



This morning I was helping my middle daughter make the batter for banana bread. Once everything was mixed, we placed the soft batter into a loaf pan and then put it in the oven. Of course, we all had to wait an hour before we could even think about enjoying her creation.

As the baking bread began to smell more and more appetizing, I began to think about anticipation - our anticipation of the treat to come, and the eager anticipation that often follows other decisions. In my case, last March I made the decision to come to St. Norbert College after spending 18 years at another institution, first as a professor (teaching organic chemistry) and more recently as associate provost. The anticipation that my family and I felt was extended because I was not to start my position here until July 1 – and they would not follow until a month later. We were eager to experience the *communio* reflected in all that we do at the college.

Yet, this is not all that much different from the anticipation that many of the newest members of our community experience. ## A legacy of friendship

For Beth Blahnik '04 (College Advancement), connecting donors' passions with the financial needs of students is all in a day's work. Some days, though, making that connection carries particular meaning, as with the recent creation of the Justin C. Kausch Memorial Scholarship Fund.

Justin Kausch '03 was Blahnik's friend and classmate at St. Norbert. An honor student and athlete. Kausch was, in fact, a friend to many. His penchant for developing relationships led him, during his time at St. Norbert, to found the independent fraternity Alpha Kappa Pi with six friends. With Kausch as the group's first recruiting officer. Alpha Kappa Pi flourished, eventually joining the Phi Delta Theta international fraternity. Tragically, Kausch didn't get to witness that accomplishment. In 2002, he died in a car accident while spending the summer after his junior year at home.

Now, his parents, together with Kausch's friends Christopher Lundh '03. Carson Diltz '02, Evan Celing '03 and Peter Andrews '04, plus members of Phi Delta Theta, have worked with Blahnik to see into fruition a scholarship fund that honors both Kausch's life and the value he placed on the sense of community. The Kausch Memorial Fund provides annual financial assistance to a community-focused sophomore, junior or senior. Preference is given to members of Phi Delta Theta as well as to those majoring in biology and chemistry – fields that particularly interested Kausch.

Blahnik, as both Kausch's friend and, now, as newly elected advisor to Phi Delta Theta, has relished her role in establishing the scholarship. "All around, this has simply been a joy," she says.

## Bud Selig to speak at Sport and Society 2012

Maior League Baseball commissioner Bud Selig will be one of the featured speakers at the second "A Mirror of Our Culture: Sport and Society in America" conference, scheduled for May 22-24, 2012. Scholars who focus on the impact of sports, along with professionals in sports-related fields, will gather for this, the second conference of its kind co-sponsored by St. Norbert College and the Green Bay Packers.

The conference, held both on campus and at Lambeau Field, encourages academics and practitioners to share their expertise in American sport through presentations, papers and networking. In addition to keynote addresses by Selig and other renowned professionals from the world of sport, the event will feature a gallery exhibition of the finest American sports photography and a juried festival of sports-themed films and videos.

Prominent human rights scholar George Lopez received the college's 2011 Ambassador of Peace Award during a Sept. 21 reception in his honor. Lopez, the University of Notre Dame's Rev. Theodore M. Hesburgh, C.S.C., Professor of Peace Studies, serves as an advisor to the U.N. Security Council, the European Union and numerous governments and human rights organizations.

The college's annual Ambassador of Peace Award honors an individual who is an influential advocate for sustainable peace and demonstrates the qualities of a peacemaker.

## Meet the Class of 2015

They are the record-breaking, AP-taking, difference-making Class of 2015 and it is our pleasure to introduce you to these, our new firstyears, by letting you know just a few of the things they have already achieved.

Incoming students for this academic year competed among the largest pool of applicants ever and, in the process of admitting the class of 2015, other records were broken, too. The 2,270 total applications for a first-year place mark a 12.32 percent increase over the previous high of 2.021 (set in 2008) and a 12.76 increase from last vear.

The office of admission went on to enroll the second-largest group in college history. The incoming group totals 659, a figure that includes 580 new U.S. first-years, 56 new U.S. transfer students and 23 international students. The new cohort is the most selective ever and also includes. the largest number of students of color.

Individual members of the class have already proven themselves in some pretty remarkable arenas. Among their numbers are:

The new director of the Mulva Library says she desired a career that would allow her to live out deeply held values – values nurtured at Earlham College, the Religious Society of Friends (Quaker) school where she majored in peace and iustice studies. It wasn't until she landed a job at the science branch library, though, that she realized a career as a librarian could do just that.

She says, "It was there that I learned more about the connection between libraries and democracy, the role that a library plays in a democracy and how, in an educational institution the library is also able to be a partner in a student's education."

Vogel went on to graduate from Indiana

University School of Library and Information Science. In the years since, she's held positions at Alma College, Illinois Weslevan University and St. Louis University.

Vogel joined the Mulva team this July. Though only on campus a short while, she has already reached out to many staff members,

current requirements. And faculty members tell her students need to continue to improve their research skills and information "savvy-ness."

Traditionally, students learn research skills from their professors in class, from faculty members and librarians teaming up to teach targeted skills, or by signing up for an individual workshop at the library. Vogel says the library staff is looking to add another option - short electronic tutorials that can be accessed whenever the students want and need them.

Vogel says: "Students learn best when they have a need. So students in college are highly motivated when they've got a research assignment from a faculty member and they need to know, and they want to know, how to get the best information for a project." Library staff have access to tutorials created elsewhere and have recently

## Krew knows what to do

Clad in bright orange Kunkel's Krew Tshirts, 130 student, faculty and staff volunteers swarmed campus Aug. 26 to carry boxes, answer questions and personify *communio* for new Green Knights moving into the college's residence halls. It was the start of the academic year and movein day for the Class of 2015.

"There were quite a few people who didn't have to move a thing. By the time they checked into their hall, all their stuff had already been carried to their room," says Rob Trembinski (Residential Education and Housing), "All the students, staff and faculty who helped out just had a blast."

The number of volunteers for the first-ofits-kind welcome effort, launched with the help of **President Tom Kunkel**, exceeded expectations by 30 percent – and the 110 returning students on Kunkel's Krew reaped a few benefits of their own. They got to move in on Aug. 24 ahead of other students, and they were thanked with an invitation to dinner at the president's residence at the end of move-in day.

## Workshops on Somali culture meet local need

Some 30 educators, health-care workers and social services agents gathered on campus in August and September for a taste of Somalia's traditions and an introduction to the language of the African nation.

Language Services offered the two Somali culture workshops in response to the quadrupling of northeast Wisconsin's Somali population in the past year. Years of conflict and drought have displaced millions of Somalis.

The Green Bay area's safe environment, affordable housing and new mosque have attracted the mostly second-generation refugees, many of whom are Muslim.

Firdosa Hussein, the Somali liaison for the Green Bay Area School District, led the series of workshops. The Green Bay and Howard-Suamico school districts expect to see continued increases in their Somali student populations.

## College loses a friend

Evaleen Neufeld, "an outstanding lady" and the first woman to chair the college's board of trustees, has died at the age of 86.

Neufeld, who made her career as a social worker, served on the board 1978-92, and as its



chair 1988-92. She was instrumental in seeing the Bemis International Center built, and is remembered particularly for the strong interest she took in the student body. She was awarded an honorary doctorate in

humane letters in 1993.

President Emeritus Thomas Manion remembers: "When there was a decision to make, I'd always ask the question, 'Is it the right thing to do?' Evie would say, 'Is it the kind thing to do?' She was an outstanding lady. She made us think in different directions.'

Neufeld and her late husband, Joe, established six scholarships at St. Norbert, and many other institutions also benefited from the couple's ongoing and generous philanthropy. Neufeld, who was a longtime resident of De Pere, died on Sept. 5, 2011.

## Timely discovery greets Class of 1961

Just a few weeks before the Class of 1961 assembled on campus for its 50th reunion, a construction worker discovered a time capsule - from 1961.

Pat Wells, of Miron Construction, has been working on the new Michels Commons, a transformation of the former Sensenbrenner Union building. When he spotted a gleam of copper inside the original Sensenbrenner cornerstone, removed for the installation of a new elevator, he investigated further.

The capsule was so well sealed that it had to be forced open with metal cutters. The Rev. Jay Fostner, O.Praem., '84 (Mission and Student Affairs) says: "We were considering waiting for the dedication of the new building. But we got too excited!"

The contents - photos and college publications, including an edition of The St. Norbert Alumni Quarterly, a precursor to this magazine – were removed and put on display in time for the Class of 1961's reunion. Those items, alongside their 2011 counterparts, will be sealed in a new time capsule that will be set in the cornerstone of Michels Commons.

who aspires to a career in the medical field. "I would like to be involved in music, and I like that you can participate in music without having it be a major or minor. I was hoping to get a feel for the campus, and I'm very satisfied with my visit.'

Her mother, on the other hand, was so taken by the visual appeal of the campus

and the friendliness of the people they encountered that she found it difficult to contain her enthusiasm. "My first impression is, the school is absolutely beautiful," Marie stated. "Looking at the updated buildings, it's so appealing. Alyssa is very smart, loves the smaller setting and class sizes, but all the while I'm thinking, 'Yes, but it's beautiful!''

The experience of first-time visitors to campus has been transformed by the Ariens Family Welcome Center, and all was made possible by a wholesale reimagining of the original Third Street admissions building a reimagining that has seen the college's core tradition of radical hospitality now actually rendered in bricks and mortar.

The project, completed in August, more than doubles the original building's square footage and reorients its main entrance to focus on the heart of the campus. Windows in the building's Glenn and Barbara Madrigrano Gallery and Presentation Theatre provide a wide view of Third Street and the St. Norbert arch. Visitors have a clear view of landmarks such as the Mulva Library, Abbot Pennings Hall of Fine Arts and Baer Mall. The gallery in the building's rotunda greets visitors with its high-impact images illustrating the St. Norbert experience and words used in iconic fashion to encapsulate the essence of the institution.

"Your introduction to communio begins right here," explains Bridget Krage O'Connor '93 (Enrollment Management and Communications). "The Ariens Family Welcome Center is a special tribute to a

family that has been involved and engaged with the college for decades. Now we can extend that welcome to countless families for years to come. This facility allows us to transcend the typical campus tour and help people understand what St. Norbert College is all about. The gallery and rotunda of the building are intended to provide a very welcoming experience, and a bit of a 'wow' factor, too."

That "wow" factor scored a direct hit on John Angster, who visited the campus with his daughter, Jennifer, on what happened to be Dedication Day for the new facility. "Our first impression was, the building looks very new, but we had no benchmark for what it was like prior to this," John said. "We went right in and told the staff we were here for a tour. They had a packet ready for us and were attentive to us, even though the dedication events were taking place."

The Admissions staff leads four scheduled tours that start from the rotunda throughout the day. Staff make an effort to accommodate additional requests, such as

visits with faculty members or even sitting in on a class. Prospective athletes also meet with coaches and tour the athletics facilities.

"Every family has a different agenda when they visit the campus," said Jim Stamatakos (Admissions). "Our tours are very modular, so the pieces can be moved around and adjusted as needed."

Jennifer Angster is a high-school track star who is interested in continuing her athletics career at the college level. Soon after she clicked the "How to Apply" button on the St. Norbert website, she received a call from track coach Don Augustine.

"He set up the tour for me, and we even had lunch during our visit with some of the track and cross-country people," Jennifer said. "The tour definitely got my interest."

"It was quite impressive as we walked the campus to see all the capital expenditures either in progress or recently completed," her father noted. "Today's experience was the best of the four other significant campus visits we've had."

## Three moments of decision arrive

Donors talk about why they give - and the deeper context where possibility begins to take shape.

amilies and individuals who have the capacity to make major gifts are used L to fielding requests for financial assistance. It takes a special relationship with the organization and a project that triggers a passionate desire to make a difference before donors can arrive at a point of taking action.

Major gifts are the lifeblood for private institutions like St. Norbert. The task of matching donors with a campus need for which they have a passion is the responsibility of Phil Oswald (College

Advancement) and President Tom Kunkel.

"Major gifts don't happen unless there is a level of trust for the leadership and financial stability of the institution," Oswald explains. "Projects need to be meaningful for donors. An additional arrival point is when we can help donors see where their passions align with the needs of the college in getting to where it's trying to go."

St. Norbert has benefited recently from the generosity of several families who arrived at their own points of decision, yet with each building on the strength of the other. The result is an impressive transformation of the campus, ushering in a new era for new generations of students.

"There certainly is a lot of momentum on campus," Oswald says. "When you have three cranes working at once, you've got some good things happening."

## The Ariens Family Welcome Center

he Ariens family has a history of giving that stretches back to the early 1950s, when the parents of Mike Ariens donated homes on Fourth Street and Reid Street to the college. Mike is a former board of trustees chair who attended St. Norbert from 1959 to 1962. He met his wife, Mimi, near the spot where the Ariens Family Welcome Center stands today, at the corner of College and Third. Six of the couple's nine children are St. Norbert graduates, Mike's three brothers attended the college, and even Mimi's father attended the old St. Norbert High School in the 1930s. The family's ties to the college truly run deep. "Our family has a history of gifting to the college, so we agreed to meet with Tom Kunkel when he called and asked to talk about a building project they had," Ariens recalls. "He and Phil [Oswald]

"Ed said that not only did he think it was a good idea to combine these offices under one roof, he was willing to contribute the resources to flesh it out. Without that, we wouldn't have been able to get the ball rolling."

"They were eager to do a project on campus," Thompson says. "My donation was important, but the involvement and creativity of putting this together in an attractive way also helped. Another important arrival point for me was understanding the value of attracting the right kids and communicating well with them. The combination ... deserved to be on that main street and in an attractive building."

The Michels family also has a long history of giving to St. Norbert, and had endowed the Michels Chair in Business. The family was open to considering an additional major gift, but the college's first suggestion of renovating the John Minahan Science Hall did not strike quite the right chord.

When Kunkel and Oswald paid the family a follow-up visit in September of 2010, the Michelses reiterated their desire to contribute in a way that would make a broader impact on the student experience.

"We wanted to help the college in some way, but the science building was not a good fit for us at that time," explains **Kevin Michels '89**, one of three brothers to graduate from the college.

When Kevin asked about the potential of updating the Sensenbrenner Memorial Union and cafeteria, it caught Oswald and Kunkel off-guard. The building certainly needed renovation, but it wasn't high on the priority list and the college had yet to develop a proposal for such a project.

"Pat Michels then asked what would happen if the family gave us a large donation. How quickly would the union project move up on the priority list?" recalls Oswald. "Tom [Kunkel] looked at his watch, and that elicited some laughter."

The president's tongue-in-cheek response wasn't really an exaggeration. The St. Norbert team quickly huddled with designers and the Union staff over the next four weeks to develop a concept. The Michels family then traveled to campus to tour the facility and ask a number of questions. Upon exiting the union, the family asked for some privacy to discuss their decision. A few minutes later, they were ready to move forward.

Tim Michels '84 sealed the deal when he symbolically handed a check to Student Government Association representative Keri Hodnik '13 at a later building committee meeting. As Tim told Hodnik, this was for her and all the students at St. Norbert.

When Michels Commons opens next spring, it will stand as a state-of-the-art dining facility and reception space.

"We felt we'd be able to help the most

for a student body that potentially visits that building three times a day or more," Kevin Michels says. "We knew it was in need of major work and we felt it was a worthy project. Whether you're a prospective student or current student, that's the one place you go all the time. It fit our goals very nicely."



## St. Norbert College invites you to Week of Welcome

St. Norbert's First Year Experience (FYE) is a three-tiered program designed to help students succeed in their early days at the college. It begins with Summer Orientation, a two-day program that gives students a feel for the campus and a chance to get things set before they arrive in the fall.

Week of Welcome starts with move-in day, a few days before classes begin. Events help new students get comfortable and create a network of friends and support. Every new student is assigned to an FYE group of about 18 students who meet regularly with a mentor – a junior or senior - in the first six weeks of school.

"That's where you get to know some of your classmates for the first time." savs Nicole Jagielski '12. "It's your first group. You get to know people who aren't in your building, who aren't in your class. It's outside of an academic and residential setting, and that takes the pressure off. Because you have an FYE mentor who's another student, it's easier to ask stupid questions! It's your chance to ask how Knightline works; how early is the Campus Center open; how you look up dining menus."





Bonnie McVey (Computer Science) and Terry Jo Leiterman (Mathematics) were paired as faculty mentor and mentee when Leiterman arrived at St. Norbert five years ago. It was a meaningful connection that saw the start of an ongoing and productive friendship.

For new faculty, a new community

hanks to a unique faculty development program, new professors arriving on campus forge quick connections and find common ground in their new environment. Tomas Bogardus (Philosophy) and Mara Brecht (Religious Studies) discovered a mutual interest while chatting at the college's New Faculty Orientation Program this summer.

Both had written doctoral dissertations on epistemology - the study of knowledge. Soon they were discussing potential collaboration on a conference or workshop examining religious disagreement and religious diversity.

That's not a lone example of the relationships the program fosters.

Bob Pyne (Peace and Justice) says he made close friends when he participated in the program in 2009: "I discovered some natural

connections between others' work and mine. A couple of them have gotten involved in the peace and justice minor, which none of us had anticipated, and I have helped out in their classes and programs. There is a strong sense of collegiality, largely formed during those first few orientation times together."

Other sorts of bonds are also forged.

Bogardus and other new faculty set play dates for their young children, while Brecht says connections she made with new biology, sociology and library faculty mean "we can get to know each other more and have an impetus to get together more throughout the semester and the coming years."

Second-year faculty member Ryan Cordell (English) agrees. "The biggest benefit really is creating a cohort. I made a lot of friends with the other faculty who are coming in. They're my staple group who I always see at faculty meetings and other events. I think that really builds that sense of community here, to have not

just your own discipline but also this group of people from other disciplines who you associate closely with.'

Third-year faculty member Tynisha Meidl (Education) says her cohort met informally for lunch to discuss various issues. "You feel you have this bond and sense of connection with others who are coming in at the same time."

Cordell also found a racquetball partner - Blake Henson (Music) - and says discussing challenges

they face is a big part of their games. Building a cohort and encouraging collaboration have been aims of the New Faculty Orientation Program since it started in 1985, says Linda Beane Katner (Modern Languages and Literatures). The program fits into the office of faculty development's mission of assisting in the professional and personal growth of full- and part-time

faculty throughout their careers. The office does this by providing voluntary, confidential, individual consultation; a 1,800-volume library of professional materials; information on successful grant-writing; and funding for professional development conferences.

The college places such importance on faculty development that Beane Katner meets individually with each tenure-track candidate for 45 to 60 minutes. "It's a privilege to be able to tell our story to the faculty

candidates. They will see when they compare us to their other potential offers, wow, they've got something going on there."

Several say the services described in those meetings were a factor in their decision to come to the college.

Once they arrive, new faculty gather in August for an intensive two-day workshop starting with breakfast at St. Norbert Abbey, where the Rev. Jay Fostner, O.Praem., '84 (Mission and Student Affairs) discusses the college's Norbertine roots and leads a tour.

Participants then move to the college for talks about student demographics, building a syllabus, surviving the first few weeks and other basic information. President Tom Kunkel and Dean Jeff Frick welcome them and host lunches.

Their considerable involvement in the program surprised Bogardus. "They were really around quite a bit, which was nice," he says.

Kunkel says the program's purpose is "to connect these important people to the heart of the community right from the start, and it works very well."

The orientation allows administrators to talk about the college's mission and why faculty are central to it, and to thank them for choosing St. Norbert. It also increases understanding of expectations, helps faculty learn the college's culture, allows them to interact with experienced faculty, administrators and students, and gives them a taste of radical hospitality, Frick says.

Ed Risden (English), who

participated in the program in 1990, says: "Probably for me the most useful part of the orientation was the extended process of welcome, a way of saying to new faculty and staff, 'We care about you, we want you to succeed, we want you to be happy here,' rather than any specific advice about things to do or things not to do. It was that sense of entering a community and feeling welcome there."

Ken Zahorski (English, Emeritus) was the office's founding director from its start in 1985 to 2006, when Beane Katner came on board. He says the program has always included new administrators and all new full-time and part-time faculty:

"Whether it was through new faculty orientation or any other program, I've always strongly believed that when faculty are given an opportunity to grow professionally

and personally, the ultimate beneficiaries are the students."

Beane Katner calls her role with the program the best job on campus. "This is all good," she says. "I don't evaluate people. It's just about helping people achieve their full potential. We give out money. We offer these training opportunities. It's very, very rewarding to help people reach their full potential."

Faculty orientation also includes six 90-minute workshops during the first year and assignment of a mentor with whom to discuss professional and personal concerns.

Bogardus says his mentor, John Neary (English), was among the faculty members who helped his family move into their house.

Brecht's mentor, Shalisa Collins (Modern Foreign Languages), texted her before her first class wishing her good luck. "That was really nice. It's a simple thing, but it's a really good way to start the day knowing that somebody here who has more experience is paying attention to you and keeping you in their thoughts." 🗣

**T** f you want to help an area struck by disaster, then have a practical skill to l offer and be ready to be self-sufficient. It's sound advice from an obstetrician and dentist whose vacations the past eight years have found them delivering babies and practicing oral surgery in Haiti, Sri Lanka, Bosnia, Honduras and New Orleans.

Drs. Carol (Ehlinger) '77 and Tom Ritter '78 set up clinics, create medical team networks, raise money and try to foster lasting relationships with the people they serve. Their humanitarian aid trips last from a weekend to three weeks. Tom explains, "It's a vacation for us to practice what we love to do without the barriers we face delivering healthcare in the States."

The couple met at St. Norbert when they were each other's lab instructors in chemistry and microbiology. Married in 1984, they moved to Baltimore for Carol's residency at Johns Hopkins and Greater Baltimore Medical Center, where she is the director of minimally invasive surgery. Tom established a dental practice and the couple settled down to raise three children.

The Ritters undertook their first medical missions in 2004, when a team working in Honduras after Hurricane Mitch needed an obstetrician and a dentist to help.

Carol's journey to assist in relief efforts in Sri Lanka after the 2004 tsunami pulled her away from the filming of "If the Bough Breaks," the documentary the Ritters produced to educate the public on the rising costs of liability insurance - costs that are driving medical professionals away from their field.

Erik Brekke (Physics) connects with Jamie Lynch (Sociology) during one of the first workshops held for the 2011-12 cohort of new faculty members.

Besides helping to improve the Haitian dental school, Tom acts as a logistician who networks with medical teams, coordinates the flow of dental supplies, teaches and follows the care of patients. "We try not to be medical tourists," Carol says. "We go back to the villages to follow up and monitor our treatment outcomes." Carol coordinates with local doctors in Haiti, does Pap smears for hundreds of Haitian women and takes the specimens back to Baltimore for analysis, returning to operate on the abnormal results. "There is an epidemic of aggressive cervical cancer in Haiti," Carol says. Life expectancy for Haitian women is 45 and dropping.

Critical is finding local women to relay information to other women. "I try to be a voice for the voiceless - to help women empower each other," Carol says.

Carol's joy is delivering babies, because she gets to be the first person to touch the new arrivals. "This is all so much bigger than myself, " she says. Tom agrees: "You can wake up each day knowing that you

The Ritter's primary focus has been Haiti, since well before the 2010 earthquake hit. They have made some 20 humanitarian aid trips there since Carol's parents first connected with the country, through the Rev. Larry Canavera's Friends of Haiti group at St. Philip's Church, Green Bay. "We went to Haiti because of my parents' relationship with Father Larry and the church," Carol says. "It's been a love affair

can make a difference." Sometimes that requires all one's knowledge and skill. Other times, it's simple: fixing a patient's wheelchair, replacing inefficient cooking devices, introducing sterilization techniques.


Vital to the Ritters' work is listening, paying attention, networking and "doing the right work for the right reasons to make the right changes." It can be difficult not to overpromise what you can accomplish in Haiti or take on too many projects, they say.

After a disaster, medical aid workers often suffer from symptoms of posttraumatic stress disorder. Arriving three days after the 2010 earthquake, teams had to use Civil War methods to care for trauma victims and perform surgery in makeshift hospitals, using whatever was brought in their suitcases. Returning home can sometimes be the most difficult part. "People ask, 'How was Haiti?' but they really don't want to hear the long answer," says Tom.

However, the Ritters' days at St. Norbert planted hopeful seeds. Grateful for the selfless service of the Norbertines, the Ritters are also guided by it. As Tom says: "So after you've developed a profession, expanded your mind, found God, attained bliss, found your passion ... what do you do the next day? To us, the answer seems universal across all religious and spiritual traditions: Give back. Serve others selflessly."

Their next trip to Haiti will be in February 2012. 📌



hen he first set foot on U.S. soil, the Dutch Norbertine priest Bernard Pennings likely had little idea that those first steps in a new world would lead, not five years later, to the founding of St. Norbert College.

A mixture of excitement and trepidation, common to all starting off on a new adventure, must have accompanied the Rev.

Bernard Pennings, O.Praem., and his two Norbertine companions as they set off from Berne Abbey in the Netherlands on a chilly All Saints Day in 1893. It was the start of several weeks of travel to the remote frontier of northeast Wisconsin.

Bishop Messmer of Green Bay had contacted the abbot at Berne, asking him to send priests to help minister to the growing number of Belgian Catholics in what is now Wisconsin's Door Peninsula. Now three Norbertine volunteers -Pennings, the Rev. Lambert Broens, O.Praem., and Br. Servatius Heesackers, O.Praem. - were on their way to Wisconsin, with little knowledge of where they were going and what they were getting into.



## Seven: a most literate number

Seven books + one department + one year = incredible. Yet that's just what the English department has accomplished. Six professors wrote or edited seven books that were published, or are about to be published, this year.

"There's a culture of scholarship among the English faculty that is pretty impressive," says Michael Marsden (English), coeditor of "Westerns: The Essential 'Journal of Popular Film and Television' Collection" (Routledge, 2012). "And it's a good example of why the argument that teaching and scholarship are not complementary is wrong. They are."

But is there more to it than that? Is there some kind of synergy among staff members spurring such creativity? Yes, says Marsden, to some degree. While he and his colleagues are fairly independent and don't typically discuss their work at staff meetings or, say, ask each other for editing assistance, they'll casually chat about their projects over coffee or at social gatherings. And there's a strong undercurrent of support, says Marsden, which is invaluable.

Laurie MacDiarmid (English) agrees. Her new book, "Consolation Prize" (Georgetown Review Press, 2012), is a collection of poems about her family's life after her father's death when she was not quite two years old. She had written nearly all of the poems before she arrived at St. Norbert in 2000 and had been trying to get them published for years. So while she didn't find her creative impetus in her colleagues, she says, "What this place gave me was the encouragement to send it out over and over again." MacDiarmid also credits her students for her success: "The push to publish is arduous and soul-killing. But then I had a moment where I realized, I can't be standing in front of my students saying they should write every day, and have a thick skin [about getting rejected], so I sent it out one more time."

That's when her submission bested more than 300 entries to win the 2011 Georgetown Review Poetry Manuscript Contest. Although Marsden says the group's sudden slew of published books is "so unusual" and "like an alignment of the stars," he's already at work on another book, his 12th.

part to a \$2,500 scholarship from the School for International Training Study Abroad (SIT). Francuz, an international student from Serbia, is partnering with SIT for a semester that will include homestays with a family resident in the capital and a Bedouin family in the desert region of Badia

## Student revives organ music at Sunday Mass

Emily Bielinski '12 did not set out on a mission to reintegrate the organ into worship music, but that's precisely what she does every Sunday at Old St. Joseph Church. The results, according to music ministry coordinator Jennifer McAllister

When Bielinski arrived at St. Norbert, she enrolled in organ lessons not only to continue her progress on the instrument but also to meet other people who were interested in the organ. "It was hard in high school," Bielinski says, "because I had nobody to share that passion with." Since then, she's not only found other students and professors who share her enthusiasm, but also works toward cultivating the same love for organ music in those around her. The music ministry at Old St. Joseph Church provides a weekly outlet for her to do just that.

"Many Catholic churches do not even have organs anymore," says Bielinski. "Old St. Joseph Church has a beautiful instrument in our space, and I fully believe that it needs to be used."

Bielinski certainly seizes the opportunity to incorporate the organ into Mass. "Emily is not shy about her love of organ," says McAllister. "She often has me

listen to a piece that I am not sure will work on organ, but more often than not, it works beautifully."


Bielinski admits that the process of reintegrating organ music into Masses has been gradual. "I started slow, playing only the traditional songs such as 'Now Thank We All Our God.' The more I got to know Jennifer, the more she began to trust me to try new pieces on the organ. I started to introduce more contemporary songs on the organ, such as 'City of God.'"

"Most importantly," Bielinski states, "we both try to find something that works for Old St. Joe's, that fits liturgically, yet is musically interesting to the parish."

Bielinski's weekly organ lessons with **Jeff Verkuilen** (Music) give her the basis she needs to play well each Sunday. "Emily's skills and confidence have improved considerably as a leader and accompanist of congregation and solo singing," says Verkuilen.

When Bielinski holds her senior recital on Nov. 11 at St. Norbert Abbey, she will demonstrate not only her technical ability but also her training in leading congregational music, as she directs the audience in a hymn.

## A novel setting



Scenes that play out against a familiar backdrop move forward the action of "Miracle Beach" (Penguin, 2011). Magda Allen, a character in the debut novel of Erin **Celello '99**, lives in De Pere, a half-mile away from St. Norbert College, Allen's interactions with the college are largely interior, as she attempts to reconcile the loss of her only son. In one particular scene, she stops along the stretch of the Fox River near the Campus Center. She watches students running across the Main Street bridge, and the rowing team practicing. Initials carved into the bench of a picnic table serve to remind her of an earlier time in her marriage, and allow her to question her son's relationship with his widow.

The novel centers around the two relationships called to mind by those carved initials: Allen's own deteriorating marriage, and her daughter-in-law's abruptly ended one. A significant part of the rest of the novel, which chronicles a family's struggle with loneliness and loss, takes place on Vancouver Island, a locale familiar to Celello from summer vacations.

Celello majored in English at St. Norbert, where she also ran track and was an editor of the St. Norbert Times. She earned an M.F.A. in fiction from Northern Michigan University. She now lives in Madison, Wis., with her husband, Aaron, and is working on a second novel.





## Adjustment in service

A new chapter begins for retiring military chaplains

fter more than four decades of combined military service on land, in the air and on the sea, the Rev. Steven Vanden Boogard, O.Praem., '81 and the Rev. Michael Weber, O.Praem., are adjusting to retired life.

Vanden Boogard, a Kimberly native, was ordained a priest in 1988. Five years later, he was commissioned in the U.S. Navy Reserve, marking a return to the military. He had earlier served as a hospital corpsman from 1972 to 1978, during the Vietnam War era.

"I did a little over 22 years with active duty and reserves," he says. "I spent a little over five years on the decks of ships. I sailed everything from harbor tugs to nuclear-propelled aircraft carriers and everything in between."

Vanden Boogard, who served both the U.S. Navy and Marines, recalls one year that he spent 330 days at sea. His land deployments included service at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, and with the 5th Marine Regiment in Iraq. The ministry was rewarding but very demanding, he says.

"The biggest challenge was there were very few priests," he says. "For instance, in Iraq, you've got a geographical area that's bigger than Green Bay, yet you are the only priest. When I was there, I had four battalions of Marines and an Army brigade of soldiers. Plus I had 1,500 of my own personal Marines scattered all over Fallujah.'

In addition to celebrating Masses and the sacraments, Vanden Boogard was called upon to minister to soldiers and sailors dealing with personal problems, including marital issues, and drug and alcohol dependency. While serving on the USS John F. Kennedy, he was also the point person for angermanagement issues.

"Everything you find in society you find on the ship," he says, "but you can't refer them to someone. You are at the end of the line."

Health problems led to Vanden Boogard's retirement from the military. The lieutenant commander's final assignment was as the Catholic chaplain at the Marine Corps base at Quantico, Va.

Vanden Boogard currently celebrates Masses at St. Norbert Abbey and area parishes. In 2012, he hopes to study at the Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, with plans to serve as a spiritual director.

Weber joined the U.S. Air Force after experiencing an epiphany of sorts while teaching psychology at St. Norbert.

"It was an Intro to Psych course in one of the large lecture rooms," he says. "There were 100 or so students. I gave a quiz, mostly for attendance purposes. I was looking up at the students.

I was 27 at the time. I thought to myself, 'I know more psychology than they do, but I may not know a lot more about life experiences.' I liked teaching, but I really felt that I needed some life experiences."

Despite being the son of a Marine who served in World War II, the armed forces didn't initially appeal to Weber.

"I wanted to expand my horizons," he says, "so I had to do something I didn't want to do."

Weber was commissioned to the Air Force in 1987. He worked in hospital settings, handled administration and wrote regulations. Deployment took him to the Middle East. In Kabul, Weber worked with the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, assisting with religious support efforts. He experienced the violence of war firsthand on May 19, 2010, during a frontline Taliban attack in Bagram, Afghanistan, that killed a U.S. contractor and wounded nine service members.

"A couple days before the attack there was a warehouse fire about 200 feet from where I was located," says Weber. "It exploded. We thought we were under attack. We didn't know the cause of the fire. I was thinking about how best to minister to others with the situation you find yourself in, realizing that you are under attack. How do you best take care of others while protecting yourself?"

He says one of the most rewarding aspects of his military service was assisting the enlisted members with family issues.

"It's difficult for them to be away from their spouses and families," he says. "You try to help keep people refreshed mentally and spiritually."

Weber retired as a lieutenant colonel in March of 2011. The native of Lake Benton, Minn., says he is enjoying prayer life at St. Norbert Abbey. He plans to help out at parishes, do some volunteer work and become more involved at St. Norbert College. 🍁



# Finishing strong

o one would have questioned Brigette Baudhuin '12 if she chose to walk away from basketball, but that's not in her nature. This season, the senior forward from Brussels, Wis., is determined to finish what she started.

Baudhuin suffers from psoriatic arthritis. She was diagnosed with the condition the summer before her junior year at Southern Door High School, when she noticed unusual symptoms after returning from a family vacation in Mexico. "My joints started swelling really badly where I couldn't get out of bed in the morning," she says. "My mom would have to roll me out of bed."

Baudhuin, who also was a standout volleyball player in high school, feared that her days as an athlete were over. Dr. David Keim, a rheumatologist, believed otherwise. "He was very up front with me and very positive," says Baudhuin. "He said, 'We are going to get you back on the court.' Within a month, I was back on the court."

Baudhuin's pain and discomfort vary day to day. She struggles on humid, rainy and frigid days. Swelling in her fingers and knees affects her ability to catch the basketball and run the court, yet she perseveres.

"I've been battling through it," she says. "My teammates are there for me. They know what I'm going through and are so supportive. I try to internalize it and deal with it myself. Everyone has issues that they have to deal with in life. It doesn't define who I am." Regular injections administered by her mother, Connie – Baudhuin's youth basketball coach – help treat the inflammatory arthritis and have forced Baudhuin to overcome her fear

of needles. "I used to pass out when I got shots," she says. "Every time a needle came near me I would faint."

Right now, Baudhuin is happy to be playing the game she loves. "When I was diagnosed, I wasn't thinking about playing college basketball," she says. "I was thinking about if I was going to be able to walk or hold a toothbrush in the morning. When buttoning your jeans becomes a challenge, you definitely rethink athletics, but I don't know what I would do without sports. They really are a big part of my life."

"It's remarkable what she puts up with in order to play," says women's basketball coach **Connie Tilley**. "She is one of our captains this season and is a total team player. It's a demanding game at this level. We demand so much from a defensive standpoint, and Brigette never complains. I'm just so proud that she's able to live a dream."

Baudhuin suffered a physical setback last season. She tried playing with a stress fracture in her foot, but in the third game of the season the bone fractured completely. She missed four weeks. Baudhuin is hoping for a healthy and successful final collegiate season. "I really want to contribute," says Baudhuin. "I want to help motivate the underclassmen. Being selected a captain means a lot to me. It's great that Coach Tilley respects me enough to put that trust in me and that my teammates believe in my leadership enough that they put me in that position. I hope I do good things for the program."

"I can't even give you in words how impressed I am by her as a person," says Tilley. "People like Brigette are the reason I became a coach."

The St. Norbert women are two-time defending conference champions. Winning a third consecutive title would be a rewarding way to go out, says Baudhuin, one of three seniors (along with Krista Pelky '12 and Jamie Kuhl '12). "These are your sisters for life," she says of her teammates. "You take a sense of pride in working hard every day. No one sees us practice hard every day for two to three hours in the gym.



## Ireland awaits Green Knight football

The Emerald Isle will get a little greener when St. Norbert competes in Dublin next year. The season-opening game sees the Green Knights take on John Carroll University as part of the Global Ireland Football Tournament – an event also featuring a Notre Dame-Navy face-off.

The game marks the first time St. Norbert will compete outside North America, and only the second time a Green Knight team has played outside of the continental U.S. (The St. Norbert hockey team took to the ice at the University of Alaska Fairbanks in 1997.)

## Two-time champs see more success ahead

Eight newly graduated Green Knight skaters have become very familiar with their ring sizes. Blake Bashor '11, Mike Bernardy '11, Adam Hammerbeck '11, Taylor Langford '11, Brandon Longley '11, Scott Pulak '11, Nick Tabisz '11 and Dustin Walz '11 captured their second NCAA Division III hockey national championship last season. The group also was part of the 2008 title team in their first season at St. Norbert. "I don't think as a freshman that you appreciate it as much," says Pulak. "We had so much success right away that you think it's going to happen every year. The struggle the next year and building the team back up as juniors and seniors makes you appreciate the hard work that goes into it."

The former players anticipate a challenging transition from the ice to the stands. Bernardy, who is working in finance in De Pere, says that he likely will only attend big rivalry matchups. "I don't think I will be at all of the games," he says. "It will be too depressing not being out there." "I don't think it's going to set in until everyone else is stepping on the ice and we are on the outside looking in," says Hammerbeck, who is enrolled in the Marquette University School of Dentistry. "I don't think we will ever get out of the game. A hockey player can never completely remove himself from the game."

The two-time champs like the prospects for the 2011-12 Green Knights, despite the loss of a large number of key contributors.

"I think they are going to have a good opportunity," says Pulak. "They are still returning a strong corps of players. If they go in with the right attitude and aren't complacent, they have a great chance of getting back to the Frozen Four again."

"At St. Norbert it's never really a rebuilding process," says Hammerbeck. "It's retooling, refining things a little bit."

The success of past teams sets the foundation for the future, says Bernardy.

"Coach [**Tim Coghlin**] sees each player as a piece of the puzzle and he knows where to put them," Bernardy says. "I feel that we left a legacy here that will bring in more talent that wants to win. They see that we won two national titles and played in a third. We built a legacy here on top of an already storied program."

"We are just a part of the legacy," says Pulak. "So many great players came before us to establish this program. We won two national championships but are still just a small part of it. There's going to be more to come."

If you were at our Commencement ceremony on that festive Sunday last May, you may have noticed many of our graduates wearing a new emblem on their robes. The badge read "Senior Pledge 2011."

This symbol meant these graduates had committed to give the college a donation for each of the next five years. The pledges are modest - most are for \$10 a year. The amount pledged wasn't the point, however; the commitment was.

In fact, that's why we started the Senior Class Pledge program in the first place, and we were delighted that 124 students, or about one-fourth of the total class, chose to be involved.

Philanthropic support is the backbone of any private college, and alumni giving is the backbone of any college's philanthropic regimen. That's why it's so important to try to get alumni committed, and the sooner the better. The amount they give will grow over time, as their careers develop and their incomes burgeon. But we want to instill in them early the habit of giving back. We often remind our students that they are part of a continuum - they were able to attend St. Norbert in large part because of the generosity of those who came before them, and because of their help many more will be able to attend in the future.

Alumni giving is also important because it's one of the factors U.S. News & World Report uses in determining where colleges rank nationally. Alumni giving is considered a kind of proxy for alumni loyalty in general. The best, most established private colleges have annual alumni-giving rates that can exceed 40, or even 50, percent. At St. Norbert we are approaching the more typical 20 percent, although we have been steadily moving the needle in the right direction.

And it all starts with young alums, because frankly there are more and more of them out there roughly 500 new graduates each year, joining our base. Because of the new Senior Class Pledge program, this year's graduates committed to give at more than twice the rate of the 2010 class. We also want to send out a big "thanks" to trustee Miriam Mulva '69 and her husband, Jim, for the important role they're playing in this effort. The Mulvas are the epitome of enlightened philanthropy – you'll recall their lead gift of \$10 million several years ago to underwrite our new library. And this year they agreed to match each new graduate's pledge - and those of other recent graduates, dating back to 2001 - with a gift of \$50. Talk about sweetening the pot!

As you know, the fall issue of St. Norbert College Magazine is where we particularly recognize our many friends and donors, and what their generosity has meant to us.

What it meant in the past 12 months is fairly easy to summarize: This was quite likely the best year in the history of St. Norbert College.

Generous friends like you donated more than \$17 million to the college last year, easily shattering the previous St. Norbert record. The largest of these gifts went to underwrite some of our most conspicuous and needed campus projects: the current expansion and renovation of the cafeteria and union complex into Michels Commons; the new Ariens Family Welcome Center; and completion of the locker room at Donald J. Schneider Stadium. But as always, every gift mattered, and had an impact, whether it funded scholarships, academic programs, athletics or worthy community outreach like the CEO Breakfast Series or the Girls Leadership and Development (GLAD) camp.

We had a record enrollment of 2,179 undergraduate students, and the record freshman class had the highest collective ACT scores in school history - the highest GPAs, too.

With talented new additions, our faculty ranks are stronger than ever, whether you're talking about classroom instruction, undergraduate research, mentoring, service-learning, or the production of research and scholarship that matters.

We made dramatic jumps in both the U.S. News & World Report and Forbes national rankings of colleges and universities - and our Forbes ranking for 2012 has since jumped a further 68 places.

Then there was that men's hockey Division III national championship - our second in four years! and the stellar performances by many, many other Green Knight teams.

Because of your confidence and your generosity, the momentum at St. Norbert College continues to be brisk. It will be no small feat for us to top last year's performance in 2011-12, but with your support - big and small, from alumni old and new - we know we will


