

Besides two major recitals each year, the group gives concerts and clinics off campus throughout New York and the surrounding region. This spring, the Trombone Troupe will host the 23rd Annual Frühling Posaunen, which will feature a master class with Massimo La Rosa, and the trombone ensembles from Eastman, Penn State, SUNY-Potsdam, Boston University and Ithaca.
