Mayfield December 7. 1847

Dear Brother Finly

Your Kindness to me when at the Ohio Conference  
is gratefully remembered, and this day we will have our new  
Church erected in. It will cost us about \$5000 including the Price  
of the lot. About \$2000 of this will come from the undesignated  
for the purchase of the lot & the cost of the land in Contingency for  
the Old Church. Brother Finly, this has been to me a source  
of much suffering & deep heart felt anxiety, to try my very best  
to guard our people from being carried off by the Southerners  
and contending for property which I most conscientiously believed  
could not be taken from the Methodist E. Church or her members  
Now if the next Genl. Conference will go into a settlement with the South  
here is a property worth \$60000 taken from those who built it  
and given to the South for which the South never paid one dollar  
for. and all taken from the members here. On the ground of the  
Resolutions of the Conference of 1844. This will be fully explained  
to the next Genl. Conference.

But the object of the present note is to solicit your further  
Kindness in asking from some of our Brethren in Columbus  
some further assistance to help our building Committee to comply  
with their engagements. for it would be death for the Southerners  
to crack, could they get a report against us that we had  
made contracts, had not complied with them. Dear Brother  
I know your Kindness & regard your aid & help to us to  
come from our friends there it will be of great service & thankfully  
received in this our time of need. and will never be
