REPORT OF BOARD OF LAW EXAMINERS

Report

ANNUAL REPORT TO THE SUPREME COURT SUBMITTED BY THE STATE BOARD OF LAW EXAMINERS AND MADE AVAILABLE FOR PUBLICATION BY THE MINNESOTA STATE BAR ASSOCIATION

The State Board of Law Examiners respectfully submits the following annual consolidated report of its activities for the year May 1, 1948, through April 30, 1949, pursuant to Order of the Supreme Court dated February 7, 1947. The report for the preceding year will be found in the 1948 Minnesota State Bar Association Committee Reports, 32 Minn. L. Rev. (Section on Committee Reports) 12. Like the preceding one, this report is not made on a calendar year basis but covers the period May 1st, 1948, to April 30th, 1949, so as to be available for printing with the State Bar Association Annual Committee Reports. The report does not include the results of the April, 1949, examination as the successful candidates at this examination will not be determined, or formally admitted, until sometime after May 1, 1949.

1. Admissions:

- a. A table is attached hereto showing all admissions to the Bar since May 1, 1948. The table states by Board file number and without name, the age of each applicant, his pre-legal training, his legal training, his previous attempts (if any) at the Bar Examination, the requirements of the Rules for Admission waived (if any) and other data. The table includes only those admitted and excludes those who sat for the examination but were unsuccessful and others who applied for permission to sit for the examination or for admission on motion and who were rejected. A total of 191 persons have been admitted to the Minnesota Bar since May 1, 1948.
- b. Admissions on motion: Of those admitted the last year, 5 were admitted on motion and without examination. The remaining 186 were admitted by examination.
 - (1) All of those admitted on motion were foreign attorneys who had been admitted in other jurisdictions and who had actively practiced therein for five years (or had had at least one year's active practice in the jurisdiction of their admittance, and sufficient time in the armed services of the United States, subsequent to admission, so that the total time of active practice and military service equalled or exceeded five years). These applicants were found to be of good moral character and to meet the requirements of Rule IX of the Supreme Court Rules relating to such admissions.
 - (2) There were no admissions on motion under the so-called military service rule (formerly Rule IX) originally adopted by the Court in February, 1942, and amended by the Court as a Statement of Policy under date of April 21, 1944. This rule admitted without examination under certain circumstances Minnesota residents who had entered the military service immediately after graduation from law school and before having a reasonable opportunity to sit for the Bar Examination, or who had entered military service before graduation from law school but after having had a portion of the senior year's work in such school. Most persons who qualified for

such manner of admission were admitted prior to or at the time of their entry into service. Some eligibles, however, were not advised of the rule or already were in Service in 1942 at the time of its adoption and thus made no application until their return from service. Such applicants are still considered eligible if they would have been eligible had they applied for admission at the time of their entry into the military service even though they made no application at that time. None such appeared this year, however.

- (3) The admissions on motion are included in the table of admissions attached to this report.
- c. Admissions of successful bar examinees: The results of two examinations have been released since May 1, 1948. 76 sat for the April, 1948, examination and 71 were successful. 125 sat for the September, 1948, examination and 115 were successful. 117 applicants sat for the April, 1949, examination, but as of date of writing this report, the results have not been determined and the admittees from this examination will be included in the next annual report. The percentage passing the examinations was 92,54% of all who sat for the examination.

2. Rejected applications or requests for admission:

- a. The Bar Examination: 5 of the 76 examinees who sat for the April, 1948, and 10 of the examinees who sat for the September, 1948, Bar Examinations were unsuccessful and so were not recommended for admission and were, in fact, not admitted, except for three recommended by the Bar Admissions Review Panel.
- b. Applications for admission on motion: The minutes of the Board of Law Examiners show that since May 1, 1948, 18 persons have been rejected for admission on motion or have been refused permission to sit for the examination, in each case such rejection being based upon the ground that the applicant did not comply with the Rules of the Supreme Court relative to admission. In addition to such formal applications, many more persons have made informal

inquiry of the Secretary and have been advised of their ineligibility. No records are kept of such informal inquiries.

- 3. The Board's recommendations on admission and rejections were followed and upheld by the Supreme Court in every case during the last year except for three cases recommended by the Bar Admissions Review Panel where the Board had recommended adversely.
- 4. Court Rule Changes: Rule changes prior to May 1, 1948, are set forth in previous reports of the Board of Law Examiners. There were no rule changes the last year.
- 5. Changes in Board policy:
 - a. As pointed out in previous reports, the Board has abolished the so-called oral examination.
 - b. The Board is continuing in force its policy of allowing a 10 point credit in the Bar Examination to each veteran of World War II whose legal education had been interrupted by service in the armed forces, in those law subjects which he studied in law school and successfully passed prior to his entrance in the service. 17 examinees who initially obtained failing grades were passed after military credit was given. No record is kept of those who were entitled to military credit but who received a passing grade without such and whose records were thus not changed. 3 applicants even with the aid of military credit still received failing grades.
 - c. Because the Bar Examinations are given but twice a year, and because under the prevailing conditions students are graduating from law school four times a year, the Board is continuing its policy of permitting law students to sit for the Bar Examination prior to graduation who are enrolled in a four year law course (at a school which requires but three years to graduate) and who have but one-quarter of law work left to graduate; provided admission is not recommended until an LL.B. degree is obtained. This obviates a June graduate, for instance, having to wait until the September Examination.

6. Miscellaneous:

- a. Petitions for reinstatement: During the year, the Board considered on petition for reinstatement and recommended adversely, together with the Practice of Law Committee of the State Bar Association. This recommendation was sustained by the Supreme Court.
- b. The State Bar Admissions Review Panel: Three matters were by order of the Supreme Court referred to the State Bar Admissions Review Panel during the year. Two were cases of failing first time examinees. The third was an examinee who had sat for several examinations (four times) and had failed each time. On review, the Panel concluded to recommend the admission of, all three.
- c. Chapter 285 Minn. Laws 1947 relates to admission on motion of students who had two years or more of law work prior to entry in the armed services and who complete the law course upon returning. The Board has had but one application for admission thereunder and that was, at the request of the applicant, converted into an application to sit for the Bar Examination. This application was last year and no application under this law was received this year. The constitutionality of the law thus has not yet been determined. The Legal Education Committee of the Bar Association has requested that when a formal application is filed, it be

promptly advised so that it may make known its views to the Supreme Court.

7. Future Problems:

- a. The number of examinees is expected to increase sharply within the next year. Soon there may be as many as 300 examinees a year, as compared with 201 the past year and 152 the year before. This will put a heavy burden on the members of the Board and will, of necessity render the task more arduous. Many states employ readers to assist the Board members in the task of grading the examination papers. The Board intends that consideration should be given to some such plan in Minnesota.
- b. The Board of Law Examiners, contrary to the thought retained by many members of the Bar has, and, since 1944 has had, no active duties regarding disciplinary matters affecting members of the Bar. The prosecution and handling of all disciplinary matters were transferred to the Bar Association itself by Court Order and is entirely handled by a committee thereof. However, bills incurred in the handling of disciplinary matters, after approval by the Supreme Court, are paid by the State Board of Law Examiners.
