Lancaster Friday eve

Dear Brother Findley

It has been so long since you visited Lancaster that I begin to fear it has with you no pleasant associations and that you have really forgotten too that Findley blood is coursing through our veins - come and see whether in honour or dishonour - but I would offer you a higher and holier inducement - to do good and to communicate forget not, is no doubt with you a settled principle, and the wider the sphere, the more extended the field, the happier are your labours - yet how apt are we when all is calm to lay down our oars and gently glide down the stream and yet even along the margin we might have reached forth a helping or reforming hand but passed on and saw when too late - so it may be with you and I would stir up your pure mind by way of remembrance, would not variety be a stimulus and then you would return to your old jobbing with renewed diligence for we would send over to you the Macedonian cry - COME OVER AND HELP US - we feel the Lord is waiting to be gracious
