## **Essential Tools for Sewing**

- Awl, or other tool that
  - has a sharp point
  - can make a hole about 1 mm wide through several sheets of paper
- Thread, preferably 3-ply waxed cotton cord
  - if using regular thread, double it
  - if unwaxed, rub thread against a candle to wax it
- Needles with eyelets wide enough for thread

## **Essential Tools for Paper Repair**

- Water brush
- Waxed paper (plastic sheets may be an acceptable substitute for some uses)
- Paint brushes
- Japanese paper (Japanese tissue)
  - *kozogami* in Japanese
  - made from paper mulberry tree (Broussonetia papyrifera)
  - available from art and specialty paper shops
  - no easy substitute

## **Tools when Using Japanese Paper**



## **Essential All-Purpose Tools**

- Skewers or rods (chopsticks will often work)
- Tweezers
- Cotton cloth
- Gauze bandages
- Spatula (or other tool with long, smooth, blunt edge)
- Wheat paste
  - 160 ml water
  - 30 ml white wheat starch or flour
  - mix; cook gently until hot, stirring frequently; let cool
  - keeps for about 1 week

#### Biography of James De Forest Cline:

James DeForest Cline was Professor of Music at the University of Northern Colorado from 1922 to 1949. He composed, patriotic marches, choral music, an oratorio, an operetta, several school songs and the University's current school song "Ah, Well I Remember." He also served as conductor of the Greeley Philharmonic Orchestra from 1923-1933.

He received an honorary degree from the University of Northern Colorado in 1940.

Aleesha was performed on campus in Spring 1933. Alisha was performed in January 1929.

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


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	His family moved to Denver from New York City when he was five, and he later returned there to study music. At the age of 17 he became a violin soloist with the Red Path Chautauqua and Lyceum and performed with them for seven years, traveling across the country.						
	Ginsburg settled in Denver at the age of 22 and headed the string department at Wolcott Conservatory of Music, which later became the Denver College of Music. While at the Wolcott Conservatory he organized the Denver String Quartet and was its first violinist. He was head of the string department there until he took a position teaching music at Colorado State Teachers College in Greeley in 1931.						
	Ginsburg began teaching music at Colorado State Teachers College in Greeley and continued teaching there until 1957. He received his Master of Arts degree in Music from CSTC in 1942, and in 1952 CSCE recognized his achievements by awarding him an honorary Doctor of Music degree.						
	An extraordinarily accomplished violinist, he served as concertmaster for the Denver Symphony Orchestra for over 20 years. He was the concertmaster for the Rudolph Ganz and Henry Hadley orchestras at the summer concerts held at the original Elitch Gardens, and was the concertmaster for the Central City Opera orchestra						
	Ginsburg's superb musicianship also carried over to his orchestral leadership. As musical director of Denver's KOA radio, he conducted ensembles for the General Electric Hour and McMurtry Golden Melodies. He was also the conductor for the America Theatre Company, which accompanied silent movies.						
	When he came to Greeley, Ginsberg played a major part in the Greeley Philharmonic Orchestra, first as concertmaster, and then beginning in 1934 as its conductor. In his 26 years as the maestro, he contributed greatly to its success and longevity, including bringing great artists to the area and launching the Junior Philharmonic. He retired from that position in 1970.

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## **Overview of formats**

### Web page

- + : accessible via web browsers (e.g., Google)
- - : most difficult to maintain
- - : can't be sorted
- PDF linked to web page
  - + : accessible via some web browsers (e.g., Google)
  - - : can't be sorted
- Spreadsheet linked to web page
  - + : sortable
  - - : not accessible via web browsers?

### Recommendation:

- link in both PDF and spreadsheet formats
- (you're creating the PDF from a spreadsheet already)
- also create web page if resources and expertise permit

## But wait, there's more . . .

- If your library is too small for an online catalog, or
- If you can't afford library catalog software . . .
- Publish your library holdings as a spreadsheet!
  - Users can access your "catalog" online
  - Users can sort by field (e.g., all the Mozart, all the vocal scores, all the fake books)
  - Users can search by word (ctrl-f)
  - If you share with other libraries, they can easily see what you have
