Academic Issues: Senator McCormick will present revised SLOs and will move to suspend the rules to move to second reading in order to vote on this before the end of the semester.

The English department will present an amendment to the SLO Distribution Model. Senator Rathbun stated that she would be willing to present the amendment for English. The EC discussed the idea that the assessment process needs to be driven by the faculty.

Senator McCormick came into the meeting at this point and the EC continued to discuss the amendment that the English Department will make to the SLOs. After considerable discussion, the SLOs will be sent to the Senate as proposed by the GEC. English will make their motion to amend and if approved by the Senate the revised SLOs will be taken back to the GEC for approval.
