REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Gentlemen of the School Board:

I herewith present my third annual report. I would express, for myself and for the teachers, appreciation for the suggestions and assistance which have come to us from time to time, from you and from the interested patrons of the schools. This constructive criticism is of great help to us and shows a lively and growing interest in the school system of the town. Excellent progress has been made by the pupils during the year and the standard of scholarship in the High School and in the grades has been decidedly advanced.

COMMON SCHOOLS

Reference to the financial report will show a decided deficit in the Common School Account. This is due to two causes: the fact that all accounts this year include thirteen months' bills instead of twelve, and the fact that thirty-six weeks of school were furnished in the common schools. This made it necessary to show payment this year for forty weeks of school, something which never happened before. The deficit is in no sense due to careless management or to exorbitant salaries, as the tables in the Appendix plainly show, but to increased service on the part of the schools.

The schools of Bowdoinham rank high among those who know what good schools are, and it is the constant effort of the School Board to maintain this reputation.

At the beginning of the present year the number of grades in the elementary course was reduced from nine to eight. If it is possible, by intensive teaching and carefully regulated study, to fit pupils for High School in eight years instead of nine, there will be a decided gain, both financially and in the pupil's life. The course of study was arranged to meet this change and so far the new plan works very well. It is likely that for two or three years there will be an unusual number of failures at promotion time. If this is understood to be due to the double promotion given so many students in September, 1913, when a change from Grade III to Grade IV, for example, meant two years' promotion, these failures will not occasion surprise.

A new school was organized in the John C. Coombs building for Grades V and VI, and Miss Hazel R. Holden was put in charge. Miss Lottie M. Cobb was engaged for Grades III and IV and Miss E. Melvina Börjesson for Grades VII and VIII. Miss Hattie O. Andros was continued at the Primary School with two grades instead of three. The results have more than justified the added expense and have outrun even the sanguine expectations of those who originated the plan. It would be impossible to secure such results with the salaries which are shown in the tables, were it not for the fact that six of the nine teachers employed for the fall term are young ladies of our own town, bred, educated and trained at home.

TRANSPORTATION

The matter of transportation is always a source of more or less vexation. At present we are maintaining three teams only; one from the upper Post Road to the Post Road School, one from the Card Machine Road to the White School, and one from the River Road to the Bishop School. These teams cost together \$13.00 per week and a year of 36 weeks will require \$368 for transportation. It does not appear that any team now in use could be discontinued, hence at least \$500 should be voted for transportation of pupils.

TEXT BOOKS

No decided changes have been made in the text books in use the past year and no especial call is likely to be made in the coming year. Taking into account the bills approved and out standing, there is really a deficit of \$30 in this account. This is due to the fact that the following bills approved and paid from this year's appropriation were contracted in 1910:

As all bills are at present either paid or approved and reported, an appropriation of \$300 should be sufficient to meet our needs.

REPAIRS AND SUPPLIES

I am requested by the State Educational Department to report on the condition of each building used as a schoolhouse in regard to heating, lighting, ventilating and safety in case of fire. The John C. Coombs building meets every requirement in these respects, and as the light is admitted to each of the rooms from the left side only, every desk is well lighted even in the shortest days of winter. This is not true of the rural buildings; the lighting arrangement is poor in all of them, and in several new stoves should be procured. No serious danger in case of fire exists in any of our buildings.

General repairs should be made at all the rural buildings and the lot in front of the High School buildings should be graded. We recommend an appropriation of \$300.

STANDARD HIGH SCHOOL

To continue the good work which has been done this year in the High School, it will be necessary to increase the appropriation by \$100. It is possible that the tuitions may meet this need and that \$800 as raised last year may be sufficient, but tuitions are very uncertain as a source of income, and it seems safest to provide the necessary amount.

The State recognizes the school as a Class A school and thus

allows us to accept, instead of being obliged to pay, tuition for our High School pupils. The school has this year for the first time been placed on the approved list of the Board of New England Colleges, so that our graduates may enter any college which is a member of that Board, without examination, if certificated by the Principal. Any graduate may enter the University of Maine on his diploma alone without certificate. At the same time that the classical side of the school has been so much strengthened, an even greater advance has been made in the English-Scientific Course. This now embraces a branch of science in each year of the course, and gives an excellent preparation for pupils desiring to work for the B. S. degree.

NEEDS OF THE SCHOOLS

The schools need the hearty, cordial, appreciative co-operation of the people more than they need increased appropriations with consequent higher taxation. Some progress has been made in this line during the year, but more should come. Every person connected with the school department is giving freely of the best there is in that person, for the betterment of the system, for the good of your child. I hope you will appreciate the effort.
