SIR: The general allotment bill (S. 54), now before the President for his signature, provides that the allotments of lands in severalty therein

authorized shall be made by special agents appointed by the President for that purpose, but makes no provision for the payment of the salary

and expenses of such special agents.

I therefore have the honor to recommend that the attention of Congress be called to the matter, through the proper channels, with the request that an item (draft of which is herewith submitted) be inserted in the Indian appropriation bill, appropriating the sum of \$25,000 for that purpose.
