Pittsburgh Oct 10 - 1848

Dear Bro Finley,

You will please say to Thomas Brantow, that matters in his behalf are progressing favorably. The business of his Brother with the Government - takes time as each one must have his turn according to the time of his application, both for the Bay and the Land warrant.

As to his pardon, I feel confident about that, as I have wrote to and rec^d from some of the most influential Men in Ohio - Letters that will tell with Gov^r Bebb. It is my intention when I have rec^d what I believe to be sufficient, and when I have rec^d from the Mayor of Cincinnati and from the Rev^d Granville Moody their Regent in the matter, to see the Gov^r in person, and also to visit Columbus. Nothing that can be done in my power will be left undone. Will you please drop a line to yours in the Best of Bonds. Rev^d Moody and the Mayor of Cincinnati urging them as it is now some time since I wrote } Joshua Robinson
