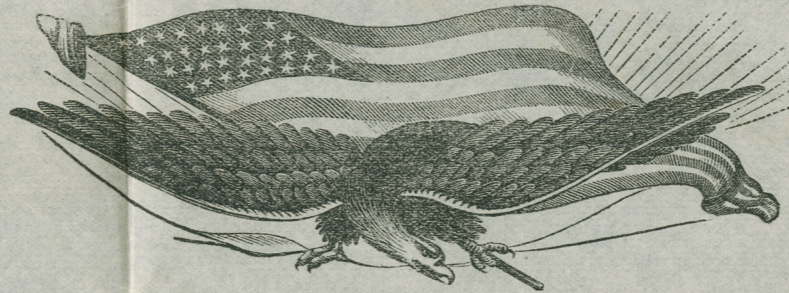

Know Ye, That reposing special trust and confidence in the patriotism, valor, fidelity and abilities of

Thomas S. Armstrong
I have appointed him First Lieutenant in the 121st Regiment
Ohio Volunteer Infantry in the service of the United States, for **Three Years**, unless sooner discharged,
under Act of **CONGRESS**, approved July 22, 1861, to rank as such from the 26 day of March
eighteen hundred and sixty-four. He is, therefore, carefully and diligently to discharge the duty
of First Lieutenant by doing and performing all manner of things thereunto belonging.
And I do strictly charge and require all Officers and Soldiers under his command to be obedient to his orders
as First Lieutenant And he is to observe and follow such orders and directions, from time to time,
as he shall receive from the General, or other superior officers set over him, according to the rules and discipline of War.

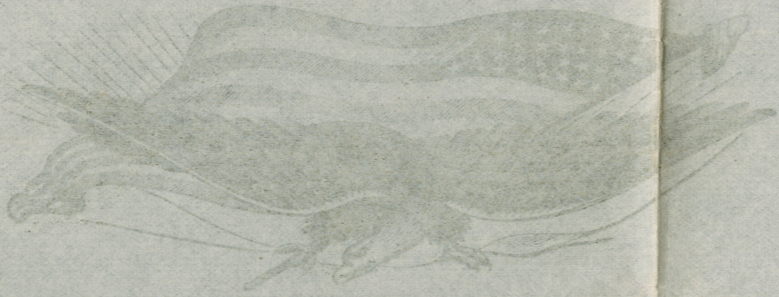
