

In September of 1957, Ken was a senior at Little Rock Central High School when President Eisenhower ordered the desegregation of that school. Nine black teenagers, whom history now calls The Little Rock Nine, were selected to attend the school of 2,000 white students. Her name is Elizabeth Eckford. She and Ken were both subjects of presentations made by three High School students from Uniontown, KS.

The title of that year's National History Day's competition was: "Taking a Stand In History." This story was picked up by the national news media and highlighted in several publications, including The Washington Post. Ken is here today to tell us about it.
