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

Biographies

Linda R. Hall

Linda R. Hall, a native of Baltimore, has taught music education in The Baltimore Public School System since 1976. Her inspirational was fueled by music educators, Spencer Hammond, Dorothy Marshall, the late Lois Wright and the late Dr. Nathan Carter. She assumed the position of Choral Director at the Baltimore City College High School in Baltimore, Maryland in 1987. Linda serves as the director for the school's choirs: The Mixed Chorus, The Concert Choir, The Singing/Swingin' Knights and the Knights and 'Daze' Show Choir and The Male Glee Club.

Under Ms. Hall's direction, the City College choirs have delighted audiences from the White House and abroad; in Verona, Italy at The International Choral Music Days Festival, The United Nations Climate Change Conference in Milan, as well as, tours in Rome, Spain and France. The choirs have performed extensively along the eastern seaboard concertizing, competing and participating in numerous festivals where they have consistently won superior ratings, awards and trophies for their performances. The choir has appeared in promotional packages and on the website for The Disney Honors Program. Ms Hall was privileged and honored to have the opportunity to conduct the City Choir at Carnegie Hall in March 2008.

Ms. Hall has prepared choirs for performances with The Baltimore Symphony Orchestra and co-directed works with The Baltimore Choral Arts Society and the Morgan State University Choir. She has conducted numerous Honors Choruses in MD, DC and VA and The ACDA Voices United Summer Conference festival chorus, privileged to share the stage with Weston Noble. Another highlight of Ms Hall's career was the opportunity and the good fortune to work with the Washington Performing Arts Society – Men and Women of the Gospel, and conduct the world premiere of INDABA!, written by and performed with Sweet Honey in the Rock. She enjoys opportunities to perform as a clinician, consultant, adjudicator and conductor. Ms. Hall has also served as The ACDA Eastern Division and State Repertoire and Standards Choir for Senior High School and is a member of CHORUS AMERICA, MENC, and MMEA. She has served as Minster of Music for many churches and is currently the director of The St. John Baptist Church Cathedral Choir in Columbia, MD.

Among the many awards Ms. Hall is grateful to have received are the 'Alumnae of Excellence' Award from her alma mater, Shenandoah University, the Excellence Merit Achievement Initiative for Maryland's Minority Students Award, the Baltimore City Council's Teacher of the Year Award, and the Outstanding Teacher Award from Baltimore City Community College. In addition, she received the Teacher Recognition Award from Johns Hopkins University Center for Talented Youth and was the honoree for The BSO (Baltimore Symphony Orchestra) and The Soulful Symphony in partnership with Magic 95.9 and WWIN–FM, "Honoring Those Who Inspire the Young and Gifted". Most recently, she was the recipient of Excellence in Music Education Award in Baltimore City and the Iota Phi Lambda- Apple for the Teacher Award. She has received citations from the governor, several mayors, city council and many other notable officials. The greatest reward, however, comes from working with those who have a passion for singing and a talent waiting to be developed!!

Dr. Janet Galván

Dr. Janet Galván, professor of music at Ithaca College, conducts the Women's Chorale, the Ithaca College Chorus, and is Artistic Director for the Ithaca Children's Choir. Dr. Galván has prepared choruses for many conductors including Lukas Foss, Carl St. Clair, Eji Oue, Gisele Ben-Dor, Richard Westenberg, and Grant Llewellyn. Dr. Galván's contribution to choral music was recognized by her New York colleagues in 1995 when she received the New York Outstanding Choral Director Award. In 2007 she received Ithaca College's Excellence in Service Award.

Dr. Galván has conducted all-state choruses throughout the United States. She was the 6th national honor choir conductor in the history of ACDA, and she has conducted numerous regional ACDA and MENC honor choirs. Dr. Galván was the conductor of the North American Children's Chorale which performed annually in Carnegie Hall from its creation in 1995 until 2005. In 2002 she conducted the Mormon Tabernacle Choir. Her own choral groups have been chosen to perform at national, regional, and state music conferences, in Carnegie Hall, Alice Tully Hall, Avery Fisher Hall, at invitational choral festivals, and in concerts in the United Kingdom and Europe. Galván has served as a clinician at national, regional, and state conferences of ACDA and MENC. She has also been featured at the VII Curso Internacional de Regencia Coral in Brazil and in workshops in the United Kingdom, Belgium, Canada, and the 2002 World Symposium on Choral Music. Galván has been recognized as one of the country's leading conducting teachers, and her students have received first place awards and been finalists in both the graduate and undergraduate divisions of the ACDA biennial National Choral Conducting Competition.

Dr. Galván was one of the invited authors for GIA's second edition of Teaching Music through Performance in Choir. Her expertise in treble repertoire led to an association with Roger Dean Publishing Company in the origin of two choral series for treble voices. She is also the series advisor to Latin Accents, a series with Boosey & Hawkes. Dr. Galván contributed a chapter on movement in the choral rehearsal to GIA's The School Choral Program: Philosophy, Planning, Organizing and Teaching. Her article on the changing voice was published in the International Federation of Choral Music Journal in August of 2007 and has been reprinted in other international journals. Dr. Galván was a member of the Grammy Award-winning Robert Shaw Festival Singers during Mr. Shaw's final years.

Dr. Baruch J. Whitehead

Dr. Baruch J. Whitehead, an associate professor of music education at Ithaca College, is an elementary music specialist with the Orff-Schulwerk Process. He is the founder of the Ithaca College Orff certification program and lead teacher of the Orff certification program at Boston University. Dr. Whitehead studied at the Orff Institute in Salzburg, Austria and founded the Orff-Schulwerk Certification Program at Marshall University.

Dr. Whitehead was a featured presenter at the International Arts and Humanities conference in Honolulu, Hawaii in 2003, 2004 and 2005 for his research paper in the area of music and learning and diversity in music education. His article entitled The Spirit of the Schulwerk was published in Reverberations. Dr. Whitehead has presented workshops at MENC, NYSSMA, NJMEA and the American Orff-Schulwerk Association national conferences, as well as a workshop entitled "Making the Connection" African-American and Native American Music, in Tenerife, Spain for the 2004 International Music education Conference. He has been a featured presenter for the West Virginia Orff-Schulwerk Association, Twin Tier Orff Association and the Texas Orff-Schulwerk Association along with serving as a clinician, conductor, and adjudicator through West Virginia, Florida, Texas, Ohio and Central New York. Dr. Whitehead traveled to Winchester, England to present a paper on the Music of the Civil Rights Movement in April of 2006.

He is the director of the multicultural chorus Voices in the Greater Ithaca Community and founder of the GIAC African Dance and Drumming ensemble. He is founder and director of the Syracuse-based Gospel Choir "Unshackled". He is a gospel music specialist and advocate for the preservation of gospel music within mainstream musical settings. He is the 2005 recipient of the Excellence in Service Award from Ithaca College. In his travels each summer with students from Ithaca College to the Dagara Music Center in Medie, West Africa he studies African Drumming and Dance where he has established a short-term study abroad program through the International Studies Department at Ithaca College.

Dr. Whitehead has taught marching band and concert band for over fifteen years. He was the athletic band director for Marshall University in Huntington, West Virginia where he directed the Marching Thunder. He served as assistant principal oboist for the Huntington Symphony Orchestra. He was recently chosen as an international author to write a chapter on the Music in the Civil Rights Movement for an upcoming book entitled Music and Conflict Resolution. He is a peace activist and presented a peace concert with famous Israeli musician, composer and performer Yair Dalal along with a special group of young people from the Muslim and Jewish community. His "Peace Cantata" was premiered at the 2006 Martin Luther King Celebration at Ithaca College.

Dr. Whitehead has taught at the World Music Village in Helsinki, Finland and continues to present workshops on diversity in music education for state, national and international conferences. He will be participating in the Russian Mosaic Music Festival in Magnitogorsk, Russia where he will present workshops on gospel music and West African Drumming. Dr. Whitehead was recently awarded tenure and promoted to the rank of associate professor of music education at Ithaca College.
