehensive Plan through the work of the Long Range Planning Committee. That group is starting its work with a close look at the zoning ordinance requirements and the zoning map compared to the types of development envisioned in different parts of Windham over the next 10-15 years.

In 2018, the Planning Department will be focusing on bringing good projects to the Town Council that will move North Windham and South Windham forward.

## 2017 ANNUAL REPORT

### 2017 Calls for Service:

Below please find the total calls for service for calendar year 2017. At 17,877 our calls for service are down 1.6% from 2016. Our volume of index crimes and Motor vehicle crashes are similar to previous year. This year the department has placed an emphasis on traffic enforcement. This was accomplished by the assignment of personnel, an adjustment in patrol scheduling and participation in Bureau of Highway safety grants. At 4,399 our total traffic stops were up nearly 26% from the 2016 total of 3,476.

I would like to thank all officers for a job well done and for being responsive to the concerns expressed to us by our citizens.

### Community Policing Events

National Night Out: This year we partnered with both the Cumberland County Sheriff's Department and Gorham PD for national night out. This event occurred in early August. There was a great turn out of citizens as well as public safety displays. Some of the displays were Police and Fire vehicles, our motorcycle as well as some K-9 demonstrations.

**Public Safety Day:** In October during fire safety week, both the Police and fire departments hosted a Public safety day. In addition to displaying both equipment and specialty positions each department provides, other public service agencies such as the Cumberland County Emergency Communications Center, Family Crisis, TRIAD and others participate to promote the services they provide to our citizens. This year Life Flight was able to land and display their helicopter.

**Tree lighting:** The community tree lighting has evolved into a popular community event. Each year the event attracts many people who enjoy the third grade chorus, the tree lighting and yes even the arrival of Mr. & Mrs. Clause who arrive in style!! A well-lit and decorated fire truck.

**Wreathes across America:** This year Wreaths across America stopped in Windham, this is a large contingent of 18 wheelers that start in Harrington Maine where Maine Christmas wreathes are built. The caravan has a large police escort from down east Maine all the way to Arlington nation cemetery where the wreathes are laid on the graves of our veterans. A very well put together and well attended ceremony was put on at the High School for the event this year. We hope the same happens in 2018!!

### Opioid Crisis

**OPIOID RESPONSE:** Like most communities throughout the State and Nation Windham has been struggling with an Opioid crisis. In addition to criminal enforcement efforts, the department had also worked on this crisis as a public health matter. We have developed and employed a Naloxone (NARCAN) program, to include policy, training and deployment of the drug. In 2017 Windham Police officers administered NARCAN to 9 people suffering from an apparent opioid overdose. We have also partnered with Westbrook, Gorham, Buxton and the Cumberland County Sheriffs Department on a collaborative grant. The purpose of the grant was to hire a Recovery Liaison Specialist, whose function would be to help people suffering with Opioid use disorder find services. These services could be acute treatment, employment, housing and other various services that help people transition back into the community. As of November 46 people were directly receiving assistance from the recovery liaison to include 10 Windham residents.

### Crash Reconstruction Unit

The Windham Police Department's crash reconstruction unit is charged with investigating all crashes where serious injury, fatalities or prosecution is likely.

The current crash reconstruction unit started in 2005 when Detective Eugene Gallant completed the 6-week training program and passed the Maine Criminal Justice Academy's crash reconstruction certification test. In 2006 the unit added forensic mapping to its abilities when Detective Gallant attended Forensic Mapping Specialist training with members of the Cumberland County Sheriff's Department. The Windham Police Department would utilize the Sheriff's Department's Sokkia forensic mapping station until 2011 when the Department purchased its current Leica forensic mapping station. In 2010 Sergeant Jason Burke was assigned to the unit and completed his training/certification that same year. In 2011 the Windham Police Department purchased a Bosch Crash Data Retrieval (CDR) tool which allowed for the download of air bag modules from crashed vehicles. Sergeant Burke attended the training for this new equipment and became the unit's first analyst. Sergeant Burke would attend the Forensic Mapping Specialist training in 2012 and become a certified vehicle autopsy mechanic in 2014. Detective Gallant would attend the CDR training in 2015 becoming the unit's second analyst. The Windham Police Department's crash reconstruction unit is currently one of only two departments in the State that can perform all four of these functions in crash investigation.

To date the unit has investigated 118 crash scenes. This includes scenes in Windham and surrounding com-



munities as well as assisting other crash reconstruction teams with their investigations. In 2017 the unit investigated 10 crashes and assisted on 5 other crashes for area police departments. Of these 10 crashes 3 were prosecution fatalities resulting in manslaughter charges being brought against the suspect drivers.

#### Animal Control

In the year 2017, there were a total of 868 calls for service regarding animal problems within the town of Windham. These calls varied in nature from reports of potential neglect, dogs left in hot cars, animal bites, lost/ found pets and loose animals ranging from cats and dogs to pigs and cows. The town employs a single full-time Animal Control Officer who is responsible for the animal calls within the town. While she is off-duty, Windham Police Officers handle the animal-related calls that are reported.

There were a total of 2,356 dogs licensed in Windham for the 2017 year, 421 of which were licensed through the state's online system that is open from mid-October to January 31st of every year. Dog owners should be reminded that licensing is only good for the year that the license was issued and are required to be renewed every year by showing that the dog is up to date on its rabies vaccination and paying the fee of \$6.00 for a spayed/neutered dog and \$11.00 for an unaltered dog. There is a mandatory \$25.00 late fee applied for licenses renewed after January 31st.

The town holds an annual rabies vaccination clinic at town hall on the first Saturday in December where dogs can be vaccinated and licensed at the same time. To help pet owners save on costs, the Tractor Supply in Windham has also been hosting vaccination clinics every Tuesday from 11:30-1:00 where pets can receive vaccinations and other veterinary services without the cost of an office visit.

## Social Services

### General Assistance

The Town of Windham's General Assistance Program (G.A.) is a state mandated, municipally administered financial assistance program. It was designed to be a program of "last resort" for residents who are unable to provide for their basic needs. The G.A. office is located in The Family Resource Center at 377 Gray Road. It is overseen by the Assistant Town Manager/H.R. Director and is staffed by René Daniel, G.A. Administrator.

Assistance is available for basic necessities as defined by local ordinance and state statutes. Eligible applicants are assisted through payments made to specific vendors. Administrative costs of the program are paid for through tax dollars. The state reimbursed the Town 70% of the cost of general assistance benefits paid for residents. In 2017, \$17,450.80 was issued to eligible recipients prior to reimbursement. This reflects over a 250% increase in overall general assistance costs from 2016 which were extremely low. The increase is attributed the federally mandated Bridging Rental Assistance Program (BRAP) that increased rental assistance by almost 250%. We continue to provide diligent oversight of the program by a certified General Assistance Administrator; provide strict adherence to the ordinance; and continued education regarding the program. The Windham Food Pantry continues to fill the gap for so many that would otherwise need food vouchers.



Under G.A., applicants must provide verification of their income and expenses, residence, and if unable to work, medical documentation substantiating their work limitations. Applicants are required to seek work if they are physically able and/or to apply for assistance through other state and federal programs that may be available to them. A determination of eligibility is made for a thirty-day period based on anticipated earnings. Individuals and families that do not qualify for financial assistance are referred to local resources appropriate to their need(s).

## Food Pantry/Clothes Closet

The Food Pantry and its companion Clothes Closet were established in response to a growing need for assistance in the community. Food insecurity is a real and urgent issue and it is being addressed at the Food Pantry with confidentiality and compassion through private appointments with the Social Services Assistant, Colette Gagnon.

Clients are served once a month and receive fresh milk, eggs, bread, and vegetables/fruit (when available) in addition to meat and staple items. Families with children are provided with "extras" during school vacations and the summer break. In 2017, the Pantry served 3,483 families made up of 5,887 people.

In 2017 the Food Pantry received U.S.D.A. surplus and "rescued" food from Wayside Food Rescue and has maintained a relationship with The Good Shepherd Food-Bank. The Food Pantry relies on, and is very fortunate to have, generous individual and corporate donations as well as community participation during food drives. In 2017, local businesses, churches, service groups, grocery stores, schools and individuals have all been very generous and provided the Food Pantry with \$25,027.42 in cash donations. The Town would like to thank these businesses, organizations, churches, and volunteers that assist those in need throughout the year.

The Food Pantry and the Clothes Closet are open Monday – Thursday 8am – 4pm. Food Pantry clients must provide proof of residency – i.e. utility bill or lease. There is no residency requirement for items needed from the Clothes Closet. Call 892-1931 to schedule an appointment.

## Town Clerk

A big change for the Clerk's Office this year was Vital Records in Augusta rolled out a new Marriage program for Town Clerk's to access on-line. It involved a lot of training, a lot of trial and error because this program is very involved. Several years ago they started with the on-line Death registration program, then followed up with the on-line Birth registration program and Marriages brought them to the end of this new era in Vital Record recording and issuing.

The town also started with new a finance software program. This new program involves almost every aspect of our daily work in the Clerk's Office from running receipts, budgets, paying an invoice, and soon, auto registrations, tax payments and dog licensing.

LD 1384 passed this year, which amends the election laws and moved the filing deadline for municipal nomination papers from the 45<sup>th</sup> day to the 60<sup>th</sup> day prior to a municipal election. This was changed to allow Clerks to receive their municipal absentee ballots in time to be mailed out with the state's absentee ballots, which starts 30 days before an election.

Last June we only had the School Budget Referendum Ballot to vote on. We had 470 people vote and there were 13,081 registered voters. In November with 12,906 registered voters we had 3,874 people participate in the election. The new Shared Maintenance Facility for Public Works and the School Department passed by 176 votes.

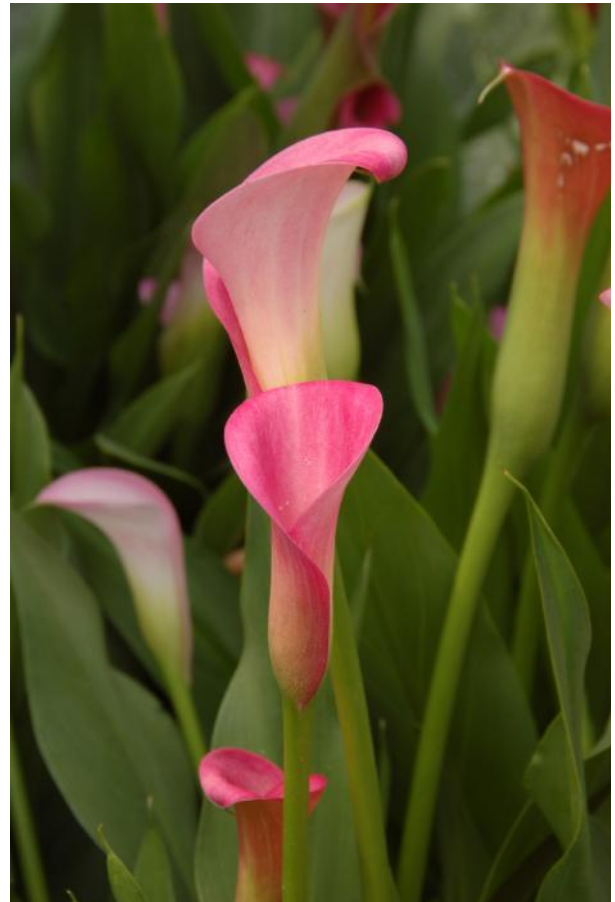

Dear Citizen of Windham:

For the past seven years as your Governor, my priority has been to make Maine—our people—prosper. Helping you keep more money in your wallet by reducing taxes has been part of that mission.

Too many Maine families are facing skyrocketing property taxes that strain household budgets. Our elderly on fixed incomes are particularly vulnerable to these increases. School budgets are often blamed for annual increases in property taxes. But there's another reason. A tremendous amount of land and property value has been taken off the tax rolls, leaving homeowners to pick up the tab.

As of 2016, towns and cities owned land and buildings valued at nearly \$5.5 billion statewide. Large and wealthy non-profits, such as hospitals and colleges, often escape paying property taxes on their vast real estate holdings—totaling more than \$5.1 billion statewide.

In Maine, nearly 2.5 million acres of land have been set aside for conservation by the federal and state governments and non-profit organizations, including land trusts. Municipalities are losing out on property taxes on an estimated \$2 billion in land that has been either removed from the tax rolls or prohibited from development—shifting the cost of municipal services to local homeowners through higher property taxes.

It's time to recognize the results of taking property off the tax rolls and identify solutions to reduce the burden on our homeowners. My administration's proposals have been met with staunch resistance.

In 1993, about 35,800 acres of land were documented as land-trust owned. That number has increased by an astonishing 1,270 percent. Land trusts now control over 490,000 acres with an estimated value of \$403 million. We must restore the balance. We will be working this session to ensure all land owners are contributing to the local tax-base. It's time for them to pay their fair share.

I encourage you to ask your local officials how much land in your municipality has been taken off the tax rolls, as well as how much in tax revenue that land would have been contributing today to offset your property taxes.

Dear Friends:

It is an honor to represent Maine in the United States Senate. I am grateful for the trust the people of our State have placed in me and welcome this opportunity to share some key accomplishments from this past year. Maine has the oldest average age in the nation. As Chairman of the Senate Aging Committee, my top three priorities for the Committee are fighting fraud and financial abuse directed at our nation's seniors, increasing investments in biomedical research, and improving retirement security. Following the Committee's investigation into skyrocketing prescription drug costs, I authored bipartisan legislation to foster generic competition, which was signed into law. The Aging Committee's toll-free hotline (1-855-303-9470) makes it easier for seniors to report suspected fraud and receive assistance. To support the 40 million family caregivers in the United States, I am proud to have authored the RAISE Family Caregivers Act to create a coordinated strategy to support family members who make countless personal and financial sacrifices to care for their loved ones.

The opioid crisis touches families and communities across our state. As a member of the Appropriations Committee, I fought for significant increases in funding to support community, law-enforcement, and public health efforts. In April, the State of Maine was awarded over \$2 million to fight this devastating public health crisis. Additionally, I have authored legislation to support grandparents and other extended family members who are raising grandchildren as a result of the nation's opioid epidemic.

Biomedical research has the potential to improve and save lives, and also supports good jobs at research facilities here in Maine. Last year, the Appropriations Committee approved a \$2 billion increase for the National Institutes of Health for the third consecutive year. This includes an increase of nearly 30 percent for research on Alzheimer's, our nation's most costly disease. As founder and co-chair of the Senate Diabetes Caucus, I work to raise awareness of the threats posed by diabetes, invest in research, and improve access to treatment options. My bill to establish a national commission of health care experts on diabetes care and prevention was signed into law in 2017.

We owe our veterans so much. Last year, I worked to secure the authorization of a Community-Based Outpatient Clinic in Portland to support the health care of Maine's veterans in the southern part of our state. I also worked to secure funding extensions to help veterans throughout rural Maine receive health care within their communities. I also worked to secure funding for housing vouchers for veterans to reduce veterans' homelessness.

Maine's contributions to our national security stretch from Kittery to Limestone. I successfully advocated for critical funding for projects at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard for construction of an additional ship that will likely be built at Bath Iron Works. This funding will strengthen our national security and preserve great jobs in our state.

As chairman of the Transportation and Housing Appropriations Subcommittee, I worked to increase funding for the TIGER program that has provided Maine with more than \$122 million for vital transportation projects. For housing, I worked to provide \$160 million to help communities protect children from the harmful effects of lead

poisoning.

Growing our economy remains a top priority. I supported the comprehensive tax reform bill because it will help lower- and middle-income families keep more of their hard-earned money; boost the economy; and encourage businesses, both small and large, to grow and create jobs here in Maine and around the country. This legislation contains key provisions I authored that are important to Mainers, including preserving the deduction for state and local taxes, expanding the deduction for medical expenses, and enabling public employees such as firefighters, teachers, and police officers, as well as clergy and employees of nonprofits, to make “catch-up” contributions to their retirement accounts. I led the effort to ensure that the tax cut will not trigger automatic budget cuts to Medicare or any other programs.

A Maine value that always guides me is our unsurpassed work ethic. As of December 2017, I have cast more than 6,500 consecutive votes, continuing my record of never missing a roll-call vote since my Senate service began in 1997.

Representing Maine in the United States Senate is an honor.

I continue my work on the Senate Armed Services Committee, each year authorizing the funding required to build our military capabilities and ensuring that our service members are trained and equipped to defend our nation. I was pleased to be part of a bipartisan effort to enact a new law to simplify the appeals review process to reduce the backlog our veterans are facing, as well as a new law that provides critical funding to the VA Choice Program, allowing veterans in rural Maine to access services closer to home.

While my committee work is important, working to combat the opioid epidemic is one of my top priorities. Although Congress has made some important strides, much remains to be done to provide additional funding for prevention, treatment and enforcement. I am working with colleagues on both sides of the aisle to pressure the Drug Enforcement Administration to reduce the amount of opioids produced and to thwart the flow of fentanyl and other deadly drugs into our country.

I am very optimistic about the integrated, multiagency effort I led with Senator Collins to foster innovation and commercialization in Maine's forest economy. Through the Economic Development Assessment Team (EDAT) we are already experiencing increased federal investments that will strengthen our existing forest products industry and help support job creation in rural communities. Initiatives like Cross Laminated Timber, Combined Heat and Power, nanocellulose, 3D printing with biobased materials and other biobased products will mean that Maine's wood-basket will continue to be a major jobs and economic contributor for our future.

Finally, the coming year will continue the work of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence in the ongoing investigation of Russian interference in the 2016 election. Our Committee has held seven public hearings and numerous classified sessions, reviewed tens of thousands of pages of documents and conducted hundreds of interviews. I remain focused on the security of our elections and committed to developing strategies to prevent interference by foreign governments in our democracy.

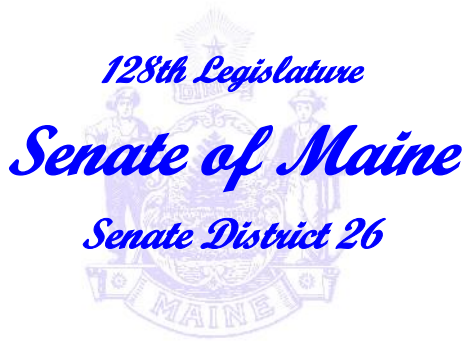

Dear Residents of Windham,

I hope 2018 finds you and your family doing well. It is an honor to represent you and this community as your state senator, and I look forward to working hard for Windham in the upcoming session.

Property tax relief remains a top priority for me, and the Legislature made great strides in 2017. This past year, my colleagues and I fought to increase the Homestead Property Exemption from \$15,000 to \$20,000, protected state funding for local services such as fire departments and road maintenance, and increased public K-12 education funding by \$162 million over the biennium. These efforts will decrease the pressure on municipalities to increase mil rates and ultimately reduce the property taxes that have been too high for too long.

Additionally, I would like to share some information about the state's unclaimed property list. "Unclaimed property" is money owed to Maine people by third parties, such as former employers, banks or utility companies. It could be from a forgotten account, an overpaid bill or uncollected wages, and could be unclaimed as a result of a change in name, addresses or bank account. Go to [www.maine.gov/unclaimed](http://www.maine.gov/unclaimed) or call 1-888-283-2808 to see if the state is holding any unclaimed property for you.

One of the best parts of being a legislator is bringing students into the State House to serve as Senate Pages. Pages assist legislators by handing out documents during the session, passing messages between senators, and performing other tasks critical to the legislative process. It's an excellent way to see Maine's government in action, and families can make a day of it by touring the State House and other nearby attractions. With the other, they are offering generous giveaways to giant corporations and the wealthiest Americans.

Over the last year, I've received an unprecedented amount of feedback on these issues from my constituents. With their concerns and interests in mind, I have fought hard against these policies. I will continue using my role in Congress and the Appropriations Committee to hold the Administration and the President accountable.
