Charlestown August 30th - 1825

Dear Brother

as the Conference

is now over and a few leisure moments  
afforded me I gladly devote them in  
writing to you. I shant have written  
so much but was always prevented by  
a press of business. the Conference  
closed its session about 12 o'clock this  
morning. we had great peace and harmony  
among the preachers. Bishop McFarlane  
was with us in good health and good spirits  
and expects to go to the Kentucky conference.  
I have also to attend there this will  
prevent me from visiting you  
at your next session which I greatly  
desire. from several considerations  
I suppose you have heard of the loss  
I sustained in the death of Z. Harrel  
last winter. this has prevented my  
being able to pay the money I loaned  
from you. you ought to have had it before  
this time but so it is. I sometimes  
disappoint my best friends but not

Intentionally have put into the  
hands of Brother M. Anter \$15<sup>00</sup> Dollars  
for your use and as Brother Anter  
expects to attend the Tennessee  
conference then expect to be  
able to send you the balance  
we are about to establish a school  
and Mission among the Pathawattama  
Indians brother Walker is our Missionary  
for that purpose and goes clothed with  
sufficient authority to act in behalf of  
the Bish[ep]s & Conference may the  
great Head of the church be with him  
Should this letter reach you in time to  
write to the Holston Conference please  
to answer it especially write by Brother  
Anter when he attends the ~~the~~ Tennessee  
Conf being weary and fatigued with  
labour I find it necessary to come  
to a close my kind regards to sister  
Ginley and accept of them yourself  
I remain as ever yours in the  
bands of a peaceful gospel
