Dear & Sister we happy to hear from
you and that you are well and
on your way to the summit of
eternal rest. May infinite power
support you and grace brotherly
refine your hearts and make you
fit for the master up. It fills
me with a degree of rapture &
joy to think, after toiling out
a few more years in trouble and
sorrow) of standing on mount Zion
with the hundreds that's gone
before, to shout eternal rounds of
hail to the everlasting Saviour
of my soul & the joy is still high-
tened when I think of meeting my
Bro James & sister Hannah in the
city of my god where parting shall
be no more & where every tear shall
be wiped away

I want you not to fail in writing to me respecting it so soon as you shall receive this letter I have been to him and he denies it and says he will never pay it unless he is compelled by law I want you to state also ~~to~~ state in your letter how it was that you disposed of a dollar which he says he paid you in order to buy Holland & I know not what way to turn Scarcely for the best May the Lord direct and support that I may do what shall be most for the glory of God I want you if I should fail in my present hopes of getting money to pay the last gall of my place to try to help to the loan often or fifteen dollars for the term of one year for which I will pay again the principal with lawful interest I have ^{as much} the following to me as will pay it all but twenty dollars and I see no way of getting it

without selling one of my cows which I cant well spare at this time If you can help me if only to ten dollars you will much oblige me and if you cant do it without an injury I dont want you to do it all you can let me know in your letter how it will be and if I can get it I will come up any time between this and the last of June will answer I dont expect to be favored a day and I want to be in readiness I must now shortly close by committing you to god and the word of his grace and oh that he may bless you and save you to the until you shall come to dwell in the paradise of the Lord Jenny remembers her greatest love to you both and Betsy likewise she would be glad to see you and enjoy your company but a grammar is god has ordered it otherwise

and Amen so let it be his will must be
done but glory to God when life sinks
apace and death leaves in view we shall
then meet and never part no more then
it will be that the gospel trumpet will
be heard no more in Zion inviting sinners
to come to Jesus and be saved But
the wicked will be driven away in their
wickedness and sentenced down to fire
pain & suffering on sinners May
God almighty bless you make you faithful
till unto we shall come to the gates
of glory and meet with those heart clearing
words of our blessed Jesus come in ye blessed
of Father & this be the prayer of your
loving brother & sister until death
