May - 15 - 1819 AD Town. State of Ohio-

Dear Sir Children We are all on the Stream
of Time, under full sail for the Port of Eternity. So
Sail as many knots in an hour at night, as in the
day. & will soon make the Port. I hope it will be
the Good Port of heaven. As to the health of the fam-
ily, it is as usual, no visible alteration either for
the better or worse. My Colleague has desisted
to travel, & the whole weight of so popular a

Circuit devolved on my Shoulders. & my old limbs
trotter beneath the ponderous weight. This
year has been more oppressive than any that
has rolled past since I have been a Student.
The works of the Lord is still progressing. & loo-
king around I see sinners gathering home to God. I
shall a. Presectable encourage this year, perhaps
not less than a hundred, the greatest number of
them profess conversion. We have had a good
among children from 9. to 16. Numbers having
