PREFACE

Only publications, professional meeting presentations, published abstracts, art exhibits, performances, compositions, and research and creative production grants awarded between January 1, 2004, and December 31, 2004, were included in this Annual Report. References to entries forthcoming by being published, performed, or exhibited in 2005 were excluded.

Although all external grants are meritorious, this publication only features research and creative production grants. All external grants are recognized in the annual <u>MSU Today</u>, Focus Edition, published by the Division of University Relations in conjunction with the Division of Academic Affairs, Office of Research, Grants and Contracts and the Research and Creative Productions Committee.

A MESSAGE From The PROVOST

Dear Academic Colleagues and Friends,

The quantity and quality of research and creative production represented in this Annual Report for 2004 provide an impressive statement about scholarship at Morehead State University. The report illustrates the full range of scholarly activity and provides testimony to the commitment of our faculty to the university's goal of "Academic Excellence and Student Success."

We see the scholarship of discovery in such diverse research as the effects of designer drugs on motor activity and the use of art and narrative to teach cultural understanding. Others are pursuing the scholarship of integration with a focus on the Kosovo-Serbian War or a review of business research on the evolution of e-commerce. Still others are engaged in the scholarship of teaching such as in the preparation of secondary English teachers with a standards-based curriculum or infusing technology into the humanities. Of particular interest, with our current emphasis on civic engagement, is the increased activity in the scholarship of application, illustrated by an investigation of how to increase foster family satisfaction and cohesion, sharing how to schedule a Habitat for Humanity "six-house blitz build," or performing at Jenney Wiley Theatre.

This report emphasizes the degree to which scholarship, teaching and learning are interdependent. While the product or outcome of any form of scholarship is important, of equal importance are the process of scholarship and its contribution to student learning. Without question, a faculty member's active engagement in scholarship enhances his or her own expertise within the discipline and maximizes the potential for teaching and student learning to be relevant and current. At the same time, active engagement in scholarship ensures that the faculty member has an understanding of, and an appreciation for, the research and creative production process—a passion for asking questions, knowing what questions to ask and understanding how to secure valid and reliable answers. Perhaps of most importance to the teaching and learning process, active engagement in scholarship provides an opportunity to instill that passion for inquiry, scholarship and creative production within students—a prerequisite to lifelong learning. To that end, the increased frequency of student-faculty collaboration in research is both impressive and commendable.

To the faculty and staff cited in this report, I wish to express my appreciation for your contribution to the mission of Morehead State University. As a result of your efforts, new knowledge or works have been created, existing knowledge has been integrated in a more meaningful and useful form or applied to meet the needs of our region, and student learning has been enhanced.

I wish also to express my gratitude to the staff in the Office of Research, Grants and Contracts for their continued and tireless support of your efforts and the University's mission. If you have not thanked an RGC staff person lately, now would be an appropriate time to do so.
