The system consists of three speakers that use an alert tone as well as voice messages to warn the campus during an emergency.

The high powered amplifiers, located on Ginger and Cartmell halls along with Jayne Stadium, are designed primarily to alert pedestrians on campus sidewalks and streets.

## Eagles bowlers seeded No. 1 in the East region

Coming off winning the 2013 Backhaul Direct Hoosier Classic - the largest USBC Collegiate event of the season – Morehead State University men’s bowling team has been seeded No. 1 in the East region for sectionals.

“Winning the Hoosier Classic is a great way to end the regular season. We have won our last three tournaments so we have a little momentum going into post season play. Being the number one seed in Allentown is an honor but it will still take hard work and determination to come out of our sectional. I would like to personally say thank you to all the people that have helped us this year and hopefully with a lot of work and a little luck we will be bringing a title back to Morehead in April,” said Bobby Brown, men’s bowling coach.

The nation's college bowling programs learned their fate Feb. 20 as sectional-qualifying assignments were handed out for the 2013 xbowling Intercollegiate Team Championships.

The four sectional qualifiers will be held March 9-10 at AMF Parkway Lanes in Allentown, Pa.; Texas Star Lanes in Las Vegas; St. Clair Bowl in Fairview Heights, Ill.; and Smyrna Bowling Center in Smyrna, Tenn.

The top four teams in each division at each sectional will advance to the 2013 xbowling Intercollegiate Team Championships, which will be held April 18-20 at Sun Valley Lanes in Lincoln, Neb.

Robert Morris-Illinois earned the No. 1 spot in the Team Ranking System and will head to Fairview Heights. Second-ranked Wichita State will headline in Las Vegas, third-ranked Morehead State heads to Allentown, while No. 4 Lindenwood will go to Smyrna.

Sectional assignments are based on the Team Ranking System points earned in USBC Collegiate-certified competition throughout the season. USBC Collegiate attempts to place no more than two of the top eight schools and no more than four of the top 16 schools in a sectional based on final TRS totals. Sectional qualifier fields are determined by taking geographic distance, economics and field size into consideration.

The sectionals will consist of 32 Baker games each day for a total of 64 Baker games. The top four teams based on total pinfall in each division following the completion of competition at each sectional will advance to the 2013 xbowling Intercollegiate Team Championships.

Competitors at each of the four sectional events will bowl six games with 24 men and 16 women - the top four men and top four women at each sectional plus eight additional selections from the men's field based on size of field at each location - advancing to the national singles tournament on April 16 at Sun Valley Lanes in Lincoln, Neb.

No. 5 MSU (14-17 overall, 8-8 OVC) will battle No. 8 UT Martin (9-20, 5-11) at 7 p.m. (6 p.m. Central Time)

The Eagles won the only meeting this season on Jan. 19, 88-74, at the Elam Center in Martin.

The other first round matchup at 9 p. m. (8 p.m. Central Time) will have No. 6 Southeast Missouri facing No. 7 Eastern Illinois.

The quarterfinals are slated for Thursday at 7 p.m. (6 p.m. Central Time) No. 4 Tennessee State will face the MSU/UT Martin winner and at 9 p.m. (8 p.m. Central Time) No. 3 Eastern Kentucky will take on the SEMO/NIU winner. The semifinals are set for Friday with the championship game slated for Saturday.

Belmont is the No. 1 seed after winning the OVC regular season championship in its first year in the league. Murray State took first place in the West Division and is the No. 2 seed.

Under the league's merit-based bracketing system, both teams will receive double byes to Friday's semifinals.

## KVL introduces new search tool and naming contest

Kentucky Virtual Library (KYVL) has introduced a new search tool to simplify research. The new EBSCO Discovery Service (EDS) searches across all the journals, magazines, encyclopedias and citation databases that KYVL provides to the Commonwealth, and increases findability through a customizable front end powered by an advanced search system.

KYVL, an operating unit of the Council on Postsecondary Education, is a statewide consortium which serves libraries of the public universities and colleges, the community and technical college system, more than 30 independent colleges and universities, public and private K-12 schools, public libraries, and hospitals across the state. The library brings member libraries together to lower costs and improve efficiencies through joint purchasing and shared resources.

The Kentucky Virtual Library's high quality resources are now easily accessible via a single search portal. KYVL also has created boxes that group resources organized by age and subject interest, which allows easier retrieval of magazine and journal articles, ebooks and newspapers.

"The EDS Service gives citizens of all ages a single entry point to discover and retrieve articles, ebooks, primary sources and other materials they need to meet their needs for school, work and life. EBSCO is a committed partner to KYVL's mission of providing equitable access to high quality information in an easy manner," said Enid Wohlstein, KYVL director.

The fifth-seeded Eagles improve to 15-17 overall, while the eighth-seeded Skyhawks finish their season 9-21.

Milton Chavis led MSU with 14 points. Bruce Reed and Angelo Warner each added 11.

"I'm proud of my guys for getting through this first game," said Eagle coach Sean Woods. "As always, in March Madness it's survive and advance, and that's exactly that we did today. We're going to go back and look at tape and get ready for Tennessee State. But I'm proud of my guys and we'll continue to get better and hopefully we'll continue to do great things so we can keep this thing rolling.

"Our defense and pressure got to them a little bit. They turned it over and we kind of capitalized on some of their turnovers."

Morehead State advances to the quarterfinal round on Thursday at 7 p.m. (6 p.m. Central Time), where it will face fourth-seeded Tennessee State (17-13).

MSU won both regular-season games against TSU this year, including a 101-100 victory on Feb. 28.

The Eagles pulled within 59-56 on Bakari Turner's 3-pointer midway through the second half, but could get no closer.

"It is hard beating a team three times as you can see. I thought that they were prepared for everything we threw at them. We didn't shoot the ball as well as we wanted to. We shot it better in the second half and made a run but we just couldn't sustain," said Eagle coach Sean Woods.

"I'm proud of my guys for this year, the resiliency and the toughness that they gave throughout the season. But the future is looking bright at Morehead State University. But I tip my hat to Tennessee State. They finally got it right on the third time against us and they deserved to win tonight."

Drew Kelly led the Eagles with 16 points while Angelo Warner added 15.

MSU finished the season at 15-18.

TSU improved to 18-13 and advances to play top-seeded Belmont in the semifinals of the OVC Tournament Friday.
