Pianist Timothy Shafer has concertized extensively throughout the United States, performing, teaching, and discussing the rich heritage of piano repertoire. With degrees from Oberlin Conservatory and Indiana University (Bloomington), Dr. Shafer is the recipient of Oberlin's Rudolf Serkin Outstanding Pianist Award, Indiana University's Annual Concerto Competition, and the 1997 PMTA Teacher of the Year Award. He has twice appeared at Carnegie Hall's Weill Recital Hall, and has also recorded a CD with violinist lames Lyon entitled Out Standing in Our Field. Appointed in 1986, Shafer is currently Professor at Penn State where he teaches piano, coordinates class piano and pedagogy programs. He is a frequent concerto soloist with regional orchestras, and is active as a chamber musician and soloist. Shafer's writings about piano teaching and repertoire have been published by Prentice Hall, Scarecrow Press, and the American Music Teacher, among others. Shafer is currently serves as music consultant for the Psalter-Hymnal project of the Orthodox Presbyterian Church. Tim lives in State College with his wife Lou Ann and their daughters Sarah, Elisabeth, and Grace. All are members of Resurrection Orthodox Presbyterian Church.
