President

Profita joined the GAA council in 1975. Within a year, she became a member of the executive board and in the span of four years, was elected second vice president, chaired the executive board, and was chosen first vice president. In June, "Jo" became the first woman GAA president. She lives in Bangor, ME.



Torrey A. Sylvester '59
First Vice President

Sylvester, a Houlton, ME attorney, joined the council in 1975 and within two years, agreed to spearhead UMO's alumni fund. As national campaign chairman, he used a "personal appeal" to meet the GAA's record goal of \$450,000. Torrey is commander of a U.S. Naval Reserves unit in Bangor, ME.



William D. Johnson '56
*Second Vice President
National Fund Chairman*

This Mobil Oil Corporation executive from Topsfield, MA, directed the national fund campaign in 1979, just two years after he joined the council. This year, Johnson will serve an unusual second term as fund chairman, seeking a record goal of \$650,000 from alumni around the world. Under his guidance, last year's Alumni Fund brought in \$540,771 — the largest amount ever raised in a single year.

Sprague was elected to his first three-year term on the council in 1980. He served an "apprenticeship" under outgoing treasurer, Jim Webster '59. Sprague not only watches the GAA's assets, but also reports to the management of the Bangor and Aroostook Railroad in Bangor, where he is vice president for public relations and personnel.

UMO alumni, who gathered in June for Reunion '81, awarded former General Alumni Association president, John F. Wilson '33, the coveted Pine Tree Emblem Award for his service in promoting alumni work. Wilson was cited at the annual ceremonies for his near-50 years of business and alumni organizing success.

In other matters, alumni gathered for outdoor ceremonies to dedicate the oldest building on campus to Charles E. Crossland, who at 86, has devoted more than 67 years to the university, including a term as acting UMO president. In his honor, North Hall was renamed the Charles E. Crossland Alumni Center.

Elected president of the GAA was Josephine M. Profita '38, of Bangor, the

first woman in the history of the GAA to hold that title. Others elected were Torrey Sylvester '59, of Houlton, first vice president; William Johnson '56, of Topsfield, MA, second vice president; Richard Sprague '51, of Bangor, treasurer; and Barbara C. Barker '39, of Longmeadow, MA, clerk.

Named to second three-year terms on the GAA Council were Barbara Barker, Preston W. Hall of West Boylston, MA; Carroll R. Pickard of Hermon, ME; Janet U. Sweetser of Auburn, ME; and Fred T. Tarr of Lexington, MA. First-term councilors named were Owen Bridgham of Bar Harbor, Dr. Norinne Fitzgibbon of New York City and Debra Scott of Shrewsbury, MA. William C. Farnham of Brewer will serve on UMO's Athletic Advisory Council.

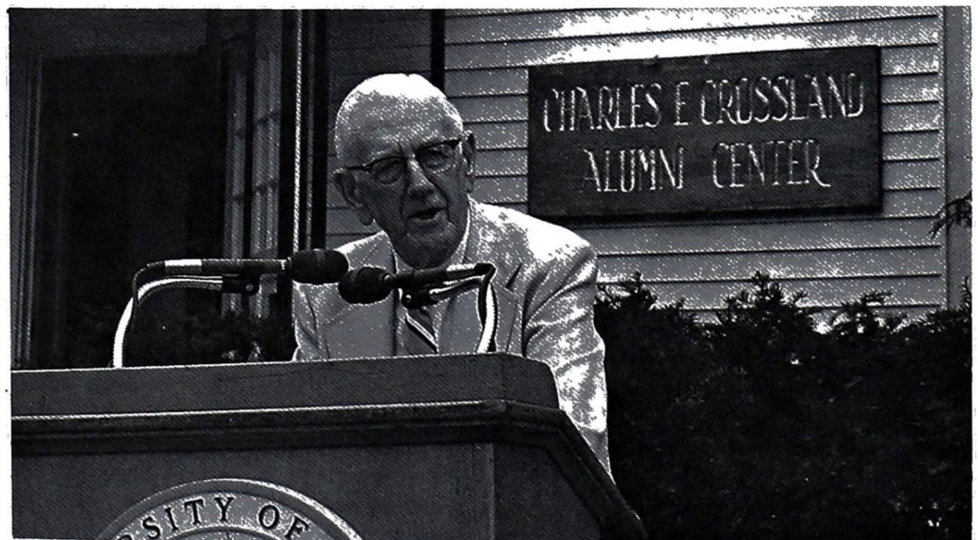

Generous Webber Trust Names School of Forestry

G. Peirce and Florence Pitts Webber, who represent the fourth generation in management of Webber Timberlands, named the University of Maine Foundation one of three beneficiaries of a generous trust fund.

During the next two decades, the Merrill Trust Co. of Bangor will pay the university's School of Forest Resources more than \$240,000 for scholarships, equipment, professional staff and research.

Webber, 71, a Harvard graduate, is former president of the University of Maine Foundation. "I would do anything to help Maine," he said in July. "My wife and I were brought up in Maine and now is the time for us to plough some of that back into Maine."

All the News of Fish in Print

'75 Alumna Educates Crusty Fishermen

STONINGTON, MAINE — This small, coastal town is the home of a tiny publication with the ambitious goal of educating the New England fisherman, the crucial first step toward what many see as the political and economic awakening of the industry.

Unlikely as it may seem, *Commercial Fisheries News*, as this instrument of industrial transformation is called, is headed by a 29-year-old woman.

Robin Alden Peters, who has never fished for a living, is trying to educate the crusty, independent (some say stubborn) and almost always male New England fisherman.

Commercial Fisheries News focuses on anything of interest to the nearly 5,000 fishermen who currently subscribe for \$12 a year.

The monthly tabloid reviews the Federal Register and reports extensively on regulatory and legislative developments. "We've always tried to be the paper of record," said Peters.

The newspaper is not strictly a government watchdog, however. It contains the fishing equivalent of a people column, articles on new equipment and technology and even a recipe column for the fisherman at sea.

The paper's simple, five-room office is located on the top floor of a large white house with a view of Stonington's harbor. Downstairs is the town library, open 1:30 to 4:30 on Tuesday and Friday afternoons.

Peters is a member of one of the industry's most important and most maligned regulatory bodies, the New England Fishery Management Council. Her newspaper provides considerable coverage of the council's activities.

Perhaps one of the major reasons *Commercial Fisheries News* is well accepted is its lack of competition. The fishing industry is probably one of the least understood and most poorly reported industries in the region.

"I can understand why that's true," said Peters. "It is a different society. It's a whole new language to learn. It is something that's difficult to walk right into and make any sense of."

The same was true in 1971. Peters, who grew up in the Belmont-Cambridge area, was part of the first coed class at Yale. She had just finished her second year and was tired of studying medieval history.

She took off for Maine ("it was small enough that you could do something and it would matter") and wrote some articles on the local fishing industry for the weekly newspaper in Stonington, the *Island Advantages*.

Peters returned to school at the University of Maine at Orono in 1975 and completed an economics degree. She also worked as a fisheries extension agent. Despite financial uncertainties, it was decided in October to transform *Maine Commercial Fisheries* into *Commercial Fisheries News*. The shift to regional coverage has not been easy and a look at a map shows why.

Stonington is a long way from Portland, let alone the region's major ports of Gloucester, New Bedford and Point Judith, RI.

Peters hopes to overcome parochialism by expanding the board of directors to include representatives from southern New England and by covering issues of interest to all fishermen.

Her degree of success will undoubtedly affect not only the future of *Commercial Fisheries News*, but also of the entire New England fishing industry.

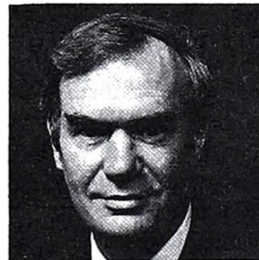

First Woman Alumni Council President

Have You Met Jo Profita?

For decades, the General Alumni Association of the University of Maine has overlooked the role and contributions of women in the male-dominated world of public fundraising.

The responsibility of appealing to UMO's graduates for support of their alma mater has rested chiefly with businessmen.

Making up for lost time is the GAA's first woman president, Josephine Profita '38, who joins the growing number of women in the nation's colleges and universities who are entering top-level offices in alumni associations. From the outset, Profita says she is not a champion of feminism, although she may look like that to others.

It is characteristic of Profita, when she tackles a new job, to plunge into it with energy, thoroughness, and total concentration. On most of her jobs, she usually puts in 12 to 15-hour days, seven days a week. Where other volunteers may tire or complain, Profita's life is marked with a sense of resolution, destiny and service to others.

Successful alumni council presidents are those who have achieved what they set out to do. They have created an image in which other people want to invest. In person, Profita is friendly and relaxed. "I work. I give everything I have to a project," she says.

To call her planning methods meticulous would be an understatement. Profita's story of successful fundraising comes at a time in history when women are not generally thought of as financial wizards. But there is nothing stagnant or conservative about the way she developed public trust in the arts and how she accomplished what others said was impossible.

Punctuating her talk with an easy laugh, Profita describes her early interests: "As a youngster, I studied violin . . . a half-sized instrument because of my own size. I was so tiny in grammar school that I sat on a big dictionary to play with the high school orchestra and became a show-

off." Although the former concert mistress was not destined for a stage career herself (she says she put her violin in its case on graduation day and left it there), Profita bares an undaunted loyalty to education and the arts.

A discerning and proficient linguist, Profita twice translated an Italian play into English for stage production, a task which came easily for the drama student of Italian lineage.

In the years which followed her graduation, Profita directed many Bangor area theatre productions and planned a life so full of alumni activities that standard calendars were inadequate for her schedule. Even today, she makes her own calendars and writes on each only what must be accomplished that day.

*"I've never been lazy —
I've never had time."*

Where others lean toward the aesthetic, Profita bends toward the practical as well. When her church needed \$80,000 to restore a rare 1860 vintage E. & G.G. Hook tracker organ, a national treasure, the parishoners of St. John's Roman Catholic Church in Bangor asked Jo Profita to raise the money.

Even for her, the task seemed gargantuan. For one year, she refused to quit, continually reached out, and fought with the dignity of her convictions against the indifference of many. She threw a gala Organ Restoration Ball, which netted the project \$11,500. Coupled with an anonymous donation of \$25,000, another Profita Project, as it was affectionately dubbed, was nearly half way to completion. "We got our \$80,000 and it makes me very, very happy," she said on the eve of a standing-room-only organ recital at the church.

Profita has also volunteered on the fundraising front lines for St. Joseph's Hospital Auxiliary, John Bapst High School, and, of course, the University of Maine at Orono.

In 1976, while president of UMO's largest alumni club, the Southern Penobscot Alumnae Association, Profita was the mainstay of a Second Century campaign drive, which not only netted more than \$100,000 to the coffers of UMO's Center for the Performing Arts, but bolstered the \$400,000 pledge from the Alumni Association.

"There is nothing more worth working for than the University," Profita told the *Alumnus*. "Whatever you put into it, you'll get back more. It may not be in dollars, but you'll get it back."

For 20 years, she has dutifully compiled news for the Class of '38 in this magazine. When a new editor inadvertently cut her long-standing signoff words, PEACE AND LOVE, from last spring's issue, Profita made a special appointment to ask that her license to express her own style be restored.

In the same manner, she would go to bat for any disgruntled alumnus. In an interview from her home, she vowed, "If I don't do anything else, I'm going to get to the bottom of alumni gripes. I want to make our image on campus and among alumni very strong."

"If you really like something, you do it. I plan just about every breath I take."

Profita joined the GAA council in 1975. Within a year, she became a member of the executive board. Then, in 1977, she was elected second vice president, a titular post which Profita later charged "smacked of tokenism." As she explained to the council, "I have never before held office that did not require work and more often than not, hard work."

Within two more years, she chaired the GAA's executive board and was voted first vice president. This year, she became the first woman to be named GAA president.

Profita also served on the Committee in search of a new UMO president and was the association's proxy at the winter inauguration of President Paul Silverman.

As if doubly blessed, Carmela Profita '34, Josephine's sister with whom she lives on Dartmouth Street in Bangor, has also brought organizational skills to bear on the Alumni Association. On the mantle in their living room, the sisters display look-alike Block M awards for the many tireless hours of service in the Bangor area, each has given to her class and to the Southern Penobscot Alumnae Association.

Despite her busy professional life, Jo Profita has also managed, over the years, to make time for the Eastern Maine Medical Center Auxiliary, the Bangor Symphony Women, the John Bapst Foundation, and of course, her church. This month, she will publish a book, written by a Jesuit priest, about the history of St. John's stained glass windows. As this issue of the *Maine Alumnus* went to press, the St. John's Parish Council elected Josephine Profita president.

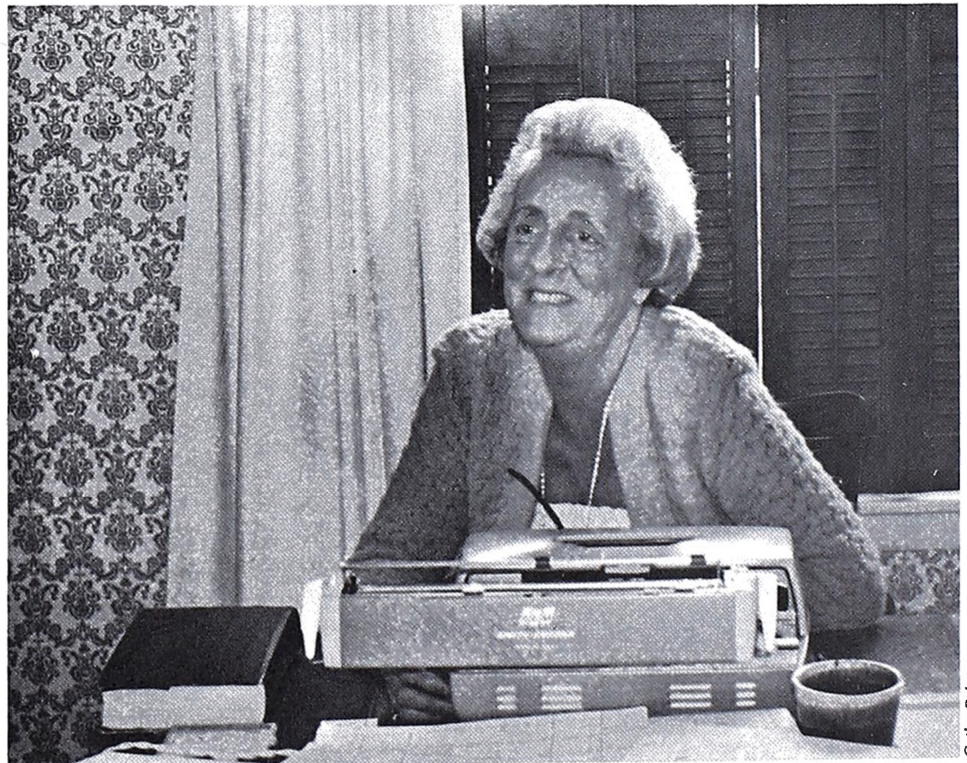
Her unspoken credo, "work hard and learn to say no when you must," is the

extra mile that spells the difference between success and failure. "I didn't get the job of GAA president because it was time for a woman," she told this reporter. "I was elected because of my abilities."

Recognizing her own limitations and the heavy GAA responsibilities, Profita told one group who asked her to take on another major fundraiser this year, "Nope. You'll have to get yourselves another chickadee."

In retrospect, Profita is a woman charged with unique energy, a force she uses to transform ideas into accomplishments. Indomitable warrior that she is, Jo Profita is never plagued with boredom. When her health was threatened last year, her response was, "God has been good to me and I'll keep working."

Vulnerable, sometimes even childlike in her personal warmth and humility, she once said facetiously about parishoners who look at the wonders she has accomplished for their church and call her God, "I haven't bothered to tell them the difference."

Planning a Trip to China?

It's Like a Trip to Nowhere Else

Tai Ch'i exercises at dawn, a kindergarten child performing kung fu, an ancient tomb, and a wall that can be seen from the moon — all these are China today.

More than one million visitors saw China last year, and the country is becoming *the* place to visit. For less than \$3,500, you can spend three weeks in this fascinating land.

I was lucky enough to fly into Hong Kong at night, and was treated to a magnificent view of a million lights. Our 12-member delegation boarded a train at Kowloon Station for the three-hour journey to Canton (now Guangzhou). Outside the train window were rice terraces, peasants, and water buffalo. Inside the coach, after a welcome in three languages, we were shown films and served tea, a courtesy which is extended continuously to guests in China. There were no local folk in our compartment. Visitors are all kept together for "ease in handling."

Our three weeks in the People's Republic of China (PRC) included Guangzhou (Canton), Guilin (Kweilin), Shanghai, Nanjing (Nanking), and Beijing (Peking). Guangzhou was like an old settee, worn and comfortable, but needing reupholstering. It was crowded, bustling, and friendly, but a little run down.

Guilin was the most picturesque. It looked like something Walt Disney Productions might have created. Shanghai was the biggest city, with a population approaching 11 million, and probably the most "western" in style. Nanking was smaller with three million residents. This city has served as China's capital several times, and is of great historical interest with its walls and tombs. The magnificent

Dr. Sun Yat-sen Memorial is there (see back cover of this issue) and the Yangtze River Bridge, the longest bridge in China over the longest river in China.

Peking, the capital, is the city most able to accommodate tourists. I was fortunate enough to stay at the luxurious Peking Hotel. Shanghai had excellent accommodations, too, but in a Guangzhou hotel I was on the 26th floor and, for a while, only one elevator of six was working. One advantage we had in every hotel was warmth. Nowhere else did we find heat — not in theatres, hospitals, museums, schools, factories, or homes.

Ideally, the time to visit the PRC is August. I went in March and found electrical storms in Guangzhou, bright sunshine in Guilin, rain in Shanghai, and light snow in Peking. Fortunately, the Chinese weather is as changeable as in the U.S. Take a folding umbrella!

Travel as lightly as possible. Take one top coat, only two pairs of shoes, and a minimum of clothing. Hotels have excellent laundry service. You'll need space in your suitcase for your Chinese purchases.

It will cost you \$3,000 to \$3,500 for a three-week tour. This sum includes airline tickets, hotels, and meals. Make sure your travelers checks are acceptable in the PRC. I bought Bank of America and had no trouble. Major American credit cards are just now appearing in China.

Excellent health is vital if you take a China tour; traveling to city after city is grueling. Be aware of the climate as you move among the different regions. I got too much sun in Guilin — certainly too much for a Maine man.

If you do become ill, medical attention is available. Cities have fully adequate

hospitals, and if you happen to be in the countryside, communes have clinics and hospitals.

Do NOT drink the water. Boil it first. Your hotel will provide hot (scalding!) water in a thermos in your room. You can make tea at any time of the day or night. If you need water to take your medication, pour it from your thermos and let it cool.

Mainland Chinese food does not resemble or taste like that served in Chinese-American restaurants, but it has tremendous variety in its combinations, textures, tastes, and smells. Some of the culinary specialties will puzzle and amuse you. One Szechuan menu, in English, read "Szechuan dishes are prepared from delicious *recherché* foodstuffs and cookery is specially famous for having numb, pungent, flavorful sour and sweet tastes of strong local characteristics." You can always find rice on the menu — and Peking Duck is magnificent.

Your money will go a long way in China. The exchange rate is approximately three yuan to two U.S. dollars (1.51 yuan = \$1). I had a haircut for six jiao, which is forty cents. Cinema seats cost a nickel or a dime, and live theatrical shows demand the lordly sum of 30-65 cents. Wooden, china, paper, jade, and ivory objects are but a fraction of their cost in the U.S. If you see something you want, and the price is right, buy it. Some items are sold in one place only, and some are sold everywhere, such as Chinese vacuum flasks, which must be the best in the world.

"Friendship Stores" in every major city are for tourists only, and sell many beautiful items, but I got more personal enjoyment from shopping among the

hundreds of stores for the local residents. Their low prices may seem ridiculous to "affluent" Americans. Whatever you buy will be of great interest to other people in the store. Smiling Chinese participate in *your* buying spree. Why is this foreigner interested in that particular item? You buy a jacket and hold it in front of you to check the size, and a dozen hands will come out of the crowd around you to finger the material. A dozen heads might nod happily that you're making the right decision.

You will also be a figure of interest in the street, theatre, park, or museum. Expect hundreds of people to stare at you. A few brave ones may stop and try to speak English to you. Nowhere have I found more charming and amiable people than in China.

If you love young children, those in China will entrance you. Their parents may be drably dressed in dark blues or greens, but the children are in very colorful garb. I visited kindergartens (3-6 year-olds) and received a tremendous welcome from the smiling, dancing,

Peking's Forbidden City, Temple of Heaven, Tien An Men Square, Ming Tombs, and the spectacular Great Wall. In Nanking, visit the Yangtze River Bridge, a magnificent structure, and particularly the Sun Yat-sen Memorial and Mausoleum. Two places I personally found quite exhilarating were Canton's National Peasant Movement Institute, where Mao Tse-tung and Chou En-lai had taught, and Shanghai's First Congress Building, site of the first secret meeting of the Chinese Communist Party in 1921.

There are also theatres, with exciting Peking and local operas, full of stage fights and acrobatics, colorful costumes, comedy, and loud music — and constantly chattering audiences. There are acrobatic, magic, and comedy shows, where one act follows another, reminiscent of American vaudeville or British music hall.

Museums are open to the public. Some depict centuries of Chinese history. Others are more modern, such as Peking's memorial exhibit of the life of Chou En-lai.

singing children. I was treated to gymnastics, dramatized fables, songs in English, minority people's dances, and even two boys and a girl (all aged six), engaging in a martial arts display — a sight to see!

Tippling in China is forbidden. It makes the receiver subservient to the giver. Instead, we gave colorful postcards to the children, and American books to our Chinese guides. Don't be condescending to anyone. Treat everyone as at least your equal. Guides are intelligent and speak fluent English. They will be friendly, bright, witty, and, above all, tolerant. For me, the highlight of my trip was the Chinese people, young and old. I loved the youngsters, but as I looked at the lined but peaceful faces of the grandparents, I wondered what their lives had been like: family members killed in civil war, or by famine and disease, the deprivation and poverty they may have experienced, and their newly-found dignity and calm.

Take lots of film with you as it is hard

to buy abroad. Even the most conservative tourists take snapshots. If you wish to photograph Chinese people, ask first; raise your camera and smile. Almost everyone will cooperate happily.

I felt safe in China at all times, even as I walked the city streets late at night. I saw no mischief, no fights, no drunkenness, no beggars, no belligerence. What was my biggest "problem" in China? Trying to cross the street! Just try to walk across six lanes of buses, trucks, and thousands of bicycles, as they blithely ignore traffic signals and bully their way through intersections! There is a constant tinkling of a thousand bicycle bells and the blaring of a hundred horns. As the old joke says, "If you want to be on the other side of the street, it would have been easier if you'd been born there."

Nighttime driving in China is hazardous only to Westerners. The Chinese are used to riding bicycles not equipped with lights or reflectors. Even buses and trucks use only parking lights when under way.

There are the usual tourist spots:

Write home a lot. Packages of brightly colored postcards range in price from 30-60 cents a dozen, and philatelists will prize the postage stamps. I have been back to Maine for some time now, but the 25-day trip is a vivid memory. And my several hundred slides enable me to relive the tour at any time. You could not come to know China in three years, let alone three weeks. I barely touched the surface of a tremendous heritage, an old world culture, a modern giant of one billion people.

If you are considering a major vacation, I suggest mainland China. It is a marvelous country to see, for its history, its scenery, and its people. Visit schools, colleges, theatres, factories, farms, stores, and the homes of peasants and factory workers. What you will learn of Chinese life will be invaluable. China is not just the Great Wall or the Yangtze River Bridge, wonderful man-made structures though they are. China is its people.

Going to China? When you return you will never be the same again!

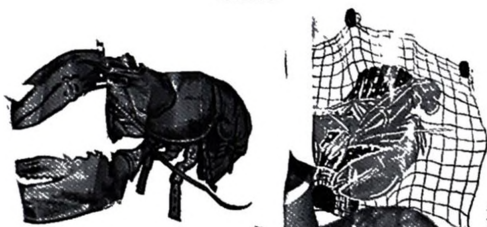
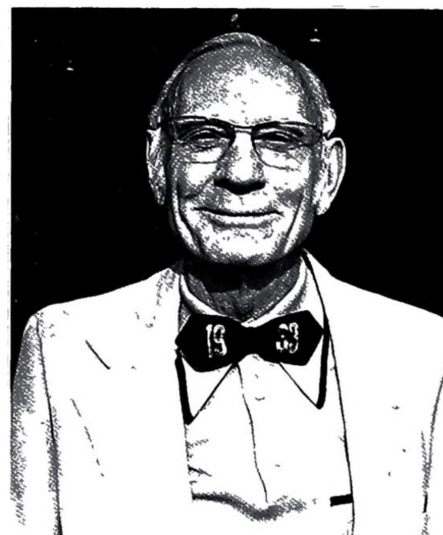

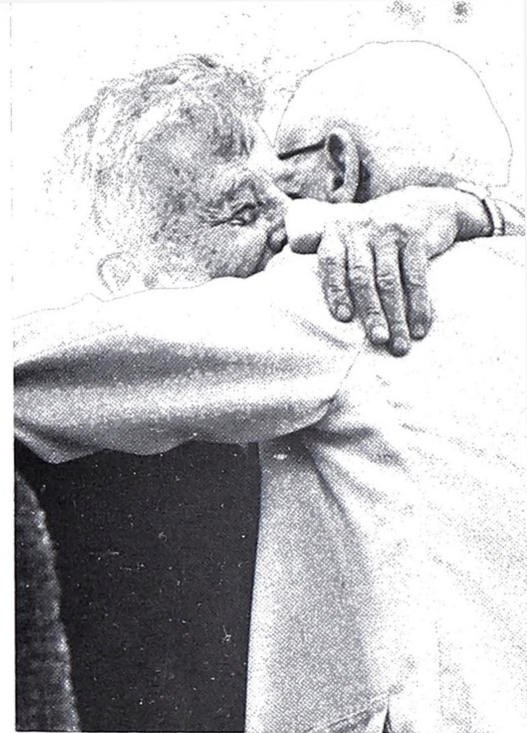

Rogerson Football: Win!

The dirt, dust and sweat caked on his face. He wore grass-stained pants and tucked under his arm a suspension helmet, emblazoned with the Michigan Wing. Ron Rogerson jogged past his teammates, Alan Riley, John Huard and Walter Hirst, on his way to the showers of the Memorial Gymnasium.

It was early October of 1964, and head coach Hal Westerman whistled the end of football practice. For Rogerson, it was a long day but his work had only begun. The college junior left the Orono campus and hitchhiked home to Brewer to his parents' variety store.

It was his mother's and father's true grit, Rogerson said in an interview, which taught him the value of hard work. By laboring 20 hours a day, seven days a week, his family created a successful business. That same single-minded effort brought one of UMO's former football headliners back to this campus as the university's newest Black Bear football coach.

Rogerson knew he wanted to be a football coach when he played for former Brewer High School coach Larry Mahaney, now one of UMO's biggest athletic program supporters. "Larry Mahaney introduced me to football and left me with such a positive attitude toward the game, I knew then that I wanted to be a coach," says Rogerson.

He also credits Harold "Westy" Westerman, Jack Butterfield, Walter Abbott and Dave Rand for managing a "first class football program" in the 60's, when Rogerson was an undergraduate.

"They taught me much more than blocking and tackling."

"I'm one of the few men who can't wait for the alarm to ring in the morning and get the day going," says Rogerson, who, at 38, takes over the reins from former UMO football coach Jack Bicknell. Rogerson worked 10 years as assistant coach at the University of Delaware, before he took over the UMO post in February.

Football players at Maine, though steeped in tradition, have seen only two winning seasons in the last 15 years. The Bears have not lost their reputation, however, as a hard-hitting team that plays tough, regardless of the score. "The Bears will be more than competitive this fall," Rogerson says. "They'll be downright dangerous."

"Our coaches are dedicated to making our players the finest student athletes," he says. "Our football program is a continuation of their education. Obviously, success must also involve winning football games. I've never been afraid of a challenge."

"Enthusiasm is my trademark," Rogerson adds. "I love the pressure of my new job, being around people — especially the young, totally committed staff who are dedicated to making Maine a winning football program. That's the kind of thing that turns me on."

"I made an early commitment to recruit outstanding Maine players," he said. "Even though we were late getting started, we were able to attract many of the finest in-state players." Rogerson hired his assistants Chris Raymond, Bob Depew, John Skladany, Steve Tosches, and Vince Martino to help him train more than 100 players during spring practice.

Rogerson married the former Ann Claverie in 1966, the year they both graduated from UMO. "My wife has been amazing," he says with a tone of relief. "She has always supported and believed in me, and stayed with me in the highs and lows. Because of the long hours of my job, she has taken much of the responsibility of raising our family." The four Rogerson boys are Greg, 13; Aaron, 11; Lincoln, 3; and Joshua, 1.

Ann and the two youngest children lived in Exeter, ME with her grandfather, Raymond Fogler '15, before the family could move into a new Orono home this summer.

Athletes Sign Pro Contracts

Kevin Buckley's glittering baseball career at the University of Maine at Orono has ended but there will be more baseball in his future.

Buckley, a .427 hitter for the Black Bears before the team swoon in the College World Series, was selected by Texas in the 17th round of the Major League free agent summer draft.

According to a sports writer for the *Portland Press Herald*, Buckley knew little about the hush-hush drafting procedure.

Buckley, though, isn't complaining.

"I've gotten the shot I wanted. Texas is fine with me. I would have played for anyone," said the third team All-American, one of two seniors on the UMO squad this season.

"As successful as our teams have been, you'd think we'd get more recognition," said the part-time relief pitcher. The Rangers drafted him strictly as an outfielder.

Buckley doesn't have an agent, "just a lawyer." Coach John Winkin said his star outfielder signed for a decent bonus. The UMO outfielder is happy for himself. "I did all I could do to get drafted on the field and it was out of my hands," he said.

Another Black Bear athlete also signed a pro contract earlier this season. Offensive tackle Andy Landers of Beverly, MA inked a football contract, as a free agent, with the Cincinnati Bengals of the NFL.

WOMEN'S FIELD HOCKEY:

Why Has Varsity Status Taken 50 Years?

It was the fall of 1923, and the first "Penny Carnival" was held to raise money to send varsity field hockey players to Applebee's English Hockey Camp in Pennsylvania for pre-season training. A pre-game rally sent the team onto Alumni Field, but, unfortunately, Sargent's School of Physical Education overwhelmed us, 9-0.

The women's field hockey schedule in 1924 included Connecticut Agricultural College, Dalhousie University, Lasell College and Maine Central Institute. All varsity games were "contracted" and guarantees ran as high as \$450. Varsity uniforms for women were long bloomers, white middy blouses, heavy black full-length stockings, and high-laced sneakers. In 1926, a freshman team was organized, Lengyel Field was built, and team members held special places at tables in student dining halls.

Field hockey competition for women ended in 1930 in favor of an extensive intramural program and "intercollegiate playdays." Because it was cheaper and benefitted more women, playdays and sportsdays continued for the next 41 years. They were alternately sponsored by UMO, Bates, UNH, Colby, and Nasson.

The "group" system of interclass competition began in the early 1930's. The upperclasswomen wore colored tunics and the freshmen wore their gym suits.

The first All Maine Hockey Team was named in 1931. Outstanding players were awarded prizes and the top competitor won the "M" award at the annual awards picnic. An "M Club" of hockey notables followed, and a traditional homecoming game pitting the All Maine Hockey Team against alumni became popular.

Field hockey regained its varsity status in 1971 when the Maine Association of Physical Education and Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (MAIAW) sponsored the first Maine State Field Hockey Tournament. In the last decade, playing

schedules have expanded from a four-game instate calendar to a 12-game schedule which includes Canadian schools like Mount Allison, University of New Brunswick (Fredericton) and McGill University, as well as out-of-state competition with URI, UVM, UMass, Providence, Plymouth and Springfield.

In 1979, the UMO women's hockey team saw its first year as an AIAW Division I team and the return of pre-season training. In 1980, the team won its fourth Maine State Championship, the first grants-in-aid for women in field hockey were awarded, and a full-time coach was hired.

Although the field hockey facilities have not changed, the program is improved. Ten years ago, a player paid for her own

meals, played only on weekends, only instate, traveled in station wagons, and wore old, light blue tunics. Today, our meals and lodging are paid, we play all week throughout New England and Canada, ride in chartered buses and wear new uniforms.

Although field hockey has been an Olympic event for men since 1934, the international competition was only this year opened to women. Public awareness of the game has increased since high schools have adopted tournament play.

At present, we are once again being recognized as a varsity sport and expanding our schedule. Women are being considered as contributing members of the "M Club" and guarantees are being weighed to encourage participation.

Don't Push Your Preschooler

by Louise Bates Ames, Ph.D. '30 and Joan Ames Chase, Ph.D., Harper & Row, 1980. 214 pages. \$11.95

In this book the authors recommend that parents relax and enjoy their preschoolers and let their minds alone. They point out that most young children learn to walk, talk, think — even to read — without vast adult interference.

Don't Push Your Preschooler can make the young child's life richer and more rewarding and will help parents understand child behavior in general and their own child in particular.

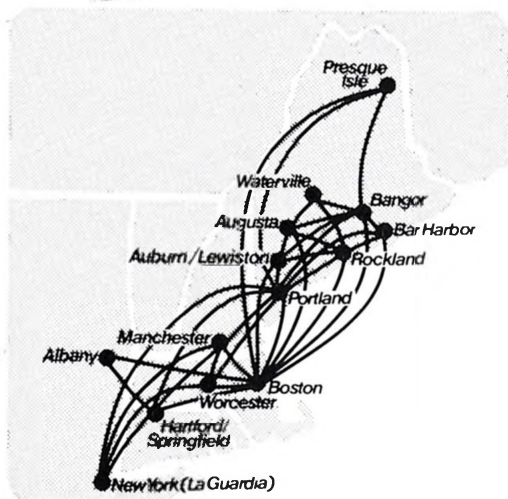
It should prove rewarding to parents that they don't *have* to follow all the latest gimmicks or take pressure-applied advice about child rearing. Given time, children will learn. Parents can neither claim the credit nor take the blame for the child's growth which happens naturally.

The chapter titled "School and Your Preschooler" sets out decision-making criteria for parents to consider when placing a preschooler. Ames and Chase write: "Nursery school provides an ideal opportunity for learning to get on with other people — not just with adults or older children who boss or give into him but with children his own age who have the same immaturities, awkwardnesses, and needs that he does."

Louise Bates Ames was one of the co-founders of the Gesell Institute of Child Development in 1950, to continue the work of the late Dr. Arnold Gesell, formerly of Yale University. Dr. Ames is coauthor of many books, including *Infant and Child in the Culture of Today*; *The Child From Five to Ten*; *Youth*; *Stop School Failure*; and others.

Dr. Joan Ames Chase was the daughter of Dr. Ames. Until her death in 1974, she was a child psychologist in Columbus, Ohio, at the Guidance Center East.

1980-81 Annual Fund Report

From the National Campaign Chairman:

Last year's Annual Fund campaign passed the "Half Million Dollar Mark" for the second year in a row. Finishing with a total of \$540,771, the campaign showed increasing alumni endorsement of the education they received at the University of Maine at Orono.

The 1980-81 Annual Fund theme took on a fresh new look, leaving behind another successful finish to a four-year fund raising effort of \$400,000 for the Performing Arts Center. Thanks to the good response from this year's reunion classes, the Association has only a small fraction remaining to pay to fulfill the pledge.

An important aspect of annual giving is the number of contributors participating each year. This year's campaign finished with 554 contributors ahead of the previous year. We now show 7,977 alumni givers — a new record.

The Senior Challenge program, which is in its third year, encourages seniors to make a five-year pledge to the University prior to graduation. Their contributions begin with a small amount the first year, increasing a little each time. This program has, in part, been responsible for the increase in the number of contributors to the campaign. This year's senior class pledged \$21,800 which will be paid over the next five years.

Another area of the campaign which has witnessed dramatic growth is the reunion class gifts. Classes have rallied their support for these special Reunion gifts with such enthusiasm that the total of reunion class giving has doubled in the last two years. With Reunion fundraising activities improving at that rate, the prospects of attaining higher goals in the future are very promising. Help from all alumni every year will enable the Annual Alumni Fund to provide the extra funding which is needed for excellence in the "Eighties."

Ever since that fateful September day in 1934 when we stood in line to register in Alumni Hall "my heart has been worn on my sleeve" for Jo Profita with, I must say, somewhat less than minimal success. Now, 47 years later, she drives up in her Oldsmobile and secretly leaves her telephone number in my mail box. Of course, along with the number there is a note attached saying "if you CAN'T write this column about my becoming the FIRST woman president of the General Alumni Association, please call me." As that is the only bit of information worthy of writing about, and knowing how reluctant Jo is to talk about herself, her number was not dialed.

The frontispiece of the 1938 PRISM reads: "Within the radius of a score or so of buildings is contained a unique feature of our scheme of things: a University, wherein, for a space of time, we work, and have our existence.

Alumnus Was Near-Moon-Man



Alumnus Fred Hermann '49 of Kennebunk, ME, was the nation's first pilot to qualify for a lunar landing. He successfully completed 50 simulated moon landings in 1966 when the Apollo moon mission made front-page news.

At present, Hermann represents Honeywell Avionics Division at the Johnson Space Center in Houston, TX. Honeywell has the contract for the flight control system of the space shuttle, due for a second flight from Kennedy Space Center in October. Hermann pretested flight equipment for the near-perfect space shuttle in April.

Hermann was a test pilot for LM contractor Grumman Aerospace Corp. of Bethpage, NY when he was elected as one of 15 so-called "company astronauts" NASA needed to test out each component connected with the moon mission.

Although officially called "spacecraft consulting pilots," these astronauts did everything but go up in space. It was Hermann's assignment to shakedown, test and retest the LM, sometimes 24-hours-a-day for weeks during stretches of the testing phase.

It was drudgery and dirty work, he explains, "but it was worth it." It was in the course of rehearsing the moon landings at various test sites in Houston, Cape Kennedy and in Bingham, NY that Hermann earned the previously unheralded distinction of being the first man in the history of the universe who qualified to land on the moon. "I didn't become an astronaut," he said, "but I did the next best thing."

For recreation, the lean 55-year-old says he sails, plays tournament tennis, and flies a private plane.

Another of Maine's noted astronauts, Maj. Gen. Robert A. Rushworth '51, retired from the Air Force in May, after 38 years of service. Rushworth, who is best known as pilot of the X-15 rocket research plane in which he flew 34 flights, was honored at a military ceremony in Danton, OH.

Phillip (Jim) Butterfield was promoted to full Professor of Physical Education at Ithaca College, Ithaca, NY. Jim was named Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association, the Football Writers Association, and the *New York Times*. He also won the Stan Lomax-Irving T. Marsh Award. Jim is a member of the Ithaca College Sports Hall of Fame and coached his teams to championships, NCAA playoff bids and three Lambert Bowls. Jim is married to the former Lois Day and they have three children.
