REPORT OF THE TOWN MANAGER

To the Board of Selectmen and Citizens of Monson:

1976 was certainly a busy and eventful year. A great deal of time and energy was spent this past year working to implement the property revaluation recommended by Patten Appraisal Associates. Although the results of the revaluation were often shocking and painful, it must be kept uppermost in mind that the intention of revaluation is equity. The courteous way in which most taxpayers conducted themselves was much appreciated by the Board of Selectmen and myself.

The void created with the passing of Dr. Isaac Nelson was filled when the Selectmen were successful in inducing Dr. Joseph Alley to locate in Dr. Nelson's former office on Main Street. The renovation of the Doctor's office, accomplished with Monson Better Health Association and Moosehead Mfg. funds, is a significant boost to quality health care in Monson.

Several businesses have changed hands during the past year in Monson and several more were established, giving us encouragement that the business climate in Monson is improving.

Although the Municipal Budget was increased this past year, a reduction may be possible this year, depending upon school taxes, etc. Careful budgeting and exclusion of last year's several one-time expenditures will enable us to at least hold the line.

In January of this year the Town Office was broken into during the night and \$700 stolen as well as a safe destroyed. Although the culprits have not been caught, we are fortunate that we were insured and that most of the funds were in checks. We would like to encourage taxpayers to continue, when possible, to pay by check.

Farrin Bros. & Smith, Inc. plowed the town roads this year for the 30th straight year. The job of sanding town roads was made more reliable with purchase of a new truck and sander.

Bridge Construction hot-topped the full two miles of Steward Road (Seven Mile Square) this past July. Although the project exceeded the Town's appropriation, we obtained a price per ton which is unlikely to be repeated and felt that completion of the entire road was important.

Recreation: The operation of Whitings Cove Beach went smoothly this past summer with big crowds on the few sunny days we had. The town has supervised the gymnasium on a regular schedule the last two winters, thanks to volunteers and CETA employee, David Suomi. The proposed land aquisition on Spring Road would be an attractive addition to the towns recreational facilities.

CETA: Monson's CETA funded summer youth program involved eight Monson youths, providing them with both salary and experience and enabled the town to provide services which otherwise would not be offered. Other participants were Ann Erickson, custodian, whose absence since mid-summer is increasingly evident and Philip Pratt, whose able replacement by Todd Cole is hardly compensation for the loss we all suffer. The CETA

program has been good to Monson, bringing both jobs and services where none before existed.

The performances of Secretary-Bookkeeper, Donna Lowell and Highway Foreman, Clarence Pratt have been, as usual, superb.

Weldon Conner did his usual excellent job as sexton, making Monson's cemeteries the pride of the county.

The Board of Selectmen meet publicly once per month, the third Wednesday, at 7:00 P. M. in the Town Office. Citizens are encouraged to attend these meetings. Minutes of the Board meetings are available at the Town Office for public inspection.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve the town during the past year.

FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

To the Citizens of the Town of Monson: Fire calls answered by the Monson Fire Department, December 15, 1975 to December 5, 1976:

- 8 Chimney Fires
- 3 Dwelling Fires
- 2 Vehicle Fires
- 1 Forest Fire
- 3 Dump Fires
- 1 False Alarm to Blanchard

Eight of these calls were out of town.

The past year has been relatively quiet for the Department. We bought very little equipment, except for some cleaning supplies and several pairs of boots. Most of our Sunday duty and spare time was spent on our Diamond T Pumper. It is now ready for a coat of paint as soon as weather permits.

Drills were held twice a month and Sunday duty was held June through September.

Possible purchases and projects for the coming year are; purchase of portable generator and smoke ejector, painting the Fire Station floor, walls and ceiling, purchasing several sets of slides to be used for training. We plan on sending several Firemen to training schools which will be held in the County and at the University of Maine. Also we plan another training session with Guilford Fire Department to be held at Moosehead Mfg. Co.

We received a very good report from the Insurance underwriters which was conducted in September, 1975. Money making projects for the past year were the usual: Rabies Clinic, Baked Bean Supper and our calendar program. Several worthy donations were made from the funds. Also dues for each Fireman was paid to the Maine Federation of Firefighters at \$3.00 each.

I have been asked by the Town Planning Board to submit several suggestions to the people who burn wood or plan on burning wood in the near future:

- 1. Have your chimney cleaned in the fall before cold weather.
- 2. Clean stove funnels regularly (this is where your chimney starts).
- 3. Use chimney sweep, it will help keep creosote from forming.
- 4. Fill all chimney thimbles with cement, replace rusted thimbles.
- 5. Leave at least one thimble accessible in second story rooms. Do not panel over these, these openings assist us in extinguishing your chimney fires.
- 6. Keep newspapers and other clutter from gathering in upstairs rooms near chimneys especially near chimney openings.

On behalf of the Monson Fire Department we thank you for your cooperation in our programs and fire fighting activities for the past year.

To Curtis Lunt or any other Resident in the Town of Monson, in the County of Piscataquis, and the State of Maine:

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Monson, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Monson Gym, in said town, on Monday, the 21st day of March, A. D. 1977 at seven o'clock in the evening then and there to act on the following articles to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year and fix his compensation.

Art. 3. To choose one Selectman who will also serve as Assessor and Overseer of the Poor for three years and to fix the Board of Selectmen's compensation for the ensuing year.

Art. 4. To choose a Town Treasurer for the ensuing year and fix his compensation.

\$250.00

- Art. 5. To choose a Fire Chief and to authorize him to form his department with complete authority over the same in behalf of the Town of Monson.
- Art. 6. To choose one (1) member of the Monson Planning Board for a term of five years.
- Art. 7. To choose two (2) members of the Monson Utilities District; one for a term of three years to fill an unexpired term and one for a term of five years.
- Art. 8. To choose all other necessary officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen on its behalf to sell and dispose of any Real Estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes thereon on such terms as they deem advisable and to execute and deliver quit-claim deeds for such property.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to fix a time when taxes shall be due and payable.
- Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount and, if so, what percentage on taxes paid 30 days after tax bills are rendered.
- Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to charge interest at ½ of 1% per month on taxes remaining unpaid September 1, 1977, with said interest to begin on the above date.
- Art. 13. To see if the Town will establish a Recreation Advisory Board for three year terms, said Board to work with and advise the Town Manager and Selectmen on matters relating to establishment, budgeting, supervision and evaluation of recreation programs.

- Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Conservation Commission as set forth in MRSA, Title 30, Section 3851, as amended.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will require that candidates for town elective offices file their intentions with the Town Clerk at least 10 days prior to the election, said requirement to become effective at the next annual election.
- Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money from Federal Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for Snow Plowing.
