3. **Plenary or Small Group? Plenary**
4. **Learning Outcomes**
  - a. Students will meaningfully explore personal values in light of shared institutional values and universal human rights.
  - b. The student will be able to explain the meaning of and rationale behind the concept of universal human rights.
  - c. The student will be able to articulate a personal grounding narrative that is alert to and respectful of the context of life at a Catholic college and within a pluralistic community.

5. **Brief Narrative:**

One of the chief hindrances to social justice is apathetic endorsement of the status quo. This presentation will challenge attitudes of indifference and relativistic isolation, calling for a personal and collective commitment to universal human rights.

A lecture with student interaction taking place through live use of Google Forms or Cahoot. Combined answers will be projected on screen to get student feedback. This will be used for a version of pre- and post-test on a couple of basic points.
