MOREHEAD, Ky.--Now in its second century of service, Morehead State University has provided generations of students from the Tri-State Area with the opportunity to obtain a quality education at an affordable cost.

On Oct. 3, 1987, the University marked the 100th anniversary of the opening of its predecessor institution—the Morehead Normal School. Although perhaps not what we today would consider as a college, the normal school served as a teacher training institution from the very beginning.

After operating for 35 years as a private normal school, it became a state institution--Morehead State Normal School--in 1922 and over the years evolved into what we know now as Morehead State University.

For MSU, 1987 was a year of growth dominated by enrollment increases and a year that saw private gifts exceed the million dollar mark for the first time in history.

It also brought the homecoming of a new president, Dr. C. Nelson Grote, and recognition of MSU's student athletes academically when the University became the first recipient of the Ohio Valley Conference Academic Banner.

A 10.1 percent fall enrollment increase over the fall of 1986 capped a year of growing enrollment which saw MSU's 1987 Spring enrollment increase by 7.3 percent over the previous spring and Summer I take a 9 percent jump from the year before.

The fall enrollment of 6,490 students included a 13.4 percent growth in full-time student population, which created such a demand for on-campus student housing that three dorms---previously closed---were reopened.

Not only did the gift-giving year of \$1,249,075 surpass all previous years, but three additional milestones were reached with the largest corporate gift, the largest individual gift and the largest bequest.

The Ashland Oil Foundation committed a half million dollars over a three-year period to MSU, with \$350,000 earmarked for scholarships for academic excellence, for enhancement of certain academic programs and for a series of distinguished lectures. Another \$150,000 was designated as the Ashland Oil-Albright Challenge Grant with \$50,000 in three annual increments which must be matched by the University in new, unrestricted gifts.

The grant was named in honor of MSU's 10th president, Dr. A. D. Albright, in recognition of his contributions to higher education.

The banner giving year of 1986-87 also included \$681,878 from Terry and Susan Jacobs for artificial turf at Jayne Stadium, representing the largest individual gift.

The largest bequest came from a retired faculty member, Dr. Norman Tant, who earmarked \$100,000 form his estate to endow the Norman and Dean Rust Tant Scholarship Endowment Fund, and also designated MSU to share in his residuary estate.

For Dr. and Mrs. C. Nelson Grote, 1987 will be remembered as the year they came home. Dr. Grote, who began his career in higher education administration at MSU 27 years earlier, became the University's 11th president on July 1, 1987, returning after a 16-year absence which saw him lead Schoolcraft College as president from 1971 to 1981 and serve as chief executive officer (chancellor) of The Community Colleges of Spokane for six years.

In his first address to the faculty and staff, Dr. Grote outlined a series of priorities which included better salaries for both faculty and staff, a well-maintained and equipped working environment, and an environment that stimulates creativity and productivity. If these goals are accomplished, then a fourth goal--seeing MSU achieve an even higher level of excellence--would be attained.

Re-emphasizing his slogan unveiled at Founders Day, "Together We Can!", Dr. Grote called for a sense of unity campuswide, saying:

"I am absolutely confident that if we will unify our resources and our creativity and work together like we have never worked before that we can achieve both our individual and corporate goals. We can be the kind of university that you will be proud to be associated with and one about which our graduates will extol the virtues. I can't do that by myself, neither can you, but together we can do anything we decide to do."

The inauguration of Dr. C. Nelson Grote drew many dignitaries including three former MSU presidents, two former governors and then-Gov. Martha Layne Collins. Gov. Collins, bringing greetings from the citizens of the Commonwealth, assured the crowd of more than 1,100 that MSU was "on sure footing" and had entered a "new era of progress and prosperity."

Some of that progress and prosperity was evident in the re-establishment of MSU's School of Education and the School of Business and Economics; approval of a four-year degree in veterinary technology; the naming of Dr. Robert L. Goodpaster, a prominent Ashland-area educator, as director of the MSU-Ashland Center; the formal opening of the MSU-Morgan Center in West Liberty, and for the third consecutive time a 100 percent passage rate on the national licensure examination by a graduating class from the University's nursing program.

MSU earned the distinction of being the first school to win the OVC's Academic Achievement Banner, recognizing the conference institution with the best overall academic record involving student-athletes who participate in conference-sponsored sports and invitational meets.

And MSU's varsity cheerleading squad was invited to participate in the National College Cheerleading Championship, held at Sea World in San Diego, Calif., in January, as one of the top five Division I teams in the country.

In 1988, Morehead State will continue to build upon its level of excellence, according to Dr. Grote.

While maintaining its aggressive student recruitment program, MSU will place even more emphasis on student assessment and retention efforts. "You can enroll students and insure their failure or you can enroll students and prepare them for success. And we intend to do all we can to enhance their opportunity for success," Dr. Grote said.

Faculty/staff development programs will be another major focal point as the University focuses on the quality of its people.

Dr. Grote also predicted that 1988 would see a growth in MSU's involvement in the region's economic development as specific partnerships with business and industry are initiated.

Repeating his earlier pledge to work closely with public school personnel to improve the quality level of education in Eastern Kentucky, he said, "We will be expanding our relationships with the public schools, helping to address issues that affect us all such as literacy, dropout prevention and drug abuse."

Major physical improvements will include the start of a three-phase renovation of the underground utility and communication system as well as renovation of two older residence halls, Fields and Thompson.

"Over the years, MSU and the Tri-State Area have worked together to improve the region's quality of life," Dr. Grote said. "We expect this partnership will continue to flourish in years to come."



MOREHEAD, Ky.--Morehead State University will conduct registration for the spring semester Monday and Tuesday, Jan. 11-12, from 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. both days. In addition to these hours, part-time students may register between 5 and 6 p.m.

Undergraduate students who did not pre-register will need their trial schedules approved by their academic advisers before entering the registration area, according to MSU Registrar Gene Ranvier.

The process will begin in Wetherby Gymnasium and students will register by an alphabetical system based on their last name. Pre-registered students who have not paid their fees also will report to Wetherby, using the same alphabetical system.

Students who pre-registered are encouraged to pay their fees prior to Jan. 9 and avoid the arena registration process. Bills for spring tuition and fees were mailed to students in mid-December.

"Those students who take advantage of the pre-payment deadline gain the advantage of extending their vacation by a few days longer since they don't have to be back for registration," the registrar noted.

Schedule adjustments for all students will be processed in the student's academic major department, beginning on Wednesday, (Jan. 13).

Day classes at Morehead State will begin at 8 a.m. Wednesday, Jan. 13, while evening classes begin Jan. 19.

Registration for MSU's off-campus classes will be conducted at the regional campus centers from 5 to 7 p.m. on Monday, Jan. 11. Mail-in registration for off-campus classes will be accepted through Jan. 12.



MOREHEAD, KY.--Morehead State University's Office of Extended Campus Programs has received grants totaling \$28,164 to fund two training programs for 1988.

The grants, funded by the TENCO Private Industry Council, will be administered through the Job Training Center.

A grant of \$14,567 will be used to fund the Pharmacy Technician training program. Under way now, this program will train graduates to be competent in maintaining patient records, dispensing and auditing routine orders for stock supplies, maintaining inventories of drug supplies, and generally serving as a pharmacist's assistant. In addition to classroom training, on-site training will be conducted at area clinic and retail pharmacies.

A \$13,597 grant will provide training in the Nursing Assistant/Health Aide program. Scheduled to begin in February, the program is designed to train older workers (age 55 or over) to perform nursing assistant and aide level functions in nursing homes, hospitals, and private homes.

"We are extremely pleased to be able to offer these programs," said Shirley Hamilton, coordinator of training. "We had a 90 percent rate of hire for our program's graduates for last year. We are very fortunate to continue to train persons for employment," she added.


