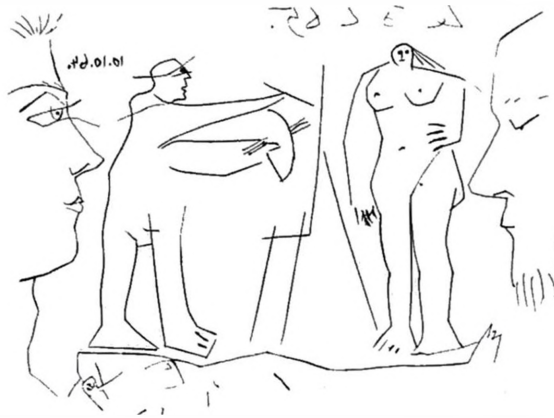

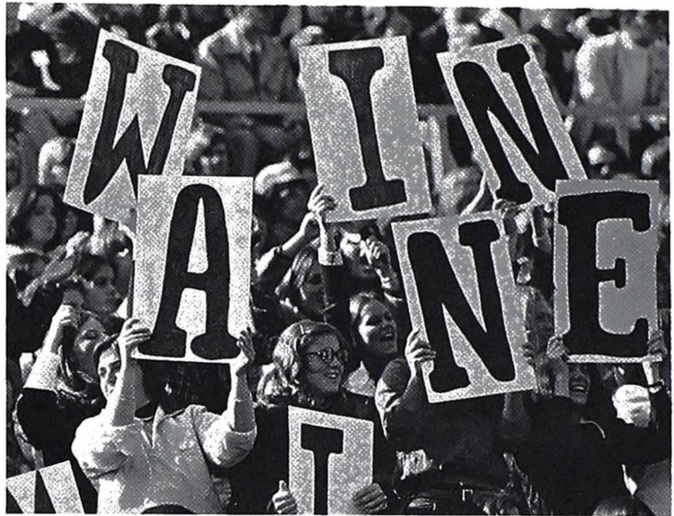

# A career women she is; A woman's libber she isn't

Petite but not diminutive; outspoken but not caustic; and 66 years old but very young only partially describe the quick-witted Dr. Louise Bates Ames '30, recipient of the 1974 Alumni Career Award.

Dr. Ames has had a career spanning 44 years as a child psychologist and is the author of over 17 books. Her work at the Gesell Institute of Child Development in New Haven, Conn. has made her a national authority on a child's psychological development. Familiar to many is her long-standing syndicated newspaper column "Parent's Ask".

When she came to Orono on Oct. 4 to receive her award she shared with us a great deal more than just the details of her career.

"Many women fuss about not getting equal pay—I don't think they should," is her opinion on the question of equal pay for women. One might expect to find a diehard women's libber in Dr. Ames considering the long and distinguished professional life she has followed. But you won't! She reasons women are not a good investment because they are so apt to leave and start families or move to wherever the husband's employment takes them.

In referring to the militant feminists she says, "I really think they carry on so, as if they discovered the whole business of discrimination. Some of these girls act as if women had never had any freedom or recognition. Personally, I have never felt discriminated against. Perhaps I was just fortunate."

Getting the vote for women, she states, is the thing that gave a future to women. She does maintain that some sort of career for a woman is very important but that to this day, marriage and the family are still the most important thing to most women. "After a certain point in your career you have done about everything you've wanted to do and succeeded as much as you are going to and so any further success or honor is nice, but one more honor is one more honor. Now with a family of children and grandchildren one always has a source of continuous interest. So no matter how important a career must be, a family is something that nearly everyone really needs."

Dr. Ames' wisdom has a sad irony to it. The mother of one daughter, Joan Ames Chase '52, she was divorced soon after her marriage. With her mother's help she raised her daughter amidst her bustling career. Early this year her daughter Joan, her son-in-law Robert C. Chase '53 and one of their three children were tragically killed

In her acceptance speech for the Career Award she talked of her success and faith. "Any success which I personally may have achieved is partly due to a combination of reasonably good heredity. Also, my good professional start here at Maine, hard work, and fortunate times in starting my career in the pioneer field of child psychology entered into it. Perhaps the best advice for me has been to be ready for what fate hands you, don't be too afraid of change and don't get hung up on the past—be ready for what the future has to offer."

Dr. Ames says that the University has been more than generous to her and has given her many things. Reminiscing about her college days brought out the very lively and warm side of her.

The Portland, Maine native transferred from Wheaton College to Maine as a junior in 1928. "There were two reasons why I came to Maine. All my friends in Portland told me what a great time they were having at the University of Maine. So I told my father I thought we were spending too much money sending me to Wheaton and that I could learn just as much for less at Maine.



And he said, 'That's the first sensible thing you've said in your life.' The second reason I came to Maine was that I was kicked out of Wheaton!

"When I came to Maine things were infinitely more liberal and the rules were much more realistic compared to Wheaton. At Wheaton it wasn't fashionable to study and get good grades. You sort of sneaked over to the library. At Maine you could do what you wanted—it was a much more democratic atmosphere.

"When I was going to college, people assumed when you finished school you would get a real good job and be set for life. Now I think as education becomes increasingly universal you might go through college but not be as such "rewarded". Of course, this assumes that money is the measure. I think higher education is extremely important. The idea of what it is going to bring you has changed. I think now it should increase your enjoyment of everything."



"And there were social differences between the two schools. At Wheaton people would say, 'Are you going abroad this summer?' and at Maine you heard 'Do you have a summer job?'"

Forty-six years ago this fall, Dr. Ames came to UMO and boarded with a professor's family at the edge of campus, in the building that now houses the Department of Police and Safety. She had to live off-campus because she was accepted on probation for one year. She still remembers the sign-out book, just for her use, in the front hall. Her senior year she moved to Mt. Vernon, a house-like dormitory. Her two brothers, John E. '33 and Silas L. '35, also chose to come to Maine.

Social differences between now and then at UMO, she says, are so vast that one can hardly compare the two. "I do remember how great the differences of class mattered." She also remembers the fraternity system. "I adored the whole thing. I just had the best time going to their activities." She was never a member of a sorority, though.

In comparing educationally the two eras she says, "There probably is much more intellectual interest now and the gap between the faculty and students has lessened. There are now more students really realizing that it is not so much the faculty's responsibility to make them learn or not, but that it is up to them."

Prof. Charles A. Dickinson, chairman of the psychology department, had a dream for Dr. Ames, then a young graduate in

1930, to one day work with the renowned child psychologist Dr. Arnold Gesell.

In the fall of 1933, after receiving her master’s degree from UMO, she went to Yale’s Clinic of Child Development as a research secretary and assistant to the director, Dr. Arnold Gesell, and worked with him until 1948. She received her Ph.D. in psychology from Yale in 1936. She was also curator of the Yale Films of Child Development from 1948-50. After the clinic split with Yale University, Dr. Ames and Dr. Frances Ilg founded the Gesell Institute of Child Development in Dr. Gesell’s honor. The institute is a private non-profit corporation for clinical work and research in the field of child behavior. Her work at the institute included clinical work, teaching, lecturing and research. She was one of the early pioneers of the Rorschach psychological testing in children and has written a great deal about it.

In addition, she has done extensive television work and for over three years did a television talk series with WBZ in Boston called “Child Behavior” which she thoroughly enjoyed. She is

the recipient of honorary degrees from both Maine and Wheaton College.

In her discipline feelings about child behavior are always changing. At the Career Award Dinner she amused guests with a quick 60-year summary on how the attitudes on child rearing have changed. “In 1910 parents were told to spank their children; in 1920 they were told to deprive them; in 1930, ignore them; in 1940, reason with them; in 1950, love them; in 1960, spank them lovingly and in 1970, to hell with them!”

“Throughout my work there is a basic premise that was instilled in me by Prof. Dickinson which I have always followed. Behavior is a function of structure. We at the institute are very biologically oriented and believe it is very difficult to transcend one’s genetic potential.”

The many books on which she has collaborated have dealt with the behavior of the infant and small school-age child. “Stop School Failure” and “Don’t Push the Preschooler” were among her most recent and most acclaimed books. The latter book she co-authored with her daughter the late Joan Chase, also a child psychologist. “Children should be started in school and subsequently promoted on the basis of behavior not age,” she contends and hopes will become the more popular belief. In conjunction with this she also believes that the same holds true for the elderly. “They shouldn’t be made to stop their activities or retire strictly on a basis of age but on the basis of behavior.” At 66, Dr. Ames is a prime example of a person’s behavior being much more important than age. “I don’t expect to stop right away,” she said of herself while she was on the subject of retirement.

For the past fifteen years she has also been working on the calibration of the aging process and has found it to be very similar to the development of child behavior only in reverse. She is currently developing a battery of tests to determine behavioral aging. She plans to publish some of her findings in the future.

The General Alumni Association has never given the Alumni Career Award twice to the same individual, but one has to feel after meeting Dr. Louise Bates Ames, that even after her 44 years as a child psychologist she still has the energy and the mind to do it all over again!

# Annual Alumni Fund offers young alumni a new challenge

This year the General Alumni Association celebrates 100 years as an association. In recognition of this occasion, the Annual Alumni Fund theme for the 1974-75 Campaign is "A Century of Progress."

Highlighting this year's campaign are two new programs for young alumni in the Classes '65 to '74 who represent 42 per cent of the alumni body. The special programs, which are designed to encourage support of the University through the annual fund are the Challenge Gift Program and the "25 for 5 Plan"

The Challenge Gift Program is sponsored by an alumnus who has offered a large Challenge Gift to appeal to the Classes '65-'69. For the contributions from these classes he will match, dollar for dollar, all new gifts. Also, any increases in gifts from current donors in those same classes will be matched by the amount of the increase. The aggregate total of his gift will be announced at a later time.

The program for alumni in the Classes '70-'74 recognizes that those alumni are recent graduates and are early into their careers, and may not be in a position to make large gifts. Arthur Nicholson, III '67 of Methuen, Mass., Chairman of Young Alumni, said, "I am asking these young alumni to help the University by pledging \$5 each year for 5 years. We call it the 25 for 5 Plan. Furthermore," he added, "strong support of this program would make a young class the leader in class competition for total donations and the leader in the percentage of class participation, as well as provide those needed funds for projects not funded by tax dollars."

John F. Wilson '33, of Barrington, R. I., the National Campaign Chairman, summed it up this way, "Young alumni have the opportunity to express their pride and belief in their University through a gesture which might be more within their means."

The General Fund Committee, which met during Homecoming Weekend on October 5, discussed the campaign schedule and reviewed the objectives of this year's campaign. According to Wilson, since '96 per cent of last year's goal of \$250,000 was achieved, a realistic goal this year would be \$275,000. This represents a logical step toward the five year goal of \$500,000 in 1978, which was established in August of 1973. "In a year such as this, when alumni are being asked to consider a contribution to a bricks and mortar campaign through the Second Century Fund and a second contribution for the on-going needs of the University through the Annual Fund, a successful campaign can be attained only through the wholehearted support and understanding of all alumni," Wilson noted.

Commenting on the Second Century Fund, Wilson recalled the message from "Woody" Hodgkins to all alumni in the Winter

Issue of the MAINE ALUMNUS, "a \$3.5 million Capital Campaign, and the Alumni Campaign with a goal of \$250,000 are being conducted almost simultaneously. . . Both efforts are absolutely essential to the continued excellence of UMO's education program. . . It has been agreed by the Alumni Council and Second Century Fund directors, that there will be no dual crediting for either dollars or participation. Gifts to the Second Century Fund will not be credited to the Alumni Fund or vice versa", he emphasized. "Both efforts involve alumni and each will stand on its own".

The schedule of the 1974-75 Annual Fund Campaign has been adjusted due to the activity of the Second Century Fund's alumni phase. The personal solicitation of nearly 2,000 alumni, normally held during November, has been postponed until March. This phase of the campaign last year generated 17 per cent of the year-end-total and was donated by 1000 alumni. Hence, in the wake of last year's success, twice as many alumni will be visited this year by alumni fund volunteers.

AAF phonothons showed promise in the 1973-74 campaign with \$22,000 in pledges in five evenings of calling and is expected to generate considerably more this year. Again, due to the success last year, the committee plans to expand their efforts and contact nearly three times as many alumni. The phonothons are planned for late April and early May.

The 1974-75 Campaign was officially launched by the President of the General Alumni Association, Ralph L. "Woody" Hodgkins '59 at the Alumni Council meeting during Homecoming Weekend with an appeal to the Council members. The council members set the pace by responding with a 25 per cent average increase over last year. The Alumni Council, the Annual Fund Committee and the Association Staff comprise the Advance Gift phase of the campaign.

John F. Wilson '33, National Campaign Chairman, announced that committee members for the campaign include: Thomas E. Desmond '33 of Chatham, Mass., Vice Chairman of Major Prospects, Clubs and Reports; Leonard N. Plavin '48 of Lewiston, Me., Vice-Chairman of Regional Solicitation in Maine; Eugene F. Sturgeon '52 of Kensington, Conn., Vice Chairman of Regional Solicitation Outside of Maine; Helen (Wormwood) Pierce '41 of Carmel, Me., Vice-Chairman of Class Agents; George P. Hitchings '37 of Darien, Conn., Vice Chairman of Matching Gifts and Corporate Programs; and Arthur Nicholson III '67, of Methuen, Mass., Vice-Chairman of Young Alumni.

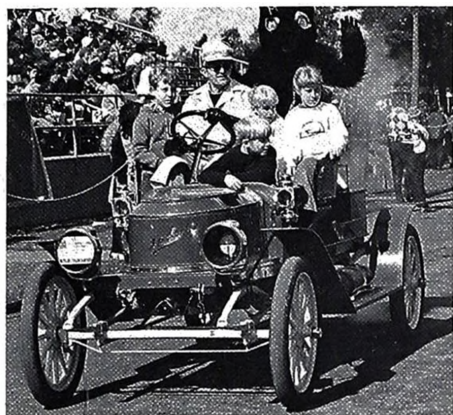
Nicholson, a new appointment this year, brings experience from a past campaign as former Vice-Chairman of the Honor Roll Club for the General Fund Committee in 1972.

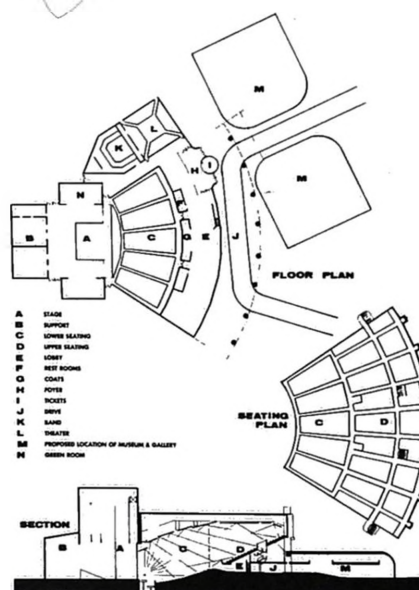

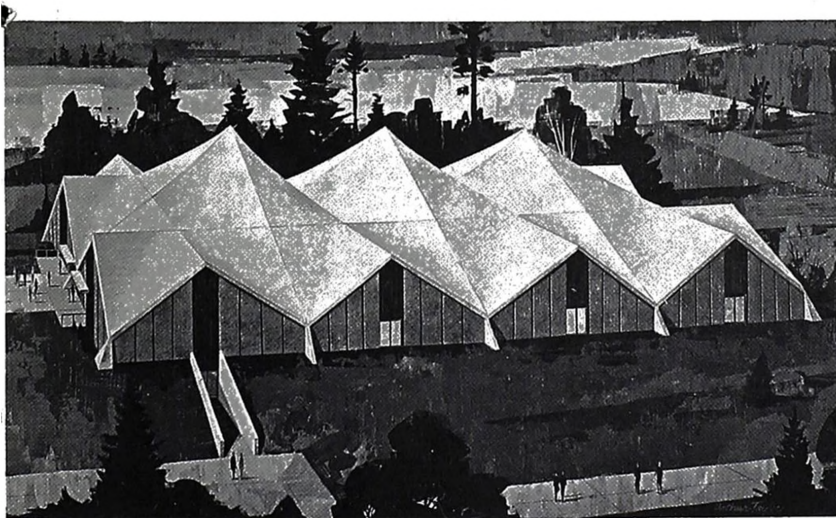
An active solicitation program has already begun in Franklin County and good reception is again being reported through initial contacts in the area.

The campaign volunteers in the alumni phase of the campaign will be able to report to their alumni prospects that more than \$921,500 was pledged during the first two phases of the campaign. 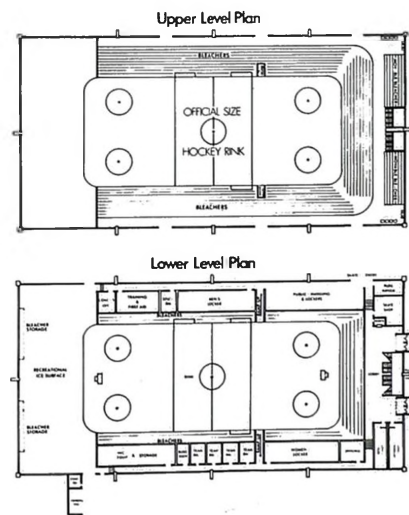
The successful completion of the on-campus phase of the campaign designated as the Official Family, surpassed its \$500,000 goal last May under the direction of Chairman Frederick E. Hutchinson '53, Dean of the College of Life Sciences and Agriculture. To date this division, which included trustees and friends, students, professional and classified employees, has reported pledges totaling over \$550,000.

Since Labor Day the second phase of the campaign, the Greater Bangor Area has generated in excess of \$315,000, despite an active United Way Campaign also in progress. Curtis M. Hutchins '29, Eastern Maine Chairman and John T. Maines '40, Greater Bangor Area Chairman, are presently leading this phase of the fund, which is slated to produce a significant amount of additional support.

Both Alumni and Greater Bangor Chairmen acknowledged the performance of the Official Family and believe they have demon-

strated a strong and encouraging desire to see these two facilities become a reality that will satisfy the campus' long-standing cultural and athletic needs.

Growing out of discussions initiated by former President Winthrop C. Libby and the UMO Development Council, plans call for the Performing Arts Center to seat 2,500 and provide backstage and other supporting facilities for cultural events. There is no comparable structure in Eastern Maine. In addition to the Performing Arts Center, funds have been committed for a Maine State Museum and art gallery which, together with the arts center, will comprise a fine arts complex. The Multi-Purpose Arena is projected to seat 5,000 for hockey games and other ice events and up to 7,000 when the convertible floor is used for non-ice events such as commencement exercises.

# “Fill the Steins to Dear Old Maine” Athletic grants-in-aid are approved

Heated trustee debates, pleased athletic administrators, slanted student editorials and some dissenting voices marked the recent passage of the trustee's decision to allow non-need athletic grants-in-aid at UMO.

Maine now joins all other Yankee Conference schools and hundreds of other schools around the country that subsidize athletes on a non-need or above need basis.

Granted by the trustees was the possible awarding of \$25,000 in grants-in-aid per year on a non-need basis. The National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) allows the largest single grant to be equivalent to the cost of one year's tuition, fees and room and board. In Maine's case, President Howard R. Neville has stated that the funds would probably be allocated in partial grants not ten full stipends, making it therefore possible to have as many as 40 grants.

The fight for passage began in July when the question of non-need aid to athletes was submitted to the Board of Trustees by President Neville and was reviewed by the Student Affairs Committee. Committee chairman Dr. Stanley J. Evans recommended the proposal to the board for passage with the stipulation that the grants be awarded under the strict rules of the Yankee Conference for a trial period of five years. Under these rules there is strict surveillance of the athlete to maintain an academically sound record. The board's vote was a deadlocked 6 to 6, with many of the opposed stating that they had not had time to study the proposal.

On September 25 the board did pass the proposal with a 9 to 5 vote giving UMO the okay for the first time in 114 years to award athletic grants. Opposing trustees John C. Donovan, Mrs. Susan R. Kominsky, Dr. Carroll R. McGary, Ms. Cynthia Murray-Beliveau and Dr. Nils Y. Wessel, reiterated their arguments voiced at the previous meeting.

Dr. Wessel, the most vocal of the opposition, said, "Any payment over and above the need is indefensible, whether it be to a flute player or a drum majorette." Accusations were made that Maine would be getting into professionalism or "pay for play" and that there was potential for possible abuse.

Proponents both on the board and off argued that Maine should be given a chance to compete on a scale with other Yankee Conference schools which have been awarding such grants. Accounts of how Maine has lost much talent through enticing scholarship offers from other schools have been cited.

President Neville says he is very much in favor of the aid proposal because he believes it will make UMO competitive in sports and that a winning team would also increase alumni interest in the University. Chancellor Donald R. McNeil supported the proposal also for reasons of upgrading the competitive sports status of the campus.

A very different view is held by Prof. Walter Schoenberger, faculty representative on the Student Affairs Committee, who says, "Maine is already competitive with other Yankee Conference schools. We have had winning teams many times in several areas and winning is competitive." Though he is a sports fan, he

opposed the proposal which he fears could lead to bigtime athletics which he believes would not be good for Maine. Schoenberger ran a survey to search out a consensus from the faculty on the question. His returned surveys ran nearly two to one in favor of the proposal.

On the other end of the scale there were those who were disgruntled over the passage because in their minds the \$25,000 allowed for grants would not be sufficient to make UMO competitive. Columnist Bob Moorehead in the Maine Sunday Telegram suggested the figure of \$100,000 should be reached for yearly aid to athletes.

Some of the most biting criticism of the proposal came from students, and in particular, the student newspaper, *The Maine CAMPUS*. It was this paper that coined the word "athleteships" in one of its earlier anti-non-need scholarship editorials, as the term for an awarding of funds to student athletes exclusively on a non-need basis.

The source of the to-be-allocated \$25,000 is to be private, through alumni and friends, stated Neville as he attempted to allay the fears of those trustees who questioned whether funds would be drained from academic sources. This also was the concern of Pam Kelly, a student representative from the Augusta campus on the Student Affairs Committee who believes there should be concern that the money might be diverted from sources serving student needs.

The vehicle for these private monies is the Black Bear Hall of Fame, an athletic aid program supported by alumni which was authorized by the Board of Trustees in 1971 on a need basis. For every dollar that is awarded to an athlete there needs to be additional dollars in reserve to carry on the scholarship for the remaining college years of the player.

Therefore, only a third of the money in the Hall of Fame can be awarded each year as grants. The current balance of the fund is \$21,000, which in itself could fund \$7,000 in grants-in-aid. Harold Westerman, director of physical education and athletics, hopes this total can be at least doubled for next fall to about \$45,000, which would make \$15,000 in aid available. Another avenue of funding can be made on an endowment basis to the University, through which the interest on the gift would be used to provide grants to athletes.

According to Lester J. Nadeau '59, executive director of the General Alumni Association, the athletic department will be working closely with the alumni office with programs of appeal for the alumni with athletic interests.

With officials not certain about the amount of funds to be available, no definite plans have been made as to how many grants will be awarded or on which sports will the aid fall for next year. Westerman has said that the aid will be divided among many sports, not just used to bolster one or two specific teams.

The first step has been taken. UMO is now authorized to award the equivalent of \$25,000 in non-need or above-need aid to athletes. This year the building of the funds will take place and next fall UMO should see the execution of the long sought after athletic grants-in-aid.

# Campus Capsules

The Board of Trustees has authorized the building of a center to house the **UMO Honors Program**, which was part of a proposal submitted by President Neville that will strengthen and more adequately define the program's actions and goals. The honors program's new home was designed by the agricultural engineering students and will be built with student labor.

Escort training for potential **professional tour guides** was offered this fall in the first course of its kind in the country. The fifteen-week course concentrated on training guides for the New England states, the Atlantic Provinces of Canada and Quebec in the areas of regional geography, history, government and economics, as well as the procedures and practices of tourism, customs and immigration.

The new dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, **Dr. Gordon A. Haaland**, was named this fall. Formerly chairman of the psychology department at the University of New Hampshire, Haaland received his A.B. degree from Wheaton College in Illinois in 1962 and his Ph.D. degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo in 1966. He succeeds Dr. John J. Nolde, who was dean for seven years before returning to a professorship in the history department.

**Watergate** and its aftermath have entered the classrooms at UMO as part of a course on American Constitutional Law. The constitutional questions of impeachment have greatly enlivened the course according to course instructor Dr. Eugene Mawhinney '47. The journalism and psychology departments have also made revisions with certain courses to include the many Watergate related questions.

**Dr. Eldred W. Hough**, former dean of the College of Engineering and Science, will become the first professor of petroleum engineering at Saudi Arabia's College of Petroleum and Minerals in Dhahran. He was invited by the Saudi Arabian government to initiate a program of study in petroleum engineering and to establish a research laboratory for teaching and service purposes. He is on a one year's leave of absence from UMO.

Personnel are puzzled at the **ROTC** department on campus since this fall's enrollment experienced a surprising 28 per cent increase. Currently 115 students, including 17 women, are enrolled. Reasons for the large increase are not forthcoming from the personnel, but Maj. John E. Winslow, assistant professor of military science, says, "Perhaps with the youngsters coming into college, Vietnam is a lifetime away and not so much an issue."

**The Empress Farah of Iran** was presented with a watercolor done by Professor Vincent A. Hartgen as a gift from Dr. and Mrs. Lloyd Elliott. Dr. Elliott, former president of UMO, is the president of The George Washington University in Washington, D.C. and visited Iran to present a Doctor of Public Service degree to the Shah of Iran.

A new house has opened on campus this fall that is not a fraternity or sorority house but rather a **child care center**. Funds for the center have come from both the student government and the Al Stodder Fund. The center is free for those children who are eligible under Title IV A of the Social Security Act of the Priority Social Services Program. Work study and volunteer students work with the paid director of the center to care for the 20 children.

A family course on **energy conservation** is being offered at UMO this fall for no credit but for many good reasons. Insulating techniques and products, efficient use of electricity and the effect of humidity/condensation control are the topics to be discussed. A \$10 registration will be offset by large savings in energy conservation for many families enrolled.

The night before **Halloween** held a special treat for Orono students this year because it was passed that classes on the afternoon of Oct. 30 would be cancelled in order to have some time in mid-semester to "let a little steam off" for both students and faculty. Games, contests, special meals in the dormitories and live music were scheduled for the afternoon.

Top academic and sports honors were presented to fraternities Oct. 28 at the Fraternity Board honors banquet. **Alpha Tau Omega** was presented with the Sigma Chi Foundation Scholastic Trophy because their 70 members collectively attained a 2.80 grade point average. The B. C. Kent Memorial Athletic Trophy or All-Points Trophy, was awarded for the fifth consecutive year to **Phi Eta Kappa**. This award, established by alumnus Benjamin C. Kent, is awarded to the fraternity scoring highest overall in the intramural sports.

A **Graduate Center** has been established at Estabrooke Hall to better meet the needs of the graduate population on campus. The center will cater to the social, academic and cultural areas of graduate student life. A graduate student office, a program for career placement and the initiation of an intramural sports program are all part of the program which has placed a greater emphasis on the graduate student.

The Department of Residential Life is sponsoring a **tutorial service** program manned by students for students. An experimental tutoring service by students was very successful last year and showed a clear need for an expanded program. Over 75 students are participating in the tutoring which is designed as a one-credit course for the tutors, entitled Volunteer Student Involvement.

The **Maine Public Broadcasting Network** hopes to relocate in a new \$2.9 million building on campus if the Maine legislature approves a construction proposal which was submitted by Chancellor Donald R. McNeil. The Board of Trustees approved the plan which is being proposed because of an acute lack of space in their current quarters in Alumni Hall. A possible relocation site being considered is as an addition to the proposed Performing Arts Center.

## Book Review

### Ruth Crosby publishes Yankee trilogy

*From an Old Leather Trunk by Ruth Crosby, Professor Emerita of English at UMO. She taught English from 1929 to 1962. The Christopher Publishing House, North Quincy, Mass. \$5.95 illus. cloth.*

"In an unused workshop at our Red House in Bethel, Maine, is an old brown leather trunk with a rounded top. . . From it came Samuel Rugg's Family Register. . . The Journals kept by Clara Newhall and Benjamin Conant during their association with Father Kemp's Old Folks Concert Troupe. . . And finally from it came Daisy A. Crosby's A Brief History."

From these documents, some dating as far back as 1801, Ruth Crosby has compiled a family trilogy detailing the colorful lives of five generations of New Englanders. Staunch, stubborn and creative, these individuals are remarkable for their solidarity in matters of family, religion and state and for their devotion to beauty and quietude, both in nature and in themselves.

From the vitality of Samuel Rugg, with his inventions, opinions, and manifold interests, to the staunchness of his great grand-daughter, Daisy Crosby, one can trace the same delightful streak of good humor and energy throughout. But, again, it is their assortment of interests and their ever continuing capacity to enjoy life which is most heartening to the reader.

Part One—Tory Patriot—is derived from information supplied by a patent, a lecture, and a notebook of miscellaneous jottings. It shows Samuel Rugg of Lancaster, Massachusetts, to have been a man of many talents: a Tory in politics but a patriot from his youth and an ardent admirer of Washington, a farmer, an inventor, a storekeeper, a toll collector, a student of the Bible, an amateur physician and dentist, a musician, and a poet.

Part Two—Old Folks' Honeymoon—is based on family letters and the journals of Samuel Rugg's granddaughter, Clara Newhall, of South Reading, now Wakefield, and Benjamin Conant of Littleton. It describes their association with Father Kemp's Old Folks Concert Troupe, their marriage, and their subsequent tour of England with the singing group.

Finally, in Part Three, Ruth Crosby shares with us an intimate, life-long account of her mother, Daisy Conant Crosby, along with pictures and excerpts from her personal diary. It is aptly titled *A Mother's Image*, but Ruth Crosby does more than give the reader a personal account of her mother. Instead, she traces the tender, courageous story of a young woman and family, from her early childhood until her ninety-sixth year (1968)—a unique story.

## Clifford G. McIntire '30 dies at 66

Clifford G. McIntire, former Maine Republican Congressman and member of the class of 1930, died on Oct. 1, 1974 in a Bangor Hospital after a fall he took on Sept. 23 at his home in Perham, Me. The 66-year-old agriculture specialist had recently been appointed by President Ford to serve on the Board of Directors of the new U.S. Railway Association.

McIntire received an honorary LL.D. in 1955 from UMO and was also bestowed honorary degrees from both Bowdoin and Maine Maritime Academy. A graduate in agronomy at Maine, he



was a member of Alpha Gamma Rho fraternity and was a potato farmer before joining Congress.

From 1933-47 he worked with the Farm Credit Administration in Springfield, Mass. In 1947 he became the assistant general manager of the Maine Potato Growers. His congressional career began in 1951 and continued until 1964. During that time he served on the House Agriculture Committee. From 1965-72 he was the director of the National Resources Department of the American Farm Bureau Federation (AFBF). Then for two years before his retirement in 1974 he was the AFBF legislative director in Washington.

The Black Bear Award for outstanding loyalty and devotion to UMO was presented to him in 1971. He was a past president of the Northern Aroostook Alumni Association. He served on the Alumni council from 1948-62. He is survived by his wife, Wilda Holts McIntire, one son, Blynn '57 of Dallas, Tex.; one daughter, Mrs. Malcolm (Patrice) Andrews '58, of North Smithfield, R.I.; one brother, Smith McIntire '32 of Perham, one sister and six grandchildren.

## Young alumna joins the Board of Trustees

Ms. Cynthia Murray-Beliveau '70 of Wayne was confirmed as a member of the Board of Trustees for the University of Maine in September. She is a guidance counselor at the Winthrop School System and received her master's degree in counseling and guidance in 1973 from UMO.

Ms. Murray-Beliveau, who replaced Mrs. Lucia Cormier on the board, is the youngest trustee. This newest member joined the Board of Trustees amidst the fight over non-need athletic grants-in-aid which at the Sept. 25 meeting she voted against.

## Cooper scholarship fund established

In a bequest from the estate of Gladys R. Cooper of Belfast, widow of the late Ralph L. Cooper '03, a Memorial Scholarship Fund has been established in the amount of \$71,739. The income from this fund is to be used annually for needy and deserving scholars (male or female) who are residents of the city of Belfast, Maine, who are graduates of the Belfast Area High School, and who are desirous of attending UMO. Ralph Cooper, the owner of a retail lumber business in Belfast for many years, died in 1947. The name of the fund is the Gladys R. Cooper Memorial Scholarship Fund.

## Huard comes back to Maine to coach

John R. Huard, known to many in 1965 when he was middle linebacker named to the Little All-American team and went with the Black Bears to the Tangerine Bowl to win the Lambert Cup, was back on the football field at Alumni Field this fall as assistant varsity football coach.

The 1967 alumnus was drafted by the Denver Broncos of the AFL after graduation from UMO and was coached by Lou Saban, now coach for the Buffalo Bills. He immensely enjoyed professional ball and called it a "dream come true" to play but opted for the position on the UMO coaching staff because he was unhappy about the continuous hassles with contracts. After four years with the Broncos he was traded to the New Orleans Saints. Following an injury playing with the Saints he became a free agent and played with the Montreal Alouettes in the Canadian Football League for two years.

Huard holds two records that still stand today in UMO football. They are for the most unassisted tackles in one season, 105, in 1965 and for the most assists on tackles in one game, 12, also set in 1965 against Vermont.

The major differences between playing college and professional ball, Huard says, are the ability to move and hit. The Black Bears, with Huard's coaching assistance this season, brought in a four win and six loss season, with a highlight being a 7-0 victory against UCONN on their field—which has not happened in twenty years.

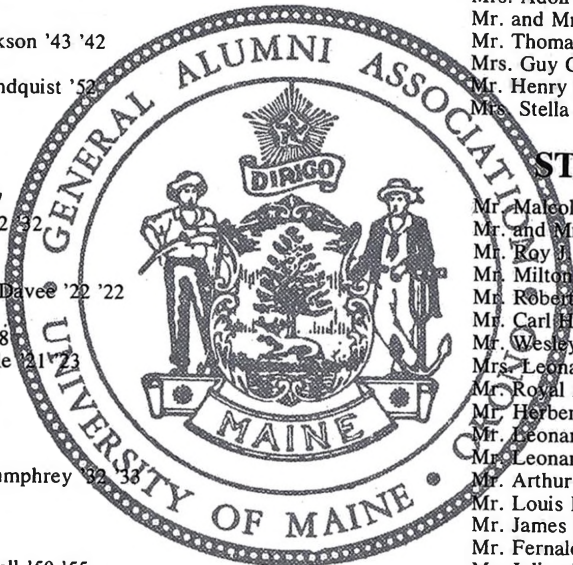

## Educator Extraordinaire

"I have no regrets. If I had it to do all over again, I would not have done things differently," said **Dr. Mark R. Shedd '50** in December of 1971 after resigning as superintendent of Philadelphia public schools because of pressure from the then police commissioner and mayor-elect **Frank Rizzo**. This action was not surprising for this progressive educator who has since been a visiting professor of education at Harvard's Graduate School of Education and in May of this year was named Connecticut's commissioner of education.

A teacher in Caribou and Auburn, Maine schools soon after graduation, **Dr. Shedd** went on to Connecticut in principal and supervisory positions. He received his master's degree from UMO and his Ph.D. from Harvard University. He served as superintendent of schools in Englewood, N.J. for three years before tackling the position of superintendent of the Philadelphia system in 1967.

In these positions he gained the mutual respect of students, teachers and fellow administrators alike. He has been called "an educator with a reputation for fresh ideas." In New Jersey he set up one of the first segregation programs in a northern state. He accepted the Philadelphia appointment fully knowing that the system was deteriorating and was on the verge of explosion. His dispute with Mayor **Frank Rizzo** was a matter of differing ideologies in running the system. Charged with fostering permissiveness in the schools, **Dr. Shedd** countered, "I don't believe I was hired or committed to run an educational system like a prison system." One of his more progressive programs was the initiation of a "school without walls", a learning experience based upon working on jobs in the field.

**Dr. Shedd's** challenge with the Connecticut system is one of equity in fund allocations to the many town school systems in the state. Also broadening the career preparation for students and providing a strengthened program of professional development for teachers and administrators are priorities he has set.

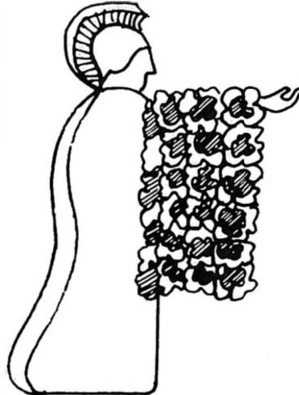
