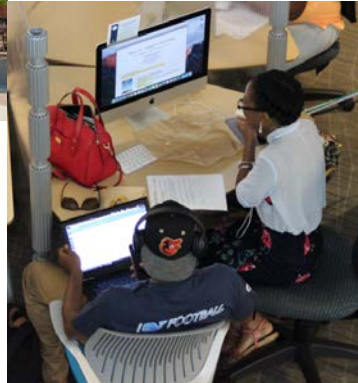

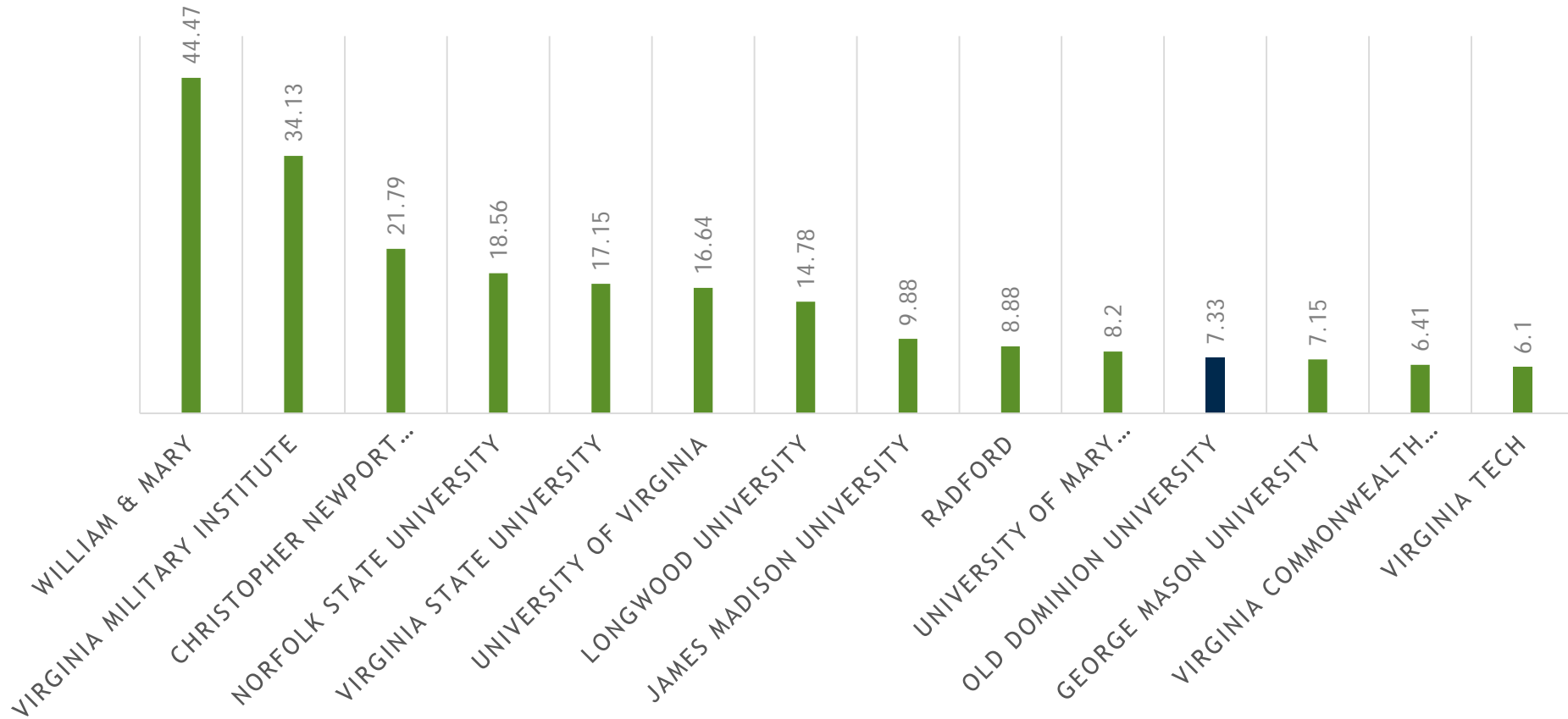

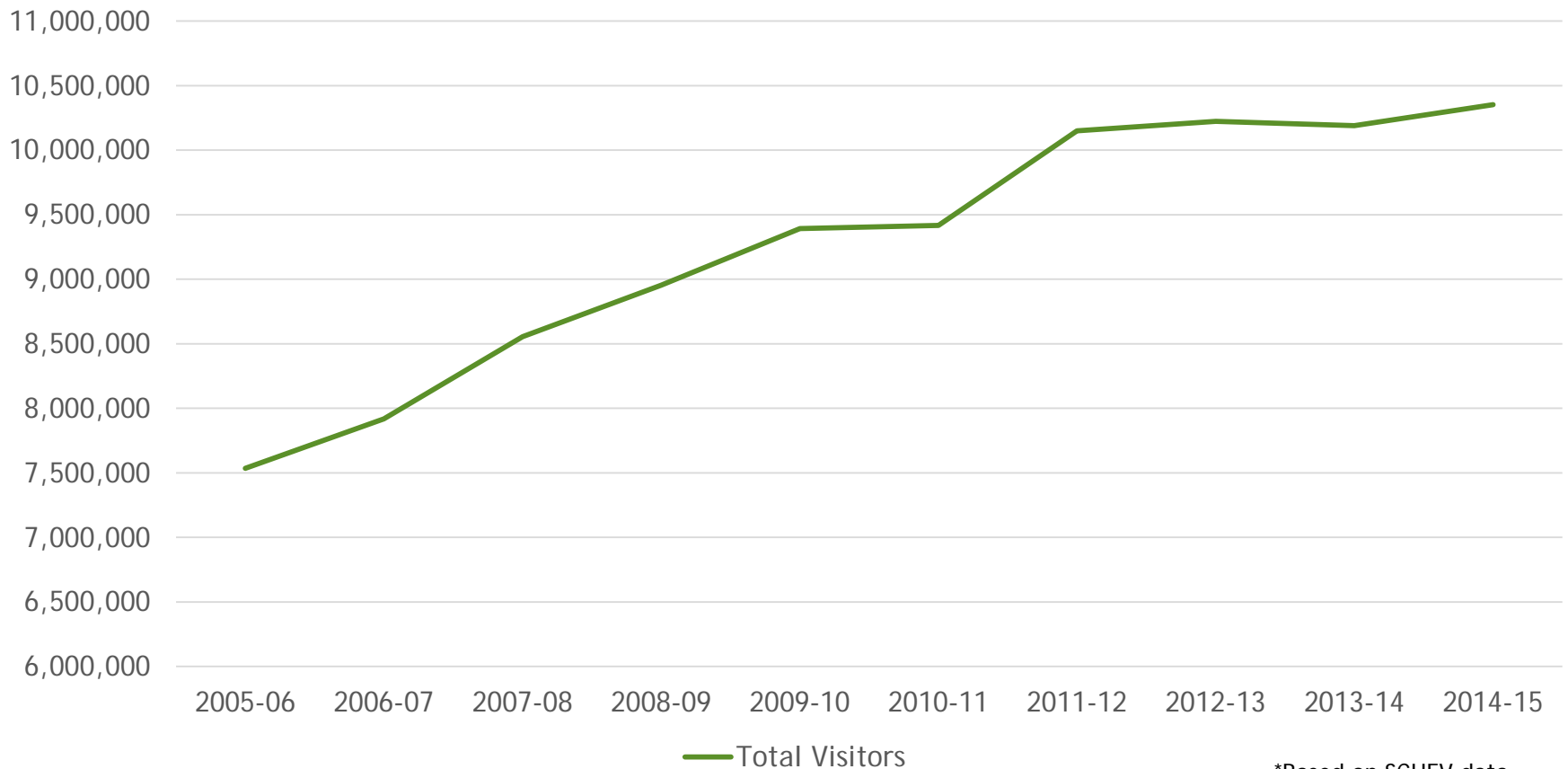
LIBRARY SPACE PER STUDENT

- ❖ Long-term goal to incorporate capital project into University Master Plan

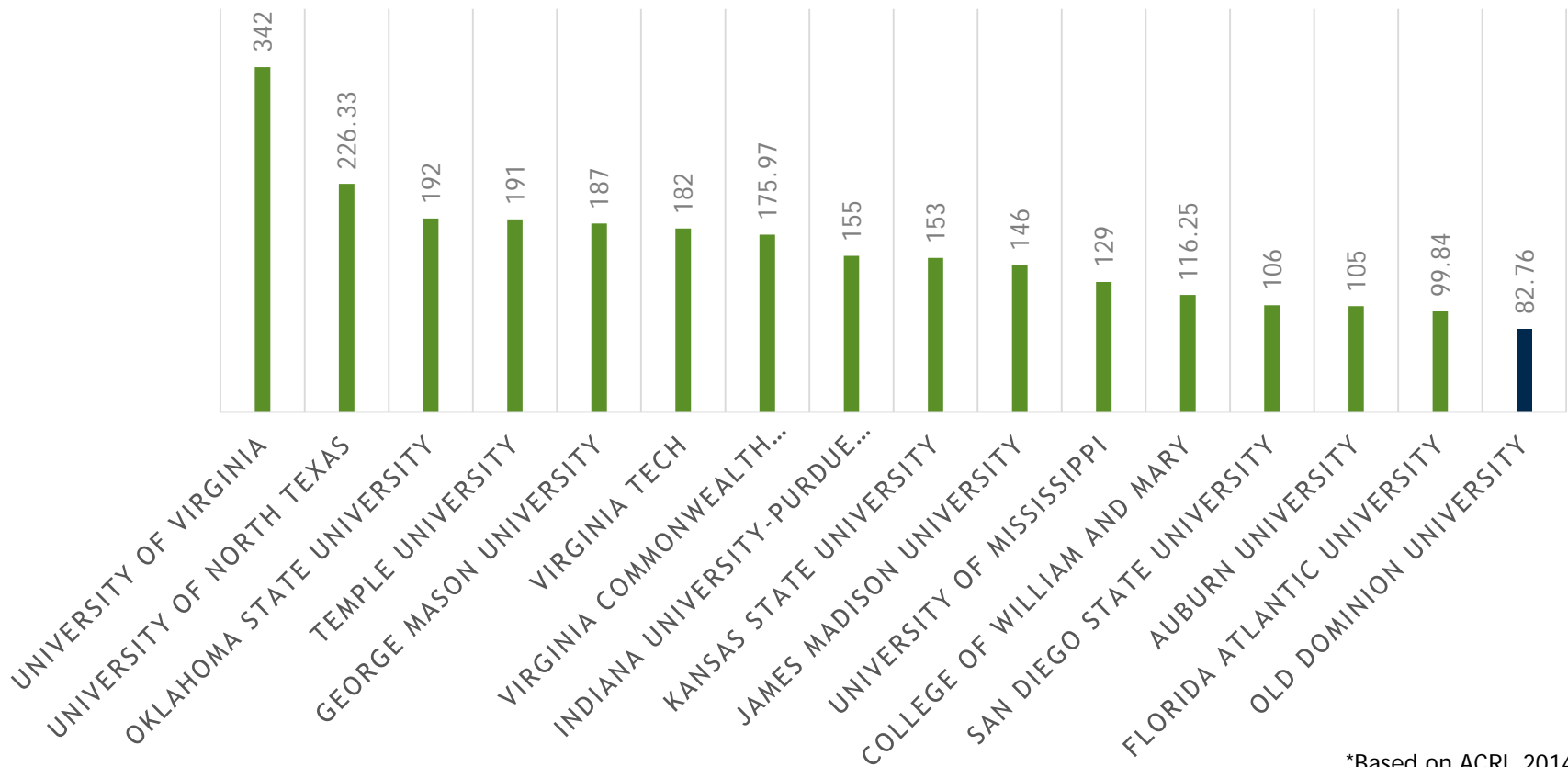

BUDGET COMPARISON

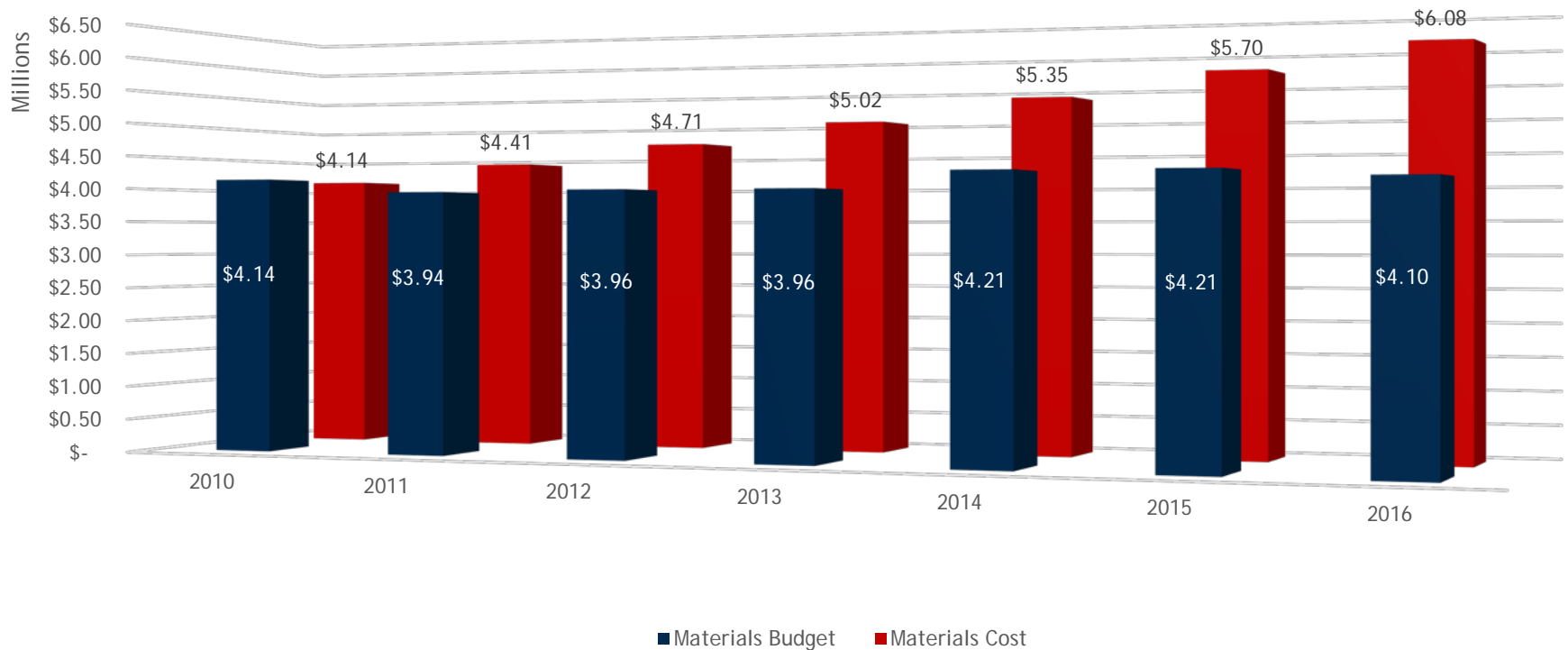


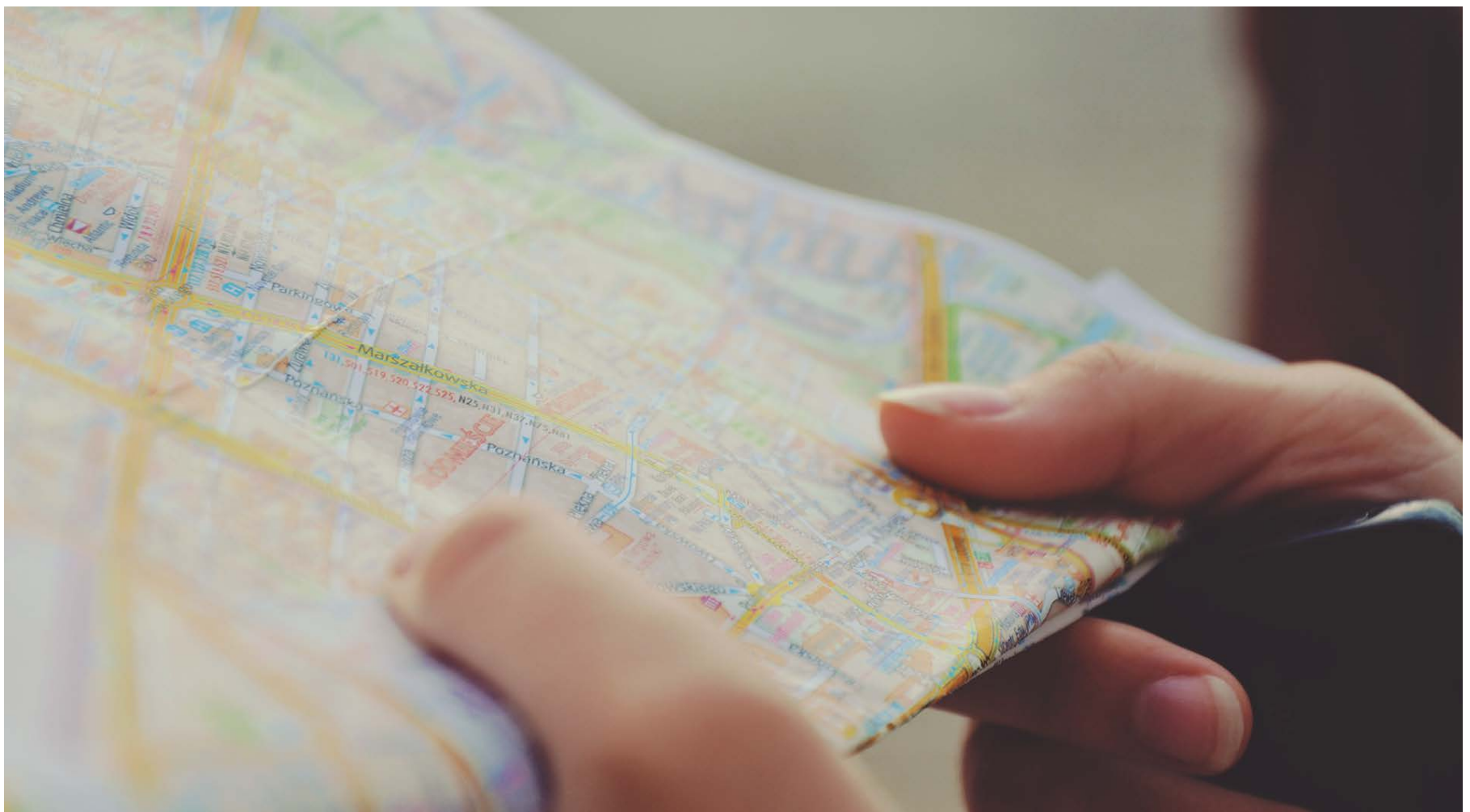
