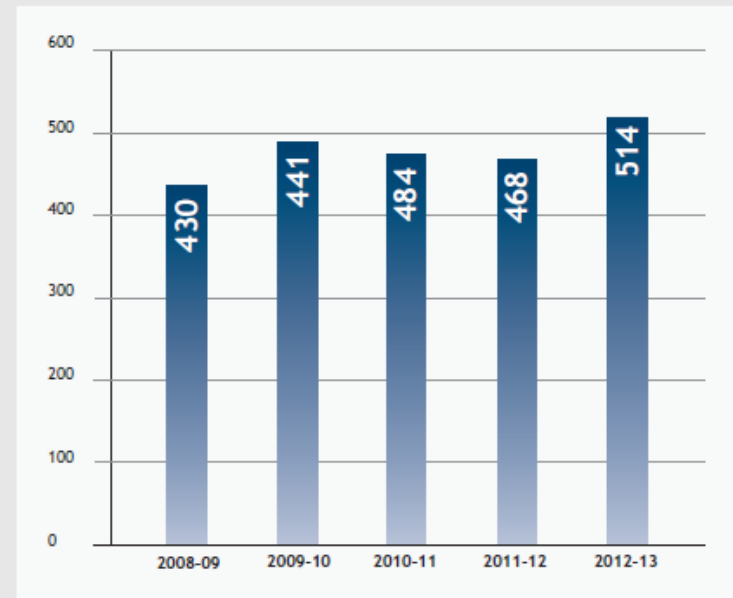


Enrollment & Degrees

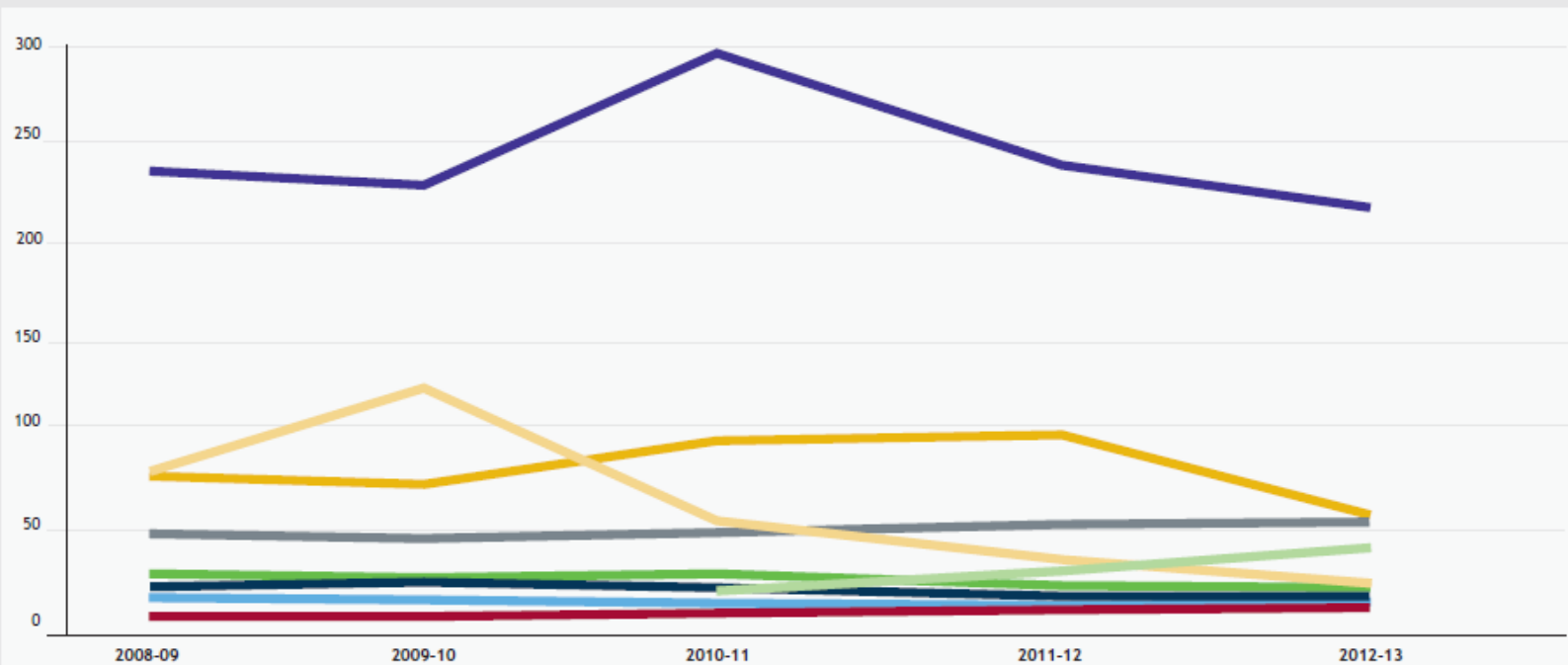

Undergraduate Enrollment by Program



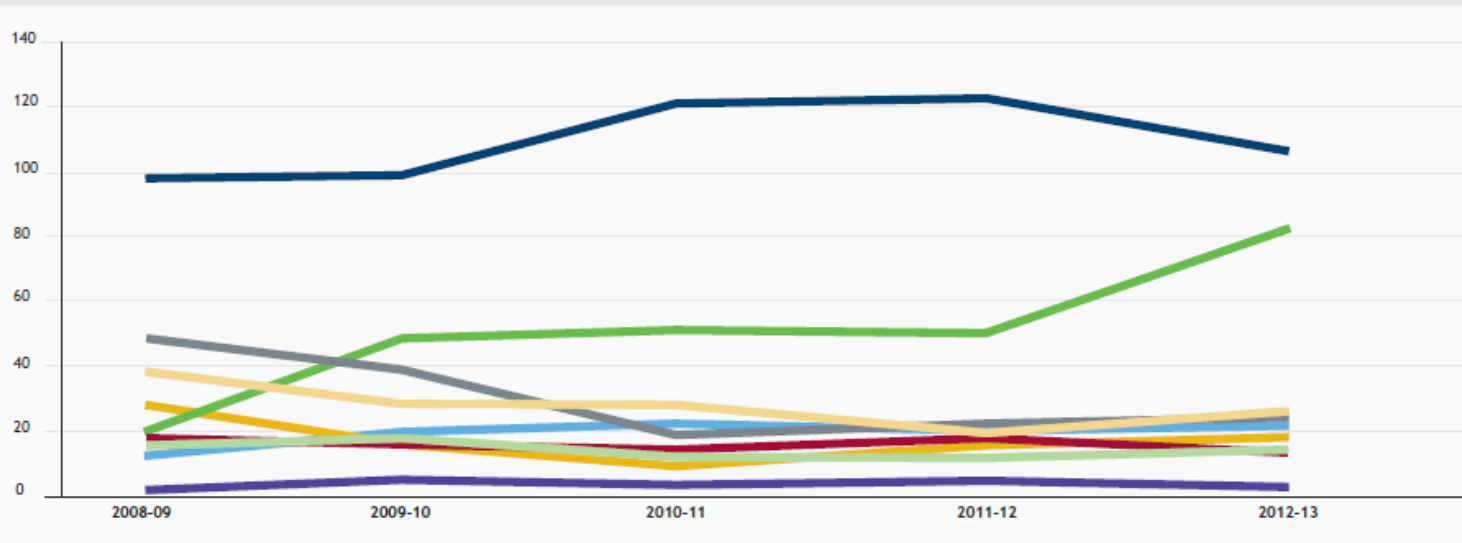

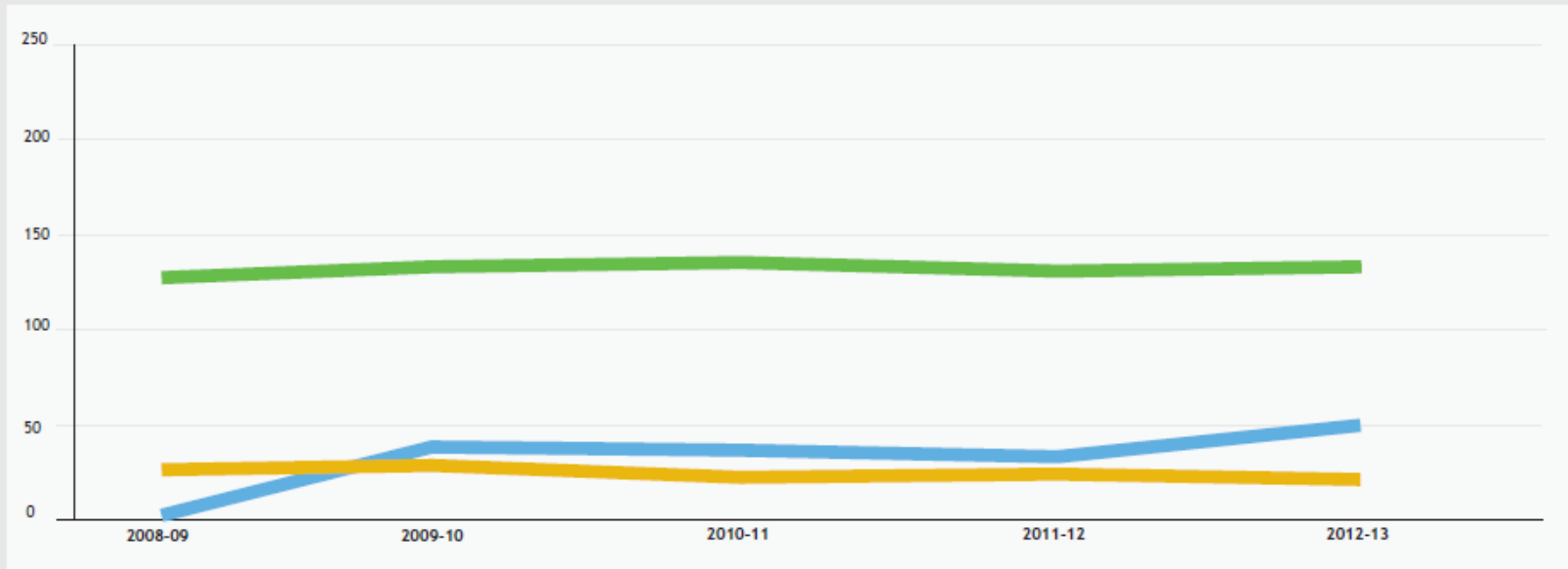

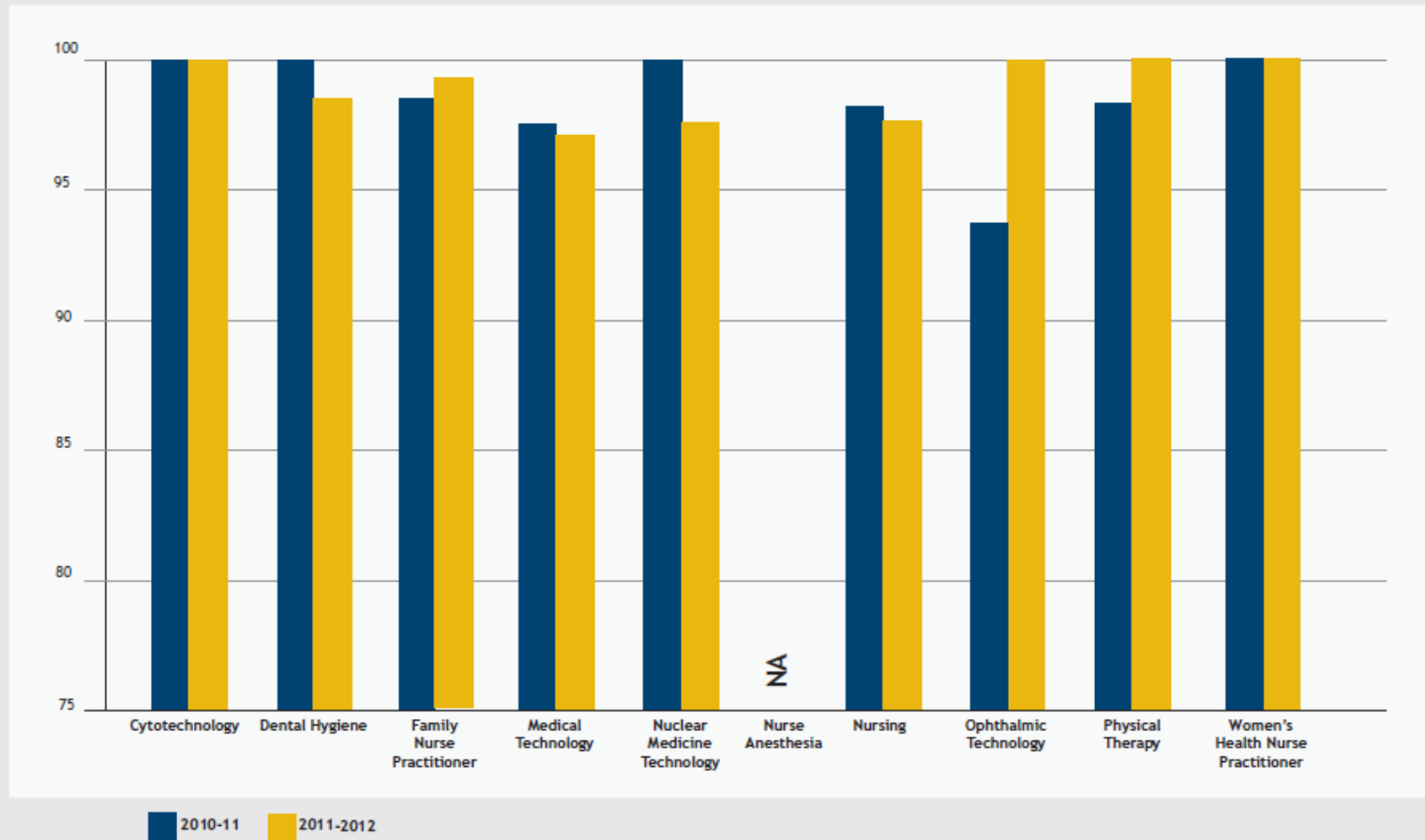

Licensure/Certification Exam Overall Pass Rates

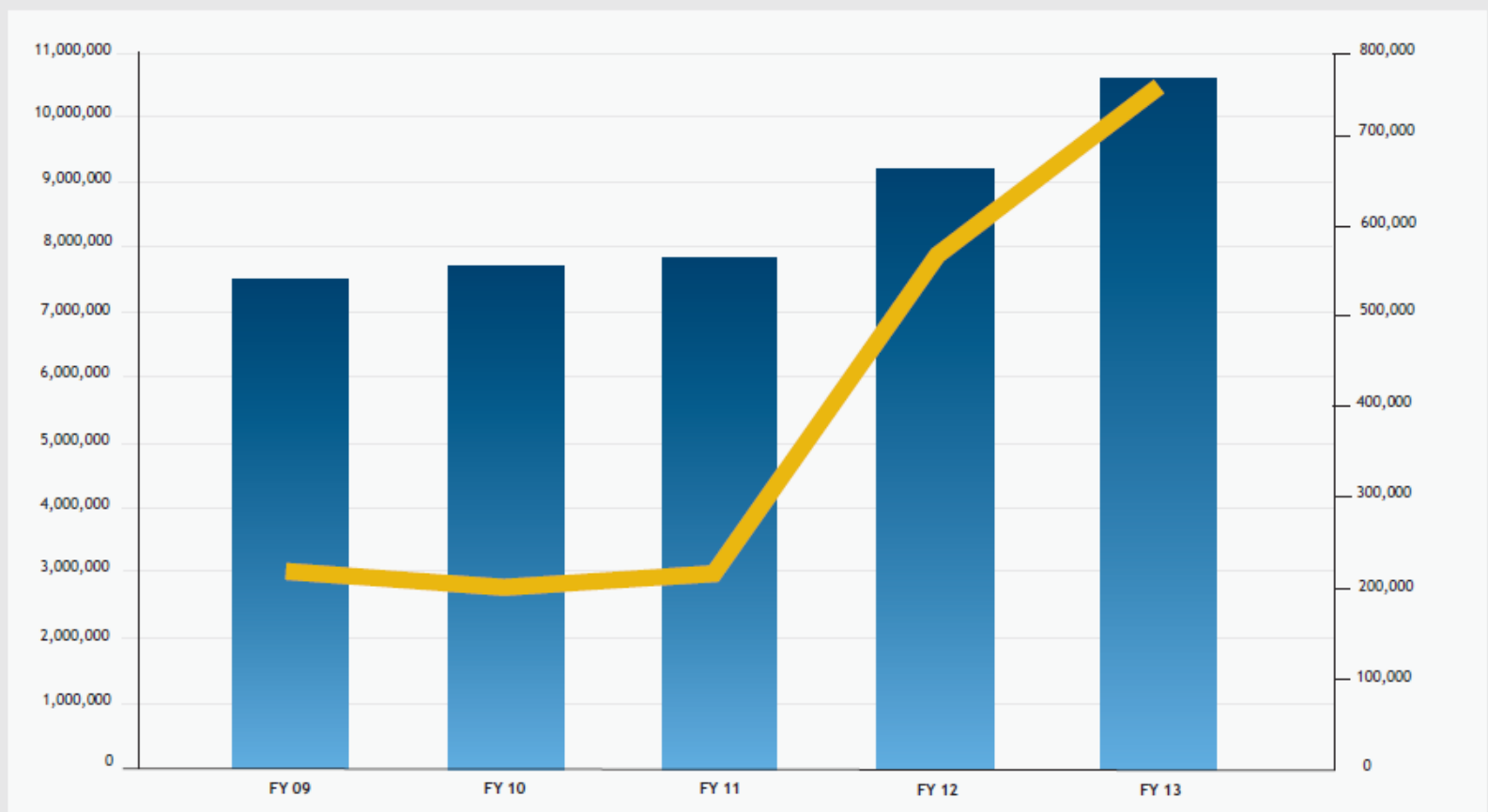

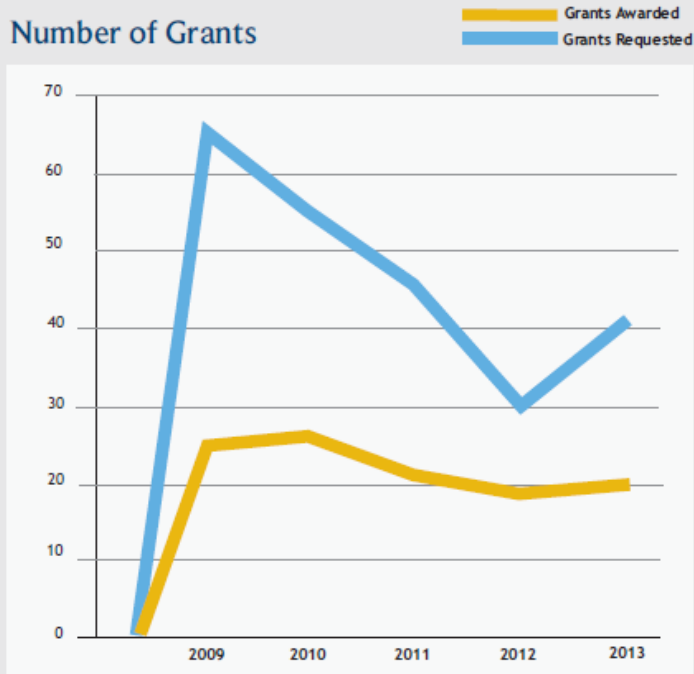

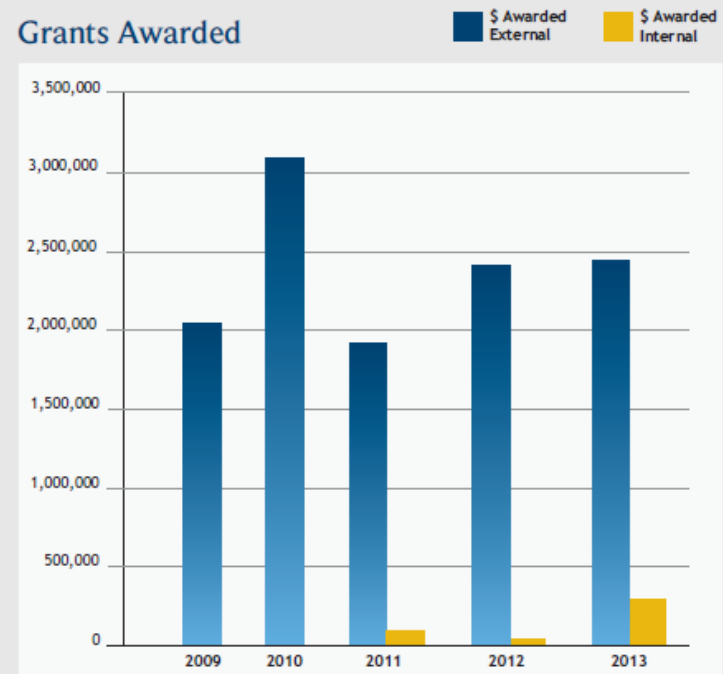

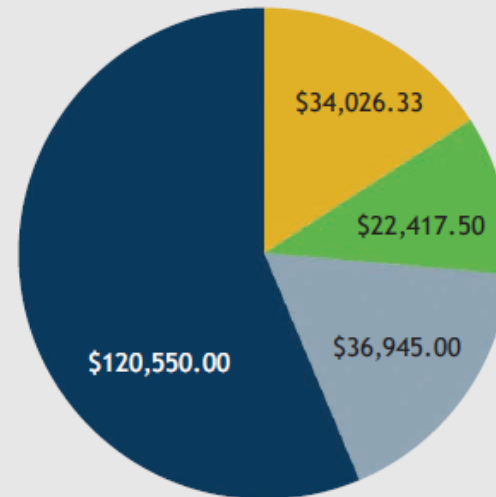
