Important Regulations

1. ENTRANCE CREDITS

Students entering Morehead State Teachers College for the first time must have credits on file before registration day. High school graduation, with at least fifteen acceptable units, is required for entrance into college, without entrance exams. Of these 15 units, at least three must be English, one Plane Geometry, and one Algebra. Students entering after the regular enrollment date, will be placed on a reduced schedule. Students not entering on certificate must pass the entrance examinations before enrolling. These examinations will be held on the first day and will be about two hours in length.

2. REGISTRATION

Registration will be held in the College gym, beginning at 8:30 a. m. A student is not considered enrolled until he has been to all the stations required.

3. STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY

Every student is responsible for his own schedule—that is he is responsible for meeting the requirements for degrees, certificates, etc.

4. CHANGE OF SCHEDULE

No student is allowed to drop or add a class without the permission of the Dean.

5. SCHOLASTIC PROBATION

Any student that makes a standing of .5 or lower on a semester's work shall be placed on probation for the next semester in residence. This means that the student will be placed on a minimum schedule, be barred from all extra-curricular activities, and be required to bring his standing up to at least .7 by the end of the semester. In case his standing is not brought up to .7, he will be required to withdraw from school for a semester. When placed on probation, his parents will be notified concerning his standing in the institution.

6. CLASS ABSENCES

When the number of absences of a student in any course equals the number of semester hours in that course, the student must take a special examination. A fee of \$2.00 will be charged for a special examination. If the absence has been occasioned by prolonged illness or by extra-curricular activities that required the absence of a student from school, the fee may be remitted. An absence on the first day before or after a holiday recess counts the same as two absences any other time.

7. CHAPEL ABSENCES

For every unexcused absence from chapel in any one semester one-tenth of a quality point shall be deducted from the total number of such points achieved by the student who has been absent.

REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTIFICATES AND DEGREES

1. COLLEGE ELEMENTARY CERTIFICATE, ISSUED ON THE BASIS OF SIXTY-FOUR HOURS IN RESIDENCE

3. THE DEGREE AND COLLEGE CERTIFICATE

The Bachelor's degree and the College Certificate are granted to those persons who satisfactorily complete 128 hours of prescribed and elective college work, and have met the requirements as to standing, entrance and residence. It is strongly urged that candidates for teaching positions remain in college throughout the four years required to earn a degree before attempting to teach.

(a) REQUIREMENT FOR THE DEGREE AND COLLEGE CERTIFICATE

The Executive Council has prescribed minimum departmental requirements for the degree. After September 1, 1931, Mathematics 51 or Teacher's Arithmetic will not count in the seven hour mathematics requirement.
