March 10<sup>th</sup> 1828 London Ohio

Dear & very dear Sir — Feeling bound by duty  
I take this method to state to you a few particulars  
as to health of self & family it is good & is generally so  
on the Circuit however death is not a stranger in  
those parts Dr John M<sup>c</sup> Donald<sup>t</sup> wife has left him  
with only one day's sickness. The State of Circ<sup>t</sup>  
appears about as common — with this and  
exception we have had better meetings for one  
month than all the past year. The introduction  
of our new Society is favourably received by a  
considerable majority of the people. We are  
making exertions which have procured perhaps  
300 subscribers who I hope will soon pay  
their subscriptions — We expect to send soon —

Cincinnati to Dr M Rieter for several dollars  
worth of Tracts. Our by-laws appropriate one  
half the money subscribed & paid to the Missionary  
Society — Our London brethren are working at  
the Meeting House & agreed to have it finished for  
last. You will therefore come to that place  
to hold said meeting

I fear Sir there is a mistake of the time —  
I have given it out for the first Saturday  
& Sabbath in April. But in this there appears  
to be a difference I wish Sir if I am mistaken —  
you would correct it as soon as possible —  
by Letter. So if it is not corrected in a few  
days it will be too late — I have only to say  
to you that my trials are great my grace few —  
my knowledge small my duty heavy & in my  
administration am opposed many hard things are  
laid but I bless God my conscience is still clear  
Dr Bullock is going on well God is with him  
& I think he is becoming more fervent —  
I have neither saw nor heard of my Brother of  
whom we spoke as traveling the remainder of  
the year

And now my dear Brother  
continue to pray for me & all we as a  
duty you owe for the peace of Zion & the  
Glory of God — While I bid you farewell  
Nov 1<sup>st</sup> 1828
