September the Hillborough Ohio 1848  
 Dear father after my respects to you iye  
 can in form you that iye am well at  
 pleasant and hope these lines may  
 find you enjoying of gods blessing  
 in like manner when they come to  
 hand well Father in the lord I  
 feel thankful to god that by his  
 assisting grace that iye am stil  
 trawling in that strate and narrow road  
 that leads to joys on high at the wright  
 hand of god and iye never intend  
 to give up the conflict until iye shd  
 come off more than conquered though  
 christ Jesus and iye hope that if we  
 shal never meet on earth that we  
 shal meet in heven to part no  
 more forever iye received your letter  
 which gave me grate satisfaction to hear  
 from you all up there and that you  
 were all well and that the work of  
 the lord was stil prospering in that  
 part of his vineyard and that  
 sinners stil is a coming home to  
 god iye am stil working with efr  
 Samuel think the man that iye  
 went to work with last spring  
 and iye dont expect to leave  
 him soon iye am a dooing well  
 here and iye expect to come out  
 there this fall if nothing hapens  
 you will please give my love to  
 all my fellow sifers up there
