### INCIDENTAL FEE:

The incidental fee for all students, payable at the time of registration, is \$10.00 for each semester. This fee is not refunded after enrollment. It entitles a student to admission to athletic contests, to lyceum numbers and special lectures, to a subscription to the **Trail Blazer**, to library service and medical advice and attention by the school physician.

### TUITION:

No tuition is charged to residents of Kentucky. The tuition for nonresidents of the state is \$18.00 per semester of eighteen weeks, \$9.00 for the spring term, and for each summer term.

### SPECIAL FEES PER SEMESTER:

A general deposit fee of \$3.00 is required of all students to cover any possible damage to school property, or to pay for books taken from the library and not returned. After deducting charges for such damages at the end of the semester, the remainder of this deposit is returned. Such damages to school property as can be traced to an individual are charged to him.

Breakage in all laboratory courses must be paid for by the student. Special fees are collected for the purpose of covering the cost of supplies and materials used by the students in class work.

### PHYSICAL EDUCATION FEE:

All women students who register in Physical Education activity courses are required to pay a rental fee of \$1.00 per term or semester for the use of a locker, lock, and towel during that term.

### FEE FOR LATE REGISTRATION:

Students who enroll after the day of registration, are required to pay an additional fee of \$1.00 for each day they are late, the total not to exceed \$5.00.

### FEE FOR CHANGE OF SCHEDULE:

A fee of \$1.00 will be charged for each voluntary change which a student makes in his schedule after it has been prepared and approved at the time of registration. Therefore, students are advised to give careful study to the program of classes and the requirements to be met before having their class schedules approved. If a change in schedule is requested by the Registrar or Dean, the student will not be requested to pay a fee.

### ROOMS FOR MEN STUDENTS

Thompson Hall is the men's dormitory. This dormitory will accommodate 165 men, is completely furnished and modern in every respect. The room rent is \$1.50 per week for each student. For those

desiring rooms for light housekeeping, the institution will be glad to recommend such a place.

### ROOMS FOR WOMEN STUDENTS

Fields Hall and Allie Young Hall are the women's dormitories. The combined facilities of these dormitories will accommodate 310 students. The rooms are tastefully furnished, light, airy and comfortable. The room rent for each student is \$1.50 per week.

### THE CAFETERIA

The college cafeteria is located on the ground floor of Allie Young Hall. The food is well-prepared, wholesome, and is served at a very reasonable price.

Men and women students occupying rooms on the campus are required to take their meals at the College Cafeteria. They are expected to pay for six cafeteria coupon books in advance at the beginning of each semester.

### SWIMMING POOL REGULATIONS

#### MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS:

A medical and physical examination by the school physician shall be required of all persons using the pool.

#### TO GAIN ADMITTANCE TO THE POOL:

- 1) The individual shall present a "Swim" card with three signatures thereon, viz.:
  - a. That of the school physician (medical approval).
  - b. That of the business agent (indicating payment of fees).
  - c. That of the physical education instructor (indicating registration in classes).
- 2) The individual shall wear a cotton bathing suit. The college does not furnish suits, nor does it launder them.
- 3) The girls shall wear caps and rubber shoes.
- 4) All individuals will be required to take a shower and step into the disinfecting footbath before entering the pool.

#### MISCELLANEOUS REGULATIONS:

No person shall go into the pool, except at the hours specified on the schedule posted on the bulletin boards.

No person shall be permitted to walk on the runways around the pool in street shoes.

No person shall go into the pool unless there is a life guard present.

All "Swim" cards are non-transferable. Any cards transferred will be invalidated.

#### MAJORS AND MINORS:

All students of sophomore rank or above should select a major subject and consult the head of that department in making their schedules. A major field must consist of not less than 24 semester hours. The first and second minors must consist of not less than 18 and 12 semester hours respectively. A student may choose his major from any one of the eleven subjects listed below:

*Biology	English
Education	Sociology and Economics
*Mathematics	French
*Chemistry	History and Government

(\* Work in these fields leads to a B. S. Degree.) Education should not be chosen as a major except by those students who are preparing for supervisory or administrative positions.

For an A. B. Degree 12 hours of one foreign language are required, while for an A. B. in Education 18 hours in Education are required in place of 12 hours of one language. Otherwise the requirements are the same for either degree, 12 hours in English, 12 hours in Social Science, 12 hours in Science, and 7 in Mathematics.

For a B. S. Degree. 12 hours in one foreign language are required, while a B. S. in Education requires 18 hours in Education in lieu of the 12 hours in one foreign language. Otherwise the requirements are similar, 60 hours in Science and related fields, 12 hours in English, 12 hours in Social Science, and 7 hours in Mathematics.

CERTIFICATES UNDER THE SCHOOL CODE ENACTED BY THE  
1934 LEGISLATURE, CURRICULUM TO BE PRESCRIBED BY  
THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION. (Effective on and after  
September 1, 1935.)

1. ELEMENTARY CERTIFICATES

- A. Provisional Elementary, valid for three years, issued on the basis of 64 semester hours (curriculum for training of elementary teachers). May be reissued or renewed after two years' teaching experience, or presentation of 16 hours of college work earned during the life of the certificate.
- B. Standard Elementary, valid for four years, issued on the basis of graduation from a standard four-year college (curriculum for training of elementary teachers). May be reissued every four years after three years' teaching experience or upon presentation of one-half year of standard graduate work.

2. HIGH SCHOOL CERTIFICATES

- A. Provisional High School, valid for four years, issued on the basis of graduation from a standard four-year college (curriculum for training of high school teachers). May be renewed every four years, after three years' teaching experience or upon presentation of one-half year of standard graduate work.
- B. Standard High School, valid for five years, issued to college graduates with one year of graduate work (curriculum for training of high school teachers). Extended for life upon presentation of evidence of three years' experience during the life of the certificate.

3. CERTIFICATES IN ADMINISTRATION AND SUPERVISION

- A. Provisional, valid for four years, issued to persons with two years' successful teaching experience, and being a graduate of a standard four-year college (curriculum for training of administrators and supervisors). Renewal every four years, on three years' experience or one-half year of graduate work.
- B. Standard, valid for five years, issued on two years' experience, four years of college work, and one year of graduate study. Extended for life on three years' successful experience during the life of the certificate.
