### Ithaca College Faculty

**Randie Blooding,** baritone, Associate Professor of Voice at Ithaca College, has been a member of the faculty for 12 years. He has performed throughout the United States with the Dallas Civic Opera, Nashville Opera, Pittsburgh Opera Theatre, tlanta Choral Guild and the New York Opera Repertory Theater. Previously in the faculties of Middle Tennessee State University and Southern Methodist University, he has received honors and awards from the National Federation of Music Clubs' National Artist Competition, the National Association of Teachers of Singing competition and the Metropolitan Opera auditions.

Kathy Hansen, pianist, is a staff accompanist at Ithaca College. She maintains a private teaching studio in Ithaca. A graduate of Washington State University with graduate study at the University of Iowa, she lived and taught in New York City private music schools for 12 years. During that time she was a member the chamber music group, Chelsea Ensemble, and performed frequently as soloist with the Bronx Chamber Orchestra. Prior to moving to Ithaca, she spent two years as a rehearsal accompanist with Seattle Opera. Her recordings include collaborative work in "The Pulse of an Irishman", a collection of Irish and Scottish songs arranged by Beethoven. She is thrilled to have a chance to visit Ireland for the second time.

**Carol McAmis**, soprano, Professor of Voice at Ithaca College, has been on the faculty for twenty-two years. She has also taught at Manchester College and University of Kansas. She has performed with the Ithaca Opera Association, ayuga Chamber Orchestra, Fort Wayne Philharmonic, and appeared at Carnegie Hall. Professionally certified as a FELDENKRAIS Practitioner<sup>™</sup>, she teachers workshops throughout the United States which represent a unique approach to learning and teaching singing based on twenty years of experience with various holistic disciplines including the FELDENKRAIS METHOD<sup>®</sup>, Myotherapy, Neuro-Linguistic Programming, performance psychology and guided imagery.

**David Parks**, tenor, Professor of Voice at Ithaca College, has been on the faculty for fourteen years, and previously served as voice teacher at William and Mary College for four years. He has performed with the Syracuse Opera, Michigan Opera Theatre, Virginia Opera, Arizona Opera, Opera Delaware, the Syracuse Symphony, Pacific Symphony, Erie Philharmonic, Louisville Bach Festival, Spoleto U.S.A., and Piedmont Opera Theater. His extensive international performances include appearances with the Spoleto Festival in Italy, CAPAB Opera, PACOFS Opera, the National South African Arts Festival, and the Mauerbach Festival in Vienna. He recently traveled to Sarajevo where he performed as the only American soloist in the Sarajevo Philharmonic Orchestra's performance of Mozart's "Requiem".

elly Samarzea, contralto, joined the Ithaca College faculty as Assistant rofessor of Voice in 2001, previously having served on the faculty at Mississippi State University. She has appeared regionally with the Cincinnati Opera, Des Moines Metro Opera and the Indiana University Opera Theater, in addition to extensive international performances throughout the Middle East and Asia. She has received prizes and honors from the Metropolitan Opera auditions, Opera Music Theater International, and the National Association of Teachers of Singing.
