I suppose you will
think it strange to receive a letter from
one that, time has long since obliterated from
your memory. Indeed I was young when you
travelled through this part of Ohio Preaching the
gospel. When occasionally you took shelter
under my father's humble roof (William Wells)
my father (in his lifetime) always spoke of you
with great respect, as well as my Brother Christie,
who were older than myself. The object of
this letter is to invite you to pay a visit to
this place and Preach once more for us before
you take your journey to the better Country. Though
if you should come there would very few
faces that you would recognise for nearly
all that heard you preach in those days have fallen
asleep. I have thought for some time if you
in your old age could travel over the ground
(from ^{hur} to the lakes) where you in early times planted
Churches or if not planted by you you watered
those that were planted by others. It would
be a great departure from the simplicity
