

CRUSADER AGAINST ILLITERACY WILL SPEAK SIX TIMES IN NEW MEXICO.

MRS. CORA WILSON STEWART
National Authority on Illiteracy, Who is Willing to Deliver Six Speeches in New Mexico.

MRS. CORA Wilson Stewart, founder of moonlight schools in Kentucky, and president of the Kentucky Illiteracy Commission, classed as the greatest authority in this country on the illiteracy problem, will speak in from four to six places in New Mexico, if the people desire her to do so. She is coming out here to address the New Mexico Educational association at Albuquerque during its annual session, November 22-24, and those who desire to hear her in other cities of the state should communicate with State Superintendent Alvan N. White, in Santa Fe.

Mrs. Stewart is said to a fascinating and convincing speaker. She has adopted the slogan, "Everybody Reads and Writes in Kentucky in 1920," which she uses on her correspondence. She seals her letters with a paper seal bearing the slogan in large letters. She has spoken in many states of the Union in her fight against illiteracy and recently toured Wisconsin and Kansas. From New Mexico she will go into Oklahoma to deal some heavy blows to the illiterates of that state, where a warm campaign now is being waged.
