





Biographies

Ms. Pamela Hill, director and 1975 alumna of Otterbein College, is a freelance director, actor, writer, and manager. Pam's previous directing projects include; *Snowangel* for the Actor's Repertory Theatre, *Tomfoolery* and *The Club* for the Contemporary American Theatre Company, and *The Robber Bridegroom* for the Little Theatre Off Broadway. Most recently, Ms. Hill served as assistant to the director for both the New York and the Players Theatre Columbus productions of *A Murder of Crows*.

Pamela's acting credits include; Lavinia in the Little Theatre Off Broadway's production of Whodunnit, Lilly St. Regis in Annie for Gallery Players, and Joanna in the Players Theatre Columbus

production of Present Laughter.

Ms. Hill has also worked as an arts manager for the American Music Theatre Festival in Philadelphia, the Kenyon Festival Theatre, Players TheatreColumbus, and the Indiana Repertory Theatre. Pamela serves on the Executive Board for the Ohio Theatre Alliance and is president of the Otterbein College Theatre Guild.

Cavin Bodouin, choreographer, holds a Master of Arts degree in dance with an emphasis in

performance and choreography from The Ohio State University and a BFA degree in dance from the University of Southern Mississippi. Currently adjunct faculty in the Department of Theatre and Dance at Otterbein College, Mr. Bodouin was a recent guest director/choreographer for the Lancaster Arts Festival. He is also coordinator of the Leo Yassenoff Jewish Center School of Dance, on faculty at Ballet Metropolitan Dance Academy, and slated to be on faculty at Kenyon College in the fall of 1989.

Jeff Pappas, musical director, holds degrees from The University of Illinois and Northern Kentucky University. Currently he is an instructor of choral and vocal music at Otterbein College where he conducts both the Otterbein Chorale and the Women's Chamber Singers as well as directing the show choir Opus Zero. Director's Note

Imagine being a woman living on the frontier only a little over a hundred years ago. There were no bathrooms as we have now, or kitchens with gas stoves, or washing machines, or even stores to buy clothes for your family. Your nearest neighbors could be two hours away. You were probably married at age 14 or 15 to someone you barely knew. Because there was no birth control, you might be pregnant every year for 10 to 15 years. All of your property, before you were married and what you obtained during marriage, belonged to your husband. Among your few cherished possessions might be a photogragh (daguerreo-

type) of your family back in the "states," a stack of letters, and a quilt that your mother had made for you.

Quilters is a compilation of true stories taken from diaries and letters of pioneer women from 1850-1890 and interviews conducted in the early 1970's with their daughters and granddaughters. The stories, as seen through the eyes of Sarah, express endurance, vitality, faith, creativity, and a sense of community as well as the fears and mysteries of the quilt Sarah leaves behind as a piece of her life. To her family, Sarah's joys and sorrows will be remembered for generations to come.



Shakespeare's timeless tragedy of "star-cross'd lovers" is often called the greatest love story of all time and ranks second only to *Hamlet* among his popular plays.

Seldom, if ever, in stage history has so much action been packed into the telling of a tender love story. Shakespeare's adventurous plot recounts the sudden love of Romeo for Juliet, their secret marriage, Romeo's banishment for killing the bride's cousin, and the tragic tryst at Juliet's tomb when Romeo, believing Juliet dead, takes his life.

One of Shakespeare's earliest plays, *Romeo and Juliet* was first produced about 1593 and has remained popular for nearly 400 years.


