PLACE NAMES OF OHIO COUNTY, KENTUCKY.

- ✓ ADABURG: Not positive, but think the name was given when a postoffice was established, about 40 years ago. Took the name Ada from the wife of Dr. Putton, whose residence was used for the postoffice.
- ✓ ARNOLD: The name of a postoffice, established about 35 years ago, on the lands of William Arnold, taking his name.
- ✓ ASKINS: The name of a postoffice and railroad station, established about 25 years ago, on the lands of W. C. Askins, taking his name. (Breck. Co)
- ✓ BAIZETOWN: About 45 years ago a small store was erected at the crossroads on the farm of John H. Baize. A few years later a postoffice was established there, taking the name of the owner of the land.
- ✓ BARRETT'S FERRY: This is on the public highway leading from Hartford to Hardinsburg, where the highway crosses Rough River. This crossing was and is on a farm owned by Barrett. A public ferry was established there by Mr. Barrett about 60 years ago, known as Barrett's Ferry. About 25 or 30 years ago a postoffice was established there, and was given the same name.
- ✓ BEDA: Beda is a little village on the public road leading from Hartford to Owensboro. About 60 or 70 years ago this village was known as Buckhorn, and was known by that name until about 35 years ago when a postoffice was established there and the name Beda given to it. It is thought that the name Beda is made up of the initials of some leading citizens of that community.
- ✓ BISHNOR: About 5 years ago a coal mine was opened on the lands of J. M. Bishop and Tichenor. The name Bishnor is a combination of the names of these two owners.
- ✓ BOARDS: About 30 years ago Jeff Board purchased a tract of land on the Owensboro Division of the Illinois Central Railroad, between Fordsville and Narrows. He started a small store and saw mill. The railroad put in a switch for his mill and called it Board's Switch. Afterwards the latter part of the name was discontinued.
- ✓ BUFORD: Many years ago, before the Civil War, this was a small village called Bell's Store. It is on the Hartford and Owensboro road. About 45 years ago a postoffice was established there and given the name Buford. It is thought that the name Buford was given it in honor of a Confederate General.
- ✓ CERALVO: This is a small village at a landing on Green River. A postoffice was established there about 50 years ago in the name of Ceralvo. We are unable to obtain information regarding the make-up of the name.
- ✓ COFFMAN POINT: This is a coal mine, opened at a point on Green River by a man named W. C. Coffman. This mine was opened about 20 years ago, taking the name of the owner of the land, together with the point on Green River.

✓ CROMWELL: This is a village at a landing on Green River. It was known by this name before the Civil War. We do not know the significance of the name.

✓ DAVIDSON: This is a village on the Illinois Central Railroad, Owensboro Division, established about 25 years ago on the lands of Ed Davidson, taking his name.

✓ DEANFIELD: A mining town established on the Illinois Central Railroad, Owensboro Division, about 30 years ago, and takes its name from Guy Deane and \_\_\_\_\_ Field who were the owners of the coal mine opened there.

✓ DUNDEE: This is a village on Rough River and was formerly known as Hines' Mill. About 35 years ago a postoffice was established at this place in the name of Dundee. This name was made up of a combination of several names which had been submitted to the Postal Department for selection.

✓ ECHOLS: A small coal mining town on the Louisville Division of the Illinois Central Railroad. About 40 years ago a postoffice was established in the name of Echols. This name was selected by postoffice authorities from a list of names that had been submitted.

✓ ELLIS: About 25 years ago a railroad stop was established by the Illinois Central Railroad on its Owensboro Division, on the lands of W. P. Ellis, Esq., taking his name.

✓ ELLMITCH: This is a railroad station on the L & N Railroad, Madisonville Division, established about 12 years ago, on the lands of William Mitchell. At that time the railroad had another station named Mitchell. For this station they reversed the name, calling it Ellmitch to distinguish it from the other station.

✓ EQUALITY: This is the name of a postoffice on the L & N Railroad, Madisonville Division, taking its name from a church located nearby. This postoffice was established about 15 years ago.

✓ FORDSVILLE: This town was settled many years ago, long before the Civil War, and takes its name from the owner of the land on which the town was built.

✓ FRIEDLAND: A small postoffice established about 25 years ago, and takes its name from a combination of names submitted to the department. The name of the railroad station at this postoffice is DAN and takes its name from the name of the owner of the land, Dan T. Wilson, who specified in the deed of conveyance of the right-of-way to the railroad company that the company should establish and maintain a station on his land, to be called DAN.

✓ GAINES: The name of a railroad switch on the Illinois Central Railroad, Owensboro Division, and takes its name from W. S. Gaines who owned a coal mine near this switch which was put in about 1895.

- ✓ HARTFORD: This is the County Seat of Ohio County. It is one of the oldest towns in this county. It is situated on the banks of Rough River. At this place the old settlers forded the river. The ford was on the lands of a man by the name of Hart. Hence, its name of Hartford. This town is over 100 years old.
- ✓ HAYNESVILLE: A small village on the public road leading from Hartford to ~~Hawesville~~. It is situated on the land formerly owned by a man by the name of ~~Haynes~~. 45 or 50 years ago a postoffice was established there in the name of the owner of the land.
- ✓ HEFLIN: A little village on the public road leading from Hartford to Livermore. About 25 or 30 years ago, W. M. Heflin opened a store there and secured the establishment of a postoffice by that name.
- ✓ HORTON: This is a small town on the Illinois Central Railroad, Louisville Division. About 35 years ago a postoffice and railroad station were established there in the name of Horton. We do not know the significance of the name.
- ✓ KERTLEY: This is a landing on Green River, on the farm owned by \_\_\_\_\_ Kertley, and takes its name from the owner of the land. This landing has been in existence for about 45 or 50 years.
- ✓ KIMBLEY: This is the name of a coal mine on the L & N Railroad, Madisonville Division, on the lands of C. G. Kimbley, taking his name. This mine was opened about 15 years ago.
- ✓ KRONOS: The name of a railroad station on the L & N Railroad, Madisonville Division, established about 12 years ago. We do not know the significance of the name. It is at this point that the postoffice named Equality is maintained.
- ✓ MCHENRY: This is a mining town on the Illinois Central Railroad, Louisville Division. Established about 50 years ago, and takes its name from the Hon. Henry D. McHenry, who together with Josh Render owned the land upon which the mines were opened.
- ✓ MAGAN: A little village on the public road leading from Hartford to Hawesville, where the Owensboro and Morgantown road crosses. Many years ago a man by the name of Magan established a small business at this point, and later a postoffice was established there, taking this man's name. This was about 40 or 45 years ago.
- ✓ MANDA: A little village on the road leading from Cromwell to Rosine where the old Hartford and Morgantown road crosses. About 15 years ago a postoffice was established at this place in the name of Manda. It is a combination of names that were submitted to the department.
- ✓ MATANZAS: A small village on the public road leading from Hartford to Point Pleasant. A postoffice was established at this point about 25 years ago, shortly after the close of the Spanish-American War. It takes its name from a seaport in Cuba, where a company of soldiers from this county were stationed during the Spanish-American War.

CLATON: A station on the Illinois Central Railroad, Owensboro Division, at a point where the Hartford and Hardinsburg road crosses the railroad, and on Caney Creek at a point formerly known as Briggs' Mill. This was an old water mill, established and maintained at this point for many, many years. People in Ohio and Grayson counties went for miles to this mill to have their wheat and corn ground. This place is fully 75 years old or more. When the railroad was built about 35 years ago a station was established at this point, called Claton. Later a postoffice was established in the same name. We do not know the origin of the name nor its significance.

PRENTISS: This is a postoffice established in this county about 30 years ago, at a place on the Hartford and Rochester road in a little village which was known for many years as Gasburg. It had been given the name of Gasburn on account of the story telling carried on by the farmers in the little store there. They would come for miles around to the village and swap yarns. Hence, its name of Gasburg. When the postoffice was established it took the name of Prentiss in honor of a noted publisher.

RALPH: This is a small village with a store, on the Hartford and Whitesville road, where the Owensboro and Morgantown road crosses. It is on Panther Creek. About 25 years ago a postoffice was established there on the lands owned by H. W. Ralph. Hence, the name of Ralph.

RENFROW: A small village in the northeastern part of the county. It is located at the crossing of the Rosina-Morgantown and Cromwell-Caneyville roads. It is on the lands of John Thomas Renfrow. About 30 years ago a postoffice was established, taking Mr. Renfrow's name.

REYNOLDS: This is a station on the Illinois Central Railroad, Owensboro Division, between Fordsville and Deaneville, at a point where the railroad crosses the public highway leading from Hartford to Hawesville. It is on the lands of J. S. Reynolds. The name is in his honor. About 25 years ago a postoffice was established at this point, called Reynolds' Station. We think the postoffice still goes by that name. The railroad stop only calls for Reynolds.

RENDER: This is a mining village near McHenry, on the I. C. R. R. Louisville Division, at which point a mine was opened on the lands of Josh Render. This was 40 or 50 years ago. About 35 years ago a postoffice was established here, taking the name of Render. The town and postoffice were both named in honor of Mr. Render.

ROSINE: A town on the I. C. R. R. Louisville Division, established in 1872. On account of the timber it was a thriving and prosperous town for many years. We do not know the significance of this name.

- ✓ SELECT: A small village on the Crowell-Caneville road. Postoffice was established there about 45 years ago in the name of Select.
- ✓ SHREVE: A small village in the northeastern part of the county, on the road leading from Fordsville to Leitchfield, on a farm formerly owned by a man by the name of Shreve. About 40 years ago a postoffice was established there in the name of Shreve.
- ✓ SIMMONS: This is a mining town on the I. C. R. R. Louisville Division. The town is known as the Broadway Coal Mining Company. The President of the company is W. M. Simmons, Memphis, Tenn. A postoffice was established there about 12 years ago, and took its name in honor of the president of said company.
- ✓ SMALLHOUSE: A little town on Green River at a point where the L & N Railroad crosses. It is also a landing for boats. Many years ago, before the railroad came, a postoffice was established here on account of the boats carrying the mail. Its one and only store was on the bank of the river. Hence, the name of Smallhouse. Since the coming of the railroad, the postoffice has been changed to Equality and is now located at Krenos, Ky. The station is still called Smallhouse.
- ✓ TAFFY: A small village on the Hartford and Hawesville road, at the junction of the Owensboro road. About 35 years ago a postoffice was established in the name of Taffy. It is given the name of Taffy on account of the excessive use of taffy by the people living in that community.
- ✓ TAYLOR MINES: A large coal mine near Beaver Dam, Ky., on the lands of Harrison B. Taylor. This mine was opened about 50 years ago and takes its name from the owner of the land.
- ✓ TRISTLER: A small place on the Hartford and Hardinsburg road, where the Fordsville and Leitchfield road crosses. About 25 years ago a postoffice was established named Tristler. This name was made up by the department from a list of names submitted. Since then the postoffice has been discontinued.
- ✓ WESTERFIELD: A postoffice established about 30 years ago on the farm of John C. Westerfield, taking his name. Since then the postoffice has been discontinued.
- ✓ WILLIAMS: The name of a coal mine near the towns of McHenry and Render, and which was opened and operated by J. S. Williams and his two brothers. This was about 30 years ago. It is now owned by the Beaver Dam Coal Company.
- ✓ WISOX: The name of a postoffice established about 25 years ago. Do not know the origin or significance of this name.

✓ **SULPHUR SPRINGS:** A watering place near Dundee on the Hartford and Fordsville public road. At one time this was quite a noted watering resort. There are fresh water springs and also white sulphur springs. About 40 years ago a postoffice was established here, taking the name of Sulphur Springs. The postoffice has since been discontinued.

✓ **SUNNYDALE:** A village on the L & N Railroad, Madisonville Division. A postoffice was established there about 12 years ago. The name is a combination word made up from a list of names given the department.

✓ **HORSE BRANCH:** A town on the Illinois Central Railroad, Louisville Division, at the junction of the Owensboro Division, on a little creek called Horse Branch, from which the town and postoffice takes their name. The town was established about 1872.

✓ **BEAVER DAM:** This is the second largest town in Ohio County. It is located on the I. C. Railroad, Louisville Division. Established about 1873. The country around this place is low and flat, and in the early days beavers were in abundance, and would frequently fill up or dam the branches. Hence, the name of Beaver Dam.

✓ **ROCKPORT:** A mining town on the I. C. Railroad, Louisville Division, where it crosses Green River. This is an old town, and where located is a very rocky bluff point on the river, and an old boat landing. Hence, its name of Rockport. It is fully sixty years old.

✓ **CENTERTOWN:** A thriving town on the L & N Railroad, Madisonville Division, in the midst of large coal mines. Many years ago it was known as Centerville. It was given its name on account of its being about half way between Hartford and Point Pleasant, which was the shipping point on Green River. It is fully 60 years old.

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DUNDEE (Ohio Co.): Duhn/dee (Dundee). This village with an active post office on KY 69 and the s bank of Rough River, 9 air miles ne of Hartford, was first called Hines Mill for a water-powered grist mill built at the site in the 1840s probably by Warren W. Hines and William R. Lowry. On May 28, 1846 Hines established the Hines Mills (sic) post office which was moved to and renamed Sulphur Springs (q.v.) in 1872 by Jeremiah B. Cannon. The community has been closely identified with <sup>with</sup> Alfred T. Hines who, for many years, ran the mill, ferry, store, distillery, and post office. Its name was changed to Dundee, for reasons unknown, but perhaps at the suggestions of J.S. Fitzhugh, a local businessman, when the post office was re-established in this name on Jan. 24. 1898.
