## TOWN WARRANT

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To Lester F. Smith, a Constable of North Yarmouth, in  
the County of Cumberland,

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of North Yarmouth qualified by law to vote in Town affairs to meet at the Town House in said Town on Monday, the 8th day of March, A.D. 1937, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To hear and act on the report of Town Treasurer, Selectmen, Overseers of Poor and Superintendent of Schools.

Art. 4. To hear and act on the report of the North Yarmouth School Fund Trustees and vote how the money shall be expended.

Art. 5. To hear and act on the report of the Cemetery Commission.

Art. 6. To receive accounts against the Town and raise money for such as may be allowed.

Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to elect our Selectmen this year in the following manner. One for 1 year,

one for 2 years, one for 3 years and thereafter each year one for 3 years.

Art. 8. To choose all such officers as required by law to be chosen in the month of March annually.

Art. 9. To choose a Cemetery Commissioner for five years.

Art. 10. To elect one or more fire wards. Also to designate one Fire Ward as Inspector, fix the compensation and raise money for same.

Art. 11. To raise money for the support of Schools as follows: Common schools, text books, repair of school houses, school supplies, high school tuition, insurance, school contingent and electric lights.

Art. 12. To raise money for the repair of roads as follows: Town roads, snow roads, bridges and culverts, cutting bushes, support of poor, Town officers, cemeteries, contingencies and interest.

Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the Town to State Aid, as provided in Section 20, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930.

Art. 14. To see what sum the Town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930 or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 175, Public Laws of 1933.

Art. 15. To see what sum, if any, the Town would recommend to take from the joint State Aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid roads in excess of the requirements of Section 2, Chapter 132, Public Laws of 1935.

Art. 16. To see if the Town will take a certain part of their Third Class money to apply bituminous treatment to said road.

Art. 17. To see if the Town will join with the State Highway Commission in raising the sum of \$50.00 to be used in grading the Patrol Road.

Art. 18. To see what sum the Town will raise for maintenance and resurfacing the Third Class Highways as per State Law.

Art. 19. To see what action the Town will take on cutting the bushes on State Aid and Third Class Highways as per law.

Art. 20. To see if the Town will hire or buy any additional snow removing equipment or take any action thereon.

Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to buy snow fence and raise money for same.

Art. 22. To fix the price of men, horses, trucks per day and all Town Officers not fixed by law.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for maintenance and resurfacing the Special Resolve Road as per law.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the services of the nurses of Cumberland County Public Health Association.

Art. 25. To see if the Town will vote to instruct Selectmen and Treasurer to enter into an agreement with men working for the Town to deduct 50 per cent of all their orders to apply on their taxes or take any action thereon.

Art. 26. To see if the Town will vote to choose a Budget Committee.

Art. 27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Treasurer to release and convey any title the Town may

have in any real estate sold for taxes on settlement of said taxes in any way satisfactory to the Board of Selectmen.

Art. 28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow by temporary loans such sums of money as may be necessary to pay bills of the Town in anticipation of unpaid taxes for the year 1937 or take any action relative to the same, subject to the provisions of Chapter 5, Section 83, of the Revised Statutes of the State of Maine.

Art. 29. To see if the Town will vote to buy a Collector's and Treasurer's bond.

Art. 30. To see if the Town will vote to discount taxes or take any action thereon.

Art. 31. To see if the Town will vote to set a time when taxes of 1937 shall be paid.

Art. 32. To see if the Town will vote to have the books audited for the ensuing year.

Art. 33. To see if the Town will vote to adopt daylight saving time.

Art. 34. To have the records of said meeting read and adopted.

Art. 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$100.00 as requested by the Cumberland Fire Co. for damages to their Fire Hose at the Dauphinee fire.

Art. 36. To see if the Town will vote to buy a piece of land from the E. M. Lombard Estate to enlarge Pine Grove Cemetery, and raise money for the same (at the request of the Cemetery Commission).

Art. 37. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to match any project of the Federal Government.



The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of correcting the voting list in said Town and hearing and deciding upon applications of persons desiring to have their names entered upon the voting list at the Town House at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.

Hereof fail not to make due return to one of us on or before the day of said meeting.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

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There are two major responsibilities resting on those who are in charge of public education. The first obligation is the efficient solution of the immediate local educational problems. An able teaching force with a sympathetic understanding of the desires and needs of children, and wise planning are the constant aims in meeting this first responsibility. This wise planning includes the careful preparation and execution of the school budgets as well as the maintenance and development of a well balanced educational program. The second obligation is to public education as an American Institution. Your school officers should never falter in making contributions to the proper guidance and protection of public education as occasions present themselves. In this connection I shall cooperate with those in the state who desire to stabilize educational support in Maine, while serving you this winter as a member of the Legislature at Augusta.

This stabilization, as at present designed, takes the form of placing upon the state the responsibility to support financially one-half the minimum educational program through taxes collected from some other source than from real estate. This support is the state's reasonable obligation toward the training and protection of its citizens. It is just as vital for the state to protect its citizens, through education, against propaganda as to protect them against invasion by military enemies. Should the Legislature pass the new Educational Bill it would mean the following to the Town of North Yarmouth:

The amount given in column three represents additional funds that could be used for the reduction of real estate taxes or for the improvement of educational opportunities—that would be for the voters to decide.

### MISCELLANEOUS

The school financial records are closed twice a year. The accounts are balanced and closed in February for the Annual Town Meeting and also in June for the State Reports. The enrollment varies from year to year in the Town of North Yarmouth and it is much more accurate to figure school costs for the school year beginning July 1st and ending June 30th.

In the Town of North Yarmouth the children are being housed, educated, and in some cases transported at the following per pupil costs:
