

THE STATE OF SOUTH-CAROLINA.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

KNOW YE, That in pursuance of an act of the legislature, entitled, "An act for establishing the mode of granting the lands now vacant in this state, and for allowing a commutation to be received for some lands that have been granted," passed the 19th day of February, 1791; We have granted, and by these presents do grant unto

Rob. Brodie his heirs and assigns, a plantation or tract of land, containing

all other sides by Rob. Brodie*

having such shape, form and marks, as are represented by a plat hereunto annexed, together with all woods, trees, waters, water courses, profits, commodities, appurtenances and hereditaments whatsoever thereunto belonging: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of

One thousand acres of land, and all and singular other the premises hereby granted unto the said *Rob. Brodie* his heirs and assigns, for ever in free and common socage.

Given under the Great Seal of the State.

WITNESS his Excellency WILLIAM MOULTRIE, Esquire, Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the said state, at Columbia, this *fourth* day of *August* Anno Domini, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-*four* and of the Independence of the United States of America the *thirtieth*
