Report of the Town Manager

To the Selectmen and Citizens of Monson:

It is my pleasure to submit to you, the Citizens of Monson, your Town Report for the year 1986.

Let us review our financial position at year end. The audit will show that we have a total surplus of \$67,095.94. We transferred to this account this year a sum of \$25,747.08 which we will use to help cut our tax commitment for the coming year. Our tax collections show that we collected 92.3% of our taxes leaving a balance of \$17,359.62 remaining uncollected. Our tax collection for the past six years has average 93% by the time of the books closing. Our thanks to all of you who have paid. Again, I say to those who have a problem paying your tax bill, we can help you by establishing a payment plan, weekly or monthly, which will not only save you interests costs, but will get the bill paid on time.

The Appalachian Trail relocation and the purchase of the land for same caused considerable publicity for Monson this past year. It was the Town's position that it was not necessary to take 4500 feet of frontage on Lake Hebron for the trail. It was felt that this would be a severe blow to our ability to maintain a local tax base and cause, five years down on the line, an increase in the town's tax rate that was unnecessary. We back the concept of the trail, but felt it could be located in less desirable land that would not be so apt to be developed. We lost in regards to the shore frontage, but received a concession in regards to road frontage on Route 15. All government land is not taxable. The total effect on Monson will be documented and will be noted as their tax payments cease.

We did sign a contract for Cable T.V. this past year and the service is now available for those who want it. The work contracted to have done on the extension of the tennis court and the improvements to our sidewalks was started. The tennis court will be completed early in the spring and will be ready for this summer. This years budget allows for the continuation of the work on the sidewalks. The water street improvement is in the works to do this spring. Once completed, then the skating rink can be finished. There are plans now being developed to build a new playground and monies are being raised now for that project. A new float is planned for the beach area. Another side was finished on the Gym and the budget allows for the completion of the outside this year.

In regards to town roads, we will continue to upgrade both the Degerstrom Road and Barrows Fall road. We anticipated doing con-

siderable patching of the Elliotsville Road in an attempt to hold as is until we are able to do a major resurfacing job there. These projects, along with our general maintenance work on the roads, project a busy summer.

This past year saw Monson, along with all the other towns in the County, approve of the jail renovations. This project to start construction in the fall of 1987.

It has been my privilege this year to be asked to serve on the Technical Rural Road Transfer Committee by the D.O.T. This committee deals with what technical info the D.O.T. has that can be given to the small rural towns to help their road commissioners or public works people better perform their responsibilities. I have also been selected by the Main Municipal Association to serve on their Insurance Advisory Committee. This committee deals with the Insurances that the M.M.A. develops to help control the cost of insurance to all towns. I was, again, selected to represent the county towns as a member of the Legislative Policy Committee of the M.M.A. This committee directs the M.M.A. in its attempts to get legislative approval on legislation beneficial to the towns in regards to tax relief etc.

It, again, appears it will be a busy year. Planning ahead, upgrading our appearances, continued growth, increase in population, all will demand your town official's attention. These happenings along with keeping a reasonable tax rate will require the best of our abilities. I am looking forward to the challenge.

To all of you, those who give their time on so many committees as well as the Board of Selectmen, I thank you for your support. To Gina, Socky and Ralph who are more directly involved in the every day problems we face, I once again give my sincere thanks for your continued help and advice. Together, with the support of the Citizens of Monson, I firmly believe we are making Monson a better place in which to live.

It is a pleasure to serve you as your Town Manager and I look forward to the challenges of 1987.

The Monson Utilities District finished the year in a sound financial position. The water division show a carrying balance, after deducting for our yearly payment for the new water system, of \$8,087.67. Of this amount \$4,000.00 is in a contingency fund as required by the F.H.A. leaving an unused balance of \$4,087.67.

The sewer division has been able to meet its obligations. The carrying balance less the contingency fund is only \$2,934.07. Our obligation in regards to the sewer loan wil be around \$4,500.00. So, the fact remains, the payment of the sewer obligation is of utmost importance.

We have installed three new manholes in the sewer system in order to monitor the flow of waste. This was needed to be able to spot our trouble areas which are contributing to an excess water in the system.

With the help of D.E.P., we will, although no firm date has been set, correct the waste and septic problem between Center and Main Streets. The engineering and associated plans are being developed now by the A.E. Hodsdon & Co.

We thank all of you for paying your bills promptly. It is essential in order to maintain the system and supply you with water and operate the sewer system.

We the members of the Monson Gym Committee would like to thank all the people who donated time, money, and support to the programs associated with the Gym in the past year. A special thanks goes out to Moosehead Manufacturing Company for the donation of ten new tables.

This past year more improvements were made to the Gym with new siding and insulated windows installed on the north side. Also the back basement doors were sealed off and the back windows were replaced. This seems to have solved our freeze up problems. Internal improvements include a new water fountain and two new flushes. These have been ordered and will be installed as soon as they arrive.

We are planning to have the siding replaced on the back of the Gym this summer, thus completing the outside work. Next year we hope to begin renovation of the inside; more specifically the gym floor, the lighting system, and the ceiling.

As in the past, the Gym was used for YBA, Summer Recreation Program, Men's Pickup BB, Volleyball, Firemen's BB Tournament, Craft Fair, Peanut Roaster Day, Karate Classes, Willimantic Christian Academy, dances and wedding receptions. New activities included Cub Scout programs and theater practice and presentations by Brown's Head Repertoire. During the school year the Gym is used by our Elementary School students for P.E., sports activities, first aid classes, and recess activities during inclement weather.

Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted governmental auditing standards, and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

As is the usual practice of municipalities in the State of Muine, the Town has not maintained a record of its general fixed assets and, accordingly, a statement of general fixed assets, required by generally accepted accounting principles is not included in the financial report.

In our opinion, except for the omission of a Statement of General Fixed Assets which results in an incomplete presentation, the Financial Statements present fairly the financial position of the Town of Monson, Maine, at January 31, 1987, and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

The accompanying Supplemental Information and the column on the Combined Balance Sheet captioned "Totals Memorandum Only" are not necessary for a fair presentation of the Tinancial Statements, but are presented to comply with certain State Statutory requirements and additional analytical data. The supplemental information has been subjected to the tests and other auditing procedures applied in the examination of the financial statements listed in the Index and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material aspects.
