Lebanon Dec 14th 1830

My Dear Uncle

Permit me to intrude a line upon your patience and ask the favour of doing for me a little errand - which is to call at B^ro^m Anderson's and get for me a strengthening plaster of a certain description, said to be good for one applied with a heating & and pack in the back - he will know the kind to which I refer.

Harris himself recommended it to me during the last summer.

This dull, damp weather joined with some exposure has produced a return of my old affliction - during the last week I have suffered considerable - Can you send me the two last numbers of the "Gleaner," - or at least all the numbers that contain a "view of the Radical Constitution" - Should it be continued in any numbers that have not come to hand have the goodness to send them as they arrive, they shall be safely returned - Last week I received a letter from our mutual friend D. Young he still continues in feeble health
