Having an opportunity
to write you a few lines I hope you will excuse
I have to night in best Sister Park from your
City was good and to take this letter as I wish to
make some inquiries if Mr. Lilly my son in law
has put any stone over my beloved Child grave
Mr. Lilly two years ago as I came from Dashiell
I stopped at Cincinnati expecting to see you
I felt very sorry that I could not see you indeed
men I never thought my mind was very true
In age I thought I should never see her more
I bless the Lord that I have a strong hope
I shall meet in our Father's house more all
inabilitie and trials shall be nipte away and
I do feel a foretaste of those joys at the
nute hand of god for ever more we pray
for me that I may come off worse the conqueror
that we may sing the song of Moses and Hamlin
men I was in your City my intention was to see
a Government Errected over my dear Child grave
but Mr. Alpheus Smith informing me Mr. Lilly
had been there and had bought ground off
him and Ellen Lake Shore and he intended to
have it down, I omitted it I wish Dear Brother
you let me know if he has any thing round her grave
ever since the death of his wife he seems as if
he was her angel I hope you will excuse me
to make an inquiry if you ever hear my

beloved Father Asbury sleep with
or Negros who I know well he has been in
my Mother's house for Months and men often
shake at him in that may it hurt my feelings and was destined
to let you know as the Person said you knew
it to be so and I want it to be written for I
loved him the same as a Father and I believe
he speaks of my Mother in his journal her Name
was Isabell

I hope your City is health and
Hundreds have flock'd here & given me
bles & with good Preacher ^{here} and I hope the Lord
will give us a Pentecost is my sincere wish
If we never meet in this world or that we may
meet in the happy reigns of uninterrupted felicity
many partings and sorrows and afflictions shall
be no more for shall one son be summoned
away and go the way of all flesh to try the
realities of another world now let me close
with assurances of my best wishes for your
happiness and your Dear Wife connected with
you by the ties of saline grace and gratitude
I am yours with due consideration and affectionate
respect my love to your Wife hopping to here
