Zen. three (300) Regts were  
turn over to you, one of which  
you caused to be issued to  
G. Martin's Div. Col. Glazebrook  
now just informs me that  
several days since, he intimated  
Genl Bragg that he had four  
(400) pictures for distribution, that  
Genl <sup>Bragg</sup> directed him to send them  
subject to your order, and that  
as you being so much said  
you ordered him to turn them  
over to Genl Martin's Div.

The parties will make here to  
night - I have but one leap  
(your Raugy) pony armed  
with pistol & I expect fully  
revert that my Sir may  
none their foibular shake.  
Every Brigadier and General  
my mind I trust that you  
will see the propriety of not  
making a distributor in favor  
of one portion of the com-  
mand against another;  
neither myself, officers or  
men, are conscious of having  
acted in such a way as to de-  
prive us of our distributor  
store of weapons, so useful  
to Cavalry & I trust you will send  
me an order here, to take my  
share - I request an early reply.
