Dedication - *Prescott and Helen Briggs*

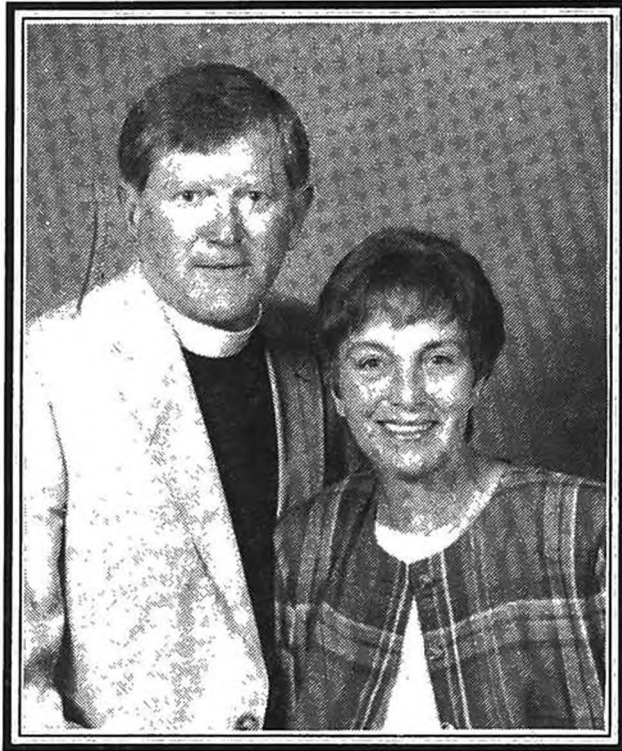


Helen and Prescott didn't always live in Sorrento. Helen grew up in Sullivan and Prescott was for a time in Gouldsboro, then Sullivan.

They started seeing each other during the war. Prescott was working in Bath then, so courting Helen was a little more difficult. Things were hard to come by and tires for your vehicle were one of them. Prescott would have to stop and patch his tires maybe several times in one trip. He had more patches showing than rubber. It must have worth the effort. The couple was married in the fall of 1945.

Work seemed to dictate where they lived. When their first-born, Sally, was young they resided in Florida. When their second child, Cindy, came along, they were living in Sorrento. Prescott was doing different facets of fishing. From seining to lobster fishing, and he also worked in the wood working shop making fine cabinets. Helen worked for some of the families in town. Except for a brief time, they remained in Sorrento and had two more children, Prescott III and Chris. Helen went to work for the VIA and is still giving years of dedicated service. Prescott retired from cabinet making and fishing, but is far from idle. The two are celebrating their fiftieth wedding anniversary this year. Every holiday that the family, now numbering fifteen get together Prescott always says to Helen, "Look what we started."

About Joan and Ted Petterson and a Town Called Sorrento



Even though it was 1973, Joan Petterson wore no polyester as she traveled across the bridge into Maine for the first time. Her two young daughters sat in the back seat resplendent in their hip hugger bell-bottoms and T-shirts. Leslie slept. Lynn looked out the window. A grape popsicle stick stuck to the back of the front seat. It was summer.

Tree leaves were flipped under side up by the wind when they arrived at the Hardy's house Down East. By evening the grown ups were playing cards by candle light and the children were upstairs telling scary stories. Outside the hurricane broke what was weak and cleaned the rest. Joan's husband Ted was delayed by work and spent the unnavigable night in a motel outside Augusta.

The morning after the storm was perfect. The sky defined "blue". The air defined "clean". The landscape was stunning amongst the debris. And Ted and Joan Petterson fell in love with Maine.

Next year they scraped together a much-too-large-percentage of their small annual income to rent a house in Winter Harbor. It rained all month and nobody cared. The craggy coast was beautiful in the mist and puddles were as much fun as the pool. On a rare clear day they went to Sorrento to visit Gam Hughson. Her hospitality was warm and the view, well, the view was unbeatable.

The following year Ted was invited to be the July rector for the Church of the Redeemer in Sorrento. Such a generous opportunity was accepted with delight. Sorrento stole their hearts that year, if you can call something stolen which is so willingly given.

Ted and Joan Petterson and their grateful daughters have returned to Sorrento for twenty summers and counting. If you asked them why they return every year you might hear a pause. Perhaps they would be wondering why they leave.

Maybe the essence of the question is best approached another way. Ask them instead why they cook a gourmet dinner every night, or why they cherish every moment sailing on the bay. Ask them about the way the people here wear like a favorite sweater. Catch Joan reading on the porch of the Rectory in the afternoon sun or Ted singing to himself as he sets up the church for Sunday service. It is in those moments that you will see the answer on their faces. Because their faces say clearly: "I am here right now, and there is no place else I would rather be."

1996 Assessor's Notice

In accordance with Title 36, M.R.S.A., Sec. 706, as amended, the Assessors of the Town of Sorrento hereby give notice to all persons liable to taxation in said municipality, that they will be in session at the Town office in said municipality on the 1st of April 1996 at 7:00 PM for the purpose of revising lists of the estates taxable in said municipality.

Owners

All persons liable to taxation in the Town of Sorrento, Maine and all Administrators, Executors, Trustees, etc., of all estates taxable in said municipality of such persons are hereby notified to furnish to THE ASSESSORS TRUE AND PERFECT LISTS OF ALL THEIR ESTATES, REAL AND PERSONAL, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the first day of April, 1996 and be prepared to make oath to the truth of the same and to answer all proper inquiries as in writing as to the nature, situation and value of their property liable to be taxed.

Estates Distributed

And when estates of persons deceased have been distributed during the past year, or have changed hands from any cause, the executor, administrator, or other persons interested, are hereby warned to give notice of such change, and in default of such notice will be held under the law to pay the tax assessed although such estate has been wholly distributed and paid over.

Persons Doomed

And any person who neglects to comply with this notice is hereby barred to his right to make application to the ASSESSORS or any appeal therefrom, for any abatement of his taxes, unless he furnishes such list with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to furnish it at the time appointed.

Notice to Dog Owners or Keepers

Licenses are due on or before January 1 of every year on all dogs 6 months of age or older, or when dog becomes 6 months old. Proof of rabies immunity must be presented when applying for license. Proof of spaying or neutering must also be presented unless this is already on record in the Town Clerk's office.

Under State law, an extra fee of \$10.00 must be paid by dog owner if license has to be collected by Animal Control Officer, by your name being put on warrant in April 1996.

Males/Females \$7.50* Neutered/Spayed \$4.00

Under new state law, dogs licensed after January 31 will pay an extra \$3.00 fee.

You may purchase the 1996 licenses as soon as I receive them in October 1995.

Report of the Sorrento Centennial Committee

The Centennial Committee created a history book, T-shirts and sweatshirts with the centennial logo, a Centennial Quilt, two church services, a parade and picnic, a special postmark, several pot-luck suppers, a Shoreline Improvement Project Plan with a dessert benefit for the purpose of sharing it with all Sorrento people, a silent auction, a yard sale, a birthday cake, planting under the sign entering Sorrento, an historical slide-show, a centennial exhibit, a street dance and a regatta. The V.I.A. sponsored a centennial children's parade with giant sub picnic, games, boat and fire engine rides and a Music Night.

A detailed breakdown of expenses and income for the Centennial Committee will be available at Town Meeting. The Town will need to vote on what it wishes to do with the balance of funds from this Committee. Please see warrant article.

Sorrento Fire Department

The Sorrento Fire Department began the 1994-95 fire season, along with most of the other fire departments from Hancock County, assisting the Sullivan Fire Department at the third largest forest fire in the County since the fall of 1947.

This fire burned over one hundred acres of woods on the afternoon of August 30. After evacuating thirty-four camps along the north shore of Flanders Pond and nearly getting caught themselves, fire fighters with the aid of helicopters from the Maine Forest Service were able to stop the advance of the fire by early evening. Camp owners were back in their homes by late evening, but the fire was not out. It was late in the night before fire fighters had the edge of the fire under control.

For the next six days as many as one hundred and fifty fire fighters a day from all over Hancock and Washington Counties continued to fight flare ups, spot fires, dig out hot spots and put a fire break around the fire area.

Many Sorrento Volunteers put in over sixty hours each on this fire as the Sorrento Volunteer Fire Department/Auxiliary assisted the Sullivan Fire Department Women's Auxiliary in supplying food and drinks to these fire fighters.

A hot afternoon on May 23, 1995 found us fighting another six acre blaze in Morancy that only slowed when the wind turned the fire back on itself. Units from Franklin, Gouldsboro, the U.S. Navy, Hancock and Eastbrook assisted Sullivan and Sorrento on this call.

Sorrento and Sullivan Fire Departments provide automatic mutual aid for each other on all structure fires and all other calls from 7 AM to 6 PM because of the reduced number of Fire Fighters (FF'ers) on hand during the day time. It is not unusual to have only four or five FF'ers in the two towns during the day. In the case of a structure fire, units from Hancock, Gouldsboro, Winter Harbor, Franklin, Lamoine and Ellsworth have all been called to assist Sorrento and Sullivan with fire fighting and or Station coverage in case of a second fire in town.

The edge of the community is not as easily defined as the town line. Almost everyone has family or friends in neighboring towns. As more training and equipment put strains on our time and budgets, we must find ways to share resources with the surrounding towns to insure our own safety as well as theirs. Every town in Hancock County now has signed the County Mutual Aid Agreement.

John Mickel and Timothy Guyette completed the Fire Instructor course in Ellsworth and will be helping with training of FF'ers and Junior FF'ers.

Areas of concern in 1994-95 continued to be Communications and automobile accidents.

Radio transmission sites and methods are being studied with the hope of eliminating

weak reception spots. Judy High and Walter Guyette attended Central Maine Fire Attack School for Communication Center Dispatching at Winslow in October, where we improved our dispatcher skills. Sorrento personnel acted as base for Sullivan nine times and Sullivan has provided base on ten of our calls.

There have been twenty accidents along Route One in the Sullivan area in the last year. Many of these accidents involved friends and families of Sorrento residents. Sorrento assisted at five serious accidents in Sullivan involving seventeen victims.

Sorrento was called three times to assist County Ambulance and three times treated injured Sorrento residents at minor accident sites.

Gary York completed a basic EMT course at Sumner High and is now Licensed and assisting County Ambulance at local emergencies.

All together thirty-seven emergency calls were received in 1994-95, one structure fire in Hancock, two structure fires in Sullivan and eighteen other calls in Sullivan.

Fire Prevention Week activities in October seem to be working as the number of child-set fires is still low in this area. Chief Guyette attended a two-day National Fire Academy course on child fire-setter intervention at Waterville in August '94 which helps us deal with this issue.

Joey Clark and John Mickel attended a two-day National Fire Academy course at Ellsworth for Safety Officers which should help us reduce the risks we take at an emergency.

Walter Guyette attended a two-day course for aerial operations and maintenance at the Central Maine Fire Attack School at Winslow.

Fifteen fields were burned and one hundred thirty-four fire permits issued. All fires other than cooking fires on your own property require a permit.

The Sorrento Volunteers have spent over 2000 hours in the last year working to protect the community at all hours of the day and night in all kinds of weather with little or no compensation. It is necessary to ensure they have the proper support and equipment with which to work.

Shoreland Zone Permits

Ten permits were issued from July 1994 through June 1995. One for a new house, four for additions and remodeling, two for new foundations, one for just an addition, one to replace an existing garage and one to do landscaping along the Town's waterfront at the Harbor.

Comprehensive Plan Committee

After many months of work, the Comprehensive Plan for Sorrento was submitted to the State who rejected it due to lack of growth management and not addressing affordable housing for Sorrento. Because the State wishes to limit growth in rural areas and promote growth in urban areas we had to convince the State that Sorrento didn't fit the mold.

The Village area has nearly reached maximum growth, and the area North of the junction of east and west Rt. 185 was the only area left.

A point system to encourage protection of the scenic appearance of the countryside and village along with Site Plan review and better Subdivision rules to promote affordable housing met with State approval.

In February copies of the key issues and findings, recommended goals, policies and implementation measures along with the results of the public opinion survey were sent to all the resident taxpayers with a notice of Public Hearing that was held in late February. At this hearing changes concerning the wording of the Marine and Public Facilities sections were made.

In August copies of the key issues and findings, recommended goals, policies and implementation measures along with the results of the public opinion survey were sent to all the non-resident taxpayers with a notice of a Public hearing that was held in early August. All resident taxpayers were mailed notices of this Hearing. No further changes were suggested at this hearing and the plan was voted on and passed at a special Town Meeting August 23, 1995.

911 Enhanced Committee

This committee has met several times during the year working toward an address system for Sorrento that will meet the State and Federal Standards. These standards are needed to make it easier for Emergency Services (Ambulance, Police and Fire) to find every location in Town.

The Town roads which require a name change have been identified. Hopefully, all the private roads with two or more residences or separate telephone service locations requiring names have been located.

A Town wide survey requesting suggestions for naming the streets/roads in question was sent out with the help of the Sorrento-Sullivan Rec. Center bulk mail permit. As we became aware of other private roads needing names, we contacted the owners.

Please see the Articles in the Town Warrant to see the results of the Survey and Public Meeting.

Also an Article to develop a 911-enhanced (street address/numbering system) ordinance is on the Warrant. The Committee will present a Model Ordinance at a later date.

98 percent of the Town has been measured and, pending acceptance of an ordinance and approval of State and Federal Agencies (notably the Post Office), street numbers will be assigned.

Long Pond Water District Report to Customers March 1995

The Federal Safe Drinking Water Act mandated that water taken from a surface pond supply (Long Pond) for human consumption, be tested and treated for numerous possible contaminants. Compliance is not an option! We are not alone. All water systems in the U.S. are experiencing the effects of this act.

We studied the alternatives. The district extensively explored using ground water from drilled wells, but a source to meet current & future needs could not be found. In order to continue to supply public water, construction of an expensive treatment plant was the only alternative.

To provide adequate system pressure, fire protection, and storage, our engineers recommended the construction of a stand pipe in the center of the distribution system. In addition the district is replacing the Bass Cove crossing main, which is inadequate and does not meet code. We are also replacing other substandard mains.

All this is expensive! But necessary. Not only will we experience a huge capital outlay, but also a large increase in operating costs and a sizable annual debt service requirement.

What will this cost the user? We do not know exactly yet. We obtained capital funding from the Farmers Home Administration (now RECD or Regional Economic Community Development). We obtained a loan in the amount of \$484,900 plus we received a grant of \$696,00 for a total of \$1,181,500. This agency will require the installation of meters and will closely monitor any rate increase which the district must seek from the Public Utilities Commission.

A guess today, is that your water bill will at least double or will cost you more than twice as much as you are currently paying. Bills will vary according to the customer.

You, the consumer will have an abundant supply of safe, clean, high quality water. This water will be more reliable (will not be lost in an electrical power outage) and will still cost the user less than drilling individual wells.

Construction started this fall on the transmission main and the stand pipe access road. The storage tank, treatment plant and building, etc., are expected to be completed during 1995.
