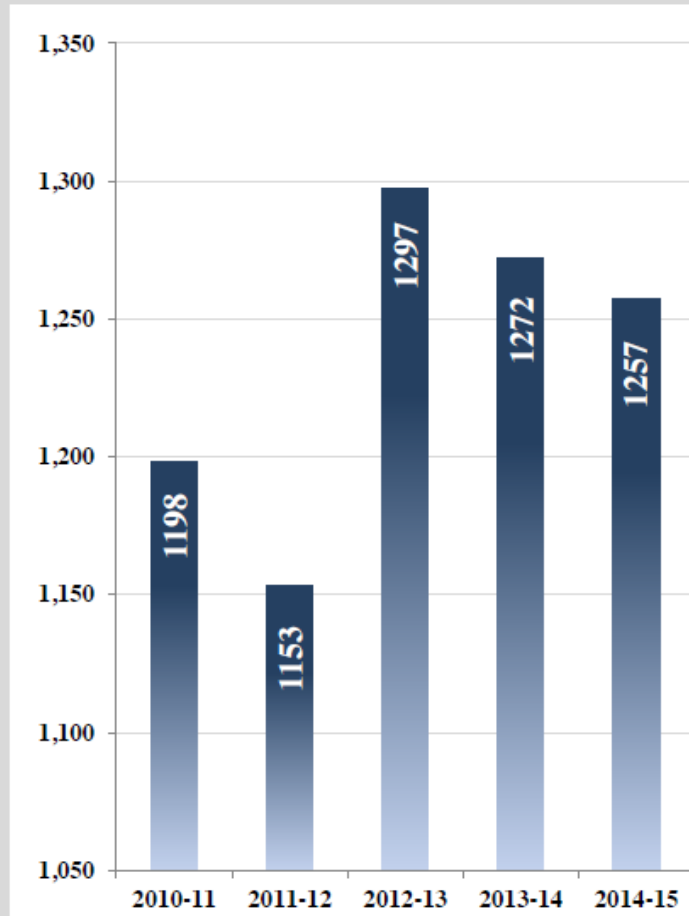

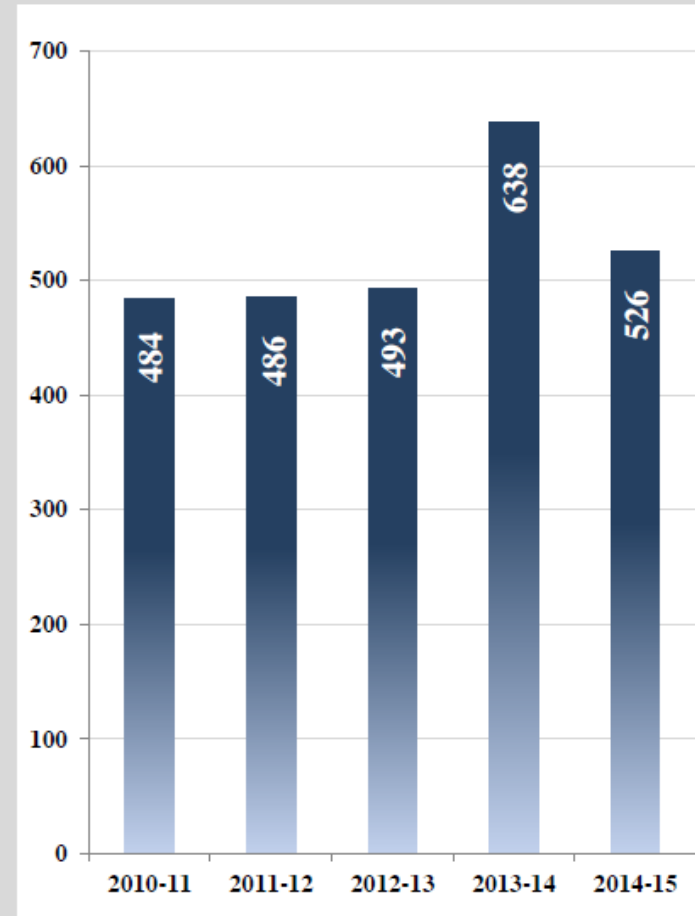


Overall Enrollment & Degrees

Total Headcounts*



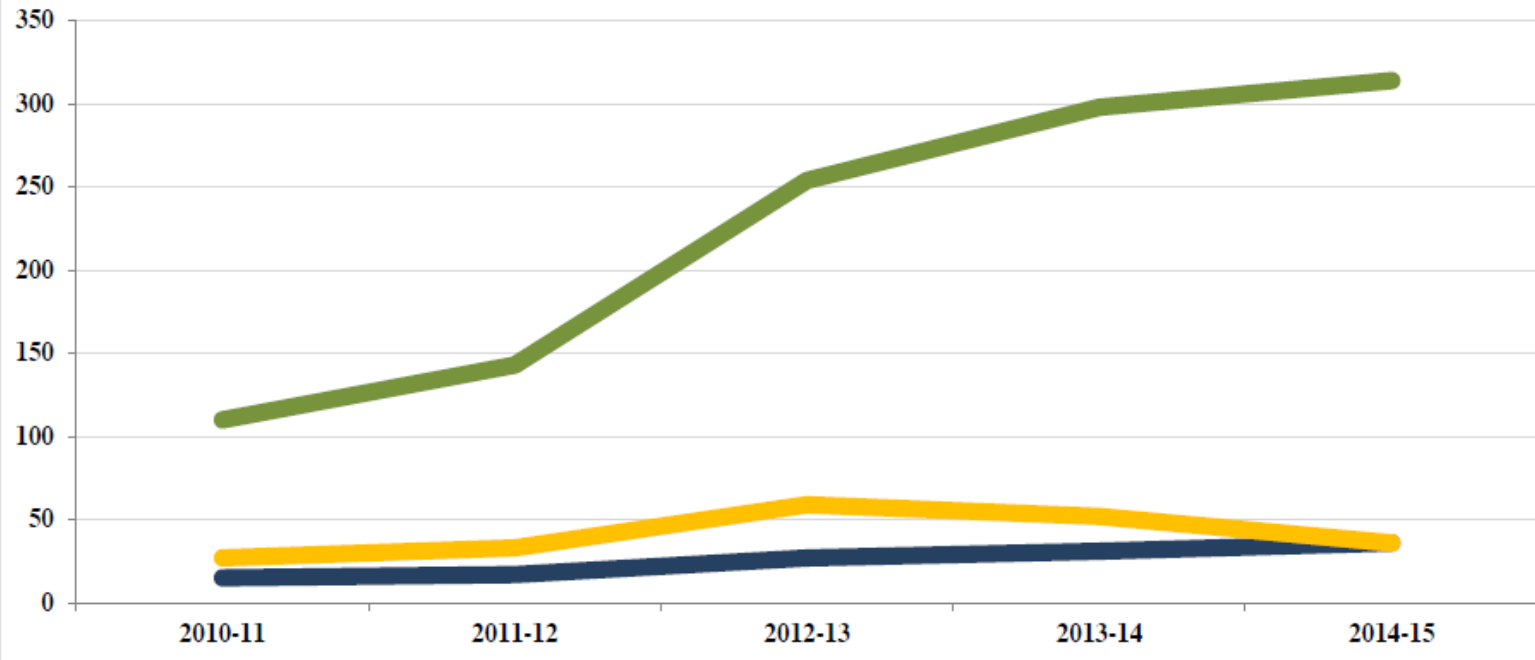
Degrees Awarded*





Undergraduate Degree Completion

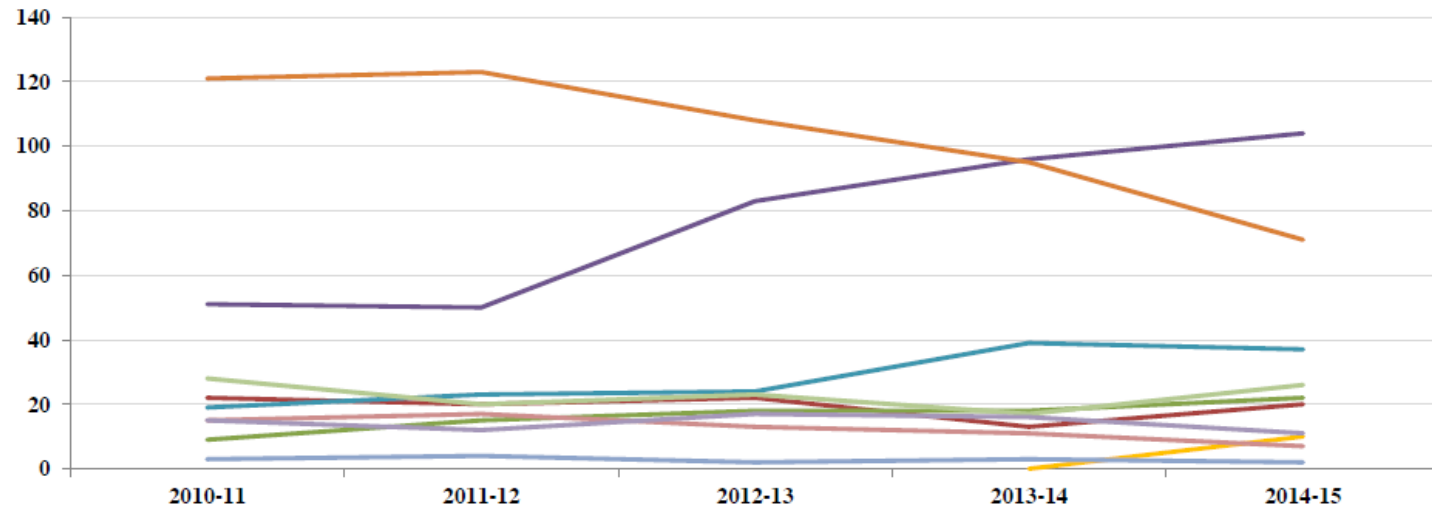

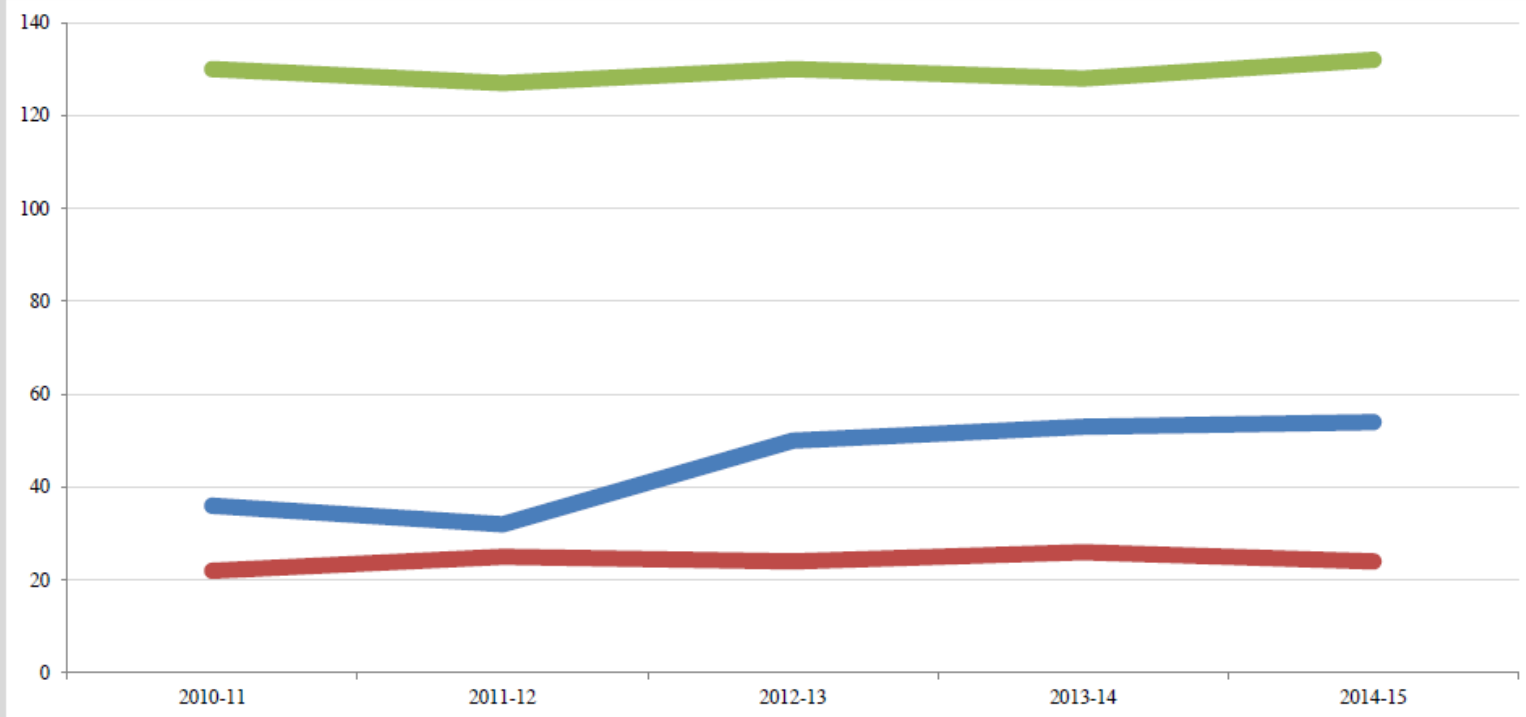

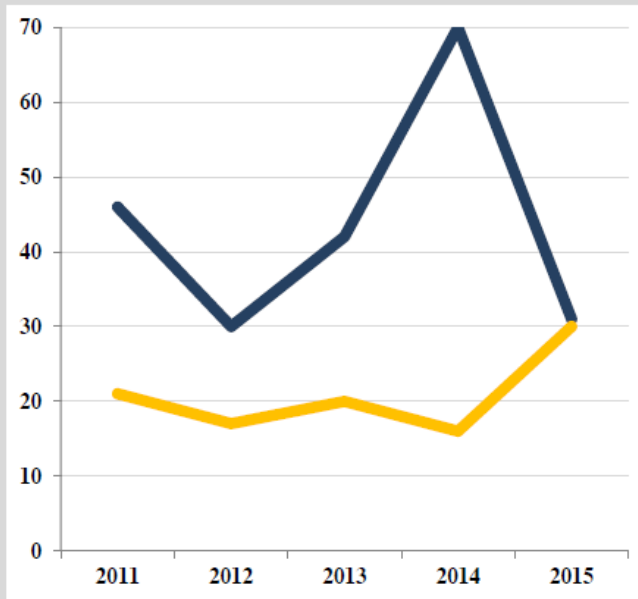

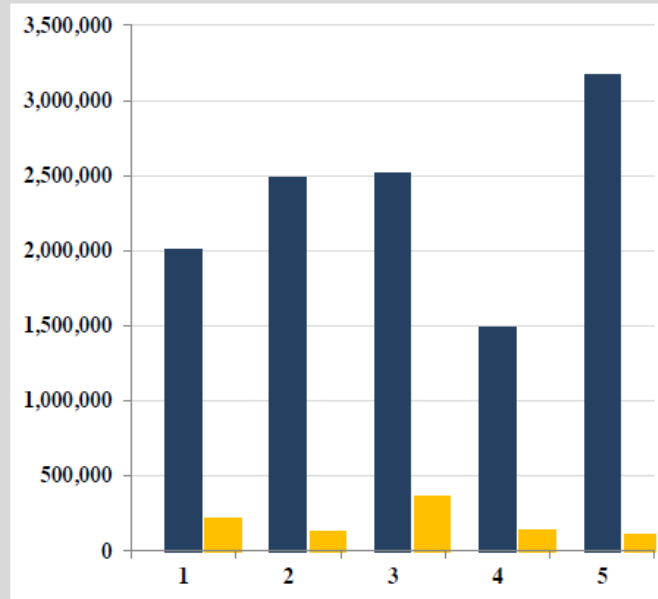

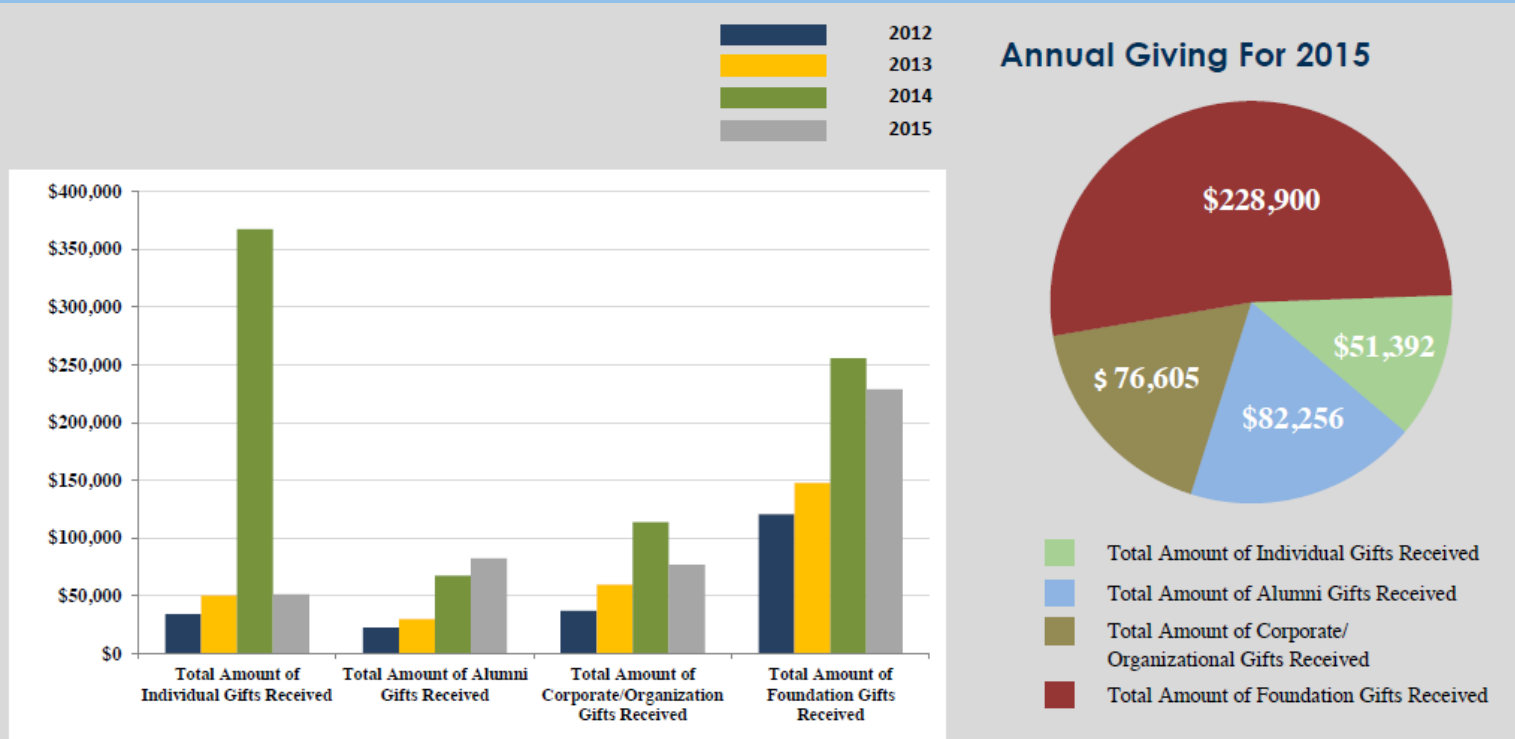

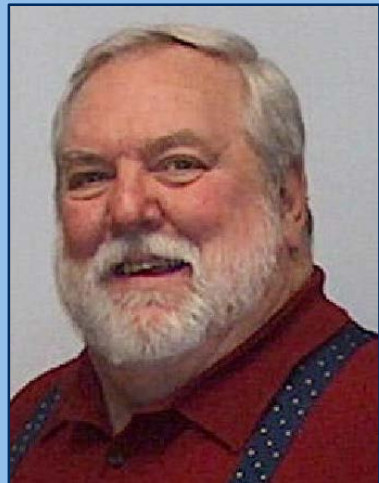
