Dear Sir -

I rec^d your letter, per last mail, making inquiry of the character of Miss Wilmore - I have only to say that I have no particular acquaintance with her. I have known her by sight, for several years, and have never heard any thing particular about her. - I have made inquiry since I rec^d your letter, but as she has made her home some 12 miles from her, I have learned nothing except from Mr Frost, who informs me that she resided in his family for several months, & that her conduct was unexceptionable, & that she was an industrious, good girl.
